
HOADIEY said that just as a matter of conversation while talking with LEDWELL on 4/17/68, concerning the dexatrene, he happened to think that he had read in the newspapers about GALT being a merchant seaman and for this reason remarked to LEDWELL, "Do you know the man who killed KING?". He said LEDWELL stated he did not know GALT but that he had written his name on a piece of paper which he had in his billfold. GALT then located this piece of paper. HOADLEY made available a zerox copy of this note which is as follows:


HOADLEY said IEDWELL had in his possession two other small pieces of paper which contained the telephone number 632-6224 of the FBI Resident Agency Office at Cheyenne, Wyoming and the maneyxxxxxxx telephone number 222-5981 and address of the Denver Office of the FBI and "COBLE SA".

HOADLEY advised that in his opinion IEDWELL is definitely a mental case. He said that while talking with LEDWELL he remarked that he could hear a motor running and that it was "causing pressure on him from all sides". He said LEDWELL said he also had some "ideas on how to drill a hole through the center of the marth", and when asked to explain these remarks LEDWELL became angry and upset and said he did not care to discuss it further. He also said LEDWELL would eat his meals and then ask for the dexadrene rather than taking it before eating to curb his appetite.

Hoadley also made available a photo of Ledwell made by Faramic PD on 4/18/68. On 4/18/68, PAUL HAMLEN LEDWELL was interviewed at the Laramie, Wyoming PD. He said he is a jockey and ordinary Merchant Seaman Lifeboatman by profession and has spent a lot time breaking thoroughbred horses. He said he applied for and obtained a new Merchant Marine ID card at San Francisco on 2/23/68. He said his last sea voyage was from 11/64, to 5/65.

LEDWELL said he uses a good deal of dexadrene to keep his weight down since he is a jobkey. LEDWELL appeared extremely nervous and when asked questions he would appear not to understand the meaning of the question and when he would answer, his answers either did not tolate to the questions asked or he was non-specific generally. He denied having ever been committed to any mental institution but admitted he had been picked up on other occasions in connection with alleged narcotic violations, however on each occasion it was because he was using dexadrene.

LETWELL said he was in the county jail at Las Vegas, Nevada for about two months from July to September 1967, and thereafter worked for about two months for LEE THOMISON, Tueson, Arizona, breaking horses, and lived on THOMISON's ranch. He said that since about December 1967, he has either been in jail or slept outside in his bedroll except except for what time he stayed at the residence of BURT CLARK, 29 Coleridge Street, San Francisco, California in March 1968, and eleven days which he worked for FRANK HILL, rancher at Saratoga, Wyoming subsequent to leaving Saratoga on 4/15/68, and hitchhiking to Laramie, Wyoming. He said he has had no other regular employment, having worked for a day or two in several Frestaurants in Nevada, and California and Arizona just to obtain some money to buy meals and dexadrene.

LEDWELL said he has read in the newspapers where BRIC STARVO GALT was a suspect in the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, Jr., and that GALT was supposed to have been a former merchant seaman. He said that upon his arrival in Laramie on 4/15/68, from Saratoga, Wyoming he wrote the name of GALT analytims on a piece of paper which he retained in his billfold. He said he quite often writes down names and FBI office numbers when he sees a name in newspapers in which the FBI has an interest, and later drops these notes, sometimes signing his name to them, in trash cans in Federal Building trash cans and hopes the FBI will find them. He remarked, XIX "I'll bet they just ignore my codes". He explained that what appears to be "F. B. I. "on the piece of paper made available by Detective HOADLEY is not really "F.B.I." but is "F.3.I.", and that the "B." only looks like a "B." because he extended the "I" in the word "entered" down through the "B." as part of his private code. LEDWELL said he never heard of CALT until he saw the name in the newspapers recently, has never seen a picture of GALT, and knows nothing about him. He further stated he has been only in the States of Arizona, Utah, Nevada, California, and Wyoming during the past two years. He said he was last at Littleton, Colorado in the summer of 1964, and at that time he was acquainted with IVAN THOMAS, General Manager, Centennial Race Track, and he planned to contact THOMAS when he gets out of jail at Laramie to see if he can go to work in the Littleton area breaking horses and possibly getting his weight down so he can work as a jockey. He said he was barred from the Sunland Park Race Track at El Paso, Texas during the racing season 1962-1963. He said that in the summer of 1966 he was self-employed maxing breaking horses around Craig, Colorado.

In view of the obvious poor mental condition of LEDWELL and no indication he knows GALT no additional investigation being conducted and information obtained from Laramie PD and GALT are submitted for information of the file.

The telephone directories for the cities of Georgetown, Central City, and Idaho Springs, Colorado, also failed to reveal GALT, LOWMEYER or LOWMYER living in these cities.

-A man who made at least one mysterious trip in recent months to New Orleans, a fact VIEW DISPUTED which appears to be of great interest to the FBI.

-A steady drinker, alternately moody and contentious in public.

This picture came into focus the result of a series exclusive interviews conducted by the Los Angeles Times with persons who knew Galt when he lived here.

A songwriter whom Galt drove to New Orleans and back in a white Mustang in the two-day trip to New Or-December said he had a strong leans. impression that the suspect was not using his right name.

The statement was made by Charles Stein, 38, who was offered the free ride after he agreed to add his signature to the drive by Wallace to qualify for a place on the California June primary ballot.

Robert Walters, campaign coordinator for Wallace in California, disputed this, "We checked all of our name files here - particularly those from the North Hollywood office and found nothing under the name of Galt or the other names he reportedly used,

Walters said.

Stein said that after he had registered for Wallace's American Independent party, he and Galt departed that afternoon on

Galt did not disclose why he was making the drive. He told his passenger he "knew some people there." He said he had been there before.

While passing through Texas, according to the songwriter, Galt made several long-distance calls from phone booths, but declined to discuss any of them.

Stein said Galt went to uncommon pains to impress upon him his name, emphasizing it in unnecessary ways, such as when they checked in at mo-

During the drive the suspect also remarked that he liked to hunt, Stein said.

Stein said he believes the suspect made a subsequent trip to New Orleans. "I heard he was asking people if they wanted him to drop anything off while he was down there," Stein said.

Stein said FBI agents have been visiting him almost every day, showing great interest in the suspect's activities in New Orleans.

He said, however, that he and Galt went their separate ways while in that city, and he had no idea what his companion was up to.

At the time of the trip, Galt was staying in a Los Angeles apartment. Residents there either did not know or remained tight lipped about him.

However, Galt subsequently moved to a hotel, the St. Francis, at 5533 Hollywood Blvd. One block away is a cocktail lounge known as the Rabbits Foot Club.

The crowd there remembers Eric Starvo Galt very well.

Until three or four weeks ago. according to bartender Bo Del Monte, Galt was a nightly patron.

He would come in at around 9 p.m., perch on a stool near the door and order the first of several screwdrivers (vodka and orange juice).

Adele Lewis, who was working there at the time, recalled that Galt often got into arguments when he tried to strike conversations.

"He once asked if he could Buy me a drink," she said "Since I was working, I said

Army Reject Is Suspect in Death of King

WASHINGTON -(AP) The FBI has pinpointed an ex-convict, high school dropout and Army reject as the phantom fugitive Eric Starvo Galt, target of a massive manhunt in the slaying of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The FBI said Friday a "systematic and exhaustive search" through its fingerprint files revealed Galt and 40-year-old James Earl Ray - drifter, loner, avid dancer and prison escapee - as the same man.

Armed, Dangerous

In its first positive identification of the man sought by the FBI since the April assassination of King in Memphis, Tenn, e-bureau further pictured Ray as a 40 ear-old white man in trouble with th I w since his youth — and one who "should be considered armed and extremely dangerous."

There was no indication the FBI was any closer to catching Ray than it was Wednesday when it put the name Galt on fugitive warrant charging him "and an ndividual whom he alleged to be h brother" with conspiring to deprive Kin of his civil right to travel from state to

In addition a warrant charging Galt with first-degree murder has been issued by state authorities in Memphis.

Ray fled the Missouri Penitentiary where he was serving the seventh year of a 20 year sentence for a 1959 market holdun and auto theft in St, Louis - on April 23, 1967.

Truck Used

Prison officials, who said a 1966 escape try by Ray was thwarted when he was discovered in a ventilator shaft, indicated he succeeded the next year by hiding in a truck carrying bread from the penitentiary bakery to its honor farms.

The earlier escape attempt landed Ray in a Fulton, Mo. prison hospital facility for a mental checkup.

"We gave him our Grade A, Class I workup," recalled Dr. Donald B. Peterson, hospital superintendent. "We found no mintal disease or defect within the law

At 3:45 P.M. on 4/9/68, DAVID STOLBERG, "Rocky Mountain News," telephoned and advised SA RICHARD L. CAMPBELL that he had just received a call from one ALLEN MIMS, 2610 Newport, who was calling the office from a neighbor's telephone. MIMS told STOLBERG that at 3:10 P.M. on 4/9/68, he saw a 1966 white Fairlane Ford with Georgia plates starting with the numeral 7 going north on Colorado Boulevard from 26th Avenue. He stated that the occupant resembled a sketch of KING's assassin.

A note was left at the residence of MIMS by SA ADSIT on 4/9/68, when attempts to contact him there failed. Subsequently, on 4/9/68, MIMS telephonically contacted SA ADSIT and related the following:

He stated that he was in his own car traveling north on Colorado Boulevard when he stopped at a red light at 29th Street. Two of his children were in the car with him. Alongside his car and to his right was a 1965 or 1966 two-door white Ford bearing Georgia plates starting with the numeral 7. men were in the car. The driver had long dark hair and a blue shirt. The rider he could describe only as chubby. stated that when he looked over at the car it appeared as though the chubby man was talking to the driver about MIMS and as he pulled off, the chubby man appeared to keep his eye on MIMS. He stated that after leaving the next intersection he attempted to hold back so as to lose the other car but the Ford kept abreast of him. At the intersection of 34th and Colorado Boulevard, the rider (the chubby man) appeared to reach down on the floorboard of the car and pick up something. MIMS tried at that point to turn off of Colorado Boulevard. He stated that he has not seen the car or its occupants since that time.


