

APWR, HINDS COUNTY CHAPTER

APWR met as usual on Tuesday night, 9/17/68, at Byrd's Truck Stop, and the following were in attendance:

ROY and JO CAMPBELL
Dr. and Mrs. E. A. COPELAND
PAT and NELL THOMAS
Mr. and Mrs. SIDNEY BARNES
GUS BOBBITT
JOE DENVER HAWKINS
Mrs. EVELYN MORGAN, Secretary
BILL PICKEL

HARRY KELLEY, JOHNNIE HAWKINS, and L. E. MATTHEWS were noticeably absent from the meeting, and they were apparently having some type of private meeting concerning JOE DANIEL HAWKINS' bond and trial for bank robbery in Memphis, Tennessee.

Most of the meeting was taken up about funds for the HAWKINS family.

Mr. BARNES has apparently moved to Jackson from Mobile, Alabama, and he gave the closing prayer, with the last few sentences or words being in some language other than English, which source could not understand. Source pointed out that Mrs. BARNES usually gives the closing prayer, and the last few words are in Latin source believes. He noted that neither Mr. or Mrs. BARNES put an Amen on the end of the prayer.

Jackson, Mississippi 9/20/68

Source advised that he had conferred with L. E. MATTHEWS on 9/19/68. Apparently there was something on local television about the jury in the Dr. MEYER's abortion case being possibly tampered with and it was being called back in session. MATTHEWS indicated he was quite concerned about this jury being called back and questioned about JOE DANIEL HAWKINS' trial in the Blackwell Bombing and the jury in the possession of explosives trial of J. L. HARPER. He indicated that at least one or two on the HARPER trial were depended upon to render a hung jury, and that one for sure on DANNY's trial knew that he would have to bring about a hung jury, this being the only chance for keeping HAWKINS out of jail.

Jackson, Mississippi 9/20/68

MINUTEMEN

Source advised that he had been in contact with L. E. MATTHEWS on 9/19/68 at which time he indicated that a high official in the Minutemen had been in Meridian, Mississippi, either Saturday or Sunday, and conferred with THOMAS ALBERT TARRANTS, III. MATTHEWS inferred that this official had contacted SAM BOWERS, Mr. SIDNEY BARNES, and L. E. MATTHEWS.

Source asked MATTHEWS a direct question, "Did you see him," whereupon MATTHEWS stated, "I may have."

Source pointed out that MATTHEWS made a trip last Friday, 9/13/68 for the weekend, but source would not know MATTHEWS' travels until his credit card tickets came in. Source further indicated that MATTHEWS, who usually confides in him, has been most secretive about the trip last weekend.

Source continued that this official had assured THOMAS ALBERT TARRANTS, III, that TARRANTS had nothing to worry about in his prosecution at Meridian, as the Minutemen Organization and funds were behind him.

MURKIN

Source stated that he had never heard of the following individuals being mentioned in Klan or APWR circles:

JAMES L. HINES HERMAN H. GRIFFIN, JR. BERNIE CRAMPTON

JOE DANIEL HAWKINS BANK ROBBERY TRIAL

Source reiterated that the main topic of conversation at the APWR meeting was the efforts to free HAWKINS on bond for the two weeks remaining before his trial. Source reported it had come to his attention that L. E. MATTHEWS, the Imperial Wizard of the WKKKKOM, summoned to his residence on the night of 9/18/68, ELAINE SMITH PEEBLES. For hours he attempted to pressure her into putting up \$25,000 cash toward the bond of HAWKINS. Source stated that ELAINE put up all types of excuses as to why she could not; such as her funds were tied up to prevent this type of thing, secondly that she could not draw from her account at Deposit Guaranty National Bank without the okay of her attorney, and various other excuses.

SMITH pointed out that JOHNNIE and CATHY HAWKINS were dressing in new clothes in exceptionally good taste these days, and further that CATHY is permitted to keep her gross receipts at the Downtown Coiffeurs, and that she can easily make and take home \$70 per day.

It was pointed out by one of these persons that over \$5,000 had been made, cleared, and turned over to the HAWKINSes from the sale of the GEORGE and LURLINE WALLACE Magazine.

At one point, ELAINE SMITH PEEBLES made a tenative offer to put up \$25,000 of her money on the condition that JOHNNIE HAWKINS would let her hold the \$20,000 plus taken from the Memphis Bank as security for ELAINE's part. MATTHEWS indicated that JOHNNIE HAWKINS might doe this and generally inferred that he, MATTHEWS, had been in on the planning of the robbery and there was no doubt but what JOE DANIEL HAWKINS had robbed the bank with the knowledge of JOE DENVER and L. E. MATTHEWS. MATTHEWS concluded by stating that PERCY QUINN was sitting in a motel in Memphis waiting on ELAINE SMITH PEEBLES' decision re the \$25,000.

In connection with the trial, MATTHEWS pointed out that they have six witnesses that will prove that DANNY was in Jackson and that he could not possibly have been in Memphis at the time of the robbery. He called no names of the witnesses nor did he mention any material company or other company whose records might be subpoensed to show they had done business with money from the robbery.

Source pointed out that MATTHEWS discussed the fact that the witness that JOHNNIE HAWKINS had flown down from the Memphis bank did not go before the Grand Jury to indict DANNY. MATTHEWS made some incoherent statement about the eye witnesses, that is something said about doing something with them or words to that effect. MATTHEWS commented that the APWR is reimbursing JOHNNIE HAWKINS. JOE DENVER HAWKINS, and PERCY QUINN for any money they spend for the defense of JOE DANIEL HAWKINS. MATTHEWS indicated that Attorney PERCY QUINN has several things up his sleve that may not be quite "kosher." One of these stunts that he plans to pull involves the pistol used by HAWKINS during the robbery. QUINN has had JOE DENVER HAWKINS purchase a pistol like the one HAWKINS used. QUINN indicated that the pistol and evidence would be lying on the table in front of the Judge. QUINN will pick it up and stick it under his coat, where he will have the pistol that JOE DENVER purchased hidden. QUINN will then pull out both pistols and try to confuse the jury as to how the jurymen could identify the pistol used in the robbery. QUINN has indicated that he has several other tricks and said he would be able to pull them before the judge caught on to what he was doing and it would have already made its impression on the jury, although the judge might not allow it as evidence.

L. E. MATTHEWS, JR.

Source advised thatit had come to his attention that on the night of 9/18/68 MATTHEWS had the two same male visitors that had slipped into his back door the previous Wednesday night. Their arrival was announced by the dogs barking. MATTHEWS commented that he had visitors, and told ELAINE SMITH and his young son to stay where they were for a bit. SMITH went to the bedroom of MATTHEWS, and the boy stayed in the living room on the second level of the tri-level. MATTHEWS talked to the two men outside, they talked for awhile under the carport on the first level. Two doors were heard to close which were believed to have been the trunk and a door of MATTHEWS car. SMITH had her car parked in the rear of the house where it could not be seen by her husband or others.

During the conversation of the three men, the names "RED" BREWER, JOHN, PITTMAN, or PITTARD, DAVIS, "The Board", and SAM (BOWERS) were heard, but in what connection not clear at all. The larger of the men would raise his voice occasionally. This man is very broadshouldered. Source stated that these individuals' mode of travel is still unknown. They came up to the back door, as last week, and MATTHEWS walked them out front toward his mothers. No cars were heard to start, no lights were seen. In the period of 30 minutes after they were known to be gone, three or four cars passed on the road which is a couple hundred yards out in front of MATTHEWS' house.

It was not known by source whether or not the trip of last weekend had anything to do with these visitors.

MATTHEWS said he saw someone in a wig over the weekend but it was not a woman. Source said the younger of the men possibly could wear a woman's wig and with proper dress could pass for a woman, but added this is merely speculation.

M. C. HEMBREE, Ecra, Mississippi, former sheriff of Pontotoc County, Mississippi, advised that IONN, H. WILLARD was arrested in 1958 in Memphis, Tennessee, as a fugitive from Pontotoc County. He said the warrant was for arson and that when WILLARD was arrested in Memphis he was returned to Pontotoc County, where he pleaded guilty on the arson charge and received three years probation.

He said that part of the time while on probation WILLARD resided in Memphis, Tennessee, and the other part resided in Pontotoc County, Mississippi.

Mr. HEMBREE advised that WILLARD formerly resided in the Ecru community of Pontotoc County but now resides west of Pontotoc, Mississippi, on Highway 6 in a new home. He said WILLARD works in a factory either in Pontotoc or in a surrounding city, but he does not know the name of the factory. He said he considers WILLARD to be a person of good character and reputation and does not know of any criminal offenses for which he might have been charged since 1958.

Enclosed are two copies of a memorandum received from the Department relative to the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. The attached sets forth interview of <u>Mr. Bill Sartor</u> by Department attorney on June 12, 1968, and August 22, 1968, however, the memorandum was not furnished to us until September 23, 1968.

Memphis should completely evaluate the contents of the Departmental memorandum and submit comments and recommendations to the Bureau including what investigative aspects of the Departmental memorandum completed and indices check of Sartor. This should be handled immediately.

Jackson should immediately furnish Bureau and Memphis results of indices check concerning Sartor. Two copies of the Departmental memorandum furnished to Jackson in the event it becomes necessary for investigation to be conducted in the future.

Based upon available data, no information recorded in Bureau files concerning Bill Sartor. No interview of Sartor should be conducted until Bureau advises.
