RE: RAOUL

In Montreal, RAOUL, after eight meetings with RAY, offered him living expenses, a good car and ultimately travel papers and \$12,000 if RAY would return to the United States, establish himself in Birmingham and be "available" and the article stated how RAY accepted this offer made by RAOUL at Earl Station in Windsor, Montreal, at 3:00 p.m., 8/21/67. On that date, according to RAY, he again repeated the telephone number where RAY could contact RAOUL at New Orleans in an emergency.

In the article it stated, on his way to Mexico, RAY mailed the safety deposit keys to the bank in Birmingham as "I was sure I would never see Birmingham again." RAY again said in reference to a meeting with RAOUL in Mexico he told RAOUL he wanted to go to Los Angeles and wait there and "RAOUL said O.K., but for me to let him know where I was by calling New Orleans, telephone number from time to time and that he would write me care of General Delivery in Los Angeles."

In the article in late November allegedly RAY left Mexico and went to Los Angeles and "almost immediately I received a command to come to New Orleans for instruction"; that "RAOUL had written me and told me to meet him at a certain bar in New Orleans at a certain time on 12/15. He said he only wanted a conference, that I would be going back to Los Angeles. STEIN and I took turns driving and drove day and night."

"Three hours after I got to New Orleans I was ready to leave. RAOUL just wanted a report on what I had been doing. He said we had one more job to do, and we'd do it in about two or three months. Then we'd be finished and for sure, he'd give me complete travel papers and a passport."

When I asked him what the next job was, he said not to worry about it and not to ask questions. Then he gave me another \$2500, all in 20-dollar bills. I wanted to leave for Los Angeles that night, but Stein was picking up the children and wanted to visit some relatives, so I agreed to wait one day for him."

The article stated RAY drove from California to Selma, Alabama, in March, 1968, and registered on March 22nd at the Flamingo Motel, using the name ERIC S. GAULT. A photographic copy of the registration is in the article showing he was in room 3, paid \$8.32, does not show time he registered in motel.

William Bradford Huie, author, has written a second article for "Look" magazine concerning the travels of James Earl Ray since Ray's escape from Missouri State Penitentiary on April 23, 1967. The second article appears in November 22, 1968, issue of "Look" (circulated November 12, 1968) and alleges the involvement of an individual by the name of "Rasul" in the King assassination. According to the article, Ray contacted "Rasul" in New Orleans, Louisiana; Selma, Alabama; Birmingham, Alabama, and in a motel across the border in Mexico.

The following is a listing of these motels and a hotel in the respective areas in which Ray was alleged to have registered as a guest using the name Eric S. Galt or John L. Bannan.

Each division will obtain a list of the guests registered at the respective hotels and hotel for a period of three days before, during, and three days after the listed period. This list should include, but not be restricted to, name, address, and identification of any vehicle used by the guests. The possibility exists that a common denominator will appear at the above in order that the identity of "Raul" will be established. 11/

In addition, the article sets forth that Ray stayed at an unnamed hotel in Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, 12-7-67. Since it is not known how many hotels are located in Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, the San Antonio Office should conduct the desired investigation only if feasible. Advise the Bureau and Memphis accordingly.

The Memphis Division, upon receipt of this information from the other listed divisions, will completely evaluate this information for possible identification of "Raul." The name "Raul" is Spanish for Ralph and it should be considered that this could be either a given name or a surname.

This is to be handled immediately and results furnished to the Bureau promptly.

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date November 22, 1968

Mr. CHARLIE TRONCALE, owner-manager, Granada Hotel, 2230 Fourth Avenue, North, made available the guest registration cards for his hotel during the period August 22 - 28, 1967, inclusive. A review of these cards resulted in the location of guest registration No. 9022 for one JOHN L. RAYNS, residence 1825 Lafayette St., St. Louis, Mo., who checked in at 9:05 a.m. on Saturday, August 26, 1967, and was assigned to Room 210 by Desk Clerk ADRIAN M. KOONCE at a rate of \$4.50. No record was maintained as to the time of checkout or method of travel. The card reflected the guest had luggage. The original of this card has been forwarded to the FBI Laboratory at Washington, D. C., for appropriate handwriting comparison.

A record was obtained of the names and addresses (where recorded) of the approximately 150 guests, other than permanent residents, during the period for which the cards were reviewed and two copies of the list are being transmitted to the Memphis FBI Office. No guest card was observed for any "RAOUL" or similar name during the period involved.

Upon observing the guest registration card of RAYNS, Mr. ADRIAN M. KOONCE identified his initials as having roomed RAYNS, but stated that due to the elapsed time he had no independent recollection of him. He stated he had previously been exhibited a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and was unable to identify that individual.

No further information was obtainable from Mr. KOONCE or other personnel of the Granada Hotel.
