On June 5, 1968, Mr. CLARENCE P. WEGMANN, Assistant Vice-President and Trust Officer, National Bank of Commerce in Jefferson Parish, 2400 Jefferson Highway, New Orleans, Louisiana, advised that his bank has 2,850 safety deposit boxes located in all its branches which are currently active. WEGMANN stated that each box has a card which is located in the respective branch banks and on this card is listed the subscriber to the box and the persons whom the subscriber designates to use the box. WEGMANN stated that a subscriber can grant as many powers of attorneys as he desires to individuals granting them the privilege of using the safety deposit box.

WEGMANN advised that his bank has approximately 45,000 savings and checking accounts. WEGMANN advised that he has no idea who might have withdrawn cash deposits of \$10,000 or more during the month of April in any of these accounts. WEGMANN stated that whenever a large withdrawal is made, a bank officer is not notified. WEGMANN stated that a \$10,000 withdrawal often occurs on a normal banking business day.

WEGMANN advised that he would estimate at least one weeks' work to go over all the records to determine large withdrawals from the bank's accounts or who had access to the safety deposit boxes.

WEGMANN advised that before he turned over any of the records to the FBI, he desired to contact the bank's attorneys for an opinion regarding this procedure.

On May 28, 1968, Mr. ROBERT SCHMIDT, Vice President, Lakeside National Bank, Broad and Front Streets, advised SA WRIGHT that it would be virtually impossible to determine the identity of individuals making withdrawals of \$10,000 or more in cash during the period of April, 1968. He explained that he would estimate that on a daily basis, perhaps 80 to 150 withdrawals in cash are made by customers and no ex separate or individual record of such withdrawals are kept at the bank. He stated that he or some other officer is usually notified of a withdrawal and the check for such an amount is scrutinized by an officer only for the purpose of determining if a kite scheme might be involved. He stated it would be necessary for every account in the bank to be checked for the month of April to determine the individuals withdrawing \$10,000 or more and that this also would be a tedious task inasmuch as many of the depositors of the bank are wealthy rice farmers, businessmen, insurance companies, and industrial plants. He advised that in his experience that iteis not unusual in this area of Louisiana which is considered a well-to-do area for an individual to withdraw \$10,000 and usually much more from time to time in connection with his personal or business reasons.
