Q. WILLIAM A. MARSHALL

On May 17, 1968, Mr. WOODROW THOMPSON, Parts Manager, employed 23 years with Rust International, Inc., International Harvester (I-H), Inc., Industrial Tractor, and Equipment Company, 1803 West Washington Street, Bloomington, Illinois, advised that there has never been a WILLIAM A. MARSHALL or any employee by the name MARSHALL with the Rust International Company at Bloomington, Illinois. He related there is no other International Harvester Dealer in the Bloomington, Illinois area. THOMPSON further advised that the closest representative for the International Harvester Company is L. C. BARNETT, District Manager, International Harvester Company, 505 Rock Island Road, Peoria, Illinois. Records of credit bureau in Bloomington, Illinois; Police Department, Bloomington, Illinois; Mc Lean County Sheriff's Office, Bloomington, negative. A search of city directory and telephone directory failed reveal any listing for WILLIAM A. MARSHALL or similarity.

Also on May 17, 1968, Mr. L. C. BARNETT, District Manager, I-H, Four Zero Five Rock Island Road, Peoria, Illinois, advised that his office covers the Northern 60 counties for the State of Illinois which includes Bloomington, and his records reflect no one by the name WILLIAM A. MARSHALL as being an employee of his or as being a francise dealer in his district. BARNETT further advised he knows of no recent employee transfers from his district to the State of California. BARNETT stated that any further checks re MARSHALL should be directed to I-H Home Offices, 401 North Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

VIII. MISCELLANEOUS

A. ROBERT HOOD STRADER

- 196 -

On this date Mrs. RCREET STRADER of Lexington, Illinois, telephone 309 355-3145, telephonically contacted the office concerning this matter. Mrs. STRADER, who sounded considerably upset emotionally, advised she expected her husband to return home from Detroit sometime late this afternoon and wanted to know whether or not we would assure that his identity would be protected in regard to any information provided to us concerning the NURKIN case. Mrs. STRADER also asked what kind of protection we could give to her husband who felt his life was in danger.

Mrs. STRADER was advised that any information furnished to this Eureau in confidence would certainly be protected but that we were in no position to physically guard her husband and if he felt his life was in danger this was a matter he should take up with local authorities, however, we were desirous of interviewing him concerning any valuable information he might have in regard to this case and would do so at his convenience upon his arrival. Mrs. STRADER advised she would have her husband contact the office upon his arrival at Lexington, Illinois. She was also furnished the name of the SRA at Bloomington and of the whereabouts of our office there.

Mrs. STRADER stated she and her husband were passing through Memphis at the time MARTIN LUTHER KING was slain. Her haband allegedly overheard a conversation among five individuals one of whom he claims resembles the published photograph of RAY, the subject, in this case, in which they talked about the killing. Subsequently, last Sunday night their car was broken into and on Monday he claims he was followed from Lexington to Detroit by a tan Chevrolet, the registration number of which he was unable to obtain. This car contained two individuals whom

he did not recognize and at a rest stop these men took a shot of him but did not hit him because he "hit the ground". He new fears he is in grave danger for his personal safety because he has information about the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KIND.

Mrs. STRADER was advised immediately upon her husband's return she should contact this office and we would set up a mutually agreeable time and place during which we could interview her husband concerning this matter.

MARGRET CARMICHAEL STRADER, Wife of ROBERT HOOD STRADER, was contacted at the residence of her father, E. P. CARMICHAEL, Route #1, Lexington, Illinois, on 4/30/63. Mrs. STRADER advised of 4/20-22/68. She advised that on the night of 4/21/68 or early morning of 4/22/60 her husband was awakened by the dogs barking outside the farm residence which is located up a fern lane one-half nile from the main rural road. She advised her husband and her father, E. P. CARMICHAEL, upon making a search of the outside area, found that the STRADER'S 1967 Oldsmobile Belta "FS". STRADER advised nothing was missing from the car and no one was left alone from the CARMICHAEL residence on the morning of 4/22/66 en route Detroit, Michigan.

Mrs. STRADER advised that in a short period of time, Mr. STRADER returned to the CARVICHAEL residence. Upon his return,

STRADER stated he had found a note in the recessed area of the speedometer of his ear. (Mrs. STRADUR pointed out that the animal has been broken; therefore, her husband was not normally attracted to the speedemeter). She related this note was made up of words out from newspapers and pasted on the back of a posket calender (unable to describe the calendar). Mrs. STRADER said the note read in substance, "If you go to the police or the FBI you will be killed." Mrs. STRADER advised her husband, after returning with the note. proceeded en route Detroit, Michigan, and after a short period of time had eleged, he telephonically contacted hor, stating he was at the Holiday Inn, Bloomington, Illinois. Mrs. STRADER stated her husban informed her that upon reaching the road one mile north of the CARMICHAEL residence, and Route 63, he saw a 1936 or 1967 Chevrolet. tan in color, no license information, with two non in the car, parked along the road. Mrs. STRADER stated her husband told her that this car followed him en route Bloomington. However, they did not turn into the Holiday Inn whon he did. Mrs. STRADER advised her busband then told her he was proceeding on to Detroit, Michigan,

Mrs. STRADER advised upon discussing above with her parents, her mother, Mrs. E. P. CARMICHAEL, stated she had noticed a late model, tan car, making several trips on the main rural road near the CARMICHAEL residence on the early morning of 4/22/63.

Mrs. STRADER advised that on the night of 4/22/63 her husband telephonically contacted her, but he would not disclose his location as he stated he was afraid to mention his location over the phone. She related her husband told her that he stopped at a rest stop area after leaving Indianapolis, Indiana. Upon leaving his car and walking the direction of the men's restroom, he saw a tun automobile occupied by two men driving very slow. He stated at this time the rider in this automobile fired a shot at him. STRADER told his wife the shot just missed his ear and he, STRADER, hit the ground where he laid as if he had been hit. STRADER stated that the tan car disappeared and he has not seen it since.

Mrs. STRADER stated her husband believesthis action was due to his being in the men's restroom at the Gulf Truck Stop, Lebanon, Tennessee, on 3/27/33, where he allegedly overheard five men planning to kill Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. Mrs. STRADER stated her husband told her that one of the men in the restroom was RAY, whom he recognized after RAY's photograph was published. She stated he further informed her that he would be able to recognize the other men he saw in the restroom. Mrs. STRADER advised she recalls being at the Gulf Truck Stop at Lebanon, Tennessee, on 3/29/68. She stated upon their leaving the truck stop, her husband did not mention to her anything of hearing of the plan to kill KING. She stated she does recall her

husband remarked, "If King goes back to Memphis he will have Mrs. STRADER advised her husband did say he wanted to have a STRAN of NEC, Washington, D.C, whom he knew but did not the desired to see STERN.

Mrs. STRADER advised her husband returned to the Calling of residence at Lexington, Illinois, on Friday, 4/26/68, where he call the morning of Saturday, 4/27/68, at which time Stratility his nother-in-law had an argument over Mrs. STRADER's son by a previous marriage. Mrs. CARMICHAEL told STRADER to leave, which

Mrs. STRADER stated she told her husband she had contest Mr. DONALD T. SULLIVAN, Assistant Special Agent in Charge, Springer Office of the FBI, and that he, STRADER, should call Mr. SULLIVAN and set up an appointment; that Mr. SULLIVAN had informed her he would make an appointment to neet STRADER at any location or at any time when STRADER was available. Mrs. STRADER stated her husband to attempt to meet with FBI Agents, so he followed her husband to make arrangements for a meeting with the FBI. She advised her husband is very much interested in obtaining protection.

Mrs. STRADER advised of some of her husband's activities,' which are not concerning the murder of Dr. KING. She advised that she does not know all of her husband's business and that she is sure he has not told her all he knows.

Mrs. STRADER advised her husband is acquainted with RAYYGND STARMS of Baton Roug, Louisiana, who told STRADER in the summer of 1967 that there were several businessmen in the area of Baton Rouge. Louisiana, who were taking up a collection to obtain money to have KING assassinated. Mrs. STRADER advised her husband is well acqualated in the Eaton Rouge and Denham Springs, Louisiana, area. She stated he was, in the summer of 1967, connected with the E.C. Donnell Construction Company of Denham Springs, La., which was doing constructive work for the telephone company. She related E. C. DONNELL lives in Dallas, Texas. She related DOWNELL had an equipment rental business and while STRADER and DONNELL were attempting to rent the equipment they were trying to gain financing for a recreational park in Louisiasa similar to "Six Flags Over Texas." She related that some way they came in contact with a CHARLES and LILLIAN SHAPIRO (ph) of Minai, Florida, who advised they could finance same but were not interested, in a recreational park but would be interested in financing a horse racing track. Mrs. STRADER advised Mr. DONNELL obtained RAYMOND STARKS to help locate his land which could be used as a horse racing park. He also obtained sanction of the sheriff, (FNU) IRWIN and SAM ECSKO, both of Slidell, La; however, "things got out of hand" and an article

appeared in "Life" magazine and the Governor of Lousiana placed a stop to the entire operation.

Mrs. STRADER advised her husband is in telephonic contact with her daily but declines to furnish information as to his location over the telephone, as he is very afraid. Mrs. STRADER was advised to inform her husband if he has any information he desires to furnish to the FBI, he can contact any FBI Field Office who will then arrange for an interview with him.

CARL STERN. Washington, D.C.. NBC Office, advised a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, that a man (FNU) STRADER, whom he had met on one occasion, while coering a story in the South, had, on April 24, 1968, telephoned him from someplace around Toledo, Ohio. STRADER informed him he was en route to the home of his wife's parents in Lexington. Illinois. He then told STERN a "fantastic tale" about him. STRADER, overhearing a conversation on March 29, 1968 in Lebanon, Tennessee, concerning the killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING. Apparently STRADER was of the impression that the people involved in the conversation knew he had overheard them and they had taken his license number. STRADER believed there had been at least one shot fired at him since that time. STRADER informed STERN he had vital information concerning KING's murder and called STERN for advice as to what he should do. STERN advised STRADER to call the Springfield Office of the FBI and they would make arrangements to have someone meet him at his convenience in their territory. According to Mr. STERN, BISHOP stated that STRADER is afraid to approach any office and may desire to have comeone meet him at a location other than an office.

The files of the Springfield Office contain the following references to ROBERT STRADER, however, it cannot be determined at this point whether or not they refer to ROBERT HOOD STRADER of Lexington, Illinois.

On November 19, 1965, ROBERT STRADER, 6'1" -2", 175 lbs., employed cutting timber near Edwardsville, Illinois, and in construction work at Southern Illinois University, Edwards-ville, Illinois, was considered a suspect in the robbery of the Hamel State Bank, Bufile 91-20560, SI file 91-2642.

In 10-65 presecution of RCSERT H. STRADER was declined in an ITSIV natter which involved a rental car. ROBERT H. STRADER had represented himself as an employee of General Telephone Co., of Illinois, registering at two motels at Bloomington, Illinois, and had skipped without preparly checking out and without paying for his recm. SHRADER could not be located at that time but was described as a white, hale, 35 - 40, 5'10" - 6', 150 lbs., dark brown hair, nedign build and medium complexion. He was subject of Sifile 26-25005.

One RCBERT HOCD STRADER was subject of an ITSMY; UFAP - AUTO THEFT case in which Hilwankee was 00,9/63, Eufile 26-316708, Sifile 26-23408. This individual had a rather extensive arrest record dating back to 11/48 at which time he was AVOL and which involved record of arrest for issuing worthless checks, nail fraud, investigation of forgory, and defrauding an innheeper. ACBERT H. STRADER whose FBI No. was given as 244 633 A, was twice a patient at hospitals, one as a patient at the Patton State Hespital concerning which finger-prints were furnished by the State Bureau of Identification, Sacramento, California, on 8-3-60 and subsequently again on 9-21-60, was a patient at Atascadero State Hospital, California. That individual was described as white, male, approximately 6'3", 190 Ibs., fair complexion, hazel eyes, brown hair and was considered to have suicidal tendencies.

A check through NCIC on 4-30-58 indicated BCBERT STRADER was not currently wanted.

B. INVESTIGATION, ELDORADO, ILLINOIS

JUNE HIMADE, Principal, Eldorado Migh School, Eldorado, Milinois, on 4/29/66, made a search of past condenic records available at the school. It was determined that in 1945 and to the son of J. A. RAY of Wasson, Milinois, and was born on in Saline County and entered the school 9/1/69 and book photograph was examined as to identification with the subject in captioned case. The photo did not appear to be identical.

ENTERA JEAN FOX, noe Choisser, Eldorado Illinois, who is presently secretary to the principal at Eldorado High Echool stated that JAMES DAE BAY was a school mate of hers. The examined a photo of JAMES EARL HAY and stated that she is certain that the two are not identical. She further advised that she has seen JAMES DEE RAY within the past four years and degree that he might resemble JAMES EARL HAY.

C. CECIL RAY

Mrs. FRENCH was contacted at her home on 4/29/68.

She advised that her ex-son-in-law, CECIL RAY, formerly of Vandalia, Illinois, has been to her residence on approximately two occasions within the last five years, adcompanied by an individual who resembled JAMES EARL RAY. It is her belief that CCIL RAY referred to this person as JAMES RAY. Mrs. FRENCH was unable to furnish any more specific information as to the times or when the visits were made.

She stated that CECIL RAY was separated from her step-daughter, JUDITH EARLINE RAY, who resides at 1013 Main Street, Highland, Illinois. They have been separated about four years. CECIL RAY is believed to be employed in JOLIET, ILL., as a truck driver for an unidentified Gas and Oil Company and was last seen by Mrs. FRENCH in 1966. CECIL RAY's parents are deceased but he is believed to have a brother who resides in Vandalia, Illinois, name unknown. CECIL RAY was employed as a bartender at one time at an unidentified bar on the main street in Vandalia. MRS. FRENCH had no photograph and could furnish no description of CECIL RAY.

By way of background concerning MRS. FRENCH, her husband EARL FRENCH was beat to death in Effingham, Illinois, in early 1967 and the case has not been solved. Mrs. FRENCH resides alone with her dog and according to Sheriff A. P. DITTER, is an avid beer drinker. Mrs. FRENCH did not appear to have been drinking at the time of the interview. Shedid refer to the death of her husband on several occasions and mentioned that she knew how

JUDITH RAY, 1013 thin Street, Highland, Illinois, was interviewed April 80, 1833, concerning for knowledge of possible association with the subject, JAMES HARL RAY.

JUDITH RAY, stated that her husband, CDCIL RAY, is at the present time separated from her although they are not diverced. She stated that there is a state warrant outstanding against her husband, CECIL, issued by the States Attorney's Office and divergetible, Illinois, charging her husband with nonemplost of the 4 children which she has. JUDITH RAY stated that it is her understanding from the States Attorney's Office At Edwardsville, Illinois, that her husband may have recently moved to Wisconsin, in order to escape the warrant outstanding against him in the State of Illinois.

However, she stated that his location, if he has moved to Wisconsin, is unknown to her. She further stated that it is her belief that her husband CECHL TAY has not moved to Wisconsin, but is instead living in Vandalia, Illinois, with some of his relatives. She stated that she has an several occasions contapted relatives of her husband in Vandalia but they have roftsed to help her locate her husband. She related that it is her belief that the relatives know the location of her husband but refuse to acoperate with her in finding him and they know the varrant will be issued against him.

Mrs. RAY stated that she does not know of any association which her husband may have had with the subject but said he could have associated withhim before their marriage in 1955 and may have associated sometime since then with him in Alton. Illinois.

She stated that approximately li years ago, she and her husband resided in a downtown apartment in Alten, Illinois, and they resided there for approximately 3 years. She stated that during their stay in Alten, her husband brought numerous friends home with him to drink in the apartment or play cards and he never identified any of these persons with him. She state d that she never inquired as to their identity and would not be familiar with the name JAMES EARL RAY.

Mrs. RAY stated that her husband is wellknown in the Vandalia, Illinois area in that he was raised in that City. She stated that her husband's relatives all live in Vandalia and they possibly may know the present whereabouts of her husband.

She stated that she is anxious to learn the present whereabouts of her husband and that she will cooperate it is the TBI in any way possible in determining his location. She stated that it is her belief if anyone knows his present whereabouts, it will be a member of his family in Vandalia.

It is her belief that his relatives there may be protecting his present address.

She stated that a member of the family most likely to know his address will be GILBERT RAY who lives on Randolph Street, Vandalia, Illinois. She stated that a brother of her husband; LARRY RAY, also resides in Vandalia, Illinois, but his address is unknown.

Another brother, STAMLEY RAY resides in Vira, Illinois, and both parents of her husband are deceased.

Mrs. RAY stated that LEONARD BOWLE is a close friend of her husband and may possibly know his present whereabouts. She stated that he is the owner of Metzgers Tavern, Vandalia, Illinois, and the exact address is unknown to her.

She further stated that PRESTON PRIOR who is the ewner of a Hobil Station in Vandalia, which station is lecated at the junction of the Old Highway and the New Super Highway may possibly know her husband's present whereabouts in that her husband has worked for him from time to time.

Mrs. RAY stated that she knows very little about her husband's associates and that he would be the one to contact concerning them. She further stated that she knew very little of her husband's family background before they were married and those may be some associates at that time that she is unfamiliar with.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROBERT C. HAINES:

At Edwardsville, Illinois

States Attorney LEON D. SCROGGINS, Madison County Court House, reviewed files maintained in his office and stated that a warrant for neglect and refusal was issued for CECIL RAY on complaint of his wife JUDITH in Madison County Court at Edwardsville. He stated that the information obtained at the time the complaint and warrant were issued disclosed that CECIL RAY was residing in Joliet, Illinois, and accordingly, certified copies of the warrant were forwarded to authorities at Joliet.

He indicated that he had no knowledge of the current whereabouts of CECIL RAY and that nothing in file indicated anything except that he was in Joliet.

On 5-13-68, Sheriff LEONARD KELLY, Fayette County, Vandalia, advised there are several members of the RAY family in the vicinity and he was seriously doubtful of any connection with the suspect in this case. According to investigation conducted to locate CECIL RAY, all members of the family are not too smart and prone to using alcohol to excess.

In this respect, LARRY RAY, a lity of Vandalia employee, was jailed over the weekend of 5/11-12/68 for threatening his wife, but released on \$25.00 bond.

MARION KIRKPATRICK, an employee of the USPO, advised CECIL RAY lived in the same neighborhood, but has not been in Vandalia for at least two years, unless very briefly. No removal could be located at USPO, and no mail received during recent past. Tax and voter's records also negative.

GILBERT RAY, City of Vandalia employee in the street and garbage work, advised 5-14-68, he is an uncle of CECIL RAY and, to his knowledge, he has not heard of JAMES EARL RAY, but possibly CECIL could have known him, since at one time he was at Edwardsville and Alton. There is a brother STANLEY RAY who GILBERT believes is in Vira, Ill., where he works at Crane Packing 60. There is a half brother, RICHARD RISLEY, who lives in Joliet, address unknown. GILBERT RAY advised he had not seen or heard from CECIL RAY in several months and the last he knew he was in Peoria, Illinois, working at a Shite (phoenetic) Service Station, probably the Site brand of independent stations.

LEONARD BOWLES firmer associate of CECIL RAY advised he had heard nothing from him for two or three years. BOWLES no longer operates a tavern but helps his son-in-law in the tire recapping business. PRESTON PRIOR former associate, also had no recent information of CECIL's whereaboutes.

During contact with Sheriff KELLY and Chief DALE SLATER, May 14, 1968, both advised that the entire family of this group "were a little on the stupid side."
