BILL KILEEN, Manager, Marian's Bar, 615 Iberville, was contacted and subject's photograph displayed. KILEEN advised photographs of RAY unknown to him, and he is certain this person had never been observed by him either at his own bar or at any of the other bars he frequents on Iberville Street.

DANA BARGER, who frequents on a regular basis Wanda's Seven Seas Bar, and who is currently employed at Handy-Dandy Labor Agency, and who has been known to SA HARRIGAN for two years, advised after viewing photographs of JAMES EARL RAY that he is certain he has never observed this person at Wanda's Seven Seas Bar.

CHARLES TAYLOR, also known as Cookie, who frequents Wanda's Seven Seas Bar on a daily basis and who resides at 803 St. Charles and who also has been known to SA HARRIGAN for over a year, advised after viewing photographs of JAMES EARL RAY that he is certain he had never observed RAY at either Wanda's Seven Seas Bar or at any of the other bars he frequents in the 600 block of Iberville Street.

Detective LARRY VIGUERIE, Robbery Detail, New Orleans Police Department, advised that he can recall no incident involving several arrests at Wanda's Seven Seas Bar in December, 1967. He advised he would discuss the matter with other detectives, and if any persons contacted could recall the incident he would immediately advise the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Detective VIGUERIE further advised that the New Orleans Police Department maintains on a daily basis a master list of all complaints received and arrests made in the New Orleans area. This list would contain the address at which an arrest was made or from which a complaint was received, the date this occurred, and the New Orleans police item regarding the incident. He advised that these usually number several hundred each day, and for the month of December, 1967 would total approximately five thousand. He advised he would have one of his detectives check this list for any arrests made during December, 1967 at Wanda's Seven Seas Bar.

Detective GENE EISENMANN, Robbery Detail, New Orleans Police Department, advised that a check by him of the master list of all complaints and arrests made by the New Orleans Police Department during December, 1967 showed that on Sunday, December 17, 1967, at 9:53 PM, four persons had been arrested for fighting outside Wanda's Seven Seas Bar, 608 Iberville. This information was listed under Item #12 544-67. Detective EISENMANN further advised that the arrest involved three white males and one Negro male who were all released the same day on bond. None of the arrested persons were photographed or fingerprinted.

A check of records at the Record Room, New Orleans Police Department, under Item #L 12 554-67, showed that the following persons were arrested on December 17, 1963, at 9:53 PM outside of Wanda's Seven Seas Bar, 608 Iberville:

It was also noted under this item number that the arresting officers were Patrolmen PAUL FLEMING and RONNIE CAMPBELL.

PAUL FLEMING, Patrolman, New Orleans Police Department, advised that he recalls making an arrest in mid December, 1967 outside Wanda's Seven Seas Bar. He advised that a fight occurred between a white and Negro male outside the bar and that two other white males attempted to interfere. All these persons were arrested and charged with fighting, and in addition one of the white men was charged with firing a pen gun and resisting arrest. FLEMING viewed photographs of JAMES EARL RAY but with negative results. However, he advised he is certain none of the persons arrested by him on that date was RAY or even resembled him.

RONNIE CAMPBELL, Tactical Unit, New Orleans Police Department, advised that he recalls making an arrest in December, 1967 involving three white males and one Negro male who were charged with fighting outside of Wanda's Seven Seas Bar. He advised that he could not specifically recall what these persons looked like and after viewing photographs of JAMES EARL RAY stated he is fairly certain none of the persons resembled RAY. He also advised that he regularly works in the area of town where Wanda's Seven Seas Bar is located and is certain he has never observed RAY in that part of town.

Detective JAMES MILLER and Detective EUGENE FIELDS, New Orleans Police Department, who work in the French Quarter area of New Orleans, and have several reliable sources in bars located in the 600 block of Iberville Street, were contacted and furnished their observations on available photographs of JAMES EARL RAY. Both these detectives advised subject's photographs were unknown to them and they stated they would make discreet inquiry regarding RAY among their sources on Iberville Street and that if any positive information developed indicating RAY at any time had been to any of these places they would immediately contact SA HARRIGAN.

On May 6, 1968, information was received from the Springfield Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that ROBERT HOOD STRADER, of Lexington, Illinois, alleged that he had previously been informed during the Summer of 1967, by RAYMOND STARNES, of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, that a group of businessmen in the Baton Rouge, Louisiana, area had taken up a collection to obtain money to have KING assassinated.

The following investigation was conducted by

~~RAYMOND HENRY STARNES~~ was interviewed at his residence, King David Apartments, Apartment F, 2816 David Drive, Metairie, Louisiana, on May 9, 1968. STARNES, who stated his business address is Suite 120, Courtland Plaza, 3900 Veterans Highway, Jefferson Parish, Louisiana, advised as follows:

STARNES is a native of Denham Springs, Louisiana, and is currently associated in a business partnership with EARNEST C. DONNELL, Owner of the Earnest C. Donnell Construction Company, at Denham Springs, Louisiana. Denham Springs is located nine miles distant from Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

STARNES is well acquainted in Denham Springs and knows nearly all of the businessmen in that community, including those who are reportedly members of the Ku Klux Klan and who are considered to be strong segregationists.

STARNES was in Denham Springs in the Summer of 1967, at which time there was considerable racial strife taking place, including marches by Negro groups and opposition being presented to these marches by those individuals with strong segregation beliefs. STARNES stated that he himself is a liberal in his view towards Negroes and that he did not participate in any of the activities that took place in Denham Springs in the Summer of 1967. He stated, however, that he did frequently converse with individuals whom he considered to be members of the Ku Klux Klan, these persons having been individuals that he grew up with in Denham Springs.

STARNES stated that at no time during this period did any information come to his attention that there were businessmen in Denham Springs, Louisiana, or in Baton Rouge,

Louisiana, who were taking up a collection to obtain money to have MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., assassinated. STARNs does not recall of having heard the name of KING even mentioned during the Summer of 1967, nor does he recall any information which would indicate there was a plot to kill any particular Negro or any individual of any race for that matter.

STARNs is against violence and if any information such as a plot to kill anyone had come to his attention, he would promptly notify an appropriate law enforcement agency.

During the Fall of 1967, STARNs recalls that an individual subsequently known to him as ROBERT STRADER appeared at the Earnest C. Donnell Construction Company in Denham Springs making claims to EARNEST DONNELL that he could obtain considerable financing from a SHAPIRO family in Miami, Florida. DONNELL became interested in STRADER's proposition and ordered STARNs to accompany STRADER to Miami, Florida, which he did and at which time he and STRADER met with a Mr. and Mrs. SHAPIRO. It developed, however, that STRADER did not previously know the SHAPIRO family and further that STRADER actually had no contacts or was not in a position to obtain financing for the Donnell Construction Company.

It was during the trip to Miami, Florida, that STARNs realized that STRADER had an apparent mental problem. STARNs recalled that while staying in motels in Florida, STRADER at times became most irrational and envisioned that he was being followed by Federal Agents.

After the Florida trip, STRADER continued to hang around the Donnell Company in Denham Springs, Louisiana, at which time STRADER's wife was also present. In STARNs' opinion, STRADER's wife is also an irrational person.

On one occasion, STRADER, who was doing some work for the Donnell Company, took STARNs' personally owned vehicle with the permission of STARNs on a business trip. STRADER's wife accompanied STRADER on this trip and they did not return as scheduled. The vehicle was subsequently located in Mississippi in an abandoned position. Also at this same time, STARNs and ~~EARNEST DONNELL~~ discovered that STRADER had stolen some property from the company, such as a portable electric typewriter, a brief case full of valuable engineering fittings, a telephone credit card and other miscellaneous items. Also taken from the STARNs vehicle was a .38 Police Special Revolver which was a sentimental keepsake which had been given to STARNs by his father.

The theft of these items was reported to law enforcement agencies but DONNELL subsequently decided not to press charges. The revolver has never been recovered by STARNs and he does not presently know its whereabouts.

STARNs heard from some unrecalled source several months ago that STRADER either was or is presently confined to a mental institution. He has not seen STRADER since late Fall of 1967. }

STRADER was a braggart by nature, frequently announced his animosity towards Negroes but was never known to STARNs to have specifically mentioned MARTIN LUTHER KING or any other particular Negro. STRADER frequently bragged that he had contacts with the underworld but never specifically mentioned anyone by name.

STARNs concluded that he is at a loss to explain why it is alleged that he possessed information concerning a plot to raise money to kill MARTIN KING. He stated that he wanted to cooperate fully with the FBI, which agency he admires considerably and that if any further recollection

concerning the Summer of 1967 in Denham Springs came to him, he would promptly advise the New Orleans Office.

STARNs described STRADER as a white male, six feet two inches tall, 36 years of age and possessing blonde wavy hair. During the Summer of 1967, STARNs personally owned a 1967 Oldsmobile, white over black, bearing Texas license KLX or K LW 491.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent JAMES D. HILL at Gretna, Louisiana:

On May 2, 1968, Mr. MICHAEL KNOWLES, Cadet, Jefferson Parish Sheriff's Office (JPSO), Ident Bureau, advised that a review of his records reflect that CHARLES JOSEPH STEIN was arrested on July 21, 1961, for possession of stolen property. STEIN, at the time of his arrest, gave an address of 4101 Stephen Girard Avenue, New Orleans, Louisiana. KNOWLES advised that STEIN is described as follows:

KNOWLES advised that on the bottom of the arrest sheet there is a notation which states "Lieutenant Vicknair arrested above subject upon word from Lieutenant Roy Jacobs that this subject will be charged with possession of stolen property and held for investigation of burglary."

KNOWLES advised that no disposition is shown for this arrest.

On May 2, 1968, Lieutenant BILL SMITH, Records Division, JPSO, advised that his records failed to reflect that these charges against STEIN were ever filed with the Jefferson Parish District Attorney's Office. Lieutenant SMITH stated that in all probability this arrest was based upon a New Orleans Police Department arrest, and that his department did not conduct any investigation into this matter.

MARIE LEE, 2001 Claire Avenue, telephonically contacted the New Orleans Office of the FBI and advised she wished to point out to the FBI that she did not say most of the things which appeared in the newspaper articles on April 25 and 26, 1968. She stated she did not know anything about MARIE MARTIN, CHARLES STEIN and RITA STEIN being requested to register for GEORGE WALLACE on the California Presidential Primary Ballot and further stated she could not recall the exact date STEIN was in New Orleans. Therefore, it would have been impossible for her to furnish these dates to the newspaper. She also stated she did not characterize GALT as a big spender because she did not know him.

Mrs. LEE said she was making the telephone call to set the record straight concerning her exact knowledge of STEIN's trip and to advise that the newspaper had distorted and added to her story.

RAY CHARLES STEIN, Jr. and his mother Mrs. MARIE STEIN MC LEOD, 3426 Peoples Avenue, were interviewed in the New Orleans Office, on April 26, 1968, by SA PHILLIP M. KING.

STEIN advised that he recalls last seeing his father on the Sunday, approximately one week before Christmas, 1967. He stated at this time he went to his aunt's residence, MARIE STEIN LEE, in the 1400 block of Burgundy Street. The only conversation he can recall having with his father concerning his trip from California, was that he asked his father how he arrived here and he was informed that he "got a ride." He further recalls at this time his father stating that he would be here for one or two days at most. STEIN stated that the name of ERIC or GALT was never mentioned by his father to him, nor any other information concerning the individual who drove his father to New Orleans. He stated he next saw his father at the same address on the afternoon of the following day. On this occasion STEIN stated there was no conversation by his father concerning the identity or any comments about the individual who brought his father to New Orleans. He does recall his father stating that he thought he would return to Los Angeles the following day.

STEIN resides with his mother and has so resided since he was seven months old.

MALONE stated that he did not know JOE's last name, however, stated that he was a "wino" and worked for MALONE for about seven months with the exception of three days when he traveled to Alabama in connection with some sort of family problem. MALONE stated that JOSEPH (last name unknown) left New Orleans on April 16, 1968, and returned on April 18, 1968. MALONE stated that JOSEPH hitchhiked both ways and was brought back to the Music Box Lounge in New Orleans by RAY HILBURN in HILBURN's white Corvair.

MALONE stated that with the exception of the three days that he was in Alabama JOE had been in the Music Box Bar every day for the past seven months or more. In addition, MALONE stated that in his opinion there was no resemblance between JAMES EARL RAY and JOE.

ORTIZ stated that on April 21, 1968, at approximately 7:00 AM, he was in his store and was standing by the safe when an unknown white male, driving a 1965 or 1966 Plymouth Baracuda, brown in color, fast back, bearing an unknown Alabama license, parked in front of the store. ORTIZ stated that this unknown white male was alone in the car and stayed in the car in front of the store for approximately 25 minutes. ORTIZ described this individual as a white male, pale-looking, 40 to 45 years old, normal length dark hair, 170 pounds, and had some type of marking or tattoo on his arm, but exactly what is not known.

ORTIZ advised that he had a newspaper which contained JAMES EARL RAY's picture in it and that he looked at the photograph while this unknown white male was in the grocery station. ORTIZ stated that this unknown white male looked like the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY published in the newspaper. ORTIZ was shown photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, and ORTIZ stated that the unknown white male that was in his grocery station looked like the photograph taken of RAY in 1968 with his eyes closed.

ORTIZ stated that, after this unknown white male purchased the beer, he drove off, and it appeared to ORTIZ that the unknown white male was heading for the Canal Street area. ORTIZ stated that he would immediately contact the Federal Bureau of Investigation Office if this individual should appear at his station again.

TRIPPLETT advised that he can be reached at home telephone number 865-1819 and is employed at Sutton's, 823 Canal Street, from 8:30 AM to 5:30 PM, six days a week.

TRIPPLETT said that he could not recall the name of the judge that was presiding in Section G, Criminal Court, on April 9, 1968.

Mr. GEORGE DEMANT, Manager, Holiday Inn, Bossier City, Louisiana, advised on May 11, 1968 that motel has the address of Hamilton Road and has never used Chaney Drive as an address. DEMANT said he has never heard of BETTYE VELANTI or BETTYE PRITCHARD.

WILLIAM THORNTON, Police Department, Bossier City, and Deputy Sheriff VOL DOOLEY, advised on May 11, 1968 their records are negative on BETTYE VELANTI or BETTYE PRITCHARD.

On May 4, 1968, Mrs. ~~MORITZ~~ FROSH, Apartment F, 3501 Dante Street, telephone 488-8915, advised Special Agent HARRIGAN that she was highly suspicious of a person possibly hiding out in Apartment D at 3501 Dante. She advised that the person who rented this apartment was a bartender, whose name and place of employment was unknown, but she stated on a few occasions during the past few weeks, she observed another man coming and leaving the Apartment D, and his general description matched that of JAMES EARL RAY.

Mrs. FROSH further advised that the occupant of Apartment D drove a 1965 black Chevrolet, license unknown, which vehicle was presently parked near the apartment.

Special Agent HARRIGAN observed a 1965 Chevrolet bearing Louisiana license 290B600, parked at 3501 Dante. A subsequent check with the License Bureau determined the registered owner to be JOSEPH KELLY DOMINO, 5316 Wilton Drive, New Orleans.

Mrs. FROSH described the person resembling RAY who had been seen by her coming and leaving Apartment D, 3501 Dante, as a white male, 5' 10" tall, 160 pounds, about 28 to 30 years old, well-dressed in a business suit and dark sunglasses. She further advised this person had been seen by her on the last few nights leaving Apartment D shortly after dark, at about 8:00 p.m.

On May 6, 1968, a check with the New Orleans Credit Bureau contained a listing for a JOSEPH KELLY DOMINO, residing at 5316 Wilton. The date of the credit report was 1965 and his occupation was listed as bartender and waiter.

On May 6, 1968, Lieutenant FRED SOULE, Vice Squad, New Orleans Police Department, advised that JOSEPH KELLY DOMINO was the son of SAM DOMINO, a reported LaCosa Nostra figure in the New Orleans area. He described DOMINO as a white male, approximately 40 years old, 175 pounds, who was presently working as a bartender at the Top Of The Mart, International Trade Mart Building, New Orleans. SOULE advised he had heard that DOMINO reportedly associated with various underworld figures, notably Italians, and had been involved in various New Orleans Police Department investigations for vice and narcotics investigations.

On May 6, 1968, Detective BRADY, Narcotics Squad, New Orleans Police Department, advised that their files showed that a JOSEPH KELLY DOMINO, New Orleans Police Department Number 54 452, had been the subject of some New Orleans Police Department investigations regarding alleged narcotics activities; however, he advised information in this regard had never been verified and they presently had no active investigation regarding DOMINO.

On May 6, 1968, Special Agents KEVIN J. HARRIGAN and EDWARD J. CARNEY, JR., maintained a surveillance of Apartment D, 3501 Dante, from the apartment of Mrs. FROSH, Apartment F, 3501 Dante. It should be noted that Mrs. FROSH's apartment is adjacent to that of the apartment rented by JOSEPH KELLY DOMINO, thus affording excellent observation. This surveillance was maintained from approximately 7:00 p.m., until 10:00 p.m., and no activity whatsoever was noted. Bureau Agents could hear the telephone ring eleven times during this period of time in Apartment D, but no activity was noted.

Mrs. FROSH advised on May 6, 1968, that the bartender who rented Apartment D, was observed leaving that apartment by her early that morning, but had not yet returned. She stated that she had remained home in her apartment all day and had not observed the person resembling JAMES EARL RAY at any time during the day, or for the past several days.

On May 7, 1968, Special Agents KEVIN J. HARRIGAN and NEIL E. PRICE maintained a surveillance of Apartment D, 3501 Dante, again from the Apartment of Mrs. FROSH. This surveillance was maintained from approximately 7:00 p.m., until 9:30 p.m.; however, no activity was observed at Apartment D and no one was observed entering or leaving this apartment.

On May 7, 1968, Mrs. FROSH was reinterviewed regarding the person resembling JAMES EARL RAY that she had allegedly observed entering and leaving Apartment D at 3501 Dante. She stated she has not observed this person for the past several days, but felt from physical description of RAY that this might possibly be RAY. From several photographs she selected the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY taken in California in January, 1968, as generally resembling the person she had in mind.

Mrs. FROSH advised she is a widow and remains at home practically all the time. She stated in the event she observes this person either enter or leave Apartment D, she would immediately contact the FBI.

It should be noted that contact was made with Agents of the New Orleans Office who handle Top Hoodlum investigations and they advise that JOSEPH KELLY DOMINO, son of SAM DOMINO, would probably be completely uncooperative due to his alleged underworld connections. In view of this, it was felt it would be better not to contact DOMINO at the present time and wait for Mrs. FROSH to advise when she again observed the person resembling RAY.

HELEN HILLMAN, Supervisor, Control and Delinquent Unit, Occupational Licenses Administration, Bureau of the Treasury, New Orleans Department of Revenue, New Orleans City Hall, advised that to her knowledge no list of rooming houses exists in her Department. The rooming house permits were mixed in with all of the other Occupational Permits, and a list would entail going through more than 20,000 permits individually. Nothing is filed separately, and all of the files are either in numerical or alphabetical order.

HILLMAN also advised that the New Orleans Health Department did not maintain a list of rooming houses. HILLMAN could make no suggestion where such a list would be obtained.

TIMOTHY A. DRISCOLL, JR., Chief Supervisor, State of Louisiana, Fire Marshal's Office, Louisiana State Office Building, New Orleans, Louisiana, advised that his office did not maintain a list of rooming houses. The Fire Marshal's Office kept records only of buildings which they have inspected and this included very few rooming houses. He added that they do keep records of hotels, motel and some rooming houses which they have inspected; however, all three are filed together, and to get a list of rooming houses would involve going through the entire file which, according to DRISCOLL's estimate, would take weeks. Even then, the list would not be at all comprehensive.

DRISCOLL suggested that the interviewing Agent contact the Fire Prevention Unit of the New Orleans Fire Department.

VAL W. KIENZ, Assistant Director, Fire Prevention Unit, New Orleans Fire Department, City Hall, New Orleans, advised that his Unit did not have a list of rooming houses in the New Orleans area. All the lists in this Department were kept by street number. KIENZ could make no suggestion as to where such a list could be obtained.

JAMES ELLERBUSCH, Supervisor, Department of Safety and Permits, advised that his Department did not have a list of rooming houses in the New Orleans area. He added that it would take months to look through his files, and this would only give a list of rooming houses erected since 1945. On April 24, 1968, SAs WILLIAM F. KUSCH and WILLIAM B. WOOD contacted BEN MALONE at the Music Box Bar, 1936 Canal Street, New Orleans. MALONE stated that he had been running the Music Box Bar for about a month. He stated that the Music Box had formerly been run by one "CHUCK" METHVIN, whom he stated he has not seen since Monday, April 22, 1968. MALONE stated he knew of no bartender working at the Music Box Bar having the name of JOSEPH CLAYTON MONTAGNE; however, he stated up until last Sunday, April 21, 1968, one BILL MILLER had worked at the Music Box and MALONE stated that MILLER was sometimes called "JOE."

On April 25, 1968, WILLIAM MILLER of the Center Hotel on Canal Street, New Orleans, advised SA KUSCH that he was working at the Music Box Bar up until Sunday, April 21, 1968. He stated, however, that no one called him "JOE," and he was unable to suggest who JOSEPH CLAYTON MONTAGNE might be. MILLER stated he was discharged honorably from the Navy on May 20, 1946, and had NSN 9289585.

It should be noted that MILLER bore no resemblance to JAMES EARL RAY.

MILLER examined the photograph of RAY and stated RAY resembled an individual that played in a two-man band at the Music Box Bar in July, 1967. He stated he had no additional information about this individual, as he could not recall his name but stated he had been hired by "CHUCK" METHVIN, previously mentioned.

MILLER stated that he thought that METHVIN was currently residing at Ponchatoula, Louisiana, which is about sixty miles from New Orleans on Route 60.

Mr. H. ALVIN SHARPE, President, The Educoin Company, 940 Perdido Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, furnished the following information:

He was in Chicago, Illinois, on April 9, 1968. At approximately 2:00 P.M. on that date, he went to the Delta Airlines ticket counter at the O'Hare Airport. He explained that he had a return trip ticket to New Orleans, on Delta Airlines and went to the ticket agent to discuss the possibility of changing his ticket to Eastern Airlines so that he could return to New Orleans, by way of Lexington, Kentucky, where he desired to stop for a day. He stated that while discussing this matter with one of the Delta Ticket Agents, he observed a man talking with one of the seat reservation agents for Delta Airlines. This seat reservation agent is located to the left of the ticket agents as one faces these agents. He continued that he thought the man he observed talking to the seat reservation agent was ARTHUR DARDEN, a Marine Engineer, who resides in New Orleans. He stated his attention was drawn to the man when he over heard the man say that he wanted to go to New Orleans. He recalled the man stated that he did not want to go on the flight that took him by way of Atlanta, Georgia.

Mr. SHARPE stated he walked toward the man speaking to him, thinking that he was DARDEN. In speaking he asked this man "What are you doing in Chicago?". The man did not respond, but had a blank look whereupon Mr. SHARPE stated he realized that this man was not DARDEN. He advised that he also realized at that point that the man was shorter in stature than DARDEN. He, therefore, apologized explaining that he thought that he was someone he knew.
