

Reference is made to the letter to the SAC, New Haven, from one R. L. HARDING dated April 21, 1968, and bearing the return address, P. O. Box 137, New Haven, Conn.

This letter, in essence, reveals that the writer possibly had information to the effect that ERIC STARVO GALT may have resided at 366 Elm Street, New Haven, Connecticut, during approximately February or March of 1968.

A review of the current New Haven, Connecticut, City and Telephone Directories fails to reveal that R. L. HARDING is listed in those directories.

ROYCE SMITH, referred to by HARDING in his letter as a pervert and head of the Yale Co-op Book Store, is not listed in either the New Haven, Connecticut, City Directory or the current New Haven Telephone Directory.

The City Directory reveals that the occupants at 366 Elm Street include one LUCILLE KERR, telephone number 562-5235, and one BARBARA A. GILLETTE, who lives at $366\frac{1}{2}$ Elm Street, and whose telephone number is 624-4772.

On April 25, 1968, NICKOLAS CAPOBIANCO, Staff Assistant to the Assistant Postmaster, Post Office Building, New Haven, Connecticut, advised from records that Post Office Box 137 is listed to R. L. HARDING, who resides at 44 Lynwood Place in New Haven, Connecticut. The application for this Post Office Box was dated April 28, 1967.

On April 25, 1968, Mrs. ALVINA HODGE, Clerk, New Haven, Connecticut, Credit Bureau, advised that records of that bureau contained no information which could be identified with one R. L. HARDING residing at 44 Lynwood Place, New Haven.

NH 157-818 As of April 25, 1968, arrest records of the New Haven Police Department, as maintained in the Record Room, Court Street, New Haven, Connecticut, contained no information identifiable with HARDING. On April 25, 1968, observation of the vicinity of Lynwood Place and Elm Street revealed that the address 44 Lynwood Place is the basement of the apartment building located at 356 Elm Street, New Haven. This apartment building is two doors away from the address referred to by HARDING in his letter, 366 Elm Street, New Haven. On April 25, 1968, ROBERT L. HARDING was interviewed at his place of residence, 44 Lynwood Place, New Haven, Connecticut. HARDING advised that he is the custodian of the building at 356 Elm Street, and that he lives in the basement of that building. HARDING would not allow the interviewing Agent to enter his premises, but observation of his place of residence from the door revealed that he is residing in indescribable filth. In essence, HARDING stated that occasionally he checks the mail which is received at 356 Elm Street, and that early this year he observed a letter which he thought had been addressed to ERIC STARVO GALT at 366 Elm Street, New Haven. He contended that the letter was delivered to the wrong address and consequently came to the building where he serves as custodian. He could not account for the fact that he had remembered the name of GALT, even though at that time GALT had received no publicity and even though the homicide of MARTIN LUTHER KING had not occurred as yet. After furnishing this information, HARDING went into a long dissertation concerning homosexuality in the Lynwood Place area, alleging that industry, government and practically every organization in the New Haven area had been infiltrated by homosexuals. Conversation with HARDING tended to indicate that he is a person of unstable mentality and probably is mentally unsound. On April 25, 1968, Detective OTHA BUFFALOE, Vice-Squad, New Haven, Connecticut, Police Department, advised that during the recent past and as of the night of April 24, 1968, he has been conducting surveillances in the vicinity of HARDING's residence. 2025 RELEASE UNDER E.O. 14176

NH 157-818 44 Lynwood Place. New Haven, in an effort to arrest HARDING for his homosexual activities. He stated that HARDING has not been arrested for this purpose as yet, but that the Vice-Squad is attempting to do so in view of the numerous allegations concerning frequent male visitors to HARDING's place of residence. A review of New Haven Office files reveals that on April 18, 1962. (New Haven file 62-0-8385) ROBERT L. HARDING, 44 Lynwood Place. New Haven. came to the New Haven Office where he was interviewed by SA SALVATORE F. DUCIBELLA. At that time, HARDING alleged attempts by homosexuals to infiltrate the government and industry and he stated that he had been "framed" by an employee of the High Standard Corporation in Hamden, Connecticut. It was the impression of the interviewing Agent at that time that HARDING was mentally unbalanced. New Haven file number 44-18 contains information pertaining to HARDING which is undoubtedly identical with the individual in question. In the report of SA ROBERT B. HAWLEY, dated October 24, 1950, captioned: "UNKNOWN SUBJECT; ROBERT L. HARDING-VICTIM; CIVIL RIGHTS AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE." HARDING. in a document given to Judge C.C. HINCKS, U. S.
