Ray's Criminal Career T Began 18 Years Ago in L.A.

LOS ANGELES, April 20
The criminal career of James Earl Ray, the man suspected of killing Dr. Martin Luther King, began in downtown Los Angeles early on an October evening 18 years ago.

HE TRIED to steal a typewriter from the third floor office of the Forum Cafeteria,

The assistant manager caught him in the act and scuffled with him, but Ray got away — not for long, however.

As he fied across a parking lot, an attendant heard the assistant manager's cries and grabbed Rav.

THE TWO struggled, Ray broke free, but a bank savings book and his army discharge papers fell to the pavement from his torn shirt pocket.

(That happenstance, and an extraordinary coincidence, led to the first arrest in Ray's long career of lawlessness a span of misconduct which apparently reached a climax in Memphis. A il 4, when Dr. King was assassi-

Four days later, Oct. 11, 1949, the

parking lot attendant recognized Ray emerging from a bank.

HE ATTRACTED the attention of nearby policemen, who arrested Ray and matched him up with the bank book and army papers.

Ray was given 90 days in the county jail and placed on two years probation by Superior Judge W. Turney Fox, now retired.

Judge Fox's leniency was based on the report of Dep. County Probation Officer Herbert W. Audit and the plea of Dep. Public Defender Richard S. Buckley, who represented Ray, who was unemployed at the time and broke.

AUDIT TODAY is in the probation department's Santa Monica office, while Buckley has risen to head of the public defender's office.

Buckley, in appealing for probation when Ray appeared Dec. 30, 1949, before Judge Fox for sentencing, said:

"... I feel he not only is eligible for probation but that he is a fit subject for probation ... this man is in a position to stand on his own feet, and apparently has done so for a period of time . . .

"He apparently is thrifty, acquired

some savings and also did fairly well in the Army. In view of these chromistances, I feel he is a good risk on probation . . ."

"I THINK you have a point there,"

Judge Fox told Buckley.

Then the judge turned to Ray and informed him that as a condition of his probation:

"I want you to stay out of drinking places and not indulge in the use of alcoholic liquor or frequent or go to places where it is the principal order of sale . . ."

AUDIT, the probation officer, had noted that Ray "spends much time on dates with girls" and admitted to "occasional excessive use of intoxicants."

His remarks, and those of the judge, have an ironic echo today, since women and liquor appear to have played major roles in the subsequent life of Ray who was only 21 at the time.

Audit also observed that Ray appeared to be of normal intelligence, was a Roman Catholic but did not attend church, attended movies two or three times a week and "likes to read magazines and common ordinary books."



Dear Sir:

I am presently a permanent resident of Anchorage and employeed at the Armed Forces Examining and Entrance Station, 429 D Street, Anchorage. I retired from the U.S. Army at Fort Richardson in August 1966. In view of the facts and circumstances surrounding the assasination of Dr Martin Luther King, I wish to relate a conversation which transpired at the Fort Richardson Communications Center.

On two occasions, October 1965 and in either July or August 1966, I went to the Fort Richardson Communications Center for the purpose of having photographs made of myself for ID cards. On one of these occasions while my photographs were being processed the photographer and I conversed on matters in general; the conversation later focused on future plans after either retirement or discharge from the service. At this juncture, he mentioned that if he had nothing better to do after leaving the service he could "at least" or "always" return home and "kill niggers," that there "is a price on King's head;" I believe the amount mentioned by him was \$3,000. The conversation terminated shortly afterwards.

The foregoing is all that transpired, and I have not since seen the individual again. He may have returned home as a result of having been discharged or retired from the military service. Doctor Martin Luther King was probably the center of many a southerner's conversation, and the information volunteered herein may have little or no relevance to the Bureau's present investigation; however, because of the global aspect of the investigation and the necessity for citizen respond, I felt it imperative that I proffer the information for evaluation by the Bureau.



WANTED BY THE FBI



JAMES EARL RAY, also known as Eric Starvo Galt, Harvey Lowmyer, John Willard, James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Conner.

James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee, sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is one of the FBI's "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives." FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Top Ten" list to insure widespread dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to speed his location.

Ray has been intensively sought since the murder of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom wanted notices were posted,

determined that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias of Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen. Ray, who escaped on April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary, is also sought for unlawful flight to avoid confinement for robbery. His long criminal record also includes convictions for burglary and

first long criminal record also includes convictions for burgiary and forging U.S. Postal Money Orders.

A white American, born in Alton, Illinois, on March 10, 1928, Ray is 5'10" tall, weighs 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and short brown hair. He has a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe and his left ear protrudes noticeably. Known as a "loner" and "drifter," Ray has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher. He has taken dancing lessons and completed a course at a school of bartending.

Consider Ray armed and extremely dangerous. Report any information concerning him to the nearest FBI office.
