At 9:40 a.m., 4/22/68, MARIO ORTIZ, Station Manager, Tenneco Grocery Station, 2701 Tulane Avenue, New Orleans, La., Tel. # 822-9555, telephonically advised that on 4/20/68, an individual who he believes is identical to JAMES EARL RAY came to the station twice. He stated that at approximately 7:15 a.m., 4/21/68, the man first came to his station, at which time he was driving a 1965 or 1966 Plymouth Baracuda, brown in color, fast back, which bore Alabama license. The man was alone at the time. At approximately 8 a.m., 4/21/68, the man again came to the station alone and this time he was driving a 1960 or 1961 red Dodge pickup truck, 1/2 or 3/4 ton, which also bore Alabama license. ORTIZ did not record the license numbers of either vehicle. The man was dressed in some type of work uniform, the shirt was blue in color, and ORTIZ thought the man was some type of air conditioner worker. The man held his head down most of the time, appeared to ORTIZ to be "wandering", and he said he had driven to New Orleans from Alabama.

ORTIZ described the man as pale looking, 40 to 45 years old, normal length dark hair, 170 lbs., had some type of marking or tattoo on arm but exactly what not noticed by ORTIZ, and was white male.

ORTIZ stated he had the newspaper which contained the murderer's photograph and that he looked at the photograph while the man was at his station. He said he felt sure the man was identical to the photograph. He said he called the NOPD and an officer came to his station only a couple of minutes after the man had departed the second time. He said he told the officer he thought the man was identical to the murderer of KING but that the officer "did not seem interested."

ORTIZ stated he would immediately alert the FBI if the man should again come to his station.

Re Miami teletype to Director 4/19/68 containing information concerning JACQUELINE CUTOLO.

On 4/20/68, Mrs. JACQUELINE CUTOLO, formerly employed from approximately June, 1964, to February or March, 1965, as a dance instructor, Continental Dance Studios, New Orleans, Louisiana, currently stopping at the Hicks Motor Court, 209 Crutchfield Avenue, Nashville, was contacted by SA HENDERSON HILLIN, JR., and RAYMOND J. MATKOWSKI, at which time, she reviewed her personal effects and photographs, which had been forwarded directly to the Nashville Resident Agency by the Miami Division.

Mrs. CUTOLO reviewed all of her photographs and was unable to find any photograph which in anyway resembled JAMES EARL RAY. She stated that she had been thinking about this matter and had looked at a number of photographs of RAY and that these photographs did not look familiar to her at all.

For the information of New Orleans, LIBERTO has three brothers residing in New Orleans; TONY LIBERTO, who resides near his mother, EMILY LIBERTO, 2219 Altomaster, New Orleans; VINCENT LIBERTO, who is a dock foreman at Viking Truck Lines, New Orleans; and SALVATORE LIBERTO, who is a truck driver for West Brother Truck Lines.

All efforts should be made to resolve alleged conspiracy on the part of LIBERTOS, according to MC FERREN's complaint.

JOHN MC FERREN, ROUTE FOUR, BOX ONE THREE THREE A, SOMERVILLE, TENN., WAS INTERVIEWED BY MEMPHIS AGENT ON APRIL EIGHT LAST, AFTER STATING THAT HE HAD SOME INFORMATION TO FURNISH CONCERNING THE SHOOTING OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

MC FERREN ADVISED THAT ON THE AFTERNOON OF APRIL FOUR LAST, HE PICKED UP SUPPLIES FOR HIS GROCERY STORE AT LL AND L PRODUCE CO., EIGHT ONE FOUR SCOTT STREET, MEMPHIS, TENN. MC FERREN STATED THAT WHILE AT THE LL AND L PRODUCE CO., HE OVERHEARD A HEAVY SET WHITE MALE TALKING ON THE PHONE AND STATED THAT HE HEARD THE HEAVY SET MAN SAY "KILL THE SOB ON THE BALCONY AND GET THE JOB DONE. YOU WILL GET YOUR FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS."

MC FERREN STATED THAT ANOTHER WHITE MALE WITH A SCAR ON HIS RIGHT CHEEK CAME BY AT THIS TIME AND TOLD HIM TO GO ON TO THE BACK OF THE PRODUCE COMPANY AND HELP HIMSELF.

MC FERREN STATED AFTER COMPLETING HIS BUSINESS IN THE BACK OF THE PRODUCE MARKET, HE HEARD TELEPHONE RING AGAIN

AS HE WAS PASSING THE OFFICE. THE TELEPHONE WAS ANSWERED BY THE MAN WITH THE SCAR AND MC FERREN SAID HE COULD NOT HEAR WHAT THIS MAN SAID. THE MAN WITH THE SCAR THEN HANDED THE TELEPHONE TO THE HEAVY SET MAN AND MC FERREN SAID HE HEARD THIS MAN SAYING "DON'T COME OUT HERE. GO TO NEW ORLEANS AND GET YOUR MONEY. YOU KNOW MY BROTHER."

MC FERREN STATED THAT HE ATTACHED NO SIGNIFICANCE TO THESE REMARKS AT THE TIME AND LEFT THE PRODUCE COMPANY EN ROUTE TO HIS HOME AT APPROXIMATELY FIVE FIFTEEN P.M.

MC FERREN ADVISED THAT WHEN HE ARRIVED HOME AT SOMERVILLE, TENN., AT APPROXIMATELY SIX FIFTEEN P.M., HE WAS ADVISED BY A NEIGHBOR THAT KING HAD BEEN SHOT. HE STATED THAT ON THE FOLLOWING DAY HE SAW A SKETCH OF THE UNSUB IN A NEWSPAPER WHICH WAS SUPPOSED TO BE A LIKENESS OF THE UNKNOWN INDIVIDUAL WHO SHOT KING AND WHEN HE COMPARED THE DESCRIPTION FURNISHED BY HIS WIFE FROM THE NEWSPAPER AND THE SKETCH WHICH APPEARED IN THE PAPER, HE THOUGHT OF A PERSON WHO WAS EMPLOYED AT THE LL AND L PRODUCE COMPANY SOMETIME IN THE LATE FALL OR EARLY WINTER LAST YEAR.

MC FERREN IS OF THE OPINION THAT THIS MAN WHOM HE SAW IS IDENTICAL WITH THE SKETCH THAT HE SAW IN THE NEWSPAPER AND THEREFORE FEELS THAT THIS IS THE INDIVIDUAL WHO SHOT KING. HE DESCRIBED THIS INDIVIDUAL AS FIVE FEET NINE INCHES, ONE FOUR ZERO POUNDS, WHITE MALE, SLENDER BUILD AND APPROXIMATELY TWENTYFIVE YEARS OF AGE.

MC FERREN REINTERVIEWED BY MEMPHIS AGENTS THIS DATE AND GIVES ESSENTIALLY THE SAME STORY THAT HE GAVE TO MEMPHIS AGENT ON APRIL EIGHT LAST.

MC FERREN SUSPICIOUS BECAUSE OF AN INDIVIDUAL HE KNOWS FROM SOMERVILLE, TENN., PRESENTLY RESIDING LOUISIANA, VISITED HIS RESIDENCE THIS A.M., AND ASKED QUESTIONS REGARDING HIS TRAVEL. MC FERREN IDENTIFIES THIS INDIVIDUAL AS ROBERT POWERS WHO CAME TO HIS RESIDENCE A.M., INSTANT DATE WITH HIS WIFE, DRIVING A ONE NINE SIX SIX - ONE NINE SIX SEVEN LATE MODEL BEIGE CADILLAC.

MC FERREN ADVISED THAT HE WAS NOT THREATENED BY THIS INDIVIDUAL AND THE ONLY REASON THAT HE SUSPECTS POWERS OF BEING STRANGE IS THAT MC FERREN STATES IT IS NOT COMMON FOR

MC FERREN WAS SHOWN SIX RANDOM PHOTOGRAPHS, ONE OF WHICH INCLUDED SUBJECT ERIC STARVO GALT AND DEFINITELY ELIMINATED GALT AS THE INDIVIDUAL WHOM HE SUSPECTS CAME TO THE LL AND L PRODUCE COMPANY AND IS IDENTICAL TO THE SKETCH IN THE NEWSPAPER HE SAW.

MC FERREN PICKED THREE PHOTOGRAPHS OF INDIVIDUAL WHO ARE UNDER TWENTYFIVE YEARS OF AGE AND WHO DO NOT RESEMBEL GALT AT ALL. ONE INDIVIDUAL IN THE PHOTOGRAPH IS KNOWN TO BE IN PRISON AT THIS TIME AND THE OTHER TWO ARE NOT KNOWN TO HAVE BEEN IN THE MEMPHIS AREA AT ANY TIME.

INVESTIGATION AT LL AND L PRODUCE COMPANY, MEMPHIS, REVEALED JAMES LATCH AND FRANK LABERTO, PROPRIETORS OF THIS COMPANY. THESE INDIVIDUALS UNAVAILABLE FOR INTERVIEW AND OWNER OF TONY SANSON PRODUCE COMPANY STATED FRANK LABERTO PRESENTLY IN HAMMOND, LOUISIANA, BUYING STRAWBERRIES. AND THE FACT THAT KING WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR LOSS OF REVENUE BY BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE MEMPHIS AREA. LATCH AND LIBERTO ADVISED SIMILAR DISPARAGING STATEMENTS ARE PART OF GENERAL CONVERSATION AMONG CO-WORKERS IN AND AROUND PRODUCE COMPANY AND OTHER INDIVIDUALS RESIDING AND EMPLOYED IN THE MEMPHIS AREA.

EACH STATED THEY WORKED AT THE PRODUCE COMPANY ON APRIL FOUR, LAST, AND LIBERTO ADVISED HE DEPARTED FROM WORK AT APPROXIMATELY FOUR THIRTY PM AND WAS NOT AWARE OF KING'S DEATH UNTIL AFTER ARRIVING HOME. LATCH ADVISED HE DEPARTED WORK APPROXIMATELY SIX PM AND MAY HAVE HEARD KING'S DEATH REPORTED ON THE RADIO, ALTHOUGH HE IS NOT SURE.

EACH DENIED RECEIVING ANY TELEPHONE CALL WHERE MENTION IS MADE OF SHOOTING OF KING OR OF ANY REFERENCE TO KING. EACH STATED THEY HAVE NO KNOWLEDGE OF THE SHOOTING WHILE AT WORK AT THE PRODUCE COMPANY.

LIBERTO ADVISED HE FREQUENTLY MAKES TRIPS TO NEW ORLEANS, LOUISIANA, FOR STRAWBERRIES AND OTHER PRODUCE, AND ALSO BECAUSE ALL FAMILY MEMBERS RESIDE IN NEW ORLEANS.

PAGE THREE

LIBERTO STATED THIS IS COMMON KNOWLEDGE AMONG EMPLOYEES AND CUSTOMERS AT HIS PRODUCE COMPANY AS HE FREQUENTLY MENTIONS TRIPS TO NEW ORLEANS.

LIBERTO STATED MOST PRODUCE IS PURCHASED THROUGH TELEPHONE CONVERSATIONS AND THIS INEVITABLY INVOLVES TALKING ABOUT LARGE SUMS OF MONEY OVER THE TELEPHONE.

LIBERTO ADVISED HE HAS HAD NO INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYED RECENTLY AT HIS PRODUCE COMPANY FITTING DESCRIPTION OF UNSUB DESCRIBED BY MC FERREN (MC FERREN NOT IDENTIFIED TO LIBERTO), AND STATED HE ALWAYS EMPLOYS NEGRO MALES FOR HELP IN THE PRODUCE DEPARTMENT.

BOTH LIBERTO AND LATCH STATED THEY WOULD REMEMBER ANY CONVERSATION, OVER THE TELEPHONE FOR IN PERSON, WHICH ALLEGEDLY TOOK PLACE APRIL FOUR, LAST, AND INVOLVED THE DEATH OF KING, AND STATED THAT THEY WOULD HAVE NO REASON FOR BEING INVOLVED IN ANY ACTION OF THIS SORT.

LEADS BEING SENT TO NEW ORLEANS TO FURTHER CHECK STORY BY INTERVIEWING LIBERTO'S BROTHER.

SAC JENSEN, Memphis, at 8:30 a.m., 4/22/68, telephonically contacted the New Orleans Office and advised that JOHN McFERREN, a Negro of Summerville, Tenn., buys produce from Italians in Memphis and heard an Italian talking on the telephone "Kill the S.O.B. on the balcony and get the job done. You'll get your five thousand".

Interviews in Memphis reflects it was common talk among the produce people there that they had no "love" for MARTIN LUTHER KING and made many disparaging remarks and were constantly "riding the niggers".

He requested that interviews be conducted with TONY LIBERTO, VINCENT LIBERTO, SALVATORE LIBERTO, and Mrs. EMILY LIBERTO, mother of FRANK CAMILLE LIBERTO; that a teletype be sent to the Bureau, Memphis, Birmingham and Atlanta with results of these interviews and appropriate 302s prepared on each individual.

At 10:10 A.M., 4/20/68, HERMAN HAISCH, telephone number WH 3-3863, telephonically contacted the New Orleans Office and advised that the JAMES EARL RAY being sought in connection with the murder of Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING was possibly identical with an individual recalled by him only as RAY, who he became acquainted with while an inmate at Chillicothe Correctional Institution in Cincinnati, Ohio. HAISCH stated that he was in this institution from 11/23/44 to 9/5/45, and that his number was 23697. He stated that he worked on the same work gang as the individual recalled by him as RAY, during that period of time. He described this individual as approximately 5' 6" to 5' 7" tall; slender build; dark hair; and droopy eyes.

HAISCH stated that he was not positive that this was the same individual; however, the possibility exists that he was.

HAISCH stated that he resides with his mother, who is very ill, and that if further information was needed from him, he would be happy to come to the New Orleans FBI Office to furnish this information. He stated that he could be reached at the above phone number.

At 10:40 A.M., 4/20/68, Mr. RILEY BRYANT, telephone number 891-9732, 4891 Tchoupitoulas Street, which is the address of Star Generator Company, advised that in addition to his generator business, he buys and sells used clothing for resale and gifts to other people. In that regard, Mr. BRYANT stated that he heard a broadcast on WDSU radio on 4/19/68, ~~on 4/19/68~~, advertising used clothing for sale. He was to contact phone number 822-1649, which is located at 121 Dorgenois, New Orleans.

BRYANT said that he went to the foregoing address and purchased used clothing from an individual who very closely resembled the picture published in the Times-Picayune of the suspected slayer of Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING. He described this individual as approximately 5' 11" tall; slender build; age 34 - 36 years; 165 - 170 pounds. He stated that the individual's face was somewhat slimmer than the photograph, however, there was a close resemblance.

BRYANT stated that the clothes which were purchased consisted of slacks, three sports coats and some sports shirts. He stated that the sports shirts had labels on them from stores in Memphis, Tenn., Los Angeles, California and from Rubinstein's in New Orleans, Louisiana. He stated also that the shirts had various laundry marks on them. He also stated that one of the laundry marks indicated the name PAIGE.

BRYANT stated that these clothes would be available for examination at the address of Star Generator should same be deemed necessary.

This individual exhibited the card to BOUDREAUX, who observed that it had the last name of GAULT on the card and he also observed that the card was a duplicate issued in a small town in New Mexico.

Mrs. MOAK returned to the phone and advised that this individual has been in this vicinity for approximately three days and gave the name of CLARENCE POUNDERS and said that he was residing at 234 St. Louis Street, Room 12, Baton Rouge. Mrs. MOAK advised that another individual is also residing at the above address, Room 7, using the name of DICK BORDEN and that this individual advised he was also waiting for the motor vessel Delta and has been there for four days. She advised that this is most unusual inasmuch as this vessel has a regular time schedule and that crewmen normally do not arrive to board this vessel more than a few hours in advance of its arrival. Extensive investigation to date has not specifically established residence or whereabouts of ERIC STARVO GALT prior to mid-summer 1967. Investigation has disclosed that his presence has been established in Alabama, California, Georgia, Louisiana, and Tennessee.

Possibility exists that prior to mid-summer, 1967, UNSUB may well have been a recent releasee of a Federal Penitentiary, a State Penitentiary, or some county correctional institution. In addition, the possibility that he may have been a recent releasee from a mental institution of some kind cannot be overlooked.

It is therefore requested that all offices receiving this Airtel check records of custodial institutions, penal and otherwise, in their respective divisions, for any information regarding releasees in May, June, and July 1967. Offices should be guided by the descriptive data and birth data furnished on Alabama driver's license. This set forth birthdate [redacted]. Descriptive data available on license will assist in eliminating many of the names that might appear. Use of current photo, which is dated March 1968, would also be of assistance in further eliminating any suspects included in group. At about 6 p.m. on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifle. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3 p.m. on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN WILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 422½ South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6 p.m. on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street, Memphis. A neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifle which was determined to have been

sold to one HARVEY LOWMEYER on 3/30/68 by Aeromarine Supply Co., Birmingham, Alabama.

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of binoculars at the York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The items abandoned in Memphis were all wrapped in this bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68 at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama license 1-38993. Investigation at Birmingham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1968, from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1995 cash. While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama. The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as [redacted], his height as 5'11", his weight as 170 and his eyes blue and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68 and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9 a.m. on 4/5/68.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division. //

On 4/17/68, AUSA R. MACEY TAYLOR, Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U. S. Code, and

Re Albany airtels 4/10/68 and 4/11/68, setting forth concerns who purchased Thermo-Seal marking machines, and Bureau teletype to Memphis, 4/12/68.

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.

Dear Sir:

The information here may help in tracing Eric Starvo Galt, or whoever is the slayer of Martin Luther King.

A stranger with whom I had an intense and fairly lengthy conversation in Dave's Bar (on University next door to the Roosevelt) very closely fits the description and mannerisms of the photos and stories in yesterday's Times-Picayune. It was on a Saturday, March 23rd I think, that this man began talking to me, just after speaking to another seaman (some tatoos on right arm) who left, and may have been his brother.

The talk this new acquaintance gave me (including the name of Dick Dixon) turned out to be so much a conglomeration of wild lies and thoughts of a fanatic who had delusions about himself that I later became suspicious. He told me, over several highballs and beers on my part, that he could give me a job as night hotel manager as he owned 52% of The Wohl Apartments, 2111 St. Charles, that he lived temporarily at the Roosevelt in Room 1102, that a Mrs. Margaret Kirschman, day manager of The Wohl, would be my boss, and all I would do would rent a few apartments at \$20 a night to select guests, and be well tipped. He said he owned a white T-Bird and to call him next day (Sunday). I did. The phone operator at the Roosevelt said there was no such room number as 1102 and noone at the Roosevelt was registered as Dick Dixon. At the Wohl a man who answered said no Dick Dixon had any financial interest in the establishment and no Mrs. Kirschman worked there - not one sentence in his remarks was true, unless it was the \$2,000 a month as chief electrician on the ship and fact he was able to carry liquor aboard in handbags to his stateroom.

Ordinarily I would discount the above as more bar talk, except that the descriptions given matched so nearly. Am not so sure about nose but rest of face

as to mouth, dark hair neatly combed back on head, ears and flashing blue eyes all coincided somewhat with photos and written description. I have a reporter's hunch this could be the man, having been a news reporter in early years and now 59 (born). This man wore a dark suit and blue tie and white shirt and apologized to me for ~~was~~ wearing brown shoes, saying those shoes were for comfort. He was about 5'9" tall and weighed about 160, of trim build. His buddy was larger and casually dressed in shirt, no tie, and trousers of work clothes.

If I were an Agent I would check the Wohl, the Roosevelt and maybe Dave's Bar about activities between March 22 and 24.

I am writing this because (1) I feel it a conscientious duty to help deter and prevent any further violence in a world going wild and (2) I would like to share in any reward if this is instrumental in finding and convicting an assassin - these reasons not necessarily in order of importance, to my thinking.

I refrain from signing my real name but, for identifying purposes, it could be Willis and ⁶³⁸ are my first ³ numbers of ~~my~~ ^{my} Army Serial No.. If I can give you any further information please contact me in Personal columns of Times-Picayune, addressed to WILLIS, and I will answer. Thank you. Over and out - 79.

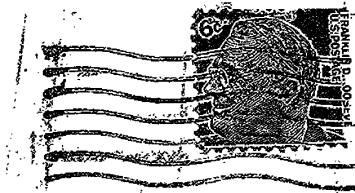
