UNITED STATES COVERNMENT - MEMORANDUM TO : ALL AGENTS FROM: SAC C. E. WEEKS EXPEDITE MATTER SUBJECT: MURKIN Re Memo all Agents April 9, 1968. THE BUREAU HAS INSTRUCTED THE FOLLOWING LEADS BE HANDLED BY ALL OFFICES. RE CONTACT WITH LAUNDRIES Among articles recovered at scene of shooting in instant case, apparently abandoned by UNSUB, were a pair of brownish, checkered print undershorts and white jockey tee shirt bearing cloth laundry tags. These tags were made by a thermo seal marking machine nanufactured by the Textile Marking Machine Co., Syracuse, New York. These tags are y wide and 1 1/16" long, red in color and bear marking which appears to be "02B-6" or "D2B-6". Only a portion of the first character is present on each tag, and this character is cut on a slight bias. No other visible laundry marks were found on either garment. The Bureau instructs that all offices immediately telephonically contact all laundries in our Division to identify laundry using this code and these tags and pursue logical leads developed. If pertinent laundry identified, immediately advise ASAC or person acting in his capacity in order that the Bureau can be telephonically advised. To quickly eliminate leads, telephonically contact these laundries and initially ask proprietor if he uses machine of Textile Marking Machine Co., in his operations. 

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



On April 11, 1968, the color photograph of the pertinent laundry marks were displayed to Mrs. JOSEPHINE MARRO, Monarch Laundry and Dry Cleaners, 149 Derby Ave., New Haven, Connecticut. Mrs. MARRO is employed as a supervisor and has been employed in the laundry business She said that her company did for thirty=seven years. not utilize the thermo machine marking machine system, but did so a number of years ago. She said that based upon her experience in the field, she would deduce the following from the laundry marks observed: The red laundry mark would indicate that the laundry involved was done as a special order - that it was a rush order. Also, since each piece of laundry was marked, this was performed as batghlor service. When laundry is done as family service, each piece is not marked. Rather, the entire lot is marked with a "swatch," which is then removed prior to delivery of the laundry.

Mrs. MARRO said that the Connecticut State Police, Hartford, Connecticut, maintains a laundry mark file, which is kept up to date on a yearly basis. She said that through use of the laundry mark file, the Connecticut State Police would be able to advise as to the identity of all laundries within the State of Connecticut which utilize the thermo machine marking system.



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
