

No Censorship Now!

The search for Eric Starvo Galt, or James r Earl Ray, or whatever his name may be, ac-# cused slayer of Martin Luther King, continues across the nation, and quite likely around the globe.

The continuing search, which makes Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark's early prediction of imminent capture look as bad as former Secretary of Defense McNamara's 1966 forecast of early victory in Vietnam, and the attendant news stories must make the American Bar Association and the censorship-eager Reardon Committee turn back flips.

After all as the chase goes on more and more background comes out on Galt (or what's his name) and more and more material is piled up to indicate that he indeed shot the Negro civil rights leader.

At first the Federal Bureau of Investigation apparently tried to hew to the Reardon Committee's rules of keeping everything secret. But as the hot hunt became cold potatoes, the FBI changed its tactics and turned to the news media in an effort to speed the capture of Galt.

It unveiled a photo of Galt or Ray, escaped Missouri convict. The bureau also trotted out a description of the man, and his past as far as the FBI could piece it together.

Perhaps the FBI intentions at first were good, for no doubt it and the State of Tennessee fear any conviction will be overturned in the ramifications and technicalities of court mumbo-jumbo. But since their first efforts withered, the press was called in so the entire nation could join the search.

Of course we know how it will turn out.

If Galt is found, and goes to trial, his defense attorneys will claim undue publicity denies him a fair trail, that newspaper stories so poisoned the air that he can't get an impartial jury, that he must get a change of venue (possibly to lower Siberia), and that he really isn't guilty because his great-grandfather was a slave owner and private in the Confederate army and that this feeling of guilt warped the man's mind.

The lawyers will whack the press for the publicity and accuse it of denying the suspect a fair trial, and if he is convicted over these objections, no doubt the Supreme Court will gnash its teeth at the press and order a new trial because of the publicity.

Martin Luther King's killer may eventually be convicted, but before it is over the news media will be flayed, and the ABA Reardon Committee will see therein more
