On 4/10/68 LATIMER advised that he had no information regarding any past or projected Klan activities in Philadelphia, Miss. He relates that the newely appointed Chief of Police, BOBBY HOLTON, who was formerly on the Louisville PD has "cleaned house" and removed all the old members of the Philadelphia PD. HOLTON'S only appointment to date has been CECIL HEMBREE, a former deputy on the Neshoba County SO. As far as LATIMER knows HEMBREE has no present or past Klan connections. LATIMER advised that he did not know the full particulars connected with HOLTON'S appointment, but doubted that he would be given a "free rein" in running the Philadelphia PD.

LATIMER also advised that CECIL PRICE, former deputy sheriff of Neshoba County, is now employed by the Neshoba County Co-op as a truck driver.

LATIMER was unable to furnish any information regarding the following names:



He relates that he has never known anyone in Neshoba County with the above mentioned names. In addition, a composite description was furnished to LATIMER pertinent to the MURKIN matter and he was unable to recall any Klan figure, past or present, from within Neshoba County who might possibly possess similar physical characteristics.

LATIMER was again contacted on 4/16/68 and related that he had no information regarding the identity of the persons responsible for the burning of the Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church in Meridian, Miss., which occurred on Easter Sunday morning April 14, 1968. He advised he would be alert for any information he might hear and immediately advise the FBI.

On 4/18/68 LATIMER was advised of the conditions regarding travel restrictions imposed on SAM BOWERS, Imperial Wizard, WKKKKOM, before USC in Hattiesburg, Miss. LATIMER states that should he observe BOWERS in Neshoba County, Miss. he would immediately contact the handling Agent.

LATIMER was asked to comment on the general tenor of the present racial situation in Neshoba County and he advised that he personally felt that conditions have gradually improved during the past two years. By way of explanation he states that Negroes are now employed on city maintenance crews and that jobs are plentiful in the area if an individual is desirous of working. LATIMER, in conclusion, stated that he could not foresee any great problems arising in the near future.

LATIMER advised on 4/18/68 that he knew of no one in Neshoba County possessing the last name GALT and knew no one by the name of ERIC STARVO GALT.

LACK OF UKA ACTIVITY, NESHOBA COUNTY

On 3/5/68 source related that he was not initiating any new attempts to reactivate the Klan in Philadelphia. He states that his efforts to date have met with unsuccessful results and he has not succeeded in recruiting anyone into the Klan since being instructed to do so by JAMES THORNTON, Province Titan, UKA. Source related that NORMAN STEVENS recently has had contact with THORTON and he has expressed a desire to reassociate with the UKA. However, according to the source, THORNTON did not encourage STEVENS in his desire to reassociate. The source related that there is no UKA activity in Philadelpia, Miss. and that all the former members have not indicated any desire to reassociate.

MISCELLANEOUS:

On 3/18/68 the source was contacted regarding any knowledge he may possess concerning the recent rash of church burnings in Meridian, Miss. At the time of the contact the source related that he had heard of no Klan talk regarding these burnings through his contacts with Klansmen within the Philadelphia and Meridian areas of Miss.

On 4/2/68 the source related that the City of Philadelphia had appointed a new chief of police and had gone to Winston County to recruit him. He identified the Chief of Police as (FNU) HOLTON and stated that he had no indication that HOLTON had any Klan connections in Winston County.

On 4/17/68 the source advised that he had no information regarding one ERIC STARVO GALT, HARVEY LOWMEYER, or HARVEY LOWMYER or JOHN WILLARD as having been residents of Neshoba County, Miss. or ever having been a member of Neshoba Klavern, UKA. The source was furnished with a composite description of a white male, and advised that he knew of no one with Klan affiliations who might possess similar physical characteristics.

The source was also advised of the recent travel restrictions placed against SAM BOWERS at Hattiesburg, Miss. and the source related that he would immediately advise the FBI should he observe BOWERS presence in Neshoba County, Miss.

APWR, JONES COUNTY, MISS., MEETING, 3/26/68:

On 3/30/68, information was received that the Jones County Chapter of the APWR held a meeting on 3/26/68 at the Marion Motor Court, U. S. Highway 11 South, of Laurel, Miss. There were 22 adults and one minor present. The following were observed in attendance at this meeting:

DEAVOURS NIX SYBIL NIX RALPH and LUCILLE STRICKLAND Mr. and Mrs. CHEVIS ODOM Mr. and Mrs. RUBY SESSUM (Father of CECIL SESSUM) MARY SESSUM (Wife of CECIL SESSUM) and her son JAMES and LUCILLE YOUNT SAM BOWERS Mrs. J. D. STEWART BENTON BROADHEAD ANDRE HENDRY Mrs. FRANK LYONS Reverend GEORGE MILES Mrs. TRAVIS BUCKLEY Mr. ELMER HENDRY HOMER SULLIVAN Mr. and Mrs. LAWRENCE BYRD

During the meeting, SAM BOWERS gave a talk about the operation of the APWR and about the trials of CECIL SESSUM in Hattiesburg, Miss., in connection with the firebomb slaying of VERNON FERDINAND DAHMER, SR. BOWERS said that all the people in Forrest County knew about CECIL SESSUM being beaten by the FBI. BOWERS commented that SESSUM had done a lot for freedom and advancement of the white race.

A motion was made that the chapter buy a shotgun to be raffled off to raise money for the attorneys in connection with the future trials at Hattiesburg. This was voted into effect and DEAVOURS NIX was instructed to have 10,000 tickets

printed. The tickets will be sold for \$1 each and the drawing will be on April 30, 1968.

DABURN; BILLY ROY PITTS; SPEED LIGHTSEY:

On 3/30/68, information was recieved that SPEED LIGHTSEY, former EC, Unit #1, WKKKKOM, Jones County, Miss., was overheard talking with another individual, believed to be a member of the Klan, about the DAHMER case. LIGHTSEY said that BILLY ROY PITTS was given a new Plymouth and \$25,000 by the FBI to testify in the case. He said he was also given \$1600 to send LAURA WELBORN to California while he was in jail.

LIGHTSEY said that BILLY ROY PITTS' father said that PITTS was mentally retarded and did not have any sense.

OKKKK, GEORGE POORE, JR., "SONNY" COOLEY, BIRL, HINTON:

On 3/30/68, information was received that early that date, GEORGE POORE and SONNY COOLEY, were observed talking with BIRL HINTON at John's Cafe. POORE was overheard telling HINTON that he and COOLEY had been to a rally of the old OKKKK on 3/29/68. POORE said that they had been granted a charter for Jones County and had openings for three officers and were trying to talk HINTON into taking the job of investigator. POORE was overheard to state that ERNEST GILBERT, Grand Dragon, State of Miss., and the lady dragon, not identified, would be in Laurel in a few days for the purpose of further organization. Source stated that HINTON did not appear too interested at the time but was heard telling POCKE and COOLEY that he would be in touch with them later.

APWR, JONES COUNTY, MISS., CHAPTER, MEETING, APRIL 2, 1968:

On 4/4/68, information was received that on 4/2/68, a meeting of the Jones County Chapter of the APWR was held at Marion Motor Court on U. S. Highway 11, South of Laurel. There were 26 adults and four children present at this meeting. The following were recognized as being present at this meeting:

DEAVOURS and SYBIL NIX Mr. and Mrs. GEORGE NIX Mr. and Mrs. RUBY SESSUM CECIL SESSUM's son RALPH and LUCILLE STRICKLAND JAMES and BUDDY YOUNT and their two children Mr. and Mrs. CHEVIS ODOM and their little boy Mrs. LESTER THORNTON, wife of LESTER THORNTON, who is in jail SAM BOWERS Reverend GEORGE MILES HOMER SULLIVAN SONNY COOLEY GEORGE POORE ANDRE HENDRY Mrs. TRAVIS BUCKLEY BENTON BROADHEAD

During this meeting, it was announced that a 12 gauge Winchester shotgun had been purchased for \$115 to be raffled off for the purpose of raising funds for attorney fees in connection with the trials at Hattiesburg, Miss.

BOWERS reported that he had a board made to hold the gun and it had cost \$15. It was also reported that 10,000 tickets had been received and the cost was \$108.50.

During the meeting, the hat was passed and \$16.50 was collected. Source reported that the tickets are to be sold for \$1 each and the drawing is to be on the 30th of April.

TRAVIS BUCKLEY; CARL FORD; BILLY ROY PITTS; ROY STRICKLAND:

ON 4/4/68, information was received that during the meeting of the APWR, on 4/2/68, that the wife of TRAVIS BUCKLEY had reported that CARL FORD and ERCY QUINN, attorneys for the Klan, had played a tape of a conversation reported to be that of BILLY ROY PITTS, ROY STRICKLAND, and JACK WATKINS, for the judge in Jackson County, Miss. Based on this tape, the judge has indicated he may grant BUCKLEY a new trial.

DEAVOURX NIX said that the judge is asking for a transcript of the Forrest County trials as he has read in the paper about the money PITTS said he had received after testifying in Jackson County. NIX said that PITTS testified he had not been paid anything in Jackson County, but the judge, after reviewing the transcript, may want to charge PITTS with perjury.

Information was received that plans are underway to play this tape for the membership of the APWR on the 19th of April.

BENTON BROADHEAD has arranged for five rallies in the next five weeks. The first, on 4/9/68, is to be at the Robinson Skating Rink at Tucker's Crossing, Highway 15 South.

SAM BOWERS; SPEED LIGHTSEY, BIRL HINTON, V. L. LEE:

On 4/4/68, it was learned that on 4/3/68, SPEED LIGHTSEY was observed talking with an individual later identified as BIRL HINTON and SAM BOWERS. LIGHTSEY was heard asking BOWERS what he thought about the report that the Black Nationalists would be taking over the South. BOWERS said that in his opinion when the riots got bad up North, the conservatives like EVERETT DIRKSON would be ready to to give the Negroes the five states they are asking for just like the Communists planned it. BOWERS stated that if we stop them it will not be legally.

After BOWERS left, LIGHTSEY was overheard telling HINTON that he figured V. L. LEE was responsible for burning the houses of HINTON's father. LIGHTSEY indicated that it was not planned by the WKKKKOM or he (LIGHTSEY) would have known about it. There were some other conversations, but the source was unable to determine the nature of the conversation.

MURKIN; SAM BOWERS:

On 4/4/68, SAM BOWERS was observed in John's Cafe, Laurel, Miss., around 8:00 p.m., talking with another individual, later identified as BIRL HINTON. Source overheard HINTON asking BOWERS what he thought about MARTIN LUTHER KING being shot, and BOWERS remarked that it was a bad time for it to have happened. BOWERS commented that he would not have shot KING at this time. BOWERS was also heard to make the statement that the "Feds" may have done it to put the heat on the Klan.

APWR, JONES COUNTY CHAPTER MEETING, 4/9/68:

On 4/13/68, information was received that on 4/9/68 a meeting of the Jones County Chapter of the APWR was held at Robinson's Skating Rink, Tucker's Crossing, Highway 15 South of Laurel, Miss. There were about 85 people present. The following were recognized in attendance at the meeting:

DEAVOURS NIX talked about the shotgun raffle and reported that SONNY COOLEY has sold 116 tickets already.

He suggested that everybody get busy on the ticket sales.

BOWERS talked about Negroes, Jews, and Communists, and how they would eventually take over this state if the APWR and other organizations did not do something about it.

ROY CAMPBELL had a book of the John Birch Society and read portions of this book, which pointed out how the "Feds" will take over this country by taking away our guns and everything that we could use to protect ourselves with.

The next meeting was to be held at Sandersville, Miss., on 4/16/68.



This is to insure that the Bureau will be immediately notified if the subject is arrested or comes to the attention of authorities with whom stops placed.

Offices covering departure or arrival of overseas flights should have renewed stops, and subject's photograph should be displayed appropriately.

All offices should conduct appropriate investigation at all "hippie" rooming houses and similar establishments to obtain any information whatsoever concerning RAY.







MONROE FOSTER, Owner, Foster Beverage Company, West Main Street, Tupelo, Mississippi, advised that on March 20, 1968, he received a shipment of Schlitz Beer from the Schlitz Brewery, Long View, Texas. He stated that he received 840 cases of Hi-cone six packs, packed 24 cans to the case, and 336 cases of 24 cans each packed loose. Mr.FOSTER stated that a check of his inventory reflects that all of this beer which was brewed with a date, March 15, 1968, has been distributed to his customers, and he is now working on beer that was brewed March 20, 1968.

HUBERT TOMLINSON, Service Beverage Company, Holly Springs, Mississippi, was located and interviewed at his place of business. TOMLINSON was advised the identity of the interviewing Agents.

TOMLINSON stated that he is a distributor for the Service Beverage Company of Clarksdale, Mississippi, and in conjunction with this employment, he distributes Schlitz Beer in Marshall County, Mississippi, and a protion of the De Soto County, Mississippi area.

TOMLINSON advised that it would have been impossible for him to have distributed any Schlitz Beer in Marshall Countyror De Soto County before the date March 15, 1968. TOMLINSON explained that the last shipment of Schlitz Beer he received, twelve and sixteen ounce cans, bore the date of March 8, 1968. He pointed out that he has not received any shipment of Schlitz beer with the cans of beer bearing a date subsequent to March 8, 1968.

TOMLINSON stated that any Schlitz beer purchased in De Soto County and bearing a date of March 15, 1968, would have had to be distributed by the Service Beverage Company in Clarksdale, Mississippi.

The following investigation was conducted by SA RICHARD T. RABIDEAU and SA JOHN DENNIS MILLER on April 15, 1968:

EDDIE FIORETTI, owner and operator, Corner Package Store, Holly Springs, Mississippi, advised that his package store is the only package store located on the north side of the Square of Holly Springs, Mississippi.

FIORETTI advised that he was working in his place of business on the day that MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was killed in Memphis, Tennessee. He advised that he could not state one way or the other whether or not anyone meeting the description of TOM NELSON DAVIS made a purchase in his store. He advised that his failure to recall the existence or nonexistence of such a fact is due to the volume of business which his store does.

FIORETTI emphasized that he did not desire to have his remarks interpreted as meaning that the individual in question did or did not enter his store on the day of the slaying.

He concluded by stating that a Negro male, BAILEY VANDERBILT, was in the store talking to him for a great portion of the afternoon of the KING slaying.

On April 15, 1968, BAILEY VANDERBILT advised he could not state whether or not any particular individual made liquor purchases at EDDIE FIORETTI's store on the Square in Holly Springs, Mississippi. He explained that he pays little if any attention to the customers who enter the store.

On April 15, 1968, WILLARD KUYRKENDOLL, manager, Billups Gas Station, Highway 78, Red Banks, Mississippi,

advised that on the day of the KING slaying, he was not working.

On April 15, 1968, PAUL CREDDLE, employee of the above mentioned Billups Gas Station, advised that he was working on the day of the KING slaying. CREDDLE stated that on that day at approximately 4:00 or 5:00 P.M., TOM DAVIS arrived at the station driving a late model white Ford Mustang. CREDDLE stated that DAVIS, who was traveling alone, paid a \$3.00 gas bill and left the station on Highway 78, headed in a northerly direction.

CREDDLE stated he is certain that DAVIS was traveling alone. He continued that he observed no guns in DAVIS' car. He also advised that DAVIS had been drinking but was not "drunk".

He concluded by advising that in the brief conversation he had with DAVIS no mention was made of KING's presence in Memphis, Tennessee.

The following investigation was conducted by SA PETER H. CROOKS:

On April 16, 1968, Mrs. VIOLA FINCH, Manager, City Cleaners, 806 Main Street, Moss Point, Mississippi, advised the writer that she had been contacted by an agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in connection with the type of laundry mark employed by the laundry. She advised that at this time, the agent had asked her if she was acquainted with the name GAULT. She advised that at the time, she did not recall ever hearing this name before; however, she has since recalled one incident where she may have seen this name.

She stated that a white male, whom she described as in his early 30's, height 5' 11", weight 140-145 pounds, build slim, complexion very red, had come into the City Cleaners on April 4, 5, 8, or 9, 1968, and left one pair of jockey shorts, one T-shirt, and an unknown number of shirts to be cleaned to be picked up the following day. She advised that this individual gave the name of ERIC/GOFF. She advised that in the band of the jockey shorts and on the back of the collar of the T-shirt, in letters approximately 1/8 of an inch in height, she had noticed the initial E plus one more unrecalled initial and the name GALT She advised that this individual picked up his shirts on the following day and she has never seen him in the City Cleaners prior to this occasion or following it / She advised that no laundry records are kept at the City Cleaners. She advised that MARTHA BALLENGÉR was present at the time this individual JN 157-9586 2

was in the City Cleaners establishment; however, Mrs. BALLENGER was not available today.

On April 17, 1968, Mrs. MARTHA BALLENGER, employee, City Cleaners, 806 Main Street, Moss Point, Mississippi, advised the interviewing agent that she never actually saw the individual that left some clothing to be laundered at the City Cleaners on a date which she recalled as the 8th or 9th of April. She advised that she was at this time working in the shirt section and recalled Mrs. FINCH making some 'remark about the discrepancy between the name given by the individual GOFF and the name appearing in the shorts and T-shirt. She advised that she herself did not see the name GOFF in the T-shirt or jockey shorts; however, she had seen the name GOFF which corresponded with the name given by the individual in the shirts which he had left. advised she could furnish no further information in connection with the shirts.

Mrs. BALLENGER and Mrs. FINCH examined the artist's conceptions of GOFF and stated that neither photo looked anything like anyone they had ever seen before.





Mr. BRELAND stated there is a notation in the record of AARON LOFTON indicating that LOFTON appeared at the registrar's office on August 22, 1967, and was given a copy of his transcript.
