PUBLICITY ON REWARDS OFFERED

Each Special Agent in Charge and Legal Attache is instructed to promptly remind their established cooperative news sources, in a discreet and tactful manner, of the existence of substantial reward money for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the killer of Dr. Martin Luther King. This money now totals at least \$100,000. The FBI should not, however, be publicized as the source of this reminder.

While the Bureau's continuing policy is to encourage the public to furnish information to law enforcement authorities as a matter of good citizenship, without expectation of financial reward, it is fully recognized that monetary rewards are often necessary to motivate some individuals. The knowledge of the existence of the substantial rewards available in the Murkin case could possibly prove of value in the solution of this major investigation.

For the information of all Agents, suspect JAMES EARL RAY took a bartending course in Los Angeles, California, during the early part of 1968 and prior to his departure from Los Angeles in March, 1968, he made several telephone calls to country clubs in an effort to obtain employment as a bartender.

This should be borne in mind in covering leads in connection with the MURKIN case and any other cases in which investigation is conducted in establishments which employ bartenders.

In order to cover the possibility that JAMES EARL RAY may have died since the commission of the crime, the Bureau has instructed that investigation be conducted at State capitals to determine whether RAY is identical with any unidentified corpse located by a local PD or similar agencies during the period from 4/5/68 to the present time.

Established sources at State Police Headquarters in the four states covered by the Boston Office have been contacted concerning this matter with negative results.

All Agents should be alert to the possibility that the body of JAMES EARL RAY may have been located and is unidentified. Accordingly, in regular contacts with law enforcement agencies in this case or on other Bureau matters, appropriate inquiries relative to unidentified dead for the period, beginning 4/5/68, should be made with particular emphasis given to whether such corpses have been fingerprinted.

# Director's Branding of Doctor In 1964 Enters Into Probe

WASHINGTON there is no break in the investigation of Dr. Martin Luther King's assassination, J. Edgar Hoover may be retired along with Lyndon Johnson this year.

He may be anyway.

Partly because of the legendary Hoover's past indiscretions, the heat is very much on at the Federal Bureau of Investigation these days. And the temperature promises to continue rising unless the King case is

Or, until, at the very least, the Feds produce the suspect they have named in separate warrants as first Eric Starvo Galt and then James Earl

There is no indication that the F.B.I.'s police work has been inferior in the case. On the contrary, the agency has violated all its own rules to prove otherwise.

Men at the top of the F.B.I. have been visiting with favored reporters and showering them with details of what evidence is at hand, what methods were used 'to pinpoint Ray as the suspect, and what leads have been chased down without results.

This has caused some consternation among the field agents, who have been trained by Hoover and his aides to treat the press with a polite but rather stony silence until a case is solved.

But this is not just another case for J. Edgar Hoover and the F.B.I. Director Hoover put his personal hostili-ties toward Dr. King on the record in 1964 by calling the civil rights leader, who had just won the Novel Peace liar in the country."

And it is an open secret in Wasningson that the Trad. had a dossier on King that was shown to wire service reporters who cover the Justice Department, as well as to others who could be trust-

The F.B.I. file contained unevaluated testimony, such as the alleged transcript of tape recordings from bugged motel rooms, that were designed to place King in a bad light and show that he was not the great man he was considered in the civil rights movement and across much of America.

Thus the R.B.I. found itself with a credibility gap of major proportions when it tried to convince its critics that it really was concerned in the aftermath of Dr. King's assassination.

Charles Morgan Jr., an Atlanta attorney who heads the Southern region of the American Civil Liberties Union, called for Director Hoover to remove himself from the King investigation because of his remarks in

#### TRADITIONAL TENSIONS

And as the traditional tensions between the civil rights movement and the F.B.I. were worsening in the wake of the King assassination, tensions were building within the Justice Department as well.

Hoover's relationship with his boss, the Attorney General, has long been the source of sardonic humor within the Justice Department.

There is the story that shortly after his appoint-ment to head the Justice Department under Eisenhower, William P. Rodgers was stopped by a building guard at the entrance.

"I'm the new Attorney General," he said.

"If you were J. Edgar Hoover himself I couldn't let you in without a pass," the guard replied.

With the exception of Robert Kennedy, when his brother was President, no Attorney General has suc-ceeded in forcing Hoover to be responsive to his wishes. Instead the 73-year-old director goes over or around his immediate boss and reports directly to the Presiin Congress.

Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark has maintained fairly good relations with the FBI. He is less bothered than some predecessors by the autonomous fiefdom, and has cooperated rather than competed for the power to rule it.

Thus some agents were dismayed when Clark, within 24 hours of the King assassination, told a Memphis news conference:

"The investigation so far gives rise to my very strong hopes that the solution can be quickly found.

"We've had some good breaks. We have put all available resources of the PPL into the case."

it appeared that Clark was both commandeering the investigation and embarrassing the investigators by promising quick results.

But if FBI agents were embarrassed and pained, no-body was moreso than Ramsey Clark. For he was reading to the press a statement written for him by one of the highest authorities in the FBI. That it turned out to be blindly over optimistic is a source of irritation for all concerned.

It is unclear just why the FBI was so anxious to forecast victory in the King case. One obvious possibility is the embarrassing history of the relationship between King and Hoover, between agents and civil rights leaders.

Another theory is that President Johnson directed Hoover to do whatever possible to calm the residents of the nations tense ghettoes, which erupted shortly before, and after Clark's statement.

In any case, Hoover and his top aides did think they would be able to wrap the case up quickly, based on the leads in their possession that night.

They had a name and a basic description of the suspect and his car. They had a rifle with latent fingerprints from it and from the telescopic sight on it. They had a pair of binoculars with more fingerprints. And the basic as a sample of the suspect's handwriting.

In the suspect signed when he checked into the flophouse across from Room 306 in the Lorraine Motel, where Dr. King had checked in a few hours earlier.

It is clear the FBI thought John Willard was a psychotic, a racist who had committed a crime of passion. Before long they would match the fingerprints, locate the store that sold the rifle to the man who owned the fingerprints, and go and collect John Willard from some backwater in the South.

They knew John Willard was probably an alias, but that would be a small problem.

It soon became obvious that whatever his motives, the killer had not acted spontaneously, out of passion.

Before long there were four names in the case, all used by the lone killer, according to the FBI.

John Willard signed the register at the flop house.

Harvey Lowmyer purchased the Remington 30.06 Gamemaster allegedly used in the assassination.

Eric Starve Galt purchased the getaway car and apparently stalked Dr. King from Atlanta to Memphis in the white Mustang.

And all three of these read, the FBI is certain, are James Earl Ray, a two-bit thief who was a three-time loser on the run from the law for breaking out of Missouri State Penitentiary at Jefferson City on Apr. 23, 1967.

#### PLENTY OF MONEY

Why does a penny-ante thief turn assassin? Where did he get the sums of cash, perhaps \$5000, that he spent in the months after his escape on dancing lessons, a bartender's course, a \$2000 car, camera equipment and an expensive, highly accurate and powerful game-hunting weapon that retails for \$140 and is a far cry from the crude, surplus mail order weapon allegedly used by Lee Harvey Oswald to assassinate John F. Kennedy?

None of these questions has been answered, although the FBI has meticulously traced the movements and the actions of Eric Starve Galt, James Earl Ray from the moment he turned up in Birmingh am Ala. Six months after the prison break and rented a safety deposit box at a bank there.

They have pictures of him, witnesses who rode in his car with him, a Mexican girl who slept with him, and a trail that leads from Canada to Mexico across several

They even have a theory about the pseudohym Eric Starve Galt. One analyst suggested it might be the combination of two fictional characters, John Galt, the elusive character of Ayn Rand's novel, "Atlantis Shrugged," a rather deep speculation of the future decline of America; the Ernst Stavro Blofeld, the villian of three James Bond novels, including "Thunderball" of cinema fame.

What the FBI cannot show is any progress in the past few weeks. Since the identity and background of Galt-Ray was established, there has been nothing.

Meanwhile agents who have infiltrated the black radical movement report discussions of "avenging" the death of Dr. King as Summer nears.

And the same kind of conspiracy theory that poisoned the well of American politics after the Kennedy assassination is building in the pres-

#### NOT KNOWN KILLER

Critics point to the fact that James Earl Ray was poor all his life, and not a very successful theif by his record of imprisonments. Yet Eric Starvo Galt was well-heeled and well-dressed, a big spender whose car had in it a map of Atlanta with the home and the church of Dr. King circled on it.

James Earl Ray would never be described as a professional killer. This would be his first known murder. Yet he allegedly checked

into a flop house, locked himself in a public bathroom for half an hour (refusing to answer when an hearder, Willie Anchutz, knocked), and square off a single round that killed his prey.

And as he trotted down the hall toward the exit, Willie Anchutz remarked, "That sounded like a chot."

And this calm killer answered, "It was a shot." Then he escaped and within 24 hours had dropped so completely out of sight that the FBI admits to no knowledge of his whereabouts.

Pressure is building. Both the New York Times and the Los Angeles Times have edi-

torialized against the FBI's handling of the case. The London Times said that "more and more Americans are becoming convinced that the crime which set the United States ablaze will remain a mystery forever... there has been little or no criticism of the FBI's failure to apprehend the assassin for so many days, and possibly — who knows — giving him time to prepare to take another victim."

J. Edgar Hoover is very much at the center of this pressure. When John F. Kennedy was elected President, Hoover was such a household god in this country that he was one of the first men to be publicly re-

tained in the administration.

Today few observers here question that he would be one of the first men dropped if Robert Kennedy was elected.

Eugene McCarthy has publicly called for the 73-year-old director's dismissal and declared that his agency should be made "an instrument of government instead of an independent operation."

The other candidates are less unfriendly to the revered director who has run the agency for 44 years. But a household god he is no longer, and a lack of success with this big case could bring him down

She advised that Mr. MAX WINOGRAD, Attorney, was appointed trustee by the court in regard to this bankruptcy.

She advised that the sale of the company's assets took place on April 22 and April 23, 1963. She advised that the Ametek Company, Incorporated of South Portland, Maine, purchased all assets of the Pantex Company. She advised that she has no information relative to the whereabouts of a number of Thermo-Seal Textile Marking Machine Units bearing Serial Numbers 32146, 32151, 31992, 31430, 31437, 31331 or 31656. She advised that it would appear to her that Ametek would have a record of the whereabouts of these machines inasmuch as they purchased all of them that were in the possession of the Pantex Company.

She suggested that possibly Mr. MANUEL OLIVER of Eastern Van Lines in Tiverton, Rhode Island, may possibly be able to furnish further information in regard to the missing items.

On May 17, 1968, Mr. MANUEL OLIVER, Assistant Comptroller, Eastern Van Lines, Tiverton, Rhode Island, advised that upon liquidation of the assets of the Pantex Manufacturing Corporation he was at that time the Chief Accountant for the company. He stated that upon the closing of the concern he worked for Ametek Company, Incorporated of South Portland, Maine, as their Chief Accountant. He stated that in regard to the sale of the assets of the Pantex Manufacturing Company, all of them, including the good will of the company, was purchased by Ametek during the sale on April 22 and 23, 1963.
