

METHODIST Bishop Aubrev Walton of New Orleans said the death of King places "greater responsibility than ever on every individual who loves this country and who is concerned for right relationships between the peoples of the United States.

EMMITT Donglas, state NAACP president, said: "This was a terrible blow to the non-violent movement. I think this will give incentive to the more militant groups.

"This is what the young militants have been saying, Nonviolence pays of forth death.' I hope nonviolence will continue . . . but it learns very gloomy at this bour."

Douglas said he cannot predict the chance of violence in. Louisiana, but added that Baton Rouge and New Orleans are the state's two "hot

He said the NAACP will-"pursue the same course of nonviolence."

Douglas was reached by telephone at Franklin, where he was attending a meeting of Negroes to promote a selective buying program. He said the mood of those at the meeting was one of great sadness but not of violent reaction.

JOSEPH DELPIT, NAACP Baton Rouge chapter president, said, "I feel the black people will not really react to peaceful demonstrations anymore . . . black people will do anything they deem necessary for total liberation."

Asked if the assassination would cause more violence, Delpit replied, "If there wasn't already violence, Mr. King wouldn't be dead."

Negroes, he said, "certainly King's murder "a great trag-will not sit back and let this sort of thing happen to them . . . I think it will be a matter

"I FORESEE a lot of bloodshed if there is no improveviolence, to our problems are ment in Negro rights." Delpit said, however, that violence could be averted if whites now "do some soul searching" about expanding Negro rights.

"It's all in the hands of the white people," he said. Clarence "Chink" Henry,

president of Negro longshore Local 1419 here, called on all 4,000 of his union's waterfront workers to refrain from any demonstration in protest to the slaying.

"I know that our members feel this great loss very keenly and we are deeply shocked, However, I am asking all riverfront workers to heed the philosophy of Dr.

"LET THERE BE no demonstrations," Henry said.

"Let there be peace." Menry said that no work will be performed on the docks by his union today or tonight out of respect for Dr. King.

"Today, we are shocked. We are deeply hurt and we are angry. The Rev. Martin Luther King, leader of the massive March on Washington in 1963, winner of the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964 and martyr for the cause of freedom in 1968, merits our everlasting gratitude," Henry said.
HENRY SAID, "the move-

ment for human dignity in the United States cannot be stopped. The United States continued in the direction of human dignity even after the assassination of President Kennedy in 1963, and likewise the movement for human dignity must continue even after the death of Dr. King."

Mayor Victor H. Schiro said, "I pray that the perpetrators will be apprehended and punished and I hope that in the heat of emotion this terrible act will not beget more violence in Memphis or any other city.

"At a time such as this, all responsible citizens should join together to reach reasonible solutions to our problems; -- be-cencluded.

Mayor Schiro said he has canceled a trip he had planned to make for his health. "After the events of the last few hours," he said, "I decided it would be better to stand by my post."

In Washington, Sen. Russell B. Long, said, "It is a terrible and tragic thing. I hope some day we can settle our differences peaceably at the polls and control the criminal element that is not satisfied with settling things in the way our American ideals dictate."

Long, whose father, Sen. Huey P. Long, was assassinated in the Louisiana State capitol 33 years ago, said, "I know how a family feels when the head of a family is assassinated."

REP. F. EDWARD Hebert D-La. said he hoped "reasonable people will realize the situation and remain calm. This was all brought on by so-called nonviolence preaching. King preached violence under the guise of nonviolence and you have to. realize that violence begets

violence."

"This should be a lesson to avoid violence. What amazes me," Hebert said, "is that people are amazed this happened. He turned against our country on the Vietnam war and was most vicious in attacking the President.

"This incident could set off a powder keg in America on which the fuse as well as the powder was inserted by those preaching nonviolence."

At Xavier University, classes were canceled and a Mass for Dr. King was celebrated at noon by the Rev. Kilian W. Downey, O.P., the Rev. Joseph I. Reardon, O.P., the Rev. Hubert Riley, O.P., and the Rev. Roburt-Wikegas,

An ecumenical group of chaplains was planning a memorral meeting for Dr. King this afternoon at Tulane University's McAlister Auditorium.

AT DILLARD University. a memorial service opened with the school choir singing "The Battle Hymn of the Republic" to a chapel overflowing with students and adults of both races.

Earlier, university president Dr. Albert W. Dent had cancelled classes and ordered the flag flown at half-mast.

Dean of students Robert L. Polk spoke at the service and chastised students for going

about their business normally after the first stunning moments when the news was released.

"If we can't find time to reflect on what has happened today," Dean Polk said, "it may be our last opportunity. We are all involved in what happened in Memphis by our complicity. We were there. We pulled the trigger."

He said too many have been content to let others do the work for all.

TRIBLITES PLANNED

Orleans Mourns Slaying of King

A 4,000-man force of Negro longshoremen stayed away from the docks here today, memorial services were scheduled, university classes canceled and some businesses closed as the city prepared to mourn slain civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King.

The city's reaction to the slaying of Dr. King last night in Memphis was expressed by Archbishop Philip M. Hannan, who said:

"Every believer in justice and racial harmony is injured by this mine.

by this crime.

"May his dente, by God's grace, hasten the triumph of racial justice and harmony to which he dedicated his life and for which we so carnestly pray and work."

White leaders here and across the state expressed shock over the assassination and called for cool heads.

eMegre leaders expressed hope that King's dedication to nonviolence would not be wasted in a violent reaction to his death, and asked that peace prevail.

New Orleans Police Department heads called a meeting to discuss possible effects of the assassination in New Orleans. The meeting was termed a precautionary measure

GOV. JOHN J. McKeithen, who has stated firmly that Louisiana intends to have racial harmony, was reported enroute to New York and was not available for a statement.

A spokesman for the telephone company said news of Dr. King's death set the state abuzz and many exchanges were jammed to capacity. Negro radio stations in New Octeans immediately began

broadcasting hymns and spirituals as a memorial to King.

One of the state's more militant Negro leaders, Robert Hicks, president of the Bogalusa Civic and Voters League, said his first impression was, "to hell with it all.

"IT'S TIME a man should not have to die for something he should have from birth," Hicks said.

"We tried to live by his philosophy of nonviolence but I think we have to start a new philosophy—an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth."

A. M. Trudeau Jr., the New Orleans Negro attorney who successfully fought through the federal courts eight years ago for integration of the city's public schools, called King's murder "a great tragedy of our times—most inopportune, as tragedies can be."

Trudeau said that, now, "the militant Negroes who have been preaching such solutions, violence, to our problems are fortified . . . this is contrary to all my prayers and hopes and I will do everything humanly possible to persuade the thoughts of our people from taking such a course."

METHODIST Bishop Aubrey Walton of New Orleans said the death of King places "greater responsibility than ever on every individual who

loves this country and who is concerned for right relationships between the peoples of the United States."

EMMITT Douglas, state NAACP president, said: "This was a terrible blow to the non-violent movement. I think this will give incentive to the more militant groups.

"This is what the young militants have been saying, 'Nonviolence pays off in death." I hope nonviolence will continue . . but it looms very gloomy at this hour."

Douglas said he cannot predict the chance of violence in Louisiana, but added that Baton Rouge and New Orleans are the state's two "hot spots".

...He said the NAACP will "pursue the same course of nonviolence."

Douglas was reached by telephone at Franklin, where he was attending a meeting of Negroes to promote a selective buying program. He said the mood of those at the meeting was one of great sadness

but not of violent reaction.

JOSEPH DELPIT, NAACP
Baten Rouge chapter president, said, "I feel the black
people will not really react
to peaceful demonstrations
anymore... black people will
do anything they deem necessary for total liberation."

Asked if the assassination would cause more violence, Delpit replied, "If there wasn't already violence, Mr. King wouldn't be dead."

Negroes, he said, "certainly will not sit back and let this sort of thing happen to them ... I think it will be a matter of self defense.

"I FORESEE a lot of bloodshed if there is no improvement in Negro rights." Delpit said, however, that violence could be averted if whites now "do some soul searching" accept expanding Negro rights. "It's all in the hands of the white people," he said. "Clarence "Chink" Henry,

All investigation must be completed and teletyped to office of origin and Bureau on same day, and an FD-302 prepared on the results of the investigation and forwarded with 25 copies to Memphis immediately following transmission of the teletype.

The airtel should be set up with a subcaption under the name of the suspect with a brief synopsis setting forth the investigation being forwarded by 302, which will enable Memphis to coordinate and handle the reporting of this case.

SA CALLENDER should immediately get out a memorandum to all Agents giving them the benefit of the instructions in this matter. The Bureau stated this will be handled under the personal supervision of the SAC, who will be held accountable for the appropriate, thorough handling of all leads.

Mr. TURNLEY stated that the review consisted of a check of every call made between 10:00 p.m. and 10:25 p.m. on 4/4/68, and no record was located of a call from Alexandria to the FBI Office at New Orleans, Louisiana.

Mr. TURNLEY stated that although a check had been made on a previous occasion of the Mark Sense Toll Tickets at Alexandria in effort to locate this call, he has arranged for a print out of all calls from Alexandria, Louisiana, to area code 504. This print out will include station-to-station calls, person-to-person calls, credit card calls, 3rd No. Billing calls, collect calls, etc.

Mr. TURNLEY stated that this print out would be complete by noon, 4/9/68, and he would immediately advise SA BROWN or SA STEPHEN M. CALLENDER of the results.


