Mr. RAY stated that to his knowledge the JAMES EARL RAY being sought in connection with this KING killing is not related in any way to his family.

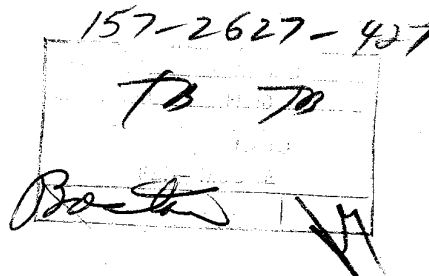

The following investigation was conducted by SAs HERBERT T. BRADSHAW and WILLIAM B. LISTON:

On May 6, 1968, Mrs. RUTH HANNEY, 601 East Adams Street, Muncie, Indiana, advised as follows:

All the information which she has furnished by letter to FBI Headquarters, Washington, D.C., was obtained by her and her daughter, Mrs. BARBARA WALLEN, St. Johns Street, at Daleville Road, Daleville, Indiana, by use of a ouija board, a device which mystically spells out words when questions are asked of it. Also, she stated that at about the time of the Pueblo incident, she began hearing signals over her television set which sounded like Morse Code being transmitted, and she thought the Russians were doing this.

Mrs. HANNEY's letter to the Bureau was orally acknowledged and she was asked not to furnish additional letters to the Bureau based on information she obtains from her ouija board.

In view of the foregoing, no further investigation should be conducted concerning information furnished by Mrs. HANNEY.

He said that he has no knowledge concerning any telephone calls received at this hospital from Orange, Texas, or any out-of-state calls in December 1967, as such calls received by the hospital are not centrally recorded. He said that he could not recall any patient at the hospital who might logically have received any telephone calls from Orange, Texas. FRIDAY advised that he checked with several clerical employees of the hospital who served at varying times on telephone duty but none could recall any long distance calls from the State of Texas.

The following investigation was conducted by SA
ROBERT D. CAMPBELL:

On May 8, 1968, Mr. CHARLES B. STEPHENS, Semmes Nursery, Semmes, Alabama, advised that he has had telephone number 342-1435 for a long time and that during the middle of December 1967, he had received a call at the Nursery from a customer by the name of PATFIELD, who called from Houston, Texas. He said that PATFIELD had a short time before gone into the nursery business and was then making most of his telephone calls from public telephones.

On May 8, 1968, WILLIAM T. HODGES, 1107 Hannon Road, Mobile, Alabama, advised that he has had telephone number 479-8740 for the past ten years. He said that he occasionally drives a truck moving furniture for Bekins Van Lines and on December 16, 1967, he was in Corpus Christi, Texas, at the residence of a sister-in-law. He recalled the date as it was his sister-in-law's birthday, and on that occasion, he called his wife in Mobile from Corpus Christi.

He said that he had not made any phone calls from Houston, Texas, to his home in Mobile at any time.

Mrs. WILLIAM T. HODGES advised that the only long distance call she received in Mobile in December 1967 was from her husband in Corpus Christi, Texas. She said that she had received no call from the Houston, Texas, area.

The Mobile telephone number 479-7378 is issued to Captain Pete's Restaurant and Lounge, Highway 90. Inquiry at the Lounge on May 8, 1968, reflected that the manager of this establishment during December 1967 was FRANCES PATRONAS, who is now located in Bel Air Apartments, Mobile.

On May 9, 1968, Mrs. FRANCES PATRONAS, Apartment 140, Bel Air Apartments, advised that she recalls receiving no telephone calls at Captain Pete's Restaurant and Lounge from the State of Texas during December 1967 and could furnish no information concerning any such calls.

MARGARET GRIFFIN and MARY WEATHERELL, waitresses at Captain Pete's Restaurant and Lounge during December 1967, were located through Mrs. PATRONAS. MARGARET GRIFFIN could recall no telephone calls from the State of Texas. MARY WEATHERELL advised she recalls a man who had been a customer at this Lounge on a number of occasions, name not recalled, and she seems to recall that this customer had received a phone call one night from a girl friend from Texas. The call she has recollection of was definitely a personal call from a girl friend. She said that this man is a traveling salesman who had been coming through Mobile on a number of occasions in the past and had frequently stopped in at this Lounge.

These persons were shown photographs of JAMES EARL RAY but could not identify any of the photographs as being similar to anyone seen by them in the past.

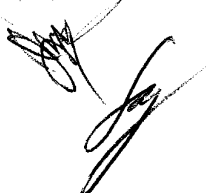

Investigation has determined that the subject, using the name of ERIC GALT, left Los Angeles, Calif., on 12/15/67, driving his Mustang automobile, in the company of CHARLES J. STEIN, of Los Angeles. STEIN had formerly been a resident of New Orleans and the alleged purpose of this trip was for STEIN to pick up two children of his sister's who were residing in New Orleans and return them to California. According to STEIN, they arrived in New Orleans on 12/17/67 and left New Orleans on 12/19/67. STEIN stayed with relatives and investigation has determined that subject registered at the Provincial Motel, 1024 Chartres Street, New Orleans, on 12/17/67 as ERIC S. GALT and was assigned room 126. The registration card indicated GALT's automobile to be a Mustang bearing Alabama license 1-38993 and his address as 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Ala. The subject, as GALT, stayed at the motel until 12/19/67 when he checked out.

Interviews of motel employees in regards to the subject have been negative in that they cannot recall him.

There is set forth under a caption for each Office the identity or identities of persons staying at the Provincial Motel from 12/17 through 19/67. The identities of these persons were obtained from the motel registration cards as well as other information which is set forth under the name. The date listed under each name is the date the individual or individuals stayed at the motel. Each Office should locate and interview these individuals for any knowledge or contact they may have had with the subject. On April 24, 1968, Mr. GEORGE AVERITT, Community Blood and Plasma Service, 166 Government Street, Mobile, Alabama, advised that his files reflect that JAMES EARL RAY had given blood at that office on March 12, 1968. The file indicated that RAY had Navy serial number 8932863, was 5'11" tall, white male, age 46, 180 pounds, had brown eyes and grey hair. His occupation was listed as welder and his residence listed as 311 May Street, Montgomery, Alabama.

Mr. AVERITT advised that he has no personal recollection of this individual giving blood and is not in a position to say whether or not the individual actually showed Navy identification at the time he gave blood.

On May 3, 1968, Mr. M. L. GRIFFIN, Vice President, Radcliff Materials Company, Mobile, Alabama, advised that JAMES E. RAY, 311 May Street, Montgomery, Alabama, had worked for his company in Mobile as a welder from February 26, 1968, through March 11, 1968, voluntarily quitting. This man was a white male, born [redacted], at Clanton, Alabama. He has Social Security Number [redacted]. RAY claimed to have served in the U. S. Navy from 1943 to 1946.

GRIFFIN advised that this individual had left this employment and had a small amount of money due him in wages which money was sent to him in care of his home address in Montgomery, Alabama. The check sent to this address was not returned to Radcliff Materials Company.

On May 3, 1968, GRIFFIN's company received a letter from this individual using a return address of Sheriff's Office, Wheatland, Wyoming, asking that money due him from his employment be sent to him in care of the Sheriff's Office at Wheatland, Wyoming.

2 New Photos Released Of Suspected Murderer

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The FBI distributed Tuesday two more photographs of the accused killer of Dr. Martin Luther King — one of them "an extremely good likeness."

Both were snapshots of James Earl Ray, alias Eric Starvo Galt, an escaped convict accused of shooting King to death in Memphis April 4.

The "extremely good likeness" is a candid photograph of Ray in a business suit and tie and shows almost his full face, taken in late January or early February somewhere in California.

The other, which the FBI said was taken last November somewhere in Mexico, shows him wearing sun glasses and what appears to be a white sports shirt. The FBI said Ray is known to wear sun glasses frequently.

The two new photographs — the FBI refused to say where or how they were obtained — will be displayed throughout the country along with three other pictures of Ray which now appear on FBI's wanted posters.

One of the earlier photographs was taken when Ray was graduated from bartending school in Los Angeles early this year. His eyes were closed when the shutter snapped, but they were sketched in by an FBI artist. The picture shows him wearing a white shirt and black bow tie.

The other two photographs were made when Ray entered the Missouri State Prison in 1960 to serve a 20-year sentence for armed robbery.

Ray, who escaped from prison April 23, 1967, by hiding in a truck, is wanted by the FBI for illegal flight to avoid prosecution, in Tennessee for King's murder.

The civil rights leader was shot to death on a motel balcony, apparently by a rifleman 200 feet away in a rooming house bathroom.

Thirteen days later the FBI announced it had issued a warrant for Galt, but after checking some 53,000 fingerprints, the FBI said two days afterwards that Galt and Ray were the same man.

Ray was added to the FBI's list of 10 most wanted criminals April 20. There have been reports of the search extending to various foreign countries, including Australia, and authorities along the U.S. borders have been alerted to watch for him.



RAY STILL SOUGHT—The Federal Bureau of Investigation released these two photographs Tuesday in Washington, identified as two additional pictures of James Earl Ray who is being sought in connection with the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. The FBI said the picture of Ray wearing dark glasses was taken in Mexico in November 1967, while the one of Ray in a business suit was made in California during the last part of 1967 or early February 1968. 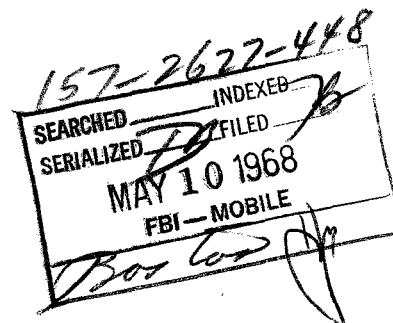
