Mrs. BACHMAN and her husband, ALBERT J. BACHMAN, viewed photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT and expressed the opinion that SHIELDS and GALT are not identical. Mrs.

BACHMAN described SHIELDS as 5' 10" and heavy set.

DAVID H. WATTIER, Social Security , who furnished his address as 1325 N. E. 5th Terrace, Fort Lauderdale, was employed at Plaza East Condominium at approximately the same time as SHIELDS, having apparently begun employment 2-13-68. WATTIER listed his DOB as , 6°, 170 pounds, brown hair, blue eyes. He indicated he was from Randolph, Nebraska. He listed previous employment as December, 1967, Dunworth Electric.

On 5-2-68, JOE BLEIER, Head Doorman, Plaza East, advised both SHIELDS and WATTIER worked under his supervision. Both individuals reportedly resided together and definitely came to and departed work in WATTIER's 1966 Chevelle Super Sport, light blue in color.

Both BLEIER and Mrs. WOLFE viewed photographs of ERIC STARVO GALT and both stated in their opinion SHIELDS is not identical with GALT. SHIELDS was a trouble-maker and caused employee discontent over low wages and left after an argument with the management.

Re investigation concerning DONALD STOUT, possible co-conspirator.

DONALD STOUT has been identified as a "car jockey" employed by National Car Rentals and other car rental agencies on an informal basis during 1966 and 1967, driving cars across the country for such agencies. STOUT, who was described as a white male, 5'8", 210 lbs., with dark hair, with a wave in the front, and a pronounced southern accent, allegedly transported two college students from Oakland, California, to Kansas City, Missouri, in Sept., 1966. He "ditched" the students in Kansas City and took off with their clothing and other personal property in the car he was delivering. The car was eventually delivered to National Car Rentals, Logan Airport, East Boston, Mass., in Sept., 1966 and one of the students who had been "ditched" had contacted National Car Rentals and the Massachusetts State Police, Logan Airport, in an effort to retrieve his stolen property.

Trooper HARDIN (PH), Massachusetts State Police, was contacted by the college student regarding the alleged theft of his personal property by STOUT. HARDIN subsequently interviewed STOUT without placing him under arrest.

LEWIS stated he would be on the alert for a reappearance of this person and in that event he would attempt to obtain more specific information concerning him.

No further investigation in this matter is contemplated by Boston, UAC.

JAMES EARL RAY, also known as Eric Starvo Galt, Harvey Lowmyer, John Willard, James McBride, James Walton, W. C. Herron and James O'Conner.

James Earl Ray, a Missouri prison escapee, sought under the alias Eric Starvo Galt in connection with the gunshot slaying of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., is one of the FBI's "Ten Most Wanted Fugitives." FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover ordered the special addition of Ray to the "Top Ten" list to insure ridespread disconnection of Pay's phytograph and description to widespread dissemination of Ray's photograph and description to speed his location.

Ray has been intensively sought since the murder of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom wanted notices were posted, determined that Galf and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias of Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a citizen. Ray, who escaped on April 23, 1967, from the Missouri State Penitentiary, is also sought for unlawful flight to avoid confinement for robbery. His long criminal record also includes convictions for burglary and forging U.S. Postal Money Orders.

A white American, born in Alton, Illinois, on March 10, 1928, Ray is 5'10" tall, weighs 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and short brown hair. He has a nervous habit of tugging at an ear lobe and his left ear protrudes noticeably. Known as a "loner" and "drifter." Ray has worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher. He has taken dancing lessons and completed a course at a school of bartending.
