## AFFIDAVIT OF MARRELL McCOLLOUGH

- I, Marrell McCollough, do hereby depose, swear and state:
- 1. On April 4, 1968, I was a member of the Memphis Police Department, assigned in an undercover capacity to infiltrate a group of young black activists known as the Invaders. When Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was shot, I was in the parking lot of the Lorraine Motel with some of his associates. I immediately rushed to him on the balcony where he lay. Concerned about my own safety as I approached Dr. King, I was watching the area across Mulberry Street from where I thought the shot had been fired. I saw no one and nothing unusual.
- 2. I am aware that someone named Loyd Jowers has made allegations that I met with other officers of the Memphis Police Department in Jim's Grill to plot the assassination of Dr. King and that, later, I participated in that plot.
- 3. I have never been in Jim's Grill in Memphis, Tennessee, and never met Loyd Jowers.
- 4. I have never met with any Memphis Police officers or anyone else regarding plans to kill Dr. King.
- 5. I never participated in any manner in any plan or plot to assassinate Dr. King.

I declare under the penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true correct.
