The following investigation was conducted telephonically by Special Agent DAN O. STEPHENS at Montgomery, Alabama, on April 11, 1968:

LUCILLE CORNISH, Umemployment Compensation Benefits Division, Alabama Department of Industrial Relations, advised as follows:

They have no central name file on individuals. Their files are indexed according to Social Security Numbers. Without a number a persons record cannot be located unless the identity of his employer is known. If the latter is known, the individuals name can be checked against the employers records. If neither are known, the record for an individual cannot be located.

She was unable to locate a record for INEZ C. GALT, Social Security Number

JO ANN FARMER, Workman's Compensation Benefits Division, Alabama Department of Industrial Relations, advised that she was unable to locate a record under the name ERIC STARVO GALT for years 1966, 1967, and 1968.

JAMES M. BRADSHAW, Chief, Income Tax Division, Alabama Department of Revenue, advised that he was unable to locate a record indicating that GALT filed an income tax return for years 1966 and 1967. He stated that he has no means for determining if this individual has had income tax deducted for these years.

On 4/16/68, Mr. R. C. SMITH, Strachan Shipping Co., Merchants National Bank Building, Mobile, Ala., advised that his company is the agent for the S. S. RHINE Ore while this ship would be in the Port of Mobile. He stated that they handled crew matters, however, the payroll records are not maintained by Strachan Shipping Co. The procedure for payroll would be the owners in Germany would wire Strachan to release a certain amount of money to the captain of the ship and the captain would distribute the payroll.

On 4/16/68, THOMAS T. HERRING, Inspector, INS, Mobile, Ala., furnished an INS Vessel Index and Inspection Record for the S. S. Rimbore which reflected the activity of the ship with reference to the Port of Mobile. The card reflected the following arrival dates:

7/12/67 9/13/67 11/17/67 1/16/68 2/10/68

Mr. HERRING advised that the 1967 papers of crew processing are now on microfilm in New York City and these papers are filed by port in date order. Mr. HERRING stated that concerning the January, 1968, arrival of the S. S. RHING ore reflected the last foreign port to be Africa. She arrived with 34 crew members, no passengers and departed 1/22/68. The 2/10/68, arrival was from Venezuela carrying 32 crew members, no passengers, departing 2/15/68. Mr. HERRING stated that the time lapse between the dates would

closely estimate the travel time from Mobile to a foreign port and return. He stated that the papers are only made at the first port of arrival in the U. S. from a foreign port. Inspector HERRING advised that when the ship leaves the first port of call destined for a foreign port and stops at another American port prior to going on the high seas, a paper is prepared concerning crew and passengers reflecting any departures or arrivals on board ship and that this paper would then be forwarded to the first port of call to be filed with the original processing papers of the vessel. Inspector HERRING advised that concerning the 1/16/68, arrival and the 2/10/68, arrival, there were original port of call processing papers and departure papers which would reflect that this vessel did not stop at an American port when it left Mobile. The processing papers reflected a WERNER DREWS, German, Seaman's Book # 6317/62; occupation, greaser, aftermed on board the S. S. Rigo Ore 12/9/67, at Glasgow, Scotland. He stated that while this ship was in port for the last two voyages to Mobile, DREWS was granted shore leave both times.

On 4/17/68, Mr. FLOYD HARVEY, Mobile Public Health Service, advised that while the vessel S. S. Rime Ore was in port, 1/16-22/68, a crew member was removed with an active case of TB. He stated that as a precautionary measure, all the crew members were x-rayed, however, no quarantine was placed on the ship and the crew members had shore leave.

On 4/17/68, Mr. WILBOR ROBERTS, Norton-Lilly Co., Mobile, Ala., stated that the S. S. Rames Ore is under charter by this company. Mr. ROBERTS advised that the S. S. Rames Ore departed Mobile, 2/15/68, outbound to Freeport, Bahamas, loaded with shale. He advised the voyage would take approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ days and approximately three days to unload the cargo. The vessel then would go to Port Ortez, Venezuela, arriving there on 2/26/68, or 2/27/68. He then stated the ship

was bound for Glasgow, Scotland, and then back to Ortez, Venezuela, arriving thre approximately on 3/26/68. The vessel was then destined for Middleburg, England, with estimated time of arrival as 4/6/68, with return to Venezuela, about 4/25/68, and from there to Antwerp, Belgium, due in 5/9/68.

In view of investigation regarding ERIC STARVO GALT, the Los Angeles Office had placed ERIC STARVO GALT there on 1/18/68 and 2/20/68 and it is therefore recommended no further action be taken concerning the whereabouts of WERNER DREWS.

The driver of the car asked where SNOW mad been and he replied Tennessee. When the driver mentioned Memphis, thinking of King's assassination, \$NOW would make no further comment. It was developed by the driver that SNOW lived at 342. g or 243 Eurton Street, Mobile.

On 4/8/68 MAUREY MCDONALD, Cadet, Mobile P.D. furnished an accident report which reflected the following: On 8/2/67, JOHNNY D. SNOW, Rt. 1, Box 60, McIntosh, Ala., while employed by Rudolph Ramelli, Inc., Mobile, wrecked a company vehicle. SNOW was described as a white male, D.O.B. 7/20/45.

In addition MCDONALD furnished an accident report dated 10/3/67 which reflected JOHNNY D. SNOW, driving a Rudolph Ramelli Company truck, had an accident in Mobile. His address was listed as 342 & Burton, Mobile.

On 4/9/68, P.Q. SMITH, Office Manager, Rudolph Ramelli, Inc., 158 Michigan, Mobile, advised his company employed JOHNNY D. SNOW, until they terminated his employment on 3/12/68. SMITH advised SNOW S cousin Louis Snow, was currently an employee. 157-2627-209

On 4/9/68, LOUIS SNOW, 3242 Burton advised MAYZEL, is living with him, LOUIS SNOW at the

On 4/9/68 attempts were made to contact Mrs. JOHNNY D. SNOW, at 324 & Burton Street, Mobile, with unsuccessful results.

On 4/10/68 MAYZEL SNOW, 324 & Burton Street, Mobile, advised she is the wife of JOHNNY D. SNOW. She stated her husband was employed by Rudolph Ramelli, Inc., a janatorial company at 158 Michigan, Mobile, until he quit on 3/12/68. He was thereafter unable to obtain employment and on 3/16/68 took her and her ### infant daughter to her parents home in Altoona, Alabama, which is north of Birmingham, Ala. On 3/17/68 J.D. as she referred to her husband, returned in the company of his brother EMERSON SNOW to Mobile. She could not furnish details regarding what he did for the following two weeks, however he subsequently mentioned having worked two days in a paper mill in the Mobile area. On 4/1/68 J.D. obtained employment with his cousin BOBBY SNOW, in Lockhart, Alabama. SNOW is a log hauler and is well known at all Lockhart service stations. J.D. resides with BOBBY in Lockhart and on Saturday, 4/6/68, he hitchhiked to Mobile to visit her. On 4/7/68 he hitchhiked back to Lockhart to resumments his employment. He is to return to Mobile late Friday evening, 4/12/68 and together they plan to visit his relatives in McIntosh, Ala., the following day. J.D. is not a Klan member and has no prior arrest record according to Mrs. Snow. He quit school while in the 7th grade. He does own a saded off shotgun, however, she believes the gun is in McIntosh, Ala., at his parents home. He owns an old (year unknown) black chevrolet. She described her husband, JOHNNY D. SNOW, as follows:

JOHNNY D. SNOW

Efforts to locate JOHNNY D. SNOW at Lockhart, Alabama, on 4/11/68, by SA's RAYMOND J. MAXWELL and HOWARD R. LINSCOTT were negative.

The residence of BOBBY SNOW was located in a rural area outside of Lockhart, Alabama, and the correct mailing address for the residence would be Route 2, Laurel Hill. Florida.

A sister of BOBBY SNOW, who stated she was a cousin of JOHNNY D. SNOW, advised that BOBBY SNOW and JOHNNY D. SNOW were working in some wooded area as "loggers" and she had no idea in the world where they might be located. She stated they do not return to her residence until very late at night, and they have no particular hour to come in. She stated it would be practically impossible for anyone to find JOHNNY D. SNOW or BOBBY SNOW during the daytime, because they never know where they will be working.

BOBBY SNOW's sister stated that she would tell JOHNNY D. SNOW that the FBI wanted to talk to him and that when he returned to Mobile, Alabama, on 4/12/68, he should contact the Mobile FBI Office.

On the evening of 4/11/68, SA MAXWELL telephonically advised SA McCOY that JOHNNY D. SNOW could not be located at Lockhart and that he should be interviewed upon his return to Mobile on 4/12/68.

On 4/12/68, JOHNNY D. SNOW, Lockhart, Ala., telephonically contacted the Mobile Office. He advised he has not recently traveled in Tennessee and was only teasing and kidding with the person who had given him a ride.

SNOW stated he has been employed in Lockhart, Ala., by his cousin, BOBBY SNOW, since 4/1/68, and on 4/6/68, hitchhiked to Mobile to visit his wife, MAYZEL who currently residing with another cousin, LOUIS SNOW, at $324\frac{1}{2}$ Burton St.

SNOW stated he has never been arrested nor has he been involved with law authorities in any way.

SNOW advised he knows nothing whatsoever concerning KING's death other than what he has heard on the radio.

He advised he can be contacted through any service station in Lockhart in the event additional information is needed.

Inasmuch as SNOW does not fit the description of UNSUB, it is suggested that no further investigation be conducted concerning him.

Supervisor WILBUR MARTINDALE, Civil Rights Section, telephonically contacted this office at 2:06 p.m., 4/18/68. He said they had just received information that an individual apparently closely resembling photograph appearing in newspapers had just parked a red Ford bearing Alabama license A199990 at the University of Maryland. It was pointed out to MARTINDALE that such a license was incorrect, noting that Alabama licenses hae either one or two numbers followed by a dash and anywhere up to five additional numbers. He was informed the first two numbers may be transposed in which case it would be a Birmingham license. He said he would check further on this. It was suggested that we initiate checks under the license 1A-99990 for now while he made checks at the University of Maryland concerning the suspect car.

A check with SA STEPHENS at Montgomery determined that Alabama license 1A-99990 has not been issued as yet and the highest number they have on record is 1A-99360. This information was relayed to SAC GAMBLE, Birmingham, with the request that he contact local licensing authorities to see if 1A-99990 is a recent purchase.

At 3:50 p.m., SAC GAMBLE advised that license 1A-9990 is issued to a Ford which has a previous Maryland registration and the Bureau has been advised concerning this.


The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent EDWARD A. HEGSTETTER at Mobile, Alabama, on the indicated dates:

On April 15, 1968, Mr. DEWEY CANNON, Patrolman, National Maritime Union (NMU), 11 Canal Street, Mobile, Alabama, advised that a check of his records failed to reflect a record for RICHARD GALT, KENNETH NEWBLE, or TOBY DANCY. Mr. CANNON advised that he has been with the NMU in Mobile for twenty-two years and he is not acquainted with a seaman with the last name of GALT. He stated that the union registry records are only kept for ninety days and then are destroyed and that the records of the men who sign up for sea duty are kept for a year and then destroyed.

Mr. HAROLD FISCHER, Dispatcher, Seafarer's International Union, 1 South Lawrence Street, advised he could locate no record concerning a RICHARD GALT. Mr. FISCHER advised that KENNETH NEWBLE was a member of the union at one time. He advised that NEWBLE is a tall slender Negro, 28-30 years old, 190 pounds, 5'10"-5'11", a nice looking light complected individual. Mr. FISCHER advised he could not locate NEWBLE's record at the union. Mr. FISCHER stated that there was no record concerning TOBY DANCY, however, a TOBE DANSLEY, Negro male, was a member of the union and that he was assigned on several ships in the steward department. Mr. FISCHER stated that DANSLEY's Z number is Z1096455 and as best he can determine, DANSLEY is currently not aboard a ship. Mr. FISCHER further stated that the file of DANSLEY does not reflect a home address.

On April 15, 1968, Mr. ERNIE BURGESS, Coast Guard Seaman's Certification Office, advised that Z number 1096455 was issued to TOBE DANSLEY, JR., date of birth at Alabama, 5'9", 200 pounds, brown eyes, black hair, last known address 605 Lang Avenue, Apartment E.

On April 15, 1968, Mrs. RICHARD KING, 605 Lang Avenue, Apartment E, advised she has been living at that



address since September, 1967, and that she does not recall an individual by the name of TOBE DANSLEY having been a prior resident at that address.

On April 15, 1968, Mrs. L. TUCKER, Clerk, Albert F. Owens Homes, 758 North Cedar, advised that the prior tenant at 605 Lang Avenue, Apartment E, was LEON ENGLISH. Mrs. TUCKER stated that she recalls having visited the home at one time and that Mrs. ENGLISH's son, TOBE DANSLEY, was present. She stated that the ENGLISH family moved to 202 Mott Drive, on September 18, 1967.

On April 15, 1968, Mrs. LEON ENGLISH, 202
West Mott Drive, advised that her son, TOBE DANSLEY, is
currently at sea, however, she has no knowledge of his
present whereabouts as she has not received a letter from
him in over a month. She stated that TOBE's wife, BARBARA
JEAN DANSLEY, is currently employed at the Mobile Infirmary.

On April 15, 1968, Mrs. BARBARA JEAN DANSLEY, employee, Mobile Infirmary, stated she had last heard from her husband, TOBE, about two weeks ago. She stated that her husband had been abord the Sea Train Louisiana and that as of two weeks ago the ship was in dry dock at San Francisco. She advised that her husband had written her and told her that he was going to stay with a cousin in San Francisco and she believes the cousin bears the same last name. She stated that in all probability her husband would be seeking employment through the union in San Francisco or possibly may be going aboard the same ship when it leaves the yard in San Francisco.

On April 16, 1968, Mr. P. D. McALLISTER, Shipping Commission, United States Coast Guard Office, Mobile, advised that his records reflected the following concerning the S. S. Hudson:

There was no record of RICHARD GALT or any individual with the last name GALT being a crew member being aboard the outbound voyage.

Mr. McALLISTER stated that this ship came in December 6, 1961, and departed December 7, 1961, and that the ship picked up a load of grain at the grain elevator. Mr. McALLISTER furnished a mutual release dated February 23, 1962, for a seaman aboard the S. S. Hudson. This record reflected that the date of departure for the ship

was December 7, 1961, from Mobile and that the seaman was discharged from the ship February 10, 1962, at Port Arthur, Texas. Mr. McALLISTER stated that it did appear that the ship departed Mobile in December, 1961, and returned to the United States February, 1962, docking in Texas.

According to WILLIAMS, the article indicated in 1962 KING had been assaulted by one ROY JAMES in Birmingham, Alabama, and on another occasion in 1965, KING was again assaulted by one JAMES GEORGE ROBERTSON in Selma, Alabama.

Reverend WILLIAMS indicated he was furnishing this data for our information and it is being furnished to receiving offices for their consideration in the investigation of MURKIN.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent SPENCER H. ROBB, on April 18, 1968, at Montgomery, Alabama:

CECIL JACKSON, Executive Secretary to Former Governor GEORGE C. WALLACE, advised the Wallace for President Headquarters had received an IBM list from Los Angeles County, California, with names of all persons who registered with the American Independent Party. He stated this list was used for the mailing of literature to the registrants, but it has since been returned to Los Angeles County authorities and is not in possession of the Wallace for President Headquarters.

JACKSON advised he had viewed the photograph of ERIC S. GALT and does not recognize it as anyone who was active in the registration activity for the American Independent Party in California. JACKSON advised that he and WILLIE B. PAINTER of the State Department of Public, Safety, were both closely associated with the registration activities in California and he feels they would have recognized the photograph if this man had been active in any way.

Captain WILLIE B. PAINTER, Alabama Department of Public Safety, advised he does not recognize the photograph of GAIT as anyone he has ever seen.

JACKSON further advised that WILLIAM K. SHEARER, who was responsible for organizing the American Independent . Party in California, but who has since been removed by the Wallace for President group should be acquainted with GALT if he were active in any way in the registration campaign in California. He stated SHEARER was found by the Wallace campaign people to be incompatible with their philosophy and in fact, appeared to be and this led to his removal by the Wallace people. He stated SHEARER was an excellent organizer and has a brilliant mind and although he does not resemble GALT in any way in appearance; he feels SHEARER would be capable of plotting an incident such as the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING. PRESS RELEASE

Attorney General Ramsey Clark announced today that Eric Starvo Galt is being sought by the FBI as a fugitive on a Federal charge arising from the fatal shooting of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., in Memphis, Tennessee, on April 4, 1968.

Director J. Edgar Hoover stated that a Federal complaint was filed by the FBI in Birmingham, Alabama, today charging Galt with conspiring to violate the civil rights of Dr. King in violation of Title 18, Section 241, of the United States Code.

The FBI complaint charges that "on or about March 29, 1968, at Birmingham, Alabama, ...Eric Starvo Galt and an individual whom he alleged to be his brother, entered into a conspiracy which continued until on or about April 5, 1968, to injure, oppress, threaten, or intimidate Martin Luther King, Jr.,..in the free exercise or enjoyment of a right secured to him by the constitution or laws of the United States; namely, the right to freely travel from state to state. In furtherance of this conspiracy, Eric Starvo Galt did, on or about March 30, 1968, purchase a rifle at Birmingham,

Alabama..."

According to Mr. Hoover, a 30.06 rifle equipped with

Main Street in Memphis immediately after the fatal shooting of Dr. King occurred. The rooming house overlooks the Lorraine Hotel and Motel where Dr. King was staying.

Mr. Hoover said that FBI Agents determined that the 30.05 rifle had been purchased from a gun dealer in Birmingham, Alabama, on March 30, 1968. The telescopic sight also was purchased from this dealer.

The FBI Director said that Galt, who has used the names of John Willard and Harvey Lowmyer in the past, is the owner of a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama license plates which was located abandoned in Atlanta, Georgia, on April 11, 1968. Investigation disclosed that Galt purchased this car from a private citizen in Birmingham on August 30, 1967. The Mustang's odometer showed that it had been driven more than 19,000 miles between late August, 1967, and early April, 1968.

According to Mr. Hoover, Galt's travels in the Mustang included trips to Los Angeles, California; New Orleans, Louisiana; Birmingham, Alabama; and Mexico, as well as to Memphis, Tennessee, and Atlanta, Georgia. Galt was reported to have been in Memphis on April 3 and 4, 1968, and to have departed from there for Atlanta.

Intensive investigation by the FBI has disclosed that Galt has claimed to have been employed as a cook on Mississippi River vessels and as a Merchant Seaman. He is said to be an avid dancer and took dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964

and 1965; in Birmingham during September and October, 1967; and in Long Beach, California, from December, 1967 to February, 1968.

drove his white Mustang to New Orleans, where he claimed he contacted either an engineering or a contracting firm. He left New Orleans on December 19th and arrived back in Los Angeles on December 21, 1967.

While in the Los Angeles area early this year, Galt took a course at a school of bartending and was graduated on March 2, 1968.

The fugitive is described as white male. He is approximately 5 feet 8 inches to 5 feet 11 inches tall and weighs between 160 and 175 pounds. He is said to be a neat dresser and has a medium build.

Galt has brown hair, which he wears in a "brush" cut. He reportedly has blue eyes; his nose is straight and narrow; his teeth are straight and clean; and he has given his date of birth as July 20, 1931.

The fugitive is said to have a nervous habit of occasionally pulling at an ear lobe with his hand. His left ear protrudes farther from his head than his right ear.

According to Mr. Hoover, persons who have met Galt describe him as a "loner" and state his language and diction have a "rural" quality and suggest that he probably does not have a high degree of education. He is said to drink alcoholic

beverages and has a preference for vodka and beer. He is a fan of western and country music.

Galt should be considered armed and dangerous.

Any information concerning him should be furnished immediately to the nearest FBI Office.



She furnished four copies each of the IBM cards for these liense holders which reflects their names; most recent addresses; and descriptions.

She further advised that the folders for each of these individuals will contain the application submitted when license originally obtained and copies of all traffic citations issued to them. No other information is available.

A cursory review of these cards failed to reflect any license holder in the territory of Montgomery RA which is similar in description to GALT.

In view of foregoing, two copies each of these IBM cards are being forwarded to Mobile for final review and leads for further investigation of those of similar description.

Identical search of all expired licenses is being conducted in same manner by DLD authorities. Results will be promptly forwarded to Mobile.
