



WILLIAM HARMAN telephonically contacted the writer instant date to advise that he is a practicing attorney in New Orleans with an address of 4532 South Tonti, telephone #822-3771. HARMAN said that he had earlier conversed with SA WILLIAM F. KUSCH and that he was now contacting this office since he, as the attorney who handles some legal details in connection with Mrs. LOUELLA M. LUTZ, owner of the Continental Dance Studios, possessed some information from his files concerning LUTZ and her associates. HARMAN advised as follows:

LUTZ, while in New Orleans, resided at Claiborne Towers and since June, 1966, has been residing at 5515 Ash Street, Apartment 7, Los Angeles, California.

Among the individuals who were on the dance instruction staff at Continental while it was in existence in New Orleans in 1964-65 were one DANNY OWENS, who is now believed residing in Texas, and who prior to departing New Orleans, was employed by the Arthur Murray Studio in New Orleans.

JUANITA WELSH, who is now probably married, and whereabouts not known, is probably known to JAMES BAKER, present co-owner of Arthur Murray Dance Studios in New Orleans.

(FNU) PRESTON and GERALD GERKIN are operators of a dance studio in New Orleans at the present time, name unknown, but who were well acquainted with LUTZ and in fact took some of her equipment over when Continental Studios went out of business.

MARTIN MYERS, who was President of the Continental Club, and whose whereabouts are presently unknown, would probably be the best person to have detailed knowledge concerning any individuals employed by Continental during its existence in New Orleans.

A Mr. (FNU) SNYDER, associated with Dracket and Dracket, an accounting firm located on Veterans Highway, handled bookkeeping accounts for Continental Dance. SNYDER could very well still possess records of Continental which should include time slips of former employees. FRED WESTENBERGER or WESTERBERGER was one of the dance directors at Continental but no information as to his present whereabouts is known.

Mr. (FNU) KATYER, Whitney Bank, Main Branch, handled the Continental Bank Account and could possibly furnish pertinent information.

Further information concerning Continental could probably be obtained by checking the Mortgage Office in Orleans Parish in the year 1964 or checking the Corporate Charter in the State Offices at Baton Rouge.

HARMAN subsequently called back to advise that the proper incorporated name of Continental is the Continental Dance Club Studio, Inc., and that this concern was incorporated on 2/26/64 with the incorporators listed as MARLIN CARL MYERS, LOUELLA M. LUTZ, and WILLIAM LANPHERE.

The above information should be reviewed in connection with results of extensive investigation being conducted this date in connection with former employees of Continental and where appropriate leads will be set forth.

The Bureau has instructed that leads in captioned matter must be covered within 24 hours and all leads developed must be set forth by telephone or teletype.

The Bureau has further instructed that all criminal informants and appropriate racial and security informants be contacted.

Therefore, each agent who receives a copy of this memo and has a criminal informant assigned to him, must immediately contact these sources and exhibit a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY as well as a photograph of WALTER TERRY RIFE, a close associate of RAY. The results of each contact, whether positive or negative, must be received and agents handling security and racial informants should contact appropriate individuals in this field and submit the results.

The following is a summary of background data in regards to JAMES EARL RAY:

RAY escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary, 4/23/67, by concealing himself in a breadbox which was aboard a truck making a delivery for an auxiliary farm. RAY was serving a 20-year sentence on a first degree charge of armed robbery.

On 7/20/67, a Federal complaint authorized by AUSA WILLIAM A. KITCHEN, WDMO, Kansas City, Mo., was filed before USC, Jefferson City, Mo., charging RAY with violation of Title 18, Section 1073, USC. A warrant was issued.

Investigation to locate RAY has been conducted by the Chicago, Springfield, St. Louis and Kansas City offices.

WALTER TERRY RIFE has been a close associate of RAY's in the past and assisted RAY in the burglary of a U. S. Post Office in 1955 at Kellerville, Ill., and as a result both RAY and RIFE were sentenced to Leavenworth Prison on 7/1/55.

The Bureau points out that there is a possibility that RIFE, because of being a close associate of RAY, could have been involved in the murder, and the Bureau is attempting to locate RIFE in connection with captioned case.

Enclosed herewith for the Laboratory are registration cards for the Candlelight Inn. 4801 Airline Highway, Metairie, La., numbers 8267, 8486, 8584, 8824, 8925, 9370, 9471, 9679, 9746, and 9800. Also enclosed for the Laboratory is a registration card, number 6834, from the Chalmette Hotel, 808 Carondelet Street.

The following information was developed based on a report of a lookalike following publication of photograph of JAMES. SCOTT NORDAL, white male, resided 623 Royal Street, New Orleans, La., from 4/1 through 4/17/68, but maid states he was absent from his room most of the time.

NORDAL was employed as a waiter at the Court of Two Sisters Restaurant, 613 Royal Street, from 3/24 until 4/13/68, with absences on 4/4 and possibly on other dates. NORDAL furnished background information to the Court of Two Sisters Restaurant which included a California drivers license and a list of all schools which he attended in California along with his mother's address in Los Angeles, California.

NORDAL placed a second lock on his room and permitted no me access to this room while he was absent. NORDAL had a large quantity of clothing and luggage and on one occasion the maid saw a large quantity of currency in a pack in the bed that contained a \$100 bill on the top.

During a search of NORDAL's room a key to the Candlelight Inn, 4801 Airline Highway, Metairie, Ia., was found. This key was for Room 219. A map was also found in this room that bore several cryptic notations.

The Los Angeles Division has advised the New Orleans Division telephonically that all background information furnished by NORDAL at the Court of Two Sisters has been checked and has proved to be false. The records of the Candielight Inn Motel were checked and registration cards for Room 219 were obtained for all individuals not known to be regular customers at this motel. Further investigation in New Orleans disclosed that SCOTT NORDAL stayed at the Chalmette Hotel, 808 Carondelet Street, New Orleans, La., from 3/22 - 3/23/68.

The Laboratory is requested to compare the handwriting on all of the enclosed registration cards with the known handwriting of JAMES EARL RAY, and WALTER TERRY RIFE, FBI #455-876-6.

The Laboratory is also requested to attempt to determine through handwriting analysis if the individual registering as SCOTT NORDAL at the Chalmette Hotel signed any of the enclosed registration cards from the Candlelight Inn Motel.

All enclosed registration cards are also to be checked for any latent fingerprints of value which might be found. It is known that these registration cards have been handled by numerous individuals acting within the scope of their employment at their respective hotel or motel.

For the information of the Laboratory, the known handwriting of the individual using the name SCOTT NORDAL appears on the top half of the registration slip from the Chalmette Hotel and all writing on the bottom half and reverse side of this card was written by the night clerk at this hotel.

The Court of Two Sisters have requested that item 1 be returned to them when comparison complete.







On 4/22/68, Mr. LEANDER "LEE" D'AVY, 348 Idlewild, Jackson, Mississippi, appeared at the Jackson Office of the FBI, and furnished the following information to SA SAMUEL N. JENNINGS:

D'AVY advised he is unemployed at the present time, but has previously worked as a cab driver and at numerous odd jobs such as selling fishing worms, acting as a doorman at some bars on Bourbon Street in New Orleans, and a variety of jobs, after receiving a General discharge from the U. S. Army for stealing a Government vehicle.

D'AVY said he was hitchhiking with his tene year-old son, LEANDER D'AVY, JR., on April 9, 1968, at Brookhaven, Mississippi. He caught a ride in front of the Coca-Cola Plant in Brookhaven, with a man who acted suspicious, and who had the name "Ray" written on the back of the Texas Inspection Sticker on the windshield of his car. D'AVY pointed out this was the day of the funeral of MARTIN LUTHER KING, and after reading in the paper that JAMES EARL RAY was alleged to be the murderer, he believes this man whom he caught a ride with might be involved in the murder of Dr. KING in some way. identified man offering D'AVY and his son a ride from Brookhaven, Miss., to Baton Rouge, Miss., was driving about a 1961 Chevrolet, four door sedan, medium green in color, with current Texas license plates, number not recalled or recorded. The unidentified driver claimed he

had recently worked on a pipe-line job near Grenada, Mississippi, and was presently enroute to another new pipe-line job in Donaldsonville, Louisiana.

During the trip, D'AVY started to comment about Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING and this caused the unidentified driver to become very upset and pound his fists on the steering wheel. D'AVY claimed the driver never gave him any name whatsoever, but he believes his name may have been RAY, since that was the name on the back of the Texas Inspection Sticker on the windshield. He said the Miss. Highway Safety Patrol stopped them just outside of Brookhaven, Miss., on a routinetype driver's license check. The driver exhibited a Texas driver's license to the patrolman. The patrolman also noted that one of the headlights did not work on this car; however, allowed them to continue on without receiving any type of ticket. During the drive to Baton Rouge, Louisiana, the unidentified driver gave D'AVY's ten-year-old son a cheap, inexpensive ring which was made in Mexico, and which he took from the glover compartment of the car. D'AVY still has this ring.

D'AVY described the unidentified driver as follows: white male, age 25-35, 5' 9" in height, 180 pounds, blue or green eyes, sandy colored brown hair with a full head of hair combed straight, no glasses, did not smoke, had on no rings, and did not appear to be carrying anything in the way of suitcases or clothes inside the car. He spoke with a normal accent which was not particularly regional. He claimed to be from Orange, Texas, originally, but did not know several people named by D'AVY who are supposedly well-known in Orange, Texas.

D'AVY viewed several photographs, including the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, and stated the unidentified driver who picked him up is definitely not identical with the photographs and bears no resemblance to the photographs.

D'AVY theorized that as soon as the true identity of the killer of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING became known to the public, it was necessary for those who had participated in the murder with RAY, to eliminate RAY in order that he could never identify them. D'AVY claims he has not only theorized about this, but he has dreamed about it also, and felt he should tell the FBI about it.


