CHANDLER was contacted on June 18, 1968, at Scottsboro, Alabama, and furnished a pamphlet concerning which he had written to the Birmingham office. The original of this pamphlet is an application with the Palmer Writers School, Minneapolis, Minnesota, which is being furnished the Bureau, and Xerox copies thereof are being furnished New Orleans and Memphis.

It is noted that the typewritten name ERIC A. WAGGH, which appears above the name CHARLES MARTIN, Inspectors of Petroleum, New Orleans, Louisiana, may have been typed by a different typewriter than MARTIN's address.

together with background information furnished by WAUGH, the possibility exists that same may have been written by subject RAY, based upon photographic specimens of his handprinting furnished the Birmingham office by the Bureau, by Routing Slip dated June 17, 1968. This, together with the fact it is known that RAY was visiting in New Orleans on March 22, 1968, which was the date indicated the Palmer Writers School pamphlet was executed, plus RAY's known propensity for correspondence courses, makes it desirable that investigation be conducted at New Orleans, as set forth below.

The FBI Laboratory is requested to make a handprinting comparison of the executed portions of the Palmer Writers School pamphlet filled in by ERIC A. WAUGH, with known handprinting specimens of subject RAY and that Birmingham, New Orleans, and Memphis be advised of the results.

WALTER STEWART came to the Lake Charles area from Orange, Texas, approximately June, 1967.

Employed: Working construction jobs with the ODELL VINSON CO., East Broad St., Lake Charles, La., since August, 1967. Presently working on a job in Port Sulphur, La., with the ODELL VINSON CO., as a subcontractor to the Coastal States Gas Producing Co. in Port Sulphur.

Social Security [redacted]

WALTER STEWART reportedly resides with his sister and brother-in-law, (FNU) PARKER, in a trailer, at the East Broad Street Trailer Park, 5711 East Broad St., Lake Charles, La. However, STEWART is normally out of town working construction jobs with the ODELL VINSON CO.

The New Orleans indices reflect no previous references to the name WALTER E. STEWART. However, the New Orleans Office files reflect numerous references to the name WALTER STEWART, none of which are believed by the writer to be identical with above described subject.

The New Orleans indices reflects only one reference to the name WALTER STUART. This WALTER STUART, is not believed by the writer to be identical with above described subject WALTER E. STEWART.

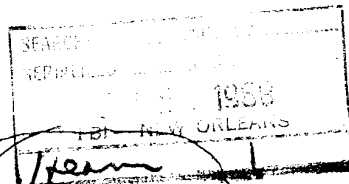

Re Birmingham airtel, 6/21/68, which set forth results of interview with AUBRY DUE CHANDLER, Scottsboro, Ala., together as an enclosure a pamphlet application with the Palmer Writers School, Minneapolis, Minn.

OSCAR J. KELLER, District Manager, Inspectors of Petroleum, 5138 Oleander, New Orleans, La., advised SA EDWARD J. GARNETT, JR., as follows on 6/25/68:

DEREK ALBERT WAUGH is currently an employee of the Inspectors of Petroleum Co., and is in training as a petroleum inspector.

WAUGH, born [redacted] at Belfast, Ireland, is a British citizen and is in the United States as a non-resident alien. WAUGH was recommended for employment with the Petroleum firm by a Petroleum firm employee who had met WAUGH in Panama. WAUGH by profession is a radio officer and prior to entering the United States, sailed on tankers under the flags of different countries out of England.

WAUGH has been employed by the Inspectors of Petroleum Co., since 1/1/68 and when he arrived in New Orleans, he took a room in a rooming house at 2028 Tulane Ave., New Orleans. KELLER recalls that WAUGH lived at

this address because on one occasion KELLER drove WAUGH home at the end of a day's work.

KELLER advised that WAUGH is a promising trainee and that because of his alien citizenship, he was encouraged by the company to participate in correspondence courses such as handwriting in order to better equip himself as an employee. KELLER had no specific knowledge that WAUGH may have enrolled in a commerce handwriting course.

KELLER described WAUGH as being 5'11", 165 pounds, reddish hair, cut short.

R. J. GONZALEZ, 225 South Salcedo, New Orleans, La., on 6/26/68, advised that he is the owner of the residence at 2928 Tulane Ave., New Orleans. GONZALEZ advised as follows:

During early 1968, he ran ads advising of the availability of rooms for rent at 2928 Tulane Ave., which neighborhood is a low class transient type area.

WAUGH telephonically contacted GONZALEZ in response to one of these ads and advised that he was from England, was learning the oil business, and needed a room. GONZALEZ met WAUGH at the 2928 Tulane Ave., address and WAUGH rented Apartment #3 at that address. The effective day of rent was on February 19, 1968 and WAUGH remained at that address until 4/19/68 when he moved elsewhere with a forwarding address not known to GONZALEZ.

GONZALEZ displayed his rental book and it disclosed that DEREK A. WAUGH was a renter from 2/19/68 through 4/19/68.

GONZALEZ described WAUGH as a pleasant individual, who was about 30, 6', 175 pounds, slender build, and blond hair.

He stated that WAUGH furnished no information about his background other than to indicate he would probably be working in Baton Rouge, La., from time to time in connection with the oil business. (KELLER mentioned that WAUGH had taken some training in Baton Rouge for his company).

Both KILLER and GONZALEZ viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY with negative results.

New Orleans will review the INS file in the name of BRECK A. WAUGH for further background information, conduct credit and criminal checks and advise Bureau, Birmingham and Memphis.

On the basis of investigation conducted thus far, it does not appear that subject RAY rented any facilities at 2828 Tulane Ave., during March, 1968.

On 6/6/68 SIDNEY GERALD FUEX, residing in Apartment B, 1508 Mirabeau, was interviewed by SAs LARRY E. ENGLEBRIGHT and RONALD J. GIBBS. FUEX was advised of the reason for the interview. He was advised he did not have to answer any questions; however, he stated he would be glad to answer any and all questions. It was noted by the interviewing agents that FUEX did not resemble JAMES EARL RAY in any way. FUEX advised as follows:

He came to New Orleans in September, 1966, and has resided at his present address since that time, living in semi-retirement inasmuch as he suffered a stroke and is partially disabled. Immediately prior to this he resided in Houston, Texas, where he was employed by Great Southern Life Insurance Company until June, 1964, when he suffered a stroke. His present income is \$350 per month, dividends from a guaranteed income insurance policy.

He denied ever making any violent statements concerning MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., or ROBERT FRANCIS KENNEDY. He viewed a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and advised that that individual was unknown to him.

During the interview FUEX sat stiffly with legs crossed and foot constantly tapping. He answered all questions promptly in crisp, clipped words, offering no elaboration whatever, and did not appear to be in control of all his mental faculties.

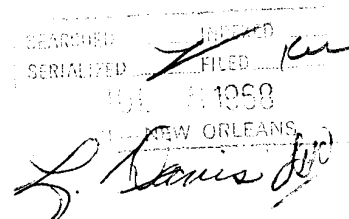

SAC JENSEN, Memphis, telephonically advised that a thorough check should be made of unsolved bank robberies in the New Orleans Division, particularly concerning the time December 1967 and March 1968 when RAY was in Louisiana.

SAC JENSEN stated that RAY had entered a bank in London on 6/4/68 with a bag, a note which requested money in five and ten pound notes, and robbed the bank of \$250. They had a latent fingerprint on the bag which was recovered, which proved it was RAY. He further advised that Scotland Yard has RAY as a suspect in a similar bank robbery in May of 1968 and possibly June of 1967.

In view of the above he requested a recheck be made of our cases and any having possible evidence, latent or otherwise, being sent to the Lab for examination and that the New Orleans PD be checked for any similar armed robberies which might fit RAY. SAC JENSEN stated this would help solidify the theory that RAY was not "paid for the job" but rather was obtaining his money from these type robberies.

One copy of this report is being provided to the Houston and San Antonio Offices for information purposes in anticipation of assisting in any subsequent investigation.

The purpose in submitting this report even though it contains the results of negative investigation is because information had been previously reported that allegedly the subject was observed on the evening of 12/16/67, making a telephone call from a coin box while being accompanied on a trip from Los Angeles, California, to New Orleans, Louisiana, by CHARLES STEIN, during the period December 15 - 17, 1967. This call was allegedly placed from a pay telephone in the area near Houston, Texas.

It has also been alleged that the subject may have made several telephone calls while traveling through Texas.

It has been further alleged that the subject had indicated that his purpose in traveling to New Orleans was on business and the subject had mentioned an Italian sounding name as the person he was to contact.

Referenced Houston airtel, dated 5/2/68, contained a list of 281 calls made 12/15 - 17/67, from within the Houston Division to Louisiana.

Referenced Houston airtel, dated 5/6/68, contained an additional 75 phone calls made 12/15 - 17/67, from within the Houston Division to Louisiana.

Referenced San Antonio teletype contained a list of nine calls made from within the San Antonio Division to Louisiana.

In view of the allegations previously set forth, New Orleans is reporting only the results of interviews of persons residing in the New Orleans area.

The subscribers of the rest of the calls to other parts of Louisiana furnished by the Houston and San Antonio Divisions have also been determined. These persons who still reside in Louisiana have been located and interviewed, and no pertinent information relative to this investigation was developed. The results of these
