GARCIA's father is MANUEL GABCIA, Atthrney, Tampa,

On Saturday, 8/80/68, GARGIA left Pt. Benning, Ga. en route to Gainesville, Florida, where he was formerly a student at the University of Florida. GARCIA took State Road 26 out of Columbus, Georgia, en route to Interstate 75 at Cordele, Georgia. Several miles out of Columbus on "26", at an isolated spot, he picked up a hitchhiker who claimed he was going to Orlando, Florida. GARCIA described this hitchhiker, who gave his name as JACK or HARRY RUSSELL as follows:

He told GARCIA he was a "ratintramp" and had arrived in the Columbus, Ga. area from Seattle by way of New Orleans and Birmingham earlier in the week. He talked as if he knew a great deal about train schedules and functions. He commented a "rail tramp" is hardest kind of individual to catch if he is on the run from

the law as he knows places to hide. He further claimed two Negroes threw him off of a train once causing him to have a concussion and causing his inner ear to fill with blood. He expressed a distinct dislike for Negroes. GARCIA advised that during convergation with this individual he asked GARCIA where he was from. When GARCIA told him he was from Tampa he asked if GARCIA knew anything about the Mafia. GARCIA told him that his father, MANUEL GARCIA, an Attorney, had done some legal work for the TRAFFICANTES in Tampa. He told GARCIA he was going to Orlando to do some work for the Mafia, for which he would receive a new Mercury and \$7000. He told GARCIA upon arrival in Orlando he was to walk up and down a certain street, name unrecalled, in Orlando until someone contacted him. He further stated that from Orlando he was going to Miami after which he would head north through Tennessee, to Idahe, and would feel better when he had a "few G's" in his pocket. He told GARCIA that his job had nothing to do with dope and indicated his job would be done in a week, after when he would be on his way to Idaho. He showed GARCIA a picture which he removed from his billfold of a place where he was going in Idaho. GARCIA recalls this picture showed snow covered mountains and a mountain lake. He claimed he was going to a small camp where he had "laid up" before. GARCIA recalls that he mentioned a waterfall at this place which gave off a spray revealing an image that looked like a reglining woman.

GARCIA advised that this individual appeared to know quite a bit about weaponry and stated that he talked about the AK47, Chinese assault rifle, laser beam, and light anti-tank weapon.

GARCIA advised after arriving in Gainesville he let this individual off on West University Avenue where he claimed he wanted to wash his clothes in a washateria. GARCIA stated that on Sunday, 3/31/68, around noon, he saw this individual hitchhiking on Archer Road toward I-75. He stopped and asked GARCIA if he would give him a ride as fer as I-75, but GARCIA was in a hurry and unable to do so. He has not seen this individual since.

GARCIA stated that he did not give too much thought to the conversation he had with this individual until after the announcement of the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. on 4/4/68. He stated after this announcement he began to give thought to the conversation mentioned herein that he had with this individual, particularly to his expressed dislake for Negroes and he also mentioned the Communist element among Negroes and he therefore thought he should report this to the proper authorities.

GARCIA reviewed all the pending identification orders but was unable to make an identification. He was asked to study the identification order of ROBERT BOLIVAR DE PUGH, IO \$4176, inasmuch as process is outstanding for DE PUGH in Seattle and the description of the hitchhiker somewhat fits DE PUGH. After closely studying DE PUGH, GARCIA stated he could not state whether or not DE PUCH was identical with the hitchhiker, primarily in view of the fact the hitchhiker had such a full bush beard.

The above information is being submitted for the evaluation of the Memphis Division in connection with captioned matter and for evaluation by Seattle in connection with DE PUGH. Any leads to be set forth is being left to the discretion of the office of origin.

Information copies being sent to Atlanta, Miami, and Tampa, in the event it becomes necessary to request investigation by these offices concerning the individual described herein.

FBI Trails Unemployed Seaman in King Probe

ATLANTA (UPI) — FBI agents investigating the sniber-slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. have been on the trail of Eric Starvo Galt, listed as an unemployed merchant mariner, for nearly a week, United Press International learned yesterday.

Galt's name first surged into the headlines Thursday night when a white Mustang auto, registered to him and resembling one that reportedly sped from the King assassination scene, was found parked in an Atlanta apartment complex.

The Rev. Ike Powell, an Atlanta Methodist minister, said he notified police about the abandoned car Thursday. He said two detectives came out but did not appear excited. FBI agents arrived later and were "all over the place," he said.

No warrant has been issued for Galt's arrest, but it was learned that the FBI in Miami had issued — and then for unexplained reasons withdrew — a "locate and notify" bulletin on Galt Thursday.

The Mustang registered to Galt carried Alabama license number 1-38993. A check with Alabama authorities established Galt's address as a roominghouse at 2608 Highland Ave. in Birmingham, but

residents, while recalling Galt, said they had not seen him since November.

In obtaining his driver's license in 1967, Galt listed his occupation as an unemployed inerchant mariner.

The FBI replied with a blanket "no comment" to all questions concerning

investigation, but persons at the Birmingham roominghouse said agents were asking "plenty" of questions about Galt last week.

This was four or five full days before the Mustang was located in Atlanta.

The only official announcements in the King case have come from Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark, who was sent to Memphis by President John-

son to help with the investigation after King was killed by a sniper while standing on a hotel balcony last Thursday.

In Washington last night

Clark said "The physical evidence is very substantial" in the case and "I remain hopeful that (the killer) will be arrested soon."

UPI reporters checking with maritime officials in Mobile learned yesterday that agents, in addition to questioning persons at the Birmingham boarding house, had also made a check of the docks long before the Mustang was found.

A spokesman at the Seafarers International Union in Mobile said agents had visited the union offices two days ago and had gone through automated files, without success, in trying to get a lead on Galt.

Officials at the Maritime Union of America in Mobile said agents had made a similar check there, and the Star Fishing Company, one of the largest firms of its kind in the

area, said it also had been visited by agents.

Agents also checked out Coast Guard files in Washington during the day without finding any trace of Galt.

This raised speculation, which again officials refused to confirm or deny, whether someone, as early as last September, set about to establish credentials for a fictitious Eric Starvo Galt.

Alabama officials said that at the time he applied for his Alabama license, at the age of 36, he claimed to have had a Louisiana license since 1962, but there is no record that he ever turned it in.

The name of Galt was further validated when license tags for the Mustang were obtained under that name on Oct. 2, 1967 in Jefferson County, Ala.

Residents of the Atlanta apartment complex where the car was found remember the

driver as a neatly-dressed man who calmly got out of the car, locked it and walked away.

This description roughly tallied with one given by occupants of a roominghouse in Memphis, where the assassin stood in a communal bath and fired the shot that killed King.

The assassin is believed to have checked into the roominghouse under the name of "John Willard." He was described as calm, neat and well-dressed — an unlikely candidate for the \$8.50 a week room, which he paid for in advance.

Persons at the murder scene reported a man jumped into a white Mustang and sped away shortly after the fatal shot was fired.







HALL stated a white male who was a member of the panel who was sitting on the floor near a Negro who was standing and who was the moderator made several comments that dealt with KING leading the march. The white male, according to HALL, reportedly made a comment to the effect, "If KING leads the march on Washington the march will be a Negro march and the poor white people will be getting screwed." HALL stated that upon viewing the artist's conception of the assassin of KING and comparing the description that had been set forth in local newspapers regarding the assassin, he believes the white male on the above television program who made remarks critical of KING's leadership appeared a similar description to the artist's conception of the assassin. Reference is made to memorandum submitted by this office under above caption on April 10, , 1968.

ALEX TAYLOR, Intelligence Unit, Tampa, Florida Police Department, advised at 5:30 PM, April 10, 1968, that no significant racial incidents had been reported in the city of Tampa during the day-light hours of said date. He said the department had gone back to working regular eight hour shifts, and to regular procedure, that the command post had been closed, and no future racial difficulties were expected.

Mr. TAYLOR was recontacted on the morning of October 12, 1968, at which time he advised that the racial situation in Tampa remains quiet, and no future significant racial disturbances are anticipated in connection with the incident of the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING.

JOHN ALLEN, President of the Charlotte County Chapter, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), advised on April 10, 1968, concerning some "heated exchanges"

and fighting which had erupted between Negroes and white students at Charlotte County Junior High School, Punta Gorda, Florida, on said date. He said there were rumors of impending racial violence due to said situation. Mr. ALLEN said that Charlotte County Sheriff BENT and Punta Gorda Chief of Police ROY ASHEY had been to the school and had helped calm the situation. White parents had picked up their children on April 10, 1968, and had taken them home, according to ALLEN and the principal of the school had decided to stagger dismissal times at the high school and junior high school to avoid having all of the students congregate at the same time. thereby avoiding some violence potential. Mr. ALLEN further stated that the junior high school would not be in session on April 11, 1968, in order to keep the junior high school students separated from the senior high school students, who would be in session.

As of April 12, 1968, no further information has been developed concerning the above described situation at Punta Gorda, Florida, however, no incidents of racial violence have been reported in connection with same.

Appropriate law enforcement and Federal authorities have been advised concerning the situations described above.
