PATTERSON, who diagonosed the illness as plurisy. He gave addresses of 6480 W. 5th Place, Lakewood, Colo., and 10020 W. 13th Place, Lakewood, Colo., and alleged to be a gunsmith. He was reportedly driving a 1965 Marcon Mercury Colorad lic. RY 5225. He listed next of kin, Mrs. RUTH JAMES, 1108 Hillside Ave., Norfolk, Va., mother. He sky referred to himself as "Vesse."

Numerous nurses at the hospital were contacted and none identified the I.O. OF subject of this case as being identical although several of the nurses indicated a close resemblence. ## King Suspect Fled After Visit

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo.-James Earl Ray, the suspected assassin of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King was visited in the Missouri State Penitentiary by his brother, John, a day before escaping last year, Warden Harold Swenson said

An FBI complaint filed April 17 accused Pric Starvo Galt, whom the FBI has sirice identified as Ray, of conspiring with "an

brother," to violate King's civil rights. The complaint did not name the individual.

Swenson said prison records showed it was the eighth time John Ray had visited his brother, who was serving 20 years for robbery. Reporters have been unable to locate John Ray and the FBI refuses to say anything about him.

Memphis police also have accused James Earl Ray, in the name of Galt, with murder.

Swenson said prison records show that Jerry Ray, another of the suspect's brothers, visited him five times. Two known relatives of the suspect have said he has one other living brother, Max, a teen-ager.

Meanwhile, the FBI continued a nationwide search for the suspect, who is believed to have abandoned a white Mustang in Atlanta 12 to 14 hours after the April 4 assassination of King in Memphis.

There is no report of his having been seen since early April 5 when several witnesses reported seeing a man park the Mustang and walk off.

#### Gave St. Louis Address

Prison records from 1960 listed John and Jerry Ray as residing with their grandmother, Mrs. Mary Maher in St. Louis, but an investigation showed they had not lived there for several years.

The Los Angeles Times has learned that John Ray's school records in Ewing, Mo., show he was born Feb. 14, 1933. An uncle, William E. Maher of Alton, Ill., told a Times reporter he thought John was a migrant farm worker.

John, who apparently also went by the nickname Jack, has a middle name which Maher said he thought was "William." However, Swenson said that on an application card for his prison visitor's pass John signed his name "and the middle name looks like 'Larry.' "

#### Visits Recalled

Swenson said John visited his brother at the prison once in 1962, three times in 1963, three times in 1966, and once in 1967-on April 22, the day before the escape.

He said he didn't know the significance of the last visit, "but we saw no evidence individual whom he alleged to be his that John had anything to do with the escape." Ray, who worked as a baker in the prison, was believed to have escaped by hiding in a bakery truck.

Swenson said Jerry Ray visited his brother twice in 1963 and three times in 1965. Jerry is believed to be in his mid-20s. Reporters also have been unable to locate him.

Although prison rules provide that a prisoner may see two visitors at once, neither of the brothers ever visited Ray at the same time, the warden said.

#### Eldest of 9 Children

William Maher has said that James Earl Ray is the eldest of nine children and that as far as he knows six of Ray's brothers and sisters still are living.

Cole County (Jefferson City) prosecutor Byron Kinder, who once considered prosecuting Ray for an earlier escape attempt, calls the suspect "a run-of-the-mill convict whose IQ was 105, relatively high for such a common criminal."

"He was a Catholic who didn't go to church." Kinder said. "He didn't appear to be violent and had no reputation at the penitentiary for being violent. I talked to Negro ex-con who knew him and who said that as far as he knew he was not anti-Negro."



THE CRIMES: Ray escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, on April 23, 1967, while serving a 20-year sentence for armed robbery and operating a motor vehicle without the owner's permission. He subsequently allegedly conspired, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, to violate the civil rights of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., shot to death on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel on April 4, 1968.

THE CRIMINAL: A 40-year-old white native of Illinois, who is known as a "loner" and "drifter" and has taken elaborate steps to establish a false identity, Ray has an extensive criminal record, including convictions for burglary, robbery and forging U.S. Postal Money Orders. 



Ray has been the subject of a massive and intensive search since the brutal gunshot slaying of Dr. King on April 4, 1968, as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tennessee, motel. One rifle bullet, believed fired from the window of a nearby rooming house, felled the victim.

An exhaustive FBI fingerprint search, comparing latent fingerprints uncovered in the Dr. King case against fingerprints of over 53,000 persons on whom wanted notices have been posted in the FBI's Identification Division, succeeded in determining that Galt and Ray are identical.

A Federal warrant, issued at Birmingham, Alabama, on April 17, 1968, charges Ray, under the alias Eric Starvo Galt, with conspiring to interfere with a Constitutional Right of a United States citizen. Ray is also sought for unlawful interstate flight to avoid confinement after conviction for armed robbery, based on a Federal warrant issued on July 20, 1967, at Jefferson City, Missouri. He had been confined at the Missouri State Penitentiary, Jefferson City, Missouri, in March, 1960, with a 20-year sentence following conviction for armed robbery and operating a motor vehicle without permission of the owner. In September, 1966, while serving the sentence, he was confined for a time in the maximum security ward at the State Hospital, Fulton, Missouri. He was reported missing from the Missouri State Penitentiary since April 23, 1967.

Ray, who has an arrest record dating back to 1949 and has been convicted of burglary, armed robbery and forging United States Postal Money Orders, has also been confined in the Los Angeles County Jail, the Joliet and Pontiac, Illinois, State Prisons and the United States Penitentiary, Leavenworth, Kansas.

He served in the Army between February, 1946, and December, 1948, received a three-month sentence at hard labor for being drunk and breaking arrest and was given a General Discharge due to ineptness and lack of adaptability for military service.

Ray is a 40-year-old white male, reportedly born in Illinois on He is approximately 5'10" inches tall, weighs from 163 to 174 pounds, has blue eyes and brown hair which he has worn cut short. He has a small scar on the center of his forehead and a scar on the palm of his right hand. He has been described as having a straight, narrow nose and straight and even teeth and to have a nervous habit of occasionally tugging at an ear lobe. His left ear protrudes noticeably.

Acquaintances describe him as a 'loner' and 'drifter' whose language and diction reflect a 'rural' quality and indicate he has had limited education.

He is reportedly a fan of western and country music, drinks vodka and beer, dresses neatly and claims past employment as a merchant seaman and cook on Mississippi River vessels. He is known to have worked as a baker, laborer and color matcher.

He is known as an avid dancer who has taken dancing lessons. He also completed a course at a school of bartending in the Los Angeles area early in 1968.

Ray should be considered armed and extremely dangerous.

## Mixup Reported In Fingerprints Of King Suspect

ATLANTA, April 25 — (UPI) — The Georgia Bureau of Investigation Thursday said fingerprints it received from the FBI supposedly belonging to James Earl Ray, accused slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., were different from prints received from the Missouri State Prison.

Both the FBI and Missouri prison officials immediately replied there had been a mixup in the prints the prison had sent out almost a year ago, and the FBI prints were correct.

Harold R. Swanson, warden of the Missouri State prison, said Kansas City police discovered the mistake almost

immediately and that corrected prints were distributed. He said the Georgia bureau should have long ago received a corrected set of prints.

Maj. Barney Ragsdale, head of the FBI, said the discrepancy in the prints was discovered in a routine check.

"Evidently most every department in the country has an incorrect set, Ragsdale said. He said Georgia had not received a correction from Missouri.

Meanwhile, it was revealed in Hong Kong that the FBI has launched an international search for information on the whereabouts of Ray. The U.S. consul general issued a statement saying the FBI has asked assistance in "giving the fullest possible publicity" to information on the ex-convict suspect. A consulate spokesman said similar requests were made through U.S. diplomatic missions in a number of countries.
