Approximately 1:00 PM, 6/5/68, Mrs. BEVERLY B. VIAL, age 40, residing R1, Box 262, Hahnville, La., Home Phone 783-2312, Business Phone 729-3454, telephonically advised the following.

82-2795 The shooting of Senator KENNEDY has prompted her to reveal transpirations of several conversations she has had in the recent past with S. GERALD FUEX, age 42, residing 1508 Mirabeau Street, New Orleans, La., Apt, B. FUEX, a World War II Air Force veteran and a classmate of hers at L. S. U. during the late 1940's, recently contacted her and has asked her to coffee several times. This is The first time she has seen FUEX since college days. During their conversations FUEX has constantly talked of violence, which upset VIAL; however she passed off these remarks as meaningless, stating that FUEX appeared to her to possibly be a mental case, although she has never heard him mention affiliation with a mental institution.

In their conversations FUEX has referred repeatedly to MARTIN LUTHER KING, stating at least three times that he pulled the trigger that killed KING. Once he mentioned killing Senator ROBERT KENNEDY. When VIAL expressed her horror at the idea he stated that he thought KENNEDY deserved killing. She thinks his exact words, referring to KENNEDY, were, "His mother is going to be very shocked when we (or I) blow his head off". She believes this conversation to have been about two weeks ago.

She has asked two or three classmates from L.S.U. where FUEX has been and what he has been doing in the last twenty years but has been unable to find out anything. Repeated questioning of FUEX has also failed to reveal his past for the last twenty years. When questioned FUEX stated that he was not affiliated with a newspaper. although he attended L.S.U. (and possibly graduated from) in the college of journalism. He also denied being any kind of a government employee including any branch of the Armed Forces. His stock answer to any inquiry about his background is "trying to stay out of Alcatraz". He has, however, mentioned travelling extensively around the United States. He also advised that he had been in New Orleans for the past 14 months.

She described FUEX as age 42, 5-11 or 6-0, thin build, black hair, green eyes, heavy beard but clean shaven, well mannered handsome, usually attired in white shirt and tie with serialized


sport attire or business suit. He drives a five or six year old Chevrolet, white or pale yellow in color. When he came to her home to see her he carried a brand new brief case. The first visit the brief case contained only a L.S.U. yearbook. On subsequent visits it contained a manila folder with pictures of his World War II planes and war buddies. He also had pocket novels depicting the fire bombings of Japan, stating that he had flown on these missions. He took great delight in discussing these bombing missions.

Mrs. VIAL advised that she would be glad to discuss FUEX further if the FBI cared to pay her a visit althoguh she doesn't know very much more, inasmuch as she has been unable to find out anything of FUEX"s background. She stated that he had been trying to arrange further dates with her but that she had been trying to discourage his attentions.

EUGENE SMITH MANSFIELD, Barnes Lane Alburas SA L. M. SHEARER, Jr., on 5-28-68 that he has been working in off-shore drilling for Penrod Drilling Co., and to the best of his recollection he heard of the killing of DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING while on a rig in the Gulf of Mexico.

He advised that since the date of the killing, he has had occasion to talk with several individuals whom he considers members of one Klan or another, and there is no indication from these conversations that the killing was a Klan action.

MANSFIELD was shown I.O. 4182 of JAMES EARL RAY, and he said he had observed an individual who somewhat resembled RAY in a tavern at Wuscaloosa, Ala., in the period shortly after 1-17-68. This individual who resembles photograph of RAY appeared to be friend of a dark-haired barmaid, name possibly NELL, who worked in tavern behind Johnny's Place at Broad St. and Greensboro Ave. The Dark-haired barmaid has a sister, a redhead, who works at Pat's bar, 9th Street and 22nd.

MANSFIELD said he could not say that this individual is identical with RAY, however the resemblance is enough that the individual could be RAY.

MANSFIELD requested that his identify not be revealed as the source of the information if it is to be checked out.

By way of background information concerning MANSFIELD, he advised that he is known to several FBI offices, that he was formerly Grand Dragon of United Klans of America at Houston, Texas, and quit in 1961. He said he is well acquainted with BOBBY SHELTON of the UKA, and that his brother BILLY WAYNE MANSFIELD, was secretary of the UKA subsequent to the death of ALVIN SYKES in S. Carolina.

MANSFIELD said he is also acquainted with L. E. MATTHEWS, reportedly a Klan member at Jackson, Miss., but actual knowledge of his membership is unknown to MANSFIELD.

According to referenced communication, the Intelligence Units of the U.S. Tressury Department have been receiving from Federal Reserve Banks a form known as TCR-1 "Report of Currency Transactions; Person or Organization Concerned in Transaction Reported." These forms are completed or filled in by banks, savings and loss associations, and other financial type institutions when a transaction involves a deposit, withdrawal or other payment or transfer effected by, through, or to such financial institution, which involves the U.S. Currency in which \$10,000 or more is handled.

In view of this, every office receiving this communication will explore the fessibility of obtaining the information from Internal Revenue Service Intelligence Units within their division. It is very possible that the information requested by the Bureau regarding withdrawals of \$10,000 or more from banks could be more readily obtained through the Internal Revenue Service.

If any discussion ensues at banks or other financial institutions, you should not mention the completion and filing of these forms under any circumstances. This information is for your intelligence only.

Prior to receipt of reBuairtel, the New Orleans Division on 5/31/68 contacted Mr. NAURBON PERRY, Group Supervisor, Intelligence, Internal Revenue Service, New Orleans, exploring the feasibility of obtaining information from TCR-1 Forms.

PERRY stated that his office receives these forms through the Federal Reserve Bank and they come from banks all over the Gulf Coast, including Mobile, Alabama. He stated cooperation with regard to completing a TCR-1 Form is for the most part voluntary on the part of the banks. The regulations regarding the TCR-1's completion are handled by the Comptroller of Currency and he pointed out that most banks do not follow these regulations to the letter.

PERRY stated he was specifically prohibited by Statute from disclosing information from the TCR-1 Form, and that he would not be able to disclose this information without the specific permission of the Commissioner of IRS.

During the course of this investigation, appropriate dissemination has been made by the Springfield Division to all law enforcement agencies and mass media contacts within the Division.

Interviews with SI 1656-C

On March 25, 1968, a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, FBI #306 443 A, made at Missouri Department of Corrections on March 17, 1960 was exhibited by SA ELYON H. DAVIS to SI 1656-C. Informant advised that the photograph was familiar to him and was someone that he thought he had known in St. Louis, Missouri, in either 1959 or 1960. Informant stated that he had never seen RAY to his knowledge in Quincy, Illinois. Informant advised that he is very close to WALTER TERRY RIFE and sees RIFE on a daily basis. He advised that RIFE had been living at the home of his brother, LONNIE RIFE at Baylis, Illinois, however, in February, 1967, WALTER TERRY RIFE had started running the restaurant in the Virginia Hotel, in Quincy, Illinois. Informant advised that he would contact WALTER RIFE and determine if RIFE knew anything concerning RAY's whereabouts. Informant advised that he did not feel that WALTER RIFE would cooperate with the Federal authorities inasmuch as it was RIFE's nature to not cooperate with police. Informant advised that WALTER RIFE had been working on a daily basis at the Virginia Hotel in Quincy, and informant knew that in the recent past, RAY has not been in contact with WALTER RIFE.

On April 7, 1968, SI 1656-C was recontacted by SA ELYON H. DAVIS concerning JAMES EARL RAY. Informant advised that he had contacted WALTER TERRY RIFE on several occasions since last contacted and that WALTER RIFE had no information as to the present whereabouts of JAMES EARL RAY. He advised

that WALTER TERRY RIFE had told him he had not seen RAY since RIFE left Leavenworth Federal Penitentiary in 1957.

On April 19, 1968, SI 1656-C was contacted by SA ELYON H. DAVIS and SA THOMAS M. SCHOENHOFER and was exhibited photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, FBI #306 443 A, made at Missouri Department of Corrections on March 17, 1960, as well as a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT. Informant advised that he has never to his knowledge seen this individual in the Quincy, Illinois area. He advised that he had been contacting WALTER TERRY RIFE almost on a daily basis and that this individual is definitely not with JAMES EARL RAY at the present time. The informant advised that he is certain that WALTER TERRY RIFE was working at his restaurant at the Virginia Hotel during the period from March 29, 1968 through April 4, 1968. Informant advised that he cannot remember exactly where he had ever seen RAY, however, he feels it was in bars located on Olive Street in St. Louis, Missouri, and to the best of his knowledge, it would have been sometime around 1959 or 1960. The informant advised that he is certain that RAY has not been in the Quincy area in the recent past or else the informant would know of it.

Informant advised that he personally is acquainted with all of the Country Music Night Clubs in the Quincy, Illinois general area and visits these places quite frequently and he is certain that RAY has not recently been to any of these night clubs.

Informant was instructed to work full time concerning the development of any information concerning the whereabouts, activities or background concerning RAY.

Interviews with SI 1661-R-Prob:

On May 1, 1968, SI 1661-R-Prob was exhibited the photograph of an unknown male allegedly resembling the subject in this matter taken at a Minutemen Meeting. Informant was unable to identify this individual as being anyone he has come in contact with within the Minutemen Organization.

Re Prior Threats to MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

On May 3, 1968, Mrs. EUGENE WALDON (protect), Route 3, West Frankfort, Illinois, mother of JOHN C. MEDIZER, advised her son is presently residing at 5506 E. R. L. Thronton (possibly Thornton) Freeway, Dallas, Texas.

During the course of this investigation, WILLIAM HICKLE, Service Representative, Illinois Bell Telephone Company, Quincy, Illinois, (whose identity should be protected,) has furnished information affording appropriate coverage of all of subject RAY's family and associates in the Springfield Division. All leads derived from this source have been checked and telephone subscribers eliminated as having no connection with this matter.

Records of the Illinois Bell Telephone Company, should they be needed in the future, can be obtained through the issuance of a Subpoena Duces Tecum directed to Mr. HICKLE.

It should be noted that the investigative period of this report precedes the date of KING's assassination; this fact due to Springfield Division's prior investigative interest in JAMES EARL RAY, SI file 88-5361, Bufile 88-41730, entitled "JAMES EARL RAY, Aka - Fugitive, UFAC - ROBBERY FIRST."
