Re Albany airtels 4/10/68 and 4/11/68, setting forth concerns who purchased Thermo-Seal marking machines, and Bureau teletype to Memphis, 4/12/68.

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.

At about 6 p.m. on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifle. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3 p.m. on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN WILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 422½ South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6 p.m. on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street, Memphis. A neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifle which was determined to have been

sold to one HARVEY LOWMEYER on 3/30/68 by Aeromarine Supply Co., Birmingham. Alabama.

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of binoculars at the York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The items abandoned in Memphis were all wrapped in this bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68 at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama License 1-38993. Investigation at Birmngham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1968, from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1995 cash. While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama. The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as his height as 5'll", his weight as 170 and his eyes blue and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68 and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9 a.m. on 4/5/68.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division.

On 4/17/68, AUSA R. MACRY TAYLOR, Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U.S. Code, and

recommended bond in the amount \$50,000. On that same date, SAC JOSEPH H. GAMBLE filed a complaint before USC MILDRED F. SPRAGUE, Birmingham, and warrant was issued that same date.

FARR, an assistant manager of Howard Shows presently operating on Orange Ave., New Haven, Conn., advised on 4/19/68 that the only owner of a white ford pickup who is attached to Howard Shows is GORDON ALLEN. FARR was shown photographs of ERIC STARVO GALT and he advised that ALLEN does not bear any resemblance to GALT, AND HE DOES NOT RECALL ever seeing anyone resembling the photographs of GALT. He advised that XXXXX Howard Shows operated at Westport, Conn., during the first two weeks in April, 1968. He stated that could personally account for the whefeabouts of ALLEN on the night of 4/4/68 because he was present in the concession being operated by ALLEN that n;ight at Westport, Conn. FARR further advised that Howard Shows has never employed anyone by the name of ERIC STARVO GALT, HARVEY LOWMEYER OR JOHN WILLARD.

GORDON ALLEN, who presently operates a chinese football game in Howard Shows, vasinterviewed on 4/19/68. He advised that he is the owner of a 1967 white Ford pickup bearing Alabama license plates 8P117510. ALLEN is 25 years old, 5"10", 175 pounds, dark bron hair and hazel eyes. On 4/19/68 Mrs. ROBERT DESJARDINS, 276 Middletown Ave., Wethersfield, Conn., telephonically advised that about 4:00pm - 4:30pm 4/18/68 she had been at McDonalds hamburger stand, Berlin Turnpike, Newington, onn., and had observed a man who looked somewhat like the picture of GALT in the newspapers. She stated that she had only seen this man for a few seconds and the only other description she could give of him was that he was wearing a sweatshirt. She did not see anyone with him nor did she see if he was in a car.

At 4:15pm 4/19/68, SA DOLAND interviewed the following individuals at MeDoanlds, all of whom advised that they had been on duty between 4:00pm - 4:30pm the day before, 4/18/68:

GARY DeSIMONO, 24 Clifford St., Newington JOHN SODERBERG, Spoonville Rd., East Granby, JAMES HUMES, Blinns, Motel, Newington ROBERT GINGRAS, 32 Hart St., New Britian.

The above individuals all advised that they had seen no on resembling the picture of ERIC STARVO GART the previous afternoon, or at any other time, and no one had mentioned to them the possibility that GALT had been at their consession. They also advise that thousands of customers come thru their establishment a day and unless somthing out of the ordinary occurs, they would not remamber any particular customer.

The following investigation was conducted by the writer and SA CLARENCE L. SMITH, JR., on 4/9/68:

Mrs. GUNTER SCHMIDT, 255 Charles Street, Bridgeport, Conn., was recontacted, and advised as follows:

At 8:30 AM on 4/6/68, she and her mother were at the Sycamore Drive-In, Bethel, Conn. They heard an individual making statements to the effect that "it was about time someone got KING." She described him as in his middle 30s, 5'll", thin build, blonde hair. She believed he fit the description of the killer of KING she heard on the radio.


Investigation at Danbury, Conn., disclosed HENRY R. MC NEASE moved from 4 Division Street to 291 Greenwood Avenue, Bethel, Conn. That address is an Atlantic Service Station, =run by MC NEASE, which was determined to be closed.

WILLIAM O'DONNELL, O'Donnell's Service Station, 51 Grassy Plain Road, Bethel (which is almost directly across an intersection from the Atlantic station) advised as follows:

He is acquainted with MC NEASE, Having spoken with him occasionally. MC NEASE is tall and thin, being at least 6' in height, and possibly as tall as 6'3". He believed MC NEESE was operating his station, which he operated along in recent past, every day of week 4/105/68.

It is possible he might have been closed one day and it could have gone unnoticed, but not more that one. MC NEASE lived in the station, and drove a yellow Pontiac convertible. He has not seen MC NEASE since Saturday morning. He believes MC NEASE packed up and left over the weekend. MC NEASE was at the station on Friday, April 5. JOEL SUTTON, 28 South Street, Bethel, formerly worked for MC NEASE at the station.

Mrs. JOEL SUTTON, 28 South Street, Bethel, advised her husband formerly worked for HENRY MC NEASE. She drives by the Atlantic station at 291 Greenwood daily, and MC NEASE was there every day from 4/1/68 to 4/5/68. He departed over weekend of 4/6-7/68, apparently without notice. She described MC NEASE as being 6'1" to 6'2" tall.

It was noted that the Sycamore Drive-In is located at 282 Greenwood Avenue, in the immediate climinated being dist 168.

MR. DANIEL GOCDELL, Manager of Railway Express Agency, Inc., (REA) 110 Brainard Rd., Hartford, Conn., advised on 4-15-68, that his records indicated that a "pick-up slip" reflected on 4-11-68 that items were to be picked up for J. SALT, 930 Asylum Ave., Hartford, # Conn.

GOODELL made available his company's receipts for the items that his various drivers had handled on 4-11-68. It was revealed that among the items picked-up and shipped out on 4-11-68, were three pieces of "Personal Effects", consigned to JENNIFER SALT, 675 West End Ave., New York, NY. The shipper's name was J. SALT, 930 Asylum Ave., Hartford.

COODELL stated that the items shipped were valued at \$500.00. and they were sent COD. The above information was contained on REA Receipt # 008524, and the driver who picked up the items was JULIUS FRANKOVITS.

In view of the fact that the name recalled by the complainant, MR. MYRON DAVIS, in referenced memorandum, was SALT and not GALT, no further investigation is recommended.
