

At approximately 9:45 a. m., on 4/20/68, Mr. TIM O"DONALD, at Casey's Bar at the corner of St. Charles Avenue and Julia Street, New Orleans, La, was located and appeared to be intoxicated and was acting in a loud and boisterous manner. He admitted the called this office and later spoke to this agent concerning meeting someone he believed to be JAMES EARL RAY. O'DONALD stated while he was at Casey's bar at about 2:30 a. m., that morning a man came in and sat beside him at the bar for about one hour. O'DONALD believed this man was drunk. While this man was sixting next to O'DONALD, O' DONALD had a current Times Picayune newspaper in front of him. O'DONALD said later when this man left the bar he saw RAY's picture on the front page of the Times Picayune and was sure the man next to him was identical to JAMES EARL RAY. advised he had some conversation with this man that sat next to him, who he believed was identical to JAMES EARL RAY, but he could furnish no information as to his occupation, place of birth or other background data. O'DONALD described this man as about 35 to 39 years old. between 5' 8" and 5' 11" tall, 165 pounds, brown hast and a ruddy complexion. O'DONALD thought his nose may have been broken at one time and he especially noticed this individuals front teeth were protruding and "looked rotten".

It should be noted the picture of RAY, which O'DONALD saw in the Times Picayune, was not particularly distinct and O'DONALD did not give this writer the impression his information was particularly reliable.



EVERETT GAULT observed photographs of ERIC STARVO GALT and advised that he had never seen this individual, and that this person is definitely not a member of his family or a relation thereof. He stated that he has a brother by the name of CURTIS HOPE GAULT, and his last known address was Pioneer, Louisiana. EVERETT GAULT stated that his brother, CURTIS GAULT, was employed by the Ford Bacon and Davis Construction Company, Monroe, Louisiana. 

OFFETSE:

This defendant on April 1, 1955 entered a plea of guilty to an Information in one count which charves that he on or about March 21, 1955 at Gauses City, Minsouri knowingly, wilfully, unlawfully, and reloniously forged a material endorsement on a G. S. Post Office Department Honey Irdar No. 7-12,237,597. On this seme date a companion, Valter Torry Rife, entered a plas of guilty in Docket No. 19119 to an Information in one count charging him with the forgery on Narrii 21, 1955 of postal money order ho. 7-62,239,500. Imposition of sentence as to defendant and his companion was deferred and this presentence investigation lyas ordered.

The facts of the case are as follows: In March 7, 1955 the U. J. Fost Office at Acl'erville. Illinois was burglarised and sixty-six blank W. S. Postal Konny Orders, Serial Wos. 7-62,237,535 to 7-62,239,600 inclusive, and the office validating stamp\weeka stoles. On Harch 8, 1955 at Alton, Illinois en unsuccessful attempt was made to cash one of thems stolen money orders. On March 21, 1955 one of the stolen money orders, order No. 7-h2,239,597, was presented to Askin's Clothing Company, 1276 Grand Avenue, Kansas City, Misecuri, by an unknown person in payment for a suit of elothes which was never licked up after alterations had been made. This money order, which was in the amount of \$75.00, was take tayable to fillard i. McBride with the purchaser being shown as Vernon 'curide. On this same date an unknown person prosented stalen measy order No. 7-12.23). For to the Chaffer Office Machine Company, 1210 Grand Avenue, Expeas City, Missouri, in reyment for a used portable Remington typesriter. This money order, too, was in the ascent of \$75.00 payable to Willard J. LeGride with the vurchaser being shown as Vernon McBride. The manager of this lim, being cospicious of this transaction, directed an employee to follow the custom: The employme moted the model and make of the automobils entered by the customer and the license number of the car. Later when this money order are ascertained

to have been stolen a description of the customer and his automobile was given to post office inspectors who alerted the Missouri State Highway Patrel. A highway patrolman on March 23, 1959 at Mannibal, Missouri arrested in this automobile Falter Terry Mife, Jemes Earl Ray, and a voman companion on her her released. Thirty-four of the money orders stolen from the Kellerville, Missis Post office were found hidden under the dash above the glove compartment in this automobile. All of them had been stamped with the validating stamp. Some were made out ready for cashing while others were not.

On March Ch. 1955 Rife executed a statement for costal inspectors in which he admitted he had prepared, forged and uttored the postal money order presented to the Chaffee Office Supply Company in Tansas City. He admitted bregaring the rane, order which was attered on forged endorgement at askin's clathing Company, Lancar Clity, Missouri. He additued that he and prepared the lace of the noney orders made ready for ceshing and which were found in the automobile in which he was arrested. He admitted eaching numerous other money orders on forged endorsements in the states of Florida, Louisiana, Frances, and Piscouri. We recalled wasuccessfully attempting to cosh the money order at Altor, Illinois on March 6, 1955. In his statement he admits that he purchased in Coincy, Illineis the stolen comey orders. They were sold to him by an unidentified man for \$20. On March 2k, 1955 Ray, declining to excente statement for postal inspectors, did yezhally state that he had participated with "ilo in the coshing of the stolen money orders in the various states. He decied noticelly knowing that the money orders were stolen. However, he shalltedly presimed that they were for he had been told by Rife that they had been purchased for (20. He admitted that it was he who forged and uttered the consy order presented at Askin's Clothing Company in Kansas City, Missouri. He stated that he curchassi for Il in St. Louis, Missouri from a "Wino" named Willard J. McBride the identification he and Rife used in uttering the money orders.

The two money orders attered by Rife and Ray in Fanses City, Cleareri and as well the money order Rife attempted to utter in Alton, Illinois have been recovered. As noted previously thirty-four of the money orders were recovered in the automobile. On April 15, 1955 when reinterviewed by costal inspectors Rife and Ray gave particulars relating to the cashing of twenty-seven additional stolen money orders located by the Regional Accounting Office. The particulars are as set out in the following table:

Two of the stolen money endors have not yet been recovered. They, housver, are the counted for as Ray has admitted eaching one of them at a luggage store in Lancas City, Kennas and Rife edults cashing one of them at high Beach, Florida.

It is pertinent to note that following the apprehension of Rife and Ray postal inspectors obtained from the room which they accepted a quantity of merchandles they had acquired by passing the stolen mensy exters. Found in their room ward a typewriter, several pieces of luggage, a radio, a camera, a wristratch, a considerable quantity of now wearing appared for Man, and other items. They have authorized the postal inspectors to return this merchanding to the stores or individuals from when it was obtained.

II. PRICA MACORD:

Defendant reluctantly civited to the writer this while intendented he hold up a textent driver. On 7-7-52 he was received at the Illinois State Fricon, Featies, Illinois in transfer from Joliet, Illinois institution. He was released by minimum empiration on 3-12-54.
- 8-30-5h : Sheriff, Edwardsville, Illinois burglary and largery.

 Defendant states that he burglarized a cleaning sheep in

 East Alton, Illinois but denies stealing entiting. Although
 no disposition has been made on this charge of burglary has
 apparently is not wanted.
- 3-23-55 : Esmateal, Miscouri police for instant offense. Releaced to federal authorities following day.

III. PAMILY HISTORY

Defendant

This defendant, age 27, was born in Alton, Illicois.

He is an only child. He recided in the parental home in Alten until age 18.

During that time, however, he frequently visited with his paternal grandparents in Quincy, Illinois. When about age 18 he entered the anny. Following displays from military service in 1956 he recided for a short time in Quincy, Illinois. He then moved to Chicago, Illinois there he resided for a period of about aix menths before moving to less Angeles, California. As noted in the section, Prince Record, he was convicted of burglary and sentenced to jail in less Angeles. The released on probation from that sentence he returned to residence in Chicago where he lived alone until he was committed in June of 1952 to the Illinois State Penitentiary. Since his release from the Illinois State Penitentiary in March of 1956 he had been rether transient living principally in Quincy, Illinois.

Pather

George Ray reportedly died of a beart condition in 1967 at ago about

k9. He was an employee of the Chicago, Burlington, and Quincy Railroad and repertedly had no arrest record.

Mother

Lucille (nes Haher) Ray died of a Liver condition in 1919 at aga 51.

Other relatives

Defendent refuses to identify his several cents and uncles the reside

in Cuincy, Illinois.

IV. HOME AND MEICHBORHOOD:

when not incorporated defendant has lived principally in Alton and Quincy, Illinois. Since his release from the Illinois State Penitentiary in March 195h has been rather transient. His last known residence for any period of time was at the Virginia Hotel in Quincy, Illinois.

V. EDUCATION:

Defendent states that he completed the lot through the 6th grades at St. Kary's School in Alton, Illinois. He states that in 1952 while residing in Chicago, Illinois he attended the Academy of Adults and obtained the equivalent of a two-year high school education.

VI. RELIGION:

Defendant danies any effiliation. His mother was Cathelic, and his father was Protestant. While in military services he infrequently attended Cathelia services.

VII. INTERESTS AND ACTIVITIES:

None.

VIII. HEALTH:

Defenient is 5' 10g" tell, voighs 170 lbs., has a raidy employion, bire eyes, and brown hair. There are no apparent marks or scars of identification. He apparently is in good health. He states that before becoming involved in the instant offense he was in the process of potitioning for edmittance to a Veterans Hospital in Illinois for a general physical checkup. He desics a history of current other than a tennillectory in Chicago in 1952. He desics a history of veneral disease or the use of marcotics. He states that he is a "moderate drinker."

IX. EMPLOYMENT AND MILITARY HISTORY:

Defendent states that at Alten, Illinois on February 19, 1946 he enlisted in the U.S. Army. He received his basic training at Comp Grander, Miscouri. To was then transferred to Comp Ailmer, Now Jersey to await transportation to the European Theater of Operations. He states that he left the continental limits of the United States for Germany in July of 1946. Gverseas he was attached to the 382nd Kilitery Police Detiplion. He eduits that he was once ANOL for a period of two days which resulted in a suspended centence to confinment for period of sixty days. He returned to the United States from Cermany in Describer of 1948 and was, he states, on December 23, 1948 given a general discharge under honorable conditions.

Defendent states that his last employment was with an uncle when he refuses to identify but who resides in Quincy, Illinois. He worked for this uncle as a painter for a period of time in the summer of 195h.

He claims that from August 1951 to May 1952 he was employed by the Borg Erick son Corporation, Chicago, Illinois. This employeems was terminated when he was arrested for robbery, which eventually resulted in a panitantiary sentence.

He states that from July of 1950 to June 1951 he was employed by the Arbey Corporation, Chicago, Illinois. He was discharged from this employment for absentesism caused by his arrest in Alton, Illinois for vagrancy when visiting in that city.

He claims that from April 1950 to July of 1950 he was employed as a laborer of a wage of 90s per hour by the Nos Produce Company, Chicago, Illinois. Es claims to have left this employment to accept more lucrative employment.

From July 1949 to September 1949 deferment states he was employed as a laborer at a wage of \$1.10 per hour by the Dryden Rubber Company, Chicago, Illinois. He quit this job to move to California.

He purports that from May 19kk to December of 19kh he was employed at a wage of 654 per hour by the International Shee Company, Hartford, Illinois. He indicates he was laid off by this employer in a general reduction of forces and that he then entered the ermy.
