On 4/25/68 Mrs. GLADYS VINBURG, supra, advised she could locate no record of the purchase of bear tags for CAMPBELL and MC INTYRE, supra.

She advised that PARK MUNSEY and PINNELL and TOLLIFSON were presently out guiding bear hunters on Kodiak Island and their exact whereabouts is unknown.

This individual identified himself as ALFRED EUGENE BENNETT, JR., residence 6078 Ravine Drive, Parma, onlo. Registration for the vehicle was in BENNETT's name. He also had Ohio operators license number E836490. The Ohio registration had been issued April 2, 1968, and listed vehicle serial number as 4W58H523334.

BENNETT advised he had run out of gas and that before leaving the vehicle to obtain fuel he had removed the keys and license plates from his vehicle to prevent theft of the car.

# The Search for Ray: Intense, Painstaking

WASHINGTON — The FBI's failure to apprehend the assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King has led to reports that J. Edgar Hoover is not interested in catching the murderer. The reports are based partly on the fact that Hoover and King were not on good terms, Hoover having publicly branded King as "the most notorious liar in the world."

We have checked into the operations of the FBI in this respect and are convinced that it is conducting perhaps the most painstaking, exhaustive manhunt ever before undertaken in the United States. Its G-men have checked every bar ever patronized by James Earl Ray, every flophouse he ever stopped at, every cantina in Mexico he ever visited. It has collected an amazing array of evidence, all linking Ray with the murder.

That he has not been found may be due, first, to the possibility that he himself was murdered by those who hired him to kill King; or, second, that he is hiding in some remote Mexican village.

If he has money — and apparently he had — Ray might be able to live in a distant part of Mexico indefinitely. The Mexico City police are efficient and co-operative, but police in the remote areas are not. In some villages few Mexicans can read or write, and radio news of the outside world does not penetrate.

WHAT THE FBI has established about King's assassin was that he was a professional killer who had studied the suspense writing of Ian Fleming and Ayn Rand. His pseudonym, Eric Starvo Galt, for instance, was taken from both authors.

Yet, while a student of crime he was also a bungler. For he left behind the murder rifle with his fingerprints on it and, wrapped around the rifle, a bedspread which contained strands of his hair, He also left behind a blue zipper bag containing a brush with hair matching those on the bedspread.

All the evidence we have been able to gather points to the probability that Ray was hired to kill Dr. King. He broke out of the Missouri State Penitentiary on April 23, 1967, after boasting to fellow prisoners that he intended to make a big "score" on the outside. He remarked to one inmate that he might try to collect a rumored \$1 million bounty that supposedly had been offered by a "businessmen's group" for the death of Dr. King.

Four months later, on Aug. 30, 1967, he opened a safe deposit box in the Birmingham Trust National Bank and suddenly began passing out crisp \$20 bills like a big spender. He paid \$499 for dancing instruction, then quit after only a few lessons. He spent \$395 for mail-order photographic equipment that he didn't know how to operate.

HE SHELLED out money for a bartending course, but showed no interest in working behind any bar. He also took a course in lock-picking from a correspondence school in Michigan. His white Mustang cost \$1,995, which he paid in cash. He drove it from Mexico to Montreal, from Los Angeles to New Orleans.

Occasionally he slipped \$20 to bar girls and prostitutes. In Mexico he lived with a prostitute in small towns like Jalisco and Puerto Vallarta where prices were cheap. Once he posed in sun glasses for a picture with his Mexican prostitute.

In Los Angeles, he advertised in the hippie newspaper that he would like to meet "a passionate married woman." He also paid \$1 to the Swinger's Club for the names and addresses of five girls.

All told, Ray spent an estimated \$10,000 in seven months. Yet he never held a job, and committed no crimes following his escape from the Missouri penitentiary that the FBI has discovered. Previously he had been in-

voluced in a long list of filling station and other robberies. But after his escape he became a loner; in some respects he became another Lee Harvey Oswald. Meanwhile, he sought to establish a new identity as Eric Starvo Galt.

It seems likely that Ray planned the murder of Dr. King for several months. He finally purchased the Remington rifle in Birmingham on March 30, then moved to a boarding house in Atlanta. In his room, agents found a map of Atlanta with four locations circled.

They were Dr. King's residence, his headquarters at the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Ray's boarding house and the spot where he abandoned his Mustang after the murder. In the middle of the map was also a clear thumbprint from Ray's right thumb.

EVIDENTLY Ray changed his mind about waylaying King in Atlanta and followed him to Memphis instead. After all the elaborate planning and the careful creation of a new identity, Ray left behind in Memphis the murder rifle, binoculars and a bag full of toilet articles.

If white extremists put up the blood money it was probably not the Ku Klux Klan or the Minute Men, for they are an impatient lot who would not have waited several months for Ray to get results.

Black extremists have also not been ruled out. They might have sought to get rid of King in order to remove the prophet of nonviolence.

Note: Ray was the product of a broken home. He was the eldest of eight children. His father deserted Ray's mother, and various people adopted the children.

When the FBI approached the father, they discovered that the elder Ray had not seen his son for 17 years. "I would be the last one he would come to for help," the father said.

On May 15, 1968, Special Agent ROBERT M. POWELL, Senior Resident Agent, Fairbanks, Alaska, and Special Agent JAMES F. MAYER, Resident Agent, Juneau, Alaska, were apprised of the contents of referenced teletype telephonically.

It will be noted that the only unsolved bank robbery or bank burglary in the Anchorage Division occurred on November 29, 1963.

On May 15, 1968, Lieutenant EARL HIBPSHMAN (NA), Chief, Detective Division, Anchorage Police Department, was contacted and he advised that a review of unsolved robberies in the Anchorage area from April 23, 1967, to April 4, 1968, reveals no armed robberies were committed where large amounts of money were obtained and there are no robbery suspects involved in these unsolved robberies fitting the description of the subject.

On May 17, 1968, Special Agent JAMES F. MAYER contacted Chief of Police PAT WELLINGTON (NA), Juneau Police Department, Juneau, Alaska, at which time a similar review as described above was conducted and it was determined there are no unsolved robberies in the Juneau area of substantial amounts of money which could be attributed to the subject.

On May 17, 1968, DONALD E. FLYNN was contacted at 10:30 PM, at his residence, Mile 2, East Road, Homer, Alaska, by Special Agent RICHARD W. HEAD, at which time it was determined that Mr. FLYNN had been in the Port William, Alaska, area on April 29, 1968, on a hunting trip.

Mr. FLYNN advised that he is a guide and the hunter with him was EARL WEYDYAHL.

Mr. FLYNN advised that he was utilizing his Boat "The Little Sioux", Alaska Department of Fish and Game No. 5603, on this hunting trip, and he had contacted BEN LEE, the Caretaker at Port William, on or about April 29, 1968. Mr. LEE had been introducted to Mr. WEYDYAHL at this time and it was made known to Mr. LEE that they were hunting for bear in the area.

Mr. FLYNN advised that tentative arrangements had been made with LEE for them to return to Port William in the event they got a bear, at which time Mr. LEE, who fancies himself to be a good photographer, had volunteered to make pictures of the bear, Mr. WEYDYAHL, and Mr. FLYNN.

Mr. FLYNN advised, however, that several days after departing Port William, a foot of snow fell and it was his observation that the snow in the area would drive the bears back to hibernation, and for this reason, FLYNN stated he moved South as quickly as possible and did not return to Port William as was tentatively planned.

On the evening of May 17, 1968, while en route to Homer, Alaska, from Anchorage, Alaska, via WESTERN AIRLINES, the May 3, 1968, issue of Life Magazine was reviewed by Special Agent HEAD concerning the feature article regarding JAMES EARL RAY and it is to be noted that the only identifiable photograph of JAMES EARL RAY contained in the article is a stand-up photograph taken in 1959.

At approximately 4:30 p.m., 5/17/68 BEN LEE again contacted the writer by radio-telephone from Port Williams, Alaska.

IEE advised he had been contacted by a news reported named TOM BROWN who gave his telephone number as 272-8561. BROWN according to IEE was inquiring concerning information LEE had reportedly furnished to the FBI concerning an individual possibly identical with JAMES EARL RAY. IEE advised he had furnished BROWN with no information whatsoever.

LEE was advised that this office had been attempting to make personal contact with him but weather conditions had not permitted this. LEE was advised also that Chief RHINES of Kodiak would possibly be in touch with him after the weather cleared. LEE then offered to furnish the identity of the individual despite lack of security of communication by radio-telephone. He reiterated the date he saw suspect as April 29, 1968, the name of the boat as "Little Sue" from Homer, Alaska, and the guide as DON FLYNN.

Immediate efforts were made to locate FLYNN through sources in the Homer area and SA RICHARD W. HEAD was dispatched to Homer for the purpose of interviewing FLYNN and positively identifying his client of April 29, 1968.
