HOWARD STAFFORD called long distance at 11:45 this morning and advised he is staying with his brother ARNOLD GENE STAFFORD in Victoria, Texas, telephone 573-2017. STAFFORD stated at the time MARTIN LUTHER KING was shot, he was living in a rooming house at 336 Hyde Park Avenue, Tampa, Florida. He stated two days after KING was shot a man moved into the rooming house whose name he does not know. He stated he had observed this man on occasions and only from the back. He stated his appearance was most unusual in that his ears did not match. He stated by that he means one was larger and protruding out from his head more than the other one. He stated his build appeared to be the same as JAMES EARL RAY. STAFFOR stated the man's actions were most unusual in that he very seldom left his apartment and on those few occasions that he did leave, it was always late at night or in the early morning hours. He stated he is quite sure that this man was having an affair with a woman who had an apartment adjoining his (STAFFORD). He does not know the name of this woman, but she has been residing at the rooming house for some time. He stated that the owner of the rooming house, a Mrs. SCHUSTER, would be able to furnish the names of the woman and the man. STAFFORD stated he left the rooming house last Sunday and came to Victoria and at that time, the man was still residing at the rooming house.

American is Freed in Mexico In King Case, With Apologies

HERMOSILLO, Mexico (UPI) — A bearded American tourist from Baltimore, Md., arrested and questioned by Mexican police in their hunt for a suspect in the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., yesterday was released with apologies by state authorities.

Daniel D. Kennedy, 42, had been arrested Wednesday in a small cafe in Caborca, 80 miles southwest of Nogales, Ariz., and questioned for 12 hours before being brought in handcuffs to this Sonora state capital.

State police turned him aloose with apologies less than two hours after his arrival in Hermosillo. Kennedy left state police headquarters saying he wanted to continue his trip to Guaymas, a small fishing and resort town on the Pacific Coast about 80 miles south of Hermosillo.

American Vice Consul Arnold Denys in Hermosillo said
Kennedy has been "eliminated" as a suspect through a
thorough check by Hermosillo
"judicial police" of his background, circumstances, facial
teatures and fingerprints."

Denys said Kennedy was traveling on his own, very nicely trying to learn about the Mexican people, when he was picked up because a hotel manager thought he matched the description of the sus-

Denys said Kennedy was "very upset" and insisted on being returned to Caborca, where he was picked up, and where he had a \$5 a day hotel

room.
Denys said he felt the request justified and state police had returned Kennedy to Caborca.

"We turned him loose less than two hour after he was brought here," state police aid. "We had a complete set photographs here from the BI, and fingerprints of the

"This man didn't match the photographs or fingerprints at

Hotel Manager Carlos Valencia Beltran in Caborca said he had told police his guest "resembled" pictures of James Earl Ray, wanted by the FBI in connection with King's assassination.

In Baltimore, when notified of her son's arrest, Kennedy's 68-year-old mather. Pearl,

said "it would take a blind man to say that he resembled the man the FBI is looking for."

She said her son had been wounded and awarded the purple heart in combat in Germany in World War II, and that he had left Baltimore March 24. She said he received a monthly veteran's compensation check from the government.

This defendant on April 1, 1955 entered a plea of guilty to an Information in one count which charges that he on or about March 21, 1955 at Ransas City, Minsouri knowingly, wilfully, unlawfully, and feloniously forged a material endorsenant on a C. S. Post Office Department Money order No. 7-12,239,597. On this same date a companion, Valter Torry Rife, entered a ples of guilty in Decimb No. 19119 to an information in one count charging him with the torgery on Namely 71, 1955 of postal money order No. 7-42,239,568. Imposition of sentence as to defendant and his companion was deferred and this presentance investigation was ordered.

The lacts of the case are as follows: In March 7, 1955 the U. J. . ost Office st del'erville, Illinois was burglarised and sixty-six blank W. S. Postal Kozay Orders, Serial Wos. 7-62,237,535 to 7-62,239,600 inclusive, and the office valideting stamp were stolen. On Harch 8, 1955 at Alten, Illinois en unsuccessful attempt was made to cash one of these stolen money orders. On March 21, 1955 one of the stolen money orders, order No. 7-12,239,597, was presented to Askin's Clothing Company, 12% Grand Avenue, Kansas City, Missouri, by an unknown person in payment for a ouit of clothes which was nover licked up after alterations had been made. This money order, which was in the amount of 175.00, was tade payable to Fillard J. McDride with the purchaser being shown as Vernon iciride. Un this same date an unknown person prosented stalen maney order No. 7-12,239,568 to the Chaffee Office Machine Company, 1110 Grand Avenue, Hanras City, Missourk, in payment for a used portable Remington typesviter. This money order, too, was in the amount of 175.00 payable to williard it carido with the purchaser being shown as Vernou McBride. The manager of thus firm, below suspicious of this transaction, directed an employee to follow the custimur. The employee noted the model and make of the automobile entered by the customer the license number of the car. later whom this money order was ascartained

to have been stolen a description of the customer and his automobile was given to post office inspectors who alerted the Missouri State Highway Fatrol. A highway patrolman on March 23, 1955 at Mannibal, Missouri arrested in this automobile Walter Terry Mife, James Earl May, and a woman companion with his been released. Thirty-four of the money orders stolen from the Cellery Mae, Thincis fost office were found hidden under the deem above the glove compartment in this automobile. All of them had been stamped with the validating stamp. Some were mode out ready for eaching while others were not.

On March Ch. 1955 Rife executed a statement for costal inspectors in which he admitted he had prepared, forged and uttored the postal mency order presented to the Chairee Office Supply Company in Manuau City. He admitted preparing the come, order which was attered on forged endorgement at askin's clathing Company, Lancar City, Missouri. He said tood that he ned prepared the race of the money orders made ready for cashing and which were found in the automobile in which he was arrested. He admitted eaching numerous other money orders on forged andorsements in the states of Florida, .ouisiana, /rkanens, and Fissouri, He recalled unsuccessfully attempting to cash the money order at Alto., Illimin on March 6, 1955. In his statement he admits that he purchased in Coincy, Illinois the stolen money orders. They were sold to him by an unidentified man for \$20. On March 2h, 1955 Ray, declining to execute statement for postal inspectors, did verbally state that he had particle ted with it e in the cashing of the stolen money orders in the various states. He defined actually knowing that the money orders were stolen. However, he schittedly presumed that they were for he had been told by Rife that they had been purchased for #20. He admitted that it was he who forged and uttered the sensy order presented it dekin's "lothing Company in Kansas City, Missouri. He stated that he curchasti for Il in St. Louis, Missouri from a "Wino" named Willard J. McBride the identification he and Rife used in uttering the money orders.

The two money orders uttered by Rife and Ray in Manage City, Disserri and as well the money order Rife attempted to utter in Alton, Illinois have been recovered. As noted previously thirty-four of the money orders were recovered in the automobile. On April 16, 1955 when reinterviewed by postal inspectors Rife and Ray gave particulars relating to the cashing of twenty-seven additional stolen money orders located by the Regional Accounting Office. The particulars are as set out in the following table:

Two of the stolen money enders have not yet been recovered. They, however, are all counted for as Ray has admitted eaching one of them at a luggege store in Manager City, Mensas and Rife admits cashing one of them at Michi Beach, Florida.

It is pertinent to note that following the apprehension of Rice and Ray postal inspectors obtained from the ream which they accupied a quantity of newchandles they had acquired by passing the stellar memoy exders. Found in their ream ways a typewriter, several pieces of luggage, a radio, a camera, a wristmatch, a cross eiderable quantity of new wearing appared for him, and other items. They have authorized the postal inspectors to return this merchandies to the stores or individuals from whem it was obtained.

Y. EDUCATION:

Defendent states that he completed the let through the 8th grades at St. Hary's School in Alton, Illinois. He states that in 1952 while residing in Chicago, Illinois he attended the Academy of Adults and obtained the equivalent of a two-year high cohecl education.

VI. RELICION:

Defendant denies any effiliation. His mother was Cathelia, and his father was Frotestant. While in military service he infrequently attended Cathelia services.

VII. INTERESTS AND ACTIVITIES:

VIII. HEALTH:

Defendent 10 5' 10g" tall, weight 170 lbs., has a raddy complexion, blue eyes, and brown hair. There are no apparent marks or scars of identification. He apparently is in good health. He states that before becoming involved in the instant offense he was in the process of positioning for admittance to a Veterans Hospital in Illinois for a general physical chaster. He denies a history of curgery other than a tensillectomy in Chicago in 1952. He denies a history of veneral disease or the use of newcotics. He states that he is a "maderale drinker."

IX. EMPLOMENT AND MILITARY HISTORY.

Defendant states that at Alton, Illinois on February 19, 1946 he enlisted in the t. S. Army. He received his basic training at Comp Crawler, Miscouri. He was then transferred to Comp Ailmer, Now Jersey to await transportation to the European Theater of Operations. He states that he left the continental limits of the United States for Germany in July of 1946. Guerseas he was attached to the 382nd Military Police Bentalian. He edmits that he was once ANOL for a period of two days which resulted in a suspended sentence to confinement for period of sixty days. He returned to the United States from Commany in Describer of 1948 and was, he states, on December 23, 1948 given a general discharge under honorable conditions.

Defendent states that his last employment was with an uncle when he refuses to identify but who resides in Quincy, Illinois. He worked for this uncle as a painter for a period of time in the summer of 195h.

He claims that from August 1951 to May 1952 he was employed by the Borg Erick-con Corporation, Chicago, Illinois. This employees was terminated when he was arrested for robbery, which eventually resulted in a penitentiary sentence.

He states that from July of 1950 to June 1951 he was employed by the Arboy Corporation, Chicago, Illinois. He was discharged from this employment for absenteoism caused by his arrest in Alton, Illinois for vegrancy then visiting in that city.

He claims that from April 1950 to July of 1950 he was employed as a laborer the a wage of 90% per hour by the Nee Produce Company, Chicago, Illinois. He claims to have left this employment to accept more lucrative employment.

From July 1949 to September 1949 defendant states he was employed as a laborer at a wage of \$1.10 per hour by the Dayden Rubber Company, Chicago, Illinois. He quit this job to move to California.

He purports that from May 19kk to December of 19k5 he was employed at a wage of 65¢ per hour by the International Show Company, Hartford, Illinois. Es indicates he was laid off by this employer in a general reduction of ferces and that he then entered the army.

approximately one year before becoming involved in the instant effecte defendant was released from service of a scattenes of one to two years for armed reberry in the Illinois State Penitentiary. In August of 195h he burglarised a cleaning establishment in East Altea, Illinois. Although he conditionly was charged with burglary he apparently has never been before the appropriate court and apparently is not presently wanted on this charge. In 1969 in Les Angeles, California he was convicted of burglary and sent most to light measure in the causing jail. After serving ninear days of this estates he was released on probables for a period of two years.

Defondant shows absolutely no remains at this time. He anticipates receiving a substantial centence for the instant offense. In writer's epinion he is a confirmed criminal and a mounce to espicitly when in the free world.

On 4/24/68, Chief Deputy JOHN SHANNON, Charlotte County SO, and Identification Officer ROBERT PRESCOTT were furnished additional identification orders of subject JAMES EARL RAY, IO # 4182. Chief Deputy SHANNON advised that on that date he had had contact with one ALFRED T. LANG, Clerk, Charlotte County Courthouse in Punta Gorda, Fla., to the effect that LANG may know the subject.

On 4/24/68, ALFRED T. LANG, Clerk, Charlotte County Courthouse, Punta Gorda, Florida, advised that he, LANG, was a clerk at the Duval County Court of Court Office, Jacksonville, Florida, from 1958 to June of 1966, at which time he left Jacksonville and arrived in Punta Gorda, Fla. He advised that while in Jacksonville he became familiar with the RAY brothers who consisted of JAMES RAY, ROBERT RAY, (FNU) RAY, a fourth brother who was drowned 4 or 5 years ago, and a fifth brother - (FNU) RAY.

LANG was shown the identification order of the subject (JAMES EARL RAY) and he advised that it (the identification order) looks quite a bit like the JAMES RAY whom he knew in the Jacksonville area, but this photograph depicts a person who has gained much weight.

MR. LANG described the JAMES RAY who he knew as follows:

He stated that he is not certain that the identification order is the same as the JAMES RAY whom he knew.

LANG explained that while he was employed at the Clerk's Office at Duval County, the RAY brothers, each of whom were married and each of whom had families, obtained control of one of the volunteer fire departments, in particular the Oakwood Community Volunteer Fire Department. During the course of examination of the records of the department, it was determined that the inventories were false and subsequently the Oakwood Community Volunteer Fire Department was disbanded and moved to another location in order to get the RAY brothers out of it.

MR. LANG advised that the signature on the identification order also looks somewhat like the signature of the JAMES RAY whom he knew. He further stated that the family came from the St. Louis, Missouri, area. He has not seen or heard from any of the RAYs since he departed Duval County in June of 1966, and he has no information whatsoever which might be of assistance in locating the family other than the information as set forth above. He advised that his only contact with them was because he was a member of the Clerk's Office of the Duval County Courthouse.

On 4/24/68, Sergeant W. SOURS, Punta Gorda PD, was contacted regarding this matter and was furnished

Did Castro Hire Dr. King's Killer?

This is the challenging question being discussed behind the scenes as the law enforcement agencies of the Federal, state and local governments are combining their efforts to capture the fugitive.

Suspicion points in the direction of Castro's Cuba, where the Red Chinese brand of communism is popular. It relies heavily on terrorism, political bombings and guerrilla tactics. A small clique of criminals has been engaging in conspiracies to carry on these activities in other countries in this hemisphere. Within the past three years there have been attempted assassinations in Brazil and Bolivia and actual assassinations in Venezuela and Guatemala. In each case, a high official or former official active in public affairs was the target.

THE FBI on Monday night sent out an order to police in Florida to be on the lookout for and pick up Eric Starvo Galt, the prime suspect in the killing of Dr. King.

An exhaustive check of fingerprints shows that Galt is the same person as James Earl Ray, who escaped from the Missouri state penitentiary in April, 1967. An examination of Ray's crime record—covering a number of years and imprisonment several times—gives the impression that he is not an overly intelligent individual. His fellow prisoners say he was fanatically eager to accumulate money by any means possible. He was the type of man who might readily have been enticed by the prospect of heing paid a large sum if he disposed of Ipr. King.

It seems unlikely that any of the racial groups inside the United States would have taken the risk of hiring someone to kill the Negro minister, particularly when there are so many other leaders to carry on with even more intensity the campaign he started. The search for a motive, therefore, turns toward the international side.

King and thus provoke disorders throughout the United States? Obviously, the assassination of one of the principal Negro leaders would cause deep emotion to be manifested and increase bitterness between the races. The Communists would look upon this as the fulfillment of one of their objectives.

The Red Chinese especially would like to see America in such great disorder that the government here would turn its attention from military operations in Vietnam and be compelled to concentrate on the home front.

Cuba as a base of operations is rather handy for the Communists. Their agents can come and go almost at will throughout the hemisphere. Several times in recent weeks planes have been hijacked over Florida and flown to Havana. Defia nite proof has been obtained that some of the troublemakers detected in differen Latin - American countries had come from Cuba and had been trained in provoking disorders. It is natural, therefore, for law enforcement agencies here to assume that the killer of Dr. King either has escaped to Cuba or is hiding in Florida in the hope of being smuggled to Havana.

A LARGE AMOUNT of reward money, totaling more than \$100,000, has been offered for the capture of the assassin. Many people do not realize that a portion of the fund would go to anyone who furnished a clue which could lead to the capture of either Eric Starvo Galt or his fellow conspirators. A small bit of information might prove very significant and result directly or indirectly in the arrest of the murderer. The wide publicity given the pictures of the suspected assassin is part of the effort to remind people who may have had some contact with the killer that the knowledge they possess could be of value in piecing together the story of what happened prior to the assassination.

A belief prevails here that Galt or Ray — whatever the name he uses — was not himself capable of planning the crime and that he must have had the guidance, if not the assistance, of other persons in a conspiracy. The general feeling now among those officials studying the case is that the killer was hired and was promised a large sum of money



Maybe Ray Wasn't Loner

By MAX LERNER

Consider the man called James Earl Ray, who also seems to have used a num-Her of other names, among them Eric

Starvo Galt, and is now the target of a vast manhunt. When Martin Luther King was killed, the first widespread impulse — which I shared with others was to assume that the bullet had been governed by the assassin's passion of racist hatred.



I wrote that the man, like the act, had

been "sick, sick," but LERNER
if Ray is in fact the man who pulled the trigger — and obviously that must remain in "if" until all the evidence is in-the theory of a single hate-governed assassin may not hold up.

Another theory, which cannot be ignored and is gaining some credence, is that it was a "contract job," much like any gangland murder, with some petty criminal punk serving as the gunman, but also with precise planning for the murder and getawav.

This does not rule out racist hatred on the part of the gunman himself, who may have lent himself more readily to the killing because it jibed with his own twisted broodings about how to set the world right, but it puts the focus not only on the killer but on whatever ether men used him.

FROM THIS ANGLE of vision many of the details now emerging about Ray — his. criminal convictions, his jail terms and escape, his travels, his bank account, his purchases and expenditures — seem to fall into a meaningful pattern. The trail will probably cool and warm again a number of times before the FBI catches up with him if it ever does. For Atty! Gen. Ramsey Clark's early description of the killer as "a lone man on the run" may no longer be

It seems probable now that he was not a lone man, and he may no longer be on the run. If, in fact, there were others who used him for their purposes, his capture now would be intolerable to them, and the indicated course for them would be to kill him before he can be caught. If they are not able to — and that, too, is possible — his capture should uncover quite a story.

Inevitably, of course, one thinks of another killer in another assassination — that of John Kennedy — which has not been cleared up in the minds of many people and may never be wholly resolved. There is even the weird coincidence in the evidence that Galt-Ray made one or several trips to New Orleans, which awakens memories of Lee Harvey Oswald's stay in that city, and of the erratic efforts of Jim Garrison to prove a New Orleans conspiracy using Oswald as a "patsy" and to hang it on the CIA and the

It all adds up to a climate of conspiracy along with the climate of hate. It is well to be on our guard against both. There is hot violence and there is cold violence — the kind that springs out of massive anger and the kind that comes from calculated plan.

Mrs. BERNICE LUND, 7603 Lavender, Clair Mel City, Tampa, Fla. was contacted and interviewed at her residence about 9:30 PM April 24, 1968. She stated she had not anticipated the FBI to contact her. She was advised that the FBI desired to exhibit to her a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY, aka. to determine if he had any connection with her missing son. She related she had not read any of the newspapers of late and was not familiar with the KING murder case. SHe was exhibited a W.F. of RAY and stated she had never seen anyone similiar.

Mrs. LUND advised that she is divorced from her husband, JACK LUND and JACK LUND was given the two sons. JACK LUND has since remarried a young, twenty-three year old, airline hostess, and troubles have ensued in the LUND family. Her sone MICHAEL RANDOLPH LUND, 16 years of age, 5'5, 145 lbs. was last known to her to have been employed washing cars at Britton Plaza car wash with a boy she has now determined to be DON HARTLEY who reportedly lives at 3415 Santiago Tampa with his grandfather, a Mrs. YOUNG, about 55-60 years of age. She has since the disappearance of her son, MICHAEL, been calling around and trying to find out something. She said she now understood that MICHAEL and DON HARTLEY have apparently taken of f for parts unknown as of Wednesday, April 17, 1968 and they haventt been seen since. She said MICHAEL has done this before and they have had to "fly him back."

Mrs. LUND stated she has been told now that DON HARTLEY reported his parents had been killed in an automobile accident and the driver of the car was a negro. She said in trying to find out something about her son she talked telephonically with Mr. YOUNG, whom she described as "all of them are ignorant people", and the most she could find out was that there had been a yellow Camaro, bearing license 365-171, State Unknown, parked in an apartment house dwelling area in the rear of Mr. YOUNG's - also a Cadillac was mentioned - and these cars had not been seen in the apartment house area since April 17, 1968 and it was assumed the two boys could have gone off with the cars or with whoever had them. She said Mr. YOUNG had reported the above to the Police Dept. when she tried to find out who had been in the apartment area from YOUNG, he told her people lived there who resembled different persons, and that he had given all informat on to the Police and possister the persons




