At 9:40 a.m., 4/22/68, MARIO ORTIZ, Station Manager, Tenneco Grocery Station, 2701 Tulane Avenue, New Orleans, La., Tel. # 822-9555, telephonically advised that on 4/24/68, an individual who he believes is identical to JAMES EARL RAY came to the station twice. He stated that at approximately 7:15 a.m., 4/21/68, the man first came to his/station, at which time he was driving a 1965 or 1966 Plymouth Baracuda, brown in color, fast back, which bore Alabama license. The man was alone at the time. At approximately 8 a.m., 4/21/68, the man again came to the station alone and this time he was driving a 1960 or 1961 red Dodge pickup truck, 1/2 or 3/4 ton, which also bore Alabama license. ORTIZ did not record the license numbers of either The man was dressed in some type of work uniform, the shirt was blue in color, and ORTIZ thought the man was some type of air conditioner worker. The man held his head down most of the time, appeared to ORTIZ to be "wandering", and he said he had driven to New Orleans from Alabama.

ORTIZ described the man as pale looking, 40 to 45 years old, normal length dark hair, 170 lbs., had some type of marking or tattoo on arm but exactly what not noticed by ORTIZ, and was white male.

ORTIZ stated he had the newspaper which contained the murderer's photograph and that he looked at the photograph which the man was at his station. He said he feet sure the man was identical to the photograph. He said he called the NOPD and an officer came to his station only a couple of minutes after the man had departed the second time. He said he told the officer he thought the man was identical to the murderer of KING but that the officer "did not seem interested."

ORTIZ stated he would immediately alert the FBI if the man should again come to his station.





You'll get your five thousand".

Interviews in Memphis reflects it was common talk among the produce prople there that they had no "love" for MARTIN LUTHER KING and made many disparaging remarks and were constantly "riding the niggers".

He requested that interviews be conducted with TONY LIBERTO, VINCENT LIBERTO, SALVATORE LIBERTO, and Mrs. EMILY LIBERTO, mother of FRANK CAMILLE LIBERTO; that a teletype be sent to the Bureau, Memphis, Birmingham and Atlanta with results of these interviews and appropriate 302s prepared on each individual.

At -10:10 A.M., 4/20/68, HERMAN HARSCH, telephone number WH 3-3863, telephonically contacted the New Orleans Office and advised that the JAMES FARL RAY being sought in connection with the murder of Doctor MARTIN LUTHER KING was possibly identical with an individual recalled by him only as RAY, who he became acquainted with while an inmate at Chillicothe Correctional Institution in Cincinnati, Ohio. HAISCH stated that he was in this institution from 11/23/44 to 9/5/45, and that his number was 23697. He stated that he worked on the same work gang as the individual recalled by him as RAY, during that period of time. He described this individual as approximately 5' 6" to 5' 7" tall; slender build; dark hair; and droopy eyes.

HAISCH stated that he was not positive that this was the same individual; however, the possibility exists that he was.

HAISCH stated that he resides with his mother, who is very ill, and that if further information was needed from him, he would be happy to come to the New Orleans FBI Office to furnish this information. He stated that he could be reached at the above phone number.

He stated that the sports shirts had labels on them from stores in Memphis, Tenn., Los Angeles, California and from Rubinstein's in New Orleans, Louisiana. He stated also that the shirts had various laundry marks on them. He also stated that one of the laundry marks indicated the name PAIGE.

BRYANT exhibited the clothing he had purchased from the man and pointed out that the labels in one of the suit coats reflected a Memphis, Tenn. elothing store.

BRYANT advised that he did not obtain this individual's name but stated that a laundry mark inside one of the shirts he had purchased reflected the name PAJGE and the address 121 Dorgenois. BRYANT was unable to furnish any further information of value.

Mrs. MOAK put the night watchman on the phone and the following information was received from him:

HAROLD BOUDREAUX, 5357 Prescott Road, Baton Rouge, telephone 357-5004, advised that he is employed as a night watchman for Red's Marine Boat Store, Baton Rouge, from 10:00 p.m. to 7:30 a.m., with the exception of Saturday nights. He stated that on the night of 4/19/68 an individual came to his place of employment and advised that he was in Baton Rouge to board the motor vessel Delta which runs between Baton Rouge and Houston, Texas. This individual remained at Red's Boat Store until about 1:00 a.m. today and during his conversation with Mr. BOUDREAUX he advised that he was from Alabama and that sometime ago he was in Florida and found the social security card of the fellow that had killed MARTIN LUTHER KING.

This individual exhibited the card to BOUDREAUX, who observed that it had the last name of GAULT on the card and he also observed that the card was a duplicate issued in a small town in New Mexico.

Mrs. MOAK returned to the phone and advised that this individual has been in this vicinity for approximately three days and gave the name of CLARENCE POUNDERS and said that he was residing at 234 St. Louis Street, Room 12, Baton Rouge. Mrs. MOAK advised that another individual is also residing at the above address, Room 7, using the name of DICK BORDEN and that this individual advised he was also waiting for the motor vessel Delta and has been there for four days. She advised that this is most unusual inasmuch as this vessel has a regular time schedule and that crewmen normally do not arrive to board this vessel more than a few hours in advance of its arrival.





At about 6 p.m. on 4/4/68, while standing on the second floor balcony outside Room 306 of the Lorraine Motel, 406 Mulberry Street, Memphis, Tennessee, Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. was struck in the right side of the face by a single bullet fired from a 30-06 rifle. The bullet severed KING's spinal cord and death was almost instantaneous.

This investigation, predicated upon a specific request from the Attorney General of the United States, disclosed that the fatal shot had been fired from the bathroom of a cheap rooming house located at 422½ South Main Street, Memphis, which bathroom was located at the rear of the rooming house, and had a window overlooking the Lorraine Motel.

At about 3 p.m. on 4/4/68, an individual using the name JOHN VILLARD had rented Room 5-B in the rooming house at 422½ South Main Street and had paid one week's rent. After hearing the rifle shot at about 6 p.m. on that same day, other tenants in the rooming house observed a man presumably identical with WILLARD, fleeing from the rooming house carrying a large package which was subsequently abandoned by him on the sidewalk in front of the Canipe Amusement Co., 424 South Main Street, Memphis. A neighborhood investigation in the vicinity of 424 South Main Street disclosed that the subject had fled from the scene in a white Mustang.

Found abandoned in front of 424 South Main Street was a 30-06 Remington model 760 rifle which was determined to have been

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of binoculars at the York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The items abandoned in Memphis were all wrapped in this bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68 at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang beaking Alabama License 1-38993. Investigation at Birmngham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1968, from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1995 cash. While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama. The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as _______, his height as 5'11", his weight as 170 and his eyes blue and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68 and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9 a.m. on 4/5/68.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division.

On 4/17/68, AUSA R. MACRY TAYLOR, Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U.S. Code, and

recommended bond in the amount \$50,000. On that same date, SAC JOSEPH H. GAMBLE filed a complaint before USC MILDRED F. SPRAGUE. Birmingham, and warrant was issued that same date.



The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size/as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.

Dear Sir:

The information here may help in tracing Eric Starvo Galt, or whoever is the slayer of Martin Luther King.

A stranger with whom I had an intense and fairly lengthy conversation in Dave's Bar(on University next door to the Roosevelt) very closely fits the description and mannerisms of the photos and stories in yesterday's Times-Picayune. It was on a Saturday, March 23rd I think, that this man began talking to me, just after speaking to another seaman(some tatoos on right arm) who left, and may have been his brother.

The talk this new acquaintance gave me (including the name of Dick Dixon) turned out to be so much a conglomeration of wild lies and thoughts of a fanatic who had delusions about himself that I later begame suspicious. He told me, over several highballs and beers on my part, that he could give me a job as night hotel manager as he owned 52% of The Wohl Apartments, 2111 St. Charles, that he lived temporarily at the Roosevelt in Room 1102, that a Mrs. Margaret Kirschman, day manager of The Wohl, would be my boss, and all I would do would rent a few apartments at \$20 a night to select guests, and be well tipped. He said he owned a white T-Bird and to call him next day (Sunday). I did. The phone operator at the Roosevelt said there was no such room number as 1102 and noone at the Roosevelt was registered as Dick Dixon. At the Wohl a man who answered said no Dick Dixon had any financial interest in the establishment and no Mrs. Kirschman worked there - not one sentence in his remarks was true, unless it was the \$2,000 a month as chief electrician on the ship and fact he was able to carry liquor aboard in handbags to his stateroom.

Ordinarily I would discount the above as more bar talk, except that the descriptions given matched so nearly. Am not so sure about nose but rest of face

as to mouth, dark hair neatly combed back on head, ears and flashing blue eyes all coincided somewhat with photos and written description. I have a reporter's hunch this could be the man, having been a news reporter in early years and now 59(born). This man wore a dark suit and blue tie and white shirt and apologized to me for war wearing brown shoes, saying those shoes were for comfort. He was about 5'9" tall and weighed about 160, of trim build. His buddy was larger and casually dressed in shirt, no tie, and trousers of work clothes.

If I were an Agent I would check the Wohl, the Roosevelt and maybe Dave's Bar about activities between March 22 and 24.

I am writing this because (1) I feel it a conscientious duty to help deter and prevent any futher violence in a world going wild and (2) I would like to share in any reward if this is instrumental in finding and convicting an assasin - these reasons not necessarily in order of importance, to my thinking.

I refrain from signing my real name But, for identifying purposes, it could be Willis and are my first numbers of a Army Serial No.. If I can give you any further information please contact me in Personal columns of Times-Picayune, addressed to WILLIS, and I will answer. Thank you. Over and out - 79.


