The following investigation was conducted by SA ROBERT P. WOMACK on 5/1/68, at Route 1, Mount Olive, Mississippi:

Mrs. VAN SULLIVAN, Jr., Route 1, Mount Olive, Miss., advised that per husband was now back at work at Sardis, Miss. She said that she and her husband had discussed his being in Memphis, Tenn., on the day that MARTIN LUTHER KING was killed, and he told her that they drove up there (he and BILLY MC GRIFF) looking for something to do to pass the time as they could not work due to weather and ground conditions. He said after they were there for a short time, they remembered fishing and that they had their tackle with them, and they left Memphis in time to be on Sardis Lake before dark where they fished for a while.

She said that her husband was bond, his hair being as light as one of her sons, a definite blond, about 5'9" tall, and weighs about 160 lbs. She said that her husband was not a "Negro hater" and was not inclined toward violence.

The information furnished rethe march on 4/7/68 at Meridian and the fact that/some type of display of remorse did not occur, the young militants might take it upon themselves to do something on their own was furnished to the Police Department, Highway Patrol and Sheriff's Office.

### WASHINGTON SPRING PROJECT

Source stated that he had been unable to ascertain the identities of any persons who plan to participate in the SCLC's project to travel to Washington, D.C., during April 1968. He stated that a number of the young persons in the Meridian, Miss., area had talked about attending this project, however, he does not believe any of them will have funds enough to participate in the project.

### MURKIN

On 4/4/68 source stated that there was a considerable amount of unrest in the Negro area of Meridian on this date. He stated that the young people in the 35th Avenue Negro area were doing a "lot of talk" but that to his knowledge no organization for violence had occurred. Source stated that several churches in the area had called special services in memory of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, and that he felt this might be an avenue to release the animosity built up against the white people and the person who was responsible for KING's Source stated that a number of young Negro males had gathered at the Taco Hut and had planned to start acts of violence in retaliation for Dr. KING's death. Source stated he attempted to talk them out of these acts, however, he did not know whether or not he was effective in this regard.

On 4/5/68 source advised that Negro leaders in the Meridian area were planning a memorial march on Sunday, 4/7/68. He stated that the Negroes felt this was necessary since considerable pressure had been brought to bear on them from young militants. Source added that restaurant owners in the Negro areas of Meridian were closing their doors early each evening in order to preclude a location for young militants to gather. Source stated that he had no information regarding any organized violence, however, a number of isolated incidents had occurred in the Negro area, such as rock throwing and the like.

# RACIAL CONDITIONS MERIDIAN, MISS.

On 4/5/68 source reported a number of incidents in potential trouble spots in the 35th Avenue area of Meridian, Miss. Information furnished by source was immediately furnished the Meridian Police Department and no large groups of Negroes were allowed to form. Source stated that there did not appear to be any organized groups of individuals contemplating any acts of violence.

On 4/7/68 source advised that a meeting would be held at the First Union Baptist Church in Meridian, Miss., at 1:30 P.M. followed by a march down 7th Street to the City Hall where memorial services for Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING would be held on the steps on the City Hall. Source stated that this march would be led by Negro leaders and ministers. Source stated that the Negro leaders felt that some type of display of remorse should occur and that if not the young militants might take it upon themselves to do something on their own. Source stated there would be approximately 1,000 persons participating in this march and to his knowledge no planned acts of violence would occur in connection with same.

# VISIT OF ROY WILKINS TO MERIDIAN, MISS., 5/5/68

On 4/24/68 source advised that ROY WILKINS, Executive Director, NAACP, New York, New York, would speak at the First Union Baptist Church, Meridian, Miss., on 5/5/68. He stated that local Negro leaders had requested WILKINS to visit Meridian since Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING did not visit Meridian, when he was last in the State of Mississippi. Source stated that to his knowledge there would be no marches or demonstrations in connection with WILKINS' visit.

### NATIONAL STATES RIGHTS PARTY

Source stated that on 4/4/68 a meeting of the National States Rights Party was held in a barbor shop in downtown Meridian, Miss. He stated that a

number of Negro citizens had noticed a large flag with a streak of lightning in the middle of it hanging as a backdrop for a speaker in this barbor shop. Source stated he could furnish no further information concerning this meeting, other than the fact that there appeared to be about twelve or fourteen persons in attendance.

### CUBS

Source stated that he had been unable to ascertain any information concerning the Congress for the Unity of Black Students (CUBS), Shaw University, Raleigh, North Carolina, Source did state that he had learned from several local youths that there was some talk about persons from the Meridian area going to Jackson for a series of training seminars. Source stated he did not know where these seminars might be held, but presumed they might be held on the campus of Alcorn College. He further related that he did not know what these seminars might pertain to, however, they are to be held during the early summer of 1968.

POSSIBLE VIOLENCE MAJOR URBAN AREAS (LAUDERDALE COUNTY

During March and April, 1968, source has devised that while there was some racial unrest due to the assasination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, he has been unable to determine any organized possible racial agitation. Source has advised that Payne's Restaurant, a Negro owned and operated restaurant in the 35th Avenue area, is a "hot spot" and that a number of young people hang out in this area. He added that he knows of no other "hot spot" and believes that the operator of Payne's Restaurant is selling whiskey to teenagers.

On 4/22/68, source stated he had recently conversed with JAMES SANDERS, brother of BOBBY SANDERS, and he advised that BOBBY was currently residing in Houma, La., and was reportedly still working for an off-shore oil drilling company. Source stated that JAMES SANDERS advised BOBBY had married his former spouse about two years ago while in Houma and had divorced her within the past several months. SANDERS also reportedly lived with the daughter of his former spouse for about two weeks after they separated. Source advised he had also talked to TONY SANDERS, brother of BOBBY, about BOBBY's whereabouts, and he also had indicated BOBBY was supposed to be living in Houma, La. Source stated that TONY advised him that the FBI was reportedly looking for BOBBY in connection with draft dodging.

Source also stated that Mrs. AUSTIN (MINNIE D.) SANDERS, stepmother of BOBBY SANDERS, whose husband is deceased, told him that BOBBY was last known to be living in Houma, La. Source related that in talking with JAMES, TONY and MINNIE SANDERS, they all advised that BOBBY did not stop to see them when he was supposedly in Scott County within the past few weeks.

Source stated he determined from MINNIE SANDERS that she has a daughter, MAE CROTWELL, or CROUTWELL, whose

husband, (FNU), delivers boats for a boat factory in Delhi, La. Source stated she is a stepsister of BOBBY SANDERS but MINNIE SANDERS did not believe BOBBY is in contact with her.

On 5/1/68, source advised he determined that BOBBY SANDERS resides on Williams St., Houma, La., and is currently working for an off-shore oil well drilling company located in Houma, name unknown.





#### ROBERT COPELAND HICKSON

Source advised that BOB HICKSON was heard to remark on March 22, 1968, that he, HICKSON, had been approached by the old original Klan to join them but that he he had not felt he could do so without getting into trouble. HICKSON stated there had been no meetings to his knowledge but if help was needed by anyone, he would be able to get a force out. Source advised he felt that it was the typical HICKSON talk and there was no unit in the Sandersville, Mississippi, area.

### VICK WEST - MARVIN TALLEY - LEONARD CAVES

Source advised that VICK WEST was heard to remark on March 26, 1968, that nobody was doing anything and that he, WEST, was just going to stay away from any Klan meeting.

MARVIN TALLEY was heard to remark on March 28, 1968, that he was strictly through with the Klan and he never wanted to attend another meeting. LEONARD CAVES was also heard to remark on March 28, 1968, he was no longer interested in the Klan.

Laurel, Mississippi April 5, 1968

## MURKIN

Source advised that he had no information regarding the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., at Memphis, Tennessee.

Laurel, Mississippi April 18, 1968

### NORMAN LEE

Source advised that NORMAN LEE was heard to remark on April 10, 1968, that he was trying to get some ammunition back which he had given to an individual several months ago. LEE stated he did not know if any meetings of the Klan were being held. LEE also stated that BILLY HAPER, Highway Patrol Investigator, told him on April 10, 1968, that the Negro situation would have to stopped by the citizens standing up and wanting the trouble stopped. LEE also remarked that A. C. KNIGHT, Superintendent of Education, Jones County, Mississippi, is trying to get him a job.

Source advised that NORMAN LEE had been trying to get a position on the Mississippi Highway Patrol but had been told that C. R. LANDRUP did the investigation of men applying and that LEE knew it would not do him any good to apply for the job.

Laurel, Mississippi April 26, 1968

## ROBERT E. RIVERS

Source advised that ROBERT E. RIVERS had quit his job at Laurel Paint and Glass in Laurel, Mississippi, and was going into the chicken business at his home in Shady Grove, Mississippi. Source advised that he had gone to RIVERS' home in April, 1968, but that RIVERS was not there.

### VICK WEST -- LEONARD CAVES -- NORMAN LEE -- V. L. LEE

Source advised that he had talked with VICK WEST and that WEST stated everything was quiet. WEST was heard to remark that they will never catch the killer of MARTIN LUTHER KING and he believed the CIA had him killed.

Source advised that LEONARD CAVES still has no interest in re-activating the Klan in Jones County, Mississippi.

Source advised he had talked to NORMAN LEE on several more occasions and that LEE feels the Klan will build back up. LEE stated that some "boy" is going to contact him about a meeting and he would let the source know and they would "get some of the boys together."

On April 17, 1968, V. L. LEE, brother of NORMAN LEE, was heard to remark that they did not have anything on him for the Masonite murder for which he and ANDRA HENDRY have been charged.

Laurel, Mississippi May 1, 1968

### NORMAN LEE

Source advised he had talked to NORMAN LEE on several more occasions and that LEE is interested in starting meetings. It was also reported that NORMAN LEE had a chance at a job but had to have a high school diploma. LEE reportedly took a college GED test at Ellisville, Mississippi, at Jones County Junior College.

### AARON JERNIGAN

Source advised that AARON JERNIGAN was heard to remark on April 24, 1968, that everything was quiet as far as the WKKKKOM in Jones County, Mississippi, was concerned in the Ellisville, Mississippi, area. JERNIGAN stated he hoped to get something started before long but he could not find much interest from the people.

#### JERRY SMITH

JERRY SMITH, member of the Laurel, Mississippi, Police Department, was heard to remark in April, 1968, that the Klan would probably get strong in Jones County, Mississippi, again. SMITH stated he did not think any of the members were meeting at this time but seemed to know quite a bit about the members and their identities.
