



At 6:31 P.M., SA INGRAM arrived at his residence, at which time it was learned through news media that MARTIN LUTHER KING had been shot at Memphis. a little after 6:00 P.M., and was in critical condition. It was later determined that he had died in a local hospital in Memphis. The Jackson Office was contacted and instructions were given to immediately contact all Senior RA's, and each SRA would immediately account for their bombing suspects and subjects having a propensity for violence.

SA PUDDISTER was contacted and he stated he would handle the list of bombing suspects and Agents to whom assigned would be immediately contacted, and those Agents would account for their suspects.

SA FITZ PATRICK was contacted and was dispatched to the office to handle the racial intelligence, as well as assist PUDDISTER in the assassination case. Selected Agents were advised to immediately contact their informants, Klan and Negro. Immediate investigation was instituted in this matter.

- April 4, 1968, at 7:55pm SA PUDDISTER received telephone call at residence from Desk #4 with instructions to assure each bombing suspect case agent verifies whereabouts of possible bombing suspects handled by Jackson assigned agents.
- At 9:26pm. On duty at office. Verified that each SRA contacted with instructions to verify whereabouts of possible bombing suspects in RA territory.
- 9:51pm. SRA PROCTOR advised that six Meridian SAs on duty and had JOE DANIEL HAWKINS under close surveillance in Meridian. Individual with HAWKINS identified as WILLIAM PICKEL.
- 10:15pm. All major bombing suspects accounted for except CHARLES GREENE. See memo of SA PRICE. 4/5/68.
- SA ROY MC DANIEL with M.B. Pierce at Jackson PD. Special detail Jackson PD on duty Lynch Street. THOMPSON'S TANK being moved into area on Lynch Street near Jackson State College.
- 11:13pm SA RABIDEAU reported MHSP at Rust College dispersed a group of about twenty students on Hway 78 near the college engaged in rock throwing at passing vehicles. Incident occurred between 8:30pm and 9:00pm, 4/4/68. Twenty Six MHSP men standing by plus county and city law enforcement. No further incidents.
- 11:14pm SA JACK WILSON reported all quiet at Alcorn A & M.
- 11:25pm SRA JOHN PROCTOR reported JOE DANIEL HAWKINS and Bill PICKEL arrested in Meridian by PD for driving on one way street. Two guns in HAWKINS red Chevrolet. Both fingerprinted and released to appear in traffic court. Guns retained by PD. PROCTOR to get SN and description of weapons.
- 11:30pm SA VAN NOTE reported minor disturbance at Mississippi Valley State College, Itta Bena. About 300 students, broken windows. All quiet at present. Campus officials handled. MHSP standing by.

SAC JENSON contacted with info and he advised that LEVIN and HERDER have been eliminated and info should be forwarded to Memphis via airtel.

1:11am SA SAMMON reported in response to Miami teletype that he had located and interviewed BOB McGOWAN. This info was furnished via telephone to SA JOSEPH HESTER, Memphis at 1:43am. SA SAMMON dictated a teletype with this information to Bureau and Memphis under 157-new "Assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. - RM." Teletype sent 2:19am, 4/5/68.

2:28am SA EUGENE G. DOUGLASS at Memphis telephonically advised that JOHN WILLARD aka JOHN HUBEART (HUBERT) WILLARD identified as possible suspect was known to have obtained a room across street from assassination site. Present whereabouts unknown. Memphis PD arrest records disclose WILLARD arrested by PD in Memphis in 1958 on a charge of arson. He was released to the Pontotoc Sheriff's Office. Described as W/M, age 20 yrs in 1958, 5'll", 152 lbs. Parents listed as ENNIS And MAMIE WILLARD of Nesbit, Mississippi. SA DOUGLASS said FBI Memphis and PD enroute to Nesbit, Miss., as it is located just acres line from Memphis. Requested Jackson contact SO Pontotoc for details and background.

- 2:34am no answer at Pontotoc SO.
- 2:37am SA JOHN CASTLES advised. He will contact SO for background.

2:41am telephone call from SIM WARE, student at Miss Valley State College. Said he would like to be contacted at the Athletic Dormitory of the college in the morning. Upon inquiry he said he heard that four students had been shot. (No report of such from MHSP.) WARE admitted he did not see the shooting.

4:11am SAC MOORE called. Said he just received call from Bureau Supv DICK LONG who furnished info to SAC re WILLARD.

On 4/5/68, Mrs. JOAN EDWARDS, Secretary, Credit Bureau of Tupelo, Miss., advised that her records reveal that in January of 1964, inquiry was made concerning a JOHN M. WILHARD, 2929 Bogan Drive, Tupelo, Miss., for Universal C.I.T. Her records revealed at that time WILHARD was employed by FRED STRANGE Motor Co. in Tupelo.

On 4/5/68, FRED STRANGE, Owner, Fred Strange Motor Co., Inc., 811 Varsity Drive, Tupelo, Miss., advised that his records reveal that JOHN MILBURN WILLARD, white male, who was born 5'4", 110 pounds, black hair, brown eyes, was employed by him as a mechanic on 9/6/63, and left of his own volition 3/5/64. His last residence was 2929 Bogan Street, Tupelo, Miss.

Mr. STRANGE said prior to working for him WILL ARD worked for Sowers Motors, Inc., Rolla, Missouri; Druitt Motors, Sedalia, Missouri; Kinder Motors, Poplar Bluff, Missouri.





CHARLES ROBERT GREENE was contacted at his place of employment, McPH4IL'S Gulf Service Station, West Capitol Street and Ellis Avenue, at which time he advised that during the period 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM on April 4, 1968, he was working at his place of employment.

GREENE advised that he had no information whatsoever concerning the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. He said he is a firm believer in segregation of the races, but he does not believe in violence in any form.

GREENE stated that he attends meetings of the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race, but that he does not belong to the Klan, and never has been affiliated with this organization. GREENE said that regardless of what people may say about him he has no inclination whatsoever toward violence, and that he cannot help what people may say about him. He said he likes to shoot a rifle, and that sometimes he goes out in the country and practices, but that this is only for his own pleasure and recreation.

GREENE advised that his permanent address, and his mailing address is 69 Ragsdale Street, Hazlehurst, Mississippi, but that he only spends a night occasionally at this address. He said he does not actually live at 2882 Terry Road, but frequently visits at this address, which is the home of Mrs. ERLINE HOMARD, his ex-sister-in-law. GREENE stated that actually he does not have an address at which he regularly stays, and that sometimes he spends the night at the home of his ex-mother-in-law in Crystal Springs, and other times he spends the night with one or another of his women friends. GREENE declined to furnish the names and addresses of his women friends, but at one did mention the name of HAZEL. He subsequently said he was referring to Hazlehurst, Mississippi.

GREENE stated that if information concerning an act of violence should come to his attention he would feel it his duty to furnish the information to the FBI.

Source advised that COPELAND was seen by the source's wife at approximately 7:00 P.M., driving down McDowell Road, and was not seen again all evening by the source.

On this date, Source's wife advised that she had just spoken to COPELAND's wife, and the wife claimed that she and COPELAND were at a revival meeting at a Pentacostal Church somewhere off of Terry Road, returning home at approximately 1 A.M. this date.





A march occurred in Greenwood, Miss., Broad Street Playground to Courthouse, a memorial for Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. It was attended by approximately 500 individuals and was led by the local clergy, the Rev. JOHNSON, Rev. KIMBALL, and Rev. WALKER, and a Father NATHANIEL. There was a meeting consisting of prayers and singing and the meeting at the courthouse lasted for 31 minutes, from 2:35 p.m. to 3:06 p.m., and afterwards the group proceeded peacefully and orderly to Broad Street and dispersed. No arrests and no disturbances.


CHARLES ROBERT GREENE was contacted at his place of employment, McPHAIL'S Gulf Service Station, West Capitol Street and Ellis Avenue, at which time he advised that during the period 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM on April 4, 1968, he was working at his place of employment.

GREENE advised that he had no information whatsoever concerning the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. He said he is a firm believer in segregation of the races, but he does not believe in violence in any form.

GREENE stated that he attends meetings of the Americans for the Preservation of the White Race, but that he does not belong to the Klan, and never has been affiliated with this organization. GREENE said that regardless of what people may say about him he has no inclination whatsoever toward violence, and that he cannot help what people may say about him. He said he likes to shoot a rifle, and that sometimes he goes out in the country and practices, but that this is only for his own pleasure and recreation.

GREENE advised that his permanent address, and his mailing address is 69 Ragsdale Street, Hazlehurst, Mississippi, but that he only spends a night occasionally at this address. He said he does not actually live at 2882 Terry Road, but frequently visits at this address, which is the home of Mrs. ERLINE HOWARD, his ex-sister-in-law. GREENE stated that actually he does not have an address at which he regularly stays, and that sometimes he spends the night at the home of his ex-mother-in-law in Crystal Springs, and other times he spends the night with one or another of his women friends. GREENE declined to furnish the names and addresses of his women friends, but at one was referring to Hazel. He subsequently said he was referring to Hazelehurst, Mississippi.

GREENE stated that if information concerning an act of violence should come to his attention he would feel it his duty to furnish the information to the FBI.

The writer talked with HOLLAND RED" HILTON at his residence at 7:50 pm on the night of 4-4-68 to determine his whereabouts at 6 PM on this date. He advised that he has been ill and had been in bed from late in the afternoon until the writer's contact.

KINARD HEMSARLING, Siwell Road, also of Jackson was telephonically contacted at 7:55 pm. He stated he had left the Clarion Ledger after getting of? from work after 5 pm and come to his home, done chores, had dinner and had not been away from his residence.

(SIMMONS SHELTON of the Clarion Ledger, brother in law of the writer, advised that he saw HEMSARLING in the business office of the paper after 3 pm on this date, has been searching for a photograph of HIMSARLING at the paper and in his personal party pictures but had not locate one to date. He reiterated that based on his having known HENSARLING for years, having ridden home with him on a number of occasion, and his above average intelligence, he still finds it hard to believe that MENSARLING is a klansman.)

In connection with HILTON, information was received earlier in the week that HILTON in addition to having recently had a heart attack, has terminal cancer, returned to work for a few hours a day this past Monday 4-1-68, and is in very ppor health.

On 4/5/68, Mr. TOM C. ROBBINS, Director of the Highway Commission, Room 711, State Office Building, Jackson, Miss., advised SA SAMUEL N. JENNINGS that WILLIAM T. PICKEL, employed by the State Highway Department at the State Office Building in Jackson, was present in the building between 4:00 P.M., and 5:00 P.M., on April 4, 1968. Mr. ROBBINS said he personally verified this through fellow workers of PICKEL, a Mr. LITTLE and a Mr. CANTEBERRY.

Mr. ROBBINS advised that he had recently been contacted by Governor JOHN BELL WILLIAMS regarding WILLIAM T. PICKEL, and the Governor indicated that the FBI had information on PICKEL which might cause him to be considered undesirable for continued employment by the State of Mississippi. Mr. ROBBINS requested that he be contacted on April 8, 1968, for an appointment, so that he could obtain whatever information was available concerning PICKEL.

A separate memorandum has been prepared verifying that WILLIAM T. PICKEL was arrested at Meridian, Miss., on a traffic charge during the evening of April 4, 1968.



AT MERIDIAN. MISSISSIPPI

On 4/4/68, JOE DANIEL HAWKINS and WILLIAM T. PICKEL were observed traveling in a 1962 two-door red Chevrolet bearing Hinds County license H-21640, arrived at BILL GORDOM's Barber Shop, Minth Street and between 21st and 22nd Avenues, Meridian. Miss., at 8:15 PM. Both PICKEL and HAWKIMS were observed by the writer attending a National States Rights Party Meeting in BILL GORDON's Barber Shop, and having guest speaker J. B. STONER. This meeting broke up at 10:15 PM and HAWKIMS and PICKEL departed the barber shop at approximately 10:22 PM. entered their car, and drove approximately three blocks onto a one-way street the wrong way where they were arrested by two Detectives from the Meridian PD. They were charged with traveling the wrong way on a one way street and two pistols were located in their automobile (not concealed). They were released by the Meridian PD shortly before midnight and departed the Meridian area toward Jackson, Miss.

At 9:56 A.M., this date, Dr. GILBERT R. MASON, Biloxi, Miss., who is head of the NAACP in the Biloxi area, telephonically contacted SA LEON ROSS GRABEN at the Gulfport, Mississippi, RA, and advised that approximately three minutes prior to his call, he had received an anonymous telephone call from a female who asked if he was Dr. MASON, and after he replied that he was, the female told him he would be interested in telephone number 772-9332, Brownsville, Tennessee. Dr. MASON stated that based on the female's voice, he was unable to determine whether or not the caller was a white or Negro female, and when he attempted to make inquiry with the caller, she hung up.

Dr. MASON stated he was furnishing this information to the FBI for their information, and any action deemed appropriate.

The following investigation was conducted on 4/5/68 at Columbus, Mississippi, by SA's BRENT W. WARBERG and LAWRENCE W. GORMAN:

TOMMY HARROLSON, manager and owner, G and H Liggett Rexall Drugstore, gave the following information:

HARROLSON stated that cash-register receipts for cash purchases made in his drugstore are automatically dated by the cash register. He stated that each cash-register receipt carries the title

G & H Rexall Drug Columbus, Miss.

Following this heading is the date of the purchase and below the date of the purchase is the amount of the purchase.

He stated that each cash-register receipt has a number; however, these numbers are immaterial to the business of his store. He stated when the numbers reach a level which he thinks is high he flips a switch on the cash register and the numbers start over. Therefore, the numbers mean nothing and no information concerning the accounting procedures of the store is filed by these numbers.

HARROLSON continued that the only other tickets handled by his drugstore are charge tickets, which carry the name G. & H. Liggett Rexall Drugstore, Columbus, Miss. He stated that the date has to be written in by a clerk and the numbers on these receipts go only to 50.

HARROLSON stated that his drugstore does put price tags on some articles. He stated that these price tags are labeled Liggett Rexall, and then the price of the article is written on the price tag and the price tag is put on the article.

He stated sacks in which merchandise is placed do not carry the name of his drugstore. He stated the only other label used by his drugstore is the label which is put on prescriptions and these contain the name G & H Rexall Drugs, Columbus, Mississippi; however, these are not placed on toilet articles.

HARROLSON continued that Liggett Rexall Drugs is a chain operation throughout the South. He stated his drugstore is the only Liggett Rexall Drugs in the state of Mississipi; however, other Liggett Drugs are predominant in Alabama, Georgia, and Florida.

HARROLSON was given a description of the unknown subject, and he stated he could not recall having sold any Head and Shoulders shampoo or Palmolive Rapid Shave to any individual answering this description.

SONNY SMITH, clerk, G & H Liggett Rexall Drug Company, stated he could not recall selling any articles to an individual answering the description of the unknown subject.

A female clerk is also employed in this store; however, she was presently at lunch and she will be contacted when she arrives back at the store.

ROBERT A. MC PHERSON, Mississippi Wholesale Hardware, Columbus, Miss., stated that he knew of no Compage or Rompage Hardware in and around the area of Columbus. He stated the only way he would be able to check something like this would be through Dun and Bradstreet and even at that he would have to have the name of a city.
