Tampa, Florida June 11, 1968

PERNELL EZZELL

On June 6, 1968, Mr. FRANK WETZEL, Manager, Perdue Radio, Television and Appliances, Incorporated, 2425 Colonial Drive, Orlando, Florida, furnished the following information:

PERNELL EZZELL is a former employee who has been missing about three weeks on this last occasion. He has previously left his job on past occasions and has been taken back. He called WETZEL on the morning of June 6, 1968 from 4:15 a.m. to 5:15 a.m. saying he was in Denver, Colorado. Mr. WETZEL said EZZELL seemed as though he were nervous, crazy or drunk.

EZZELL alleged to WETZEL that he had a great amount of money. He said he had a pile of \$20.00 bills which he had obtained as a result of his part in the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING and the shooting of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. EZZELL remarked that he had proof he was in Orlando, Florida when KING was shot and he was in Las Vegas when KENNEDY was shot if he were to need it. He alleged he was on the payroll of "CIA" and "OSI". He remarked that he had a "38", a "357", "30-30" and a "306" type of guns in the trunk of his car. He said he was using a U-Drive-It car in Las Vegas the previous day with the "357" gun on the seat when he was stopped by a deputy. He said the deputy released him when he produced his Associated Detective Agency card andhis gun permit which he read the number from as being #92B.

Mr. WETZEL said that EZZELL did not threaten any one during his call or indicate that he intended to do any harm to anyone else.

WETZEL said that EZZELL indicated that he was his only friend in Orlando, Florida and he just wanted to talk to him to find out if he could come back to Orlando.

On June 6, 1968, Mrs. FAY EZZELL, 636 22nd Street, Orlando, Florida furnished the following information.

She advised that she married PERNELL EZZELL on February 25, 1967, this being her third marriage. She said they have one... infant by this marriage and she has children by previous marriages. She said that EZZELL has caused her extreme anxiety and debt during their short period of marriage. She said he has deserted her at least three times and he was last seen by her over three weeks ago. said that he had been treated for extreme alcoholism during their short marriage on at least two occasions by Doctor HERBERT COLLINS in Orlando, Florida and she had taken him to the Florida Sanitarium Hospital, Orlando, Florida for the same type treatment. She advised that he has been also treated at the Cherry Hospital for extreme alcoholism but she could not recall the name of the town in which the hospital is located. She said that she hoped that her husband does not return.

Mrs. EZZELL said that PERNELL had called her on June 6, 1968 about 2:00 a.m. and the call lasted until about 3:00 or possibly a little later. She said he stated he was in Denver, Colorado. She said that on one occasion the call was interrupted by an operator who requested that he make a new call for credit charges which he did but the operator did not specifically identify herself as being in Denver, Colorado. Mrs. EZZELL said that PERNELL had called her on the morning of June 5, 1968 during the early hours saying that he was in Las Vegas, Nevada but she had no way of knowing his actual whereabouts at that time. She said that on both occasions he did not divulge his address or location. She said that in April, 1968, he was drinking heavily and she refused to allow him to come to the house with her children. She said he went to several motels around the Orlando, Florida area and ran up very large bills on credit cards which caused her financial difficulties. She said that on this occasions his drinking was only terminated when she took him to Dr. COLLINS for treatment of extreme alcoholism. She said that the doctor gave him tranquilizers to bring his shaking under control. She said he is a hopeless alcoholic and that when he is drinking he becomes affected mentally. Mrs. EZZELL advised that in the past PERNELL EZZELL when drinking had delusions of grandeur. She said that he would refer to big news stories in the newspapers and try to cause her to believe that he was in some way connected with military service intelligence and he would have to check on these news worthy events.

She said that on several occasions when he was drinking and he had disappeared he would finally call her teling her that he had a large sum of money and that he would buy her all sorts of new presents. She said that on these occasions she found him penniless and drunk in North Florida.

Mrs. EZZELL said that when PERNELL called her on the past two mornings he had not made any allegations involving himself in any assassination plots on Dr. KING or Senator KENNEDY. She said he had not threatened anyone on these occasions except her when she told him she was weeking employment. He said that if she obtained a job he would come by and pick up the baby.

Mrs. EZZELL said that PERNELL did have some sort of a gun which he kept in his car because she would not allow him to bring it into the house. She said he had a permit to carry this gun because he worked as a guard during the night time at Associated Detective Agency, Orlando, Florida. She said he worked in the day time as a television technician for the Perdue Radio, Television and Appliances, Incorporated.

Mrs. EZZELL said that she has been receiving numerous bills from oil companies and American Express credit card which she did not open but forwarded to his mother in North Carolina because she could not pay them. She advised that she feels that her financial situation is so destitute that she will lose her home and furniture because of previous bills made by EZZELL.

On June 6, 1968, Dr. HERBERT COLLINS, 3558 South Orange Avenue, Orlando, Florida, advised that he treated PERNELL EZZELL for about the past couple of years due to extreme alcoholism the last period of treatment being in April, 1968. He said this man is unstable but he did not further describe him.

On June 6, 1968, the files of the Orlando, Florida Police Department furnished by MARIAN HARRISON revealed PERNELL EZZELL was arrested on June 2, 1961 being charged as a public drunk; on Noveber 19, 1961 being charged with driving while intoxicated; and he was picked up on suspicion of auto theft March 9, 1962 at which time he was turned over to the Orange County Sheriff's Office. No photograph or fingerprint records for EZZELL were available.

On June 6, 1968, BERNICE FOGARTY, Orange County Sheriff's Office, Orlando, Florida, Identification Division and Deputy PHILIP MURPHY, Plain Clothes Division, both advised that they could locate no information pertaining to EZZELL in their files.

It is noted that on July 5, 1967, Officer JAMES WATFORD, Kissimmee, Florida, Police Department, advised the Tampa Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) that PERNELL EZZELL had made statements to EZZELL's wife that he was an agent of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) and in this capacity had to make secret trips, leaving his wife alone for periods of time. WATFORD indicated he knew of no one else who had been told by EZZELL that he was a CTA-agent, and that there was no evidence EZZELL had obtained anything of value from anyone other than his wife.

On August 4, 1967, a representative of the CIA, Washington, D. C., advised that a check of CIA personnel files failed to disclose any individual named PERNELL EZZELL as being employed by that agency.

On August 28, 1967, Assistant United States Attorney KENDELL WHERRY, Middle District of Florida, was informed of above facts by a Special Agent of the FBI. Mr. WHERRY stated that the facts were insufficient to constitute a violation of the Impersonation Statute, and that he would therefore decline prosecution of EZZELL.

EZZELL SHOULD BE CONSIDERED ARMED AND DANGEROUS IN VIEW OF HIS REPORTED POSSESSION OF A FIREARM, AND SINCE HE HAS BEEN DESCRIBED AS AN ALCOHOLIC WHO BECOMES UNSTABLE WHEN INTOXICATED.

Ray Bought Plane Ticket April 16

NEW YORK — On April 16, twelve days after the assassination of the Rev., Dr. Martin Luther King Jr in Memphis Tenn., a neatly dressed man in dark clothing appeared at the branch office of the Kennedy Travel Bureau, Ltd., in Toronto. Canada.

In an accent that did not at the time sound particularly American, he ordered from the office manager, Miss Lil-Man Spencer, a 21-day, round frip excursion ticket to London n a British Overseas Airways Corporation jetliner.

Although no one knew it at the time, officials of the FBI. and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police now say, that appearance in Toronto nr a r k e d the beginning of James Earl Ray's flight over seas following Dr. King's death. The flight ended yester. day with Ray's capture in London.

"Nothing seemed out of place then," said Miss Spencer yesterday of the April 16 meeting. "I asked him, as I b ways ask, if he had a Cana-Man passport. He said no, so I said we'd get it for him."

He told her, she recalled, that his name was Ramon George Sneyd, that he had been born in Toronto, had moved away and was back for three weeks and living at 962. Dundas Street - in a rooming house, she supposed. 🔹 🐪

Miss Spencer said the man told her that he did not have a oirth certificate, and that, as a recent returnee, he could notfind a guarantor who would youch for having known him two years.

As is routine in such cases, ne said, a notary public wit-essed the man's statement iat he was Sneyd. The notary

was Henry Moos, president of the 42-year-old travel agency

The man appeared May 2, four days before his departure: date for London. He paid Miss Spencer \$345 in cash for the ticket; picked up his passport and left.

Ramon George Sneyd is Toronto police constable. Why the arrested man chose to adopt the policeman's identity is something the Canadian au thorities were unable or un-

willing to explain yesterday.
Spokesmen for the external affairs ministry said the Royal Canadian Mounted Police had interviewed Sneyd, the policeman, and were satisfied he was innocent of any connection with Ray

A ministry official reported. the discovery in Ray's possession: a copy of Sneyd's birth certificate. The official said that Ray had convinced the municipal records office in Toronto that he was Sneyd and needed a copy of the certifi

The Canadian government nows Ray appeared in Lisbon May 16. He said he had lost his passport and was issued, another, also in the name of Sneya.

RE: EXTORTIONATE CREDIT TRANSACTIONS (179-00)

For your information, Public Law 90-321, the "Truth in Lending Bill," became law on 5/29/68, effective immediately. It is new Chapter 42, Title 18, U.S. Code, captioned as above.

The act prohibits "extortionate extension of credit," which is any loan involving use, or threat of use, of violence or other criminal means to harm the person, property or reputation of anyone, including members of the borrower's family.

The offense may be proved by direct evidence of violence or other criminal means used in making, collecting, or financing the loan. Proof of interstate or foreign travel, or use of interstate or foreign commerce facilities, is unnecessary. Congress found that purely intrastate extortionate credit transactions directly affect interstate and foreign commerce.

If direct evidence is unavailable, extortion is presumed on proof of the following: (1) the loan exceeded \$100; (2) the interest rate exceeded 45 per cent per annum; (3) the loan violates state law in that lender is unable to obtain complete collection judgment against borrower; and (4) lender has reputation for extortion in community of which borrower is member.

The act is a new weapon against organized crime. It can be used against both the loan shark and anyone who provides him funds necessary to finance his operations. Financing the loan shark is a violation.

Major FBI Effort Regained Trail Of Ray-Sneyd Abroad

Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation went through one very tense period and spent more than \$5 million, during their brilliantly conducted two. continent man hunt for James Earl Ray, the accused killer of Dr. Martin Luther King.

After successfully tracking and locating Ray in London early in May, the G-men temporarily lost his trail when he slipped through their surveillance network and flew to Portugal.

While Ray's disappearance almost caused a near panic among top Justice Department officials here, cooler-headed FBI agents directing the search kept the search from collapsing by immediately setting up a new dragnet.

WITH ONLY THE lead that Ray, alias Raymon George Sneyd, had apparently fled to. Europe, the FBI agents reasonel that because of his temperament and the foreign language barrier he would soon return to an English-speaking country.

Special watches for Ray were then carefully organized at all ports of entry in Great Britain, Canada, and the U.S., on the belief that the suspect would try to? return to one of those na-

Before any heads within the agency could roll, the swift chain of events that followed proved the effectiveness of the FBI strategy:

Eleven days after his second disappearance, Ray, alias neyd, flew back to London rom Lisbon. With the help of British authorities, the FBI again picked up his trail

close surveillance until he sud- about the economy move until denly prepared again to depart Great Britain for Europe - this time for Brussels. He was arrested at London Airport before he could board his plane.

Despite Ray's capture, the FBI investigation of King's assassination is far from being closed:

One agent involved in the inquiry says privately that "the arrest of Ray is only the begin-. ning of this inquiry." He points out that "Ray is the key to determining the others involved in the assassination plot."

FOR INSTANCE, FBI and Canadian authorities are still investigating how Ray was able to exploit legal loopholes like a pro in obtaining his Canadian passport.

Several dozen agents are probing Ray's alleged contacts with U.S.-based American South African Council which he wrote on Dec. 30, 1967, to ask about emigrating to Rhodesia. Also, being carefully checked is Ray's contact with a person whom the FBI photographed with King at a major U.S. airport.

One of the ironies of the successful FBI investigation is that just two months before the King assassination, the Bureau was obliged to cut in half the number of agents in Europe, including those in London as a result of President Johnson's order slashing overseas personnel of all government security and intelligence agencies.

WHEN RAY'S TRAIL led to London, however, many of these agents were sent back overseas

RAY WAS THEN kept under with instructions to forge the suspected assassin picked up.

In their intensive search for King's killer, the FBI spent more than \$5 million in the first nine weeks of its investiga-f tion. At times, upward to 3,000 agents were assigned to the



Stated that he is a Marxist-Communist and is opposed to the administration and it spolicies, opposed to war, and in general opposed to the way the country is now being run.

Complainant advised that he is owner-operator of the Apopka FED Market and Produce Co., Hwy 436 one-tenth mile east of U.S. Hwy. 441 in Apopka.

Called was placed from a public telephone in an unidentified bar in (Apopka and in response to the inquiry if he had been partaking of intoxicants, complainant replied negatively. Advised that he was fully sober and aware of all statements being made.

Writer advised that this matter would be staken into considerations and would request that he be contacted in order that he may fully express his knowledge of the **Al**leged conspiracy.

WILLIAM H. McCORD, 217 Apollo Drive, Apopka, was located at his home. He was asleen with a bottle of beer nearby on the table when agents arrived. He refused to allow agents to enter his home and, as a consequence, the conversation with him was from the front door. He denied phoning the FBI at Tampa the night of 7-1-68, claiming he was home all that night. He said he did not wish to talk to the EBI.

Perhaps the most interesting case of the century will soon be capturing the headlines of every daily newspaper in America. The federal government is bringing James Earl Ray back to this nation to stand trial for the alleged execution of a very dangerous Communist agent who called himself Martin Luther

There are many discrepancies in this case. We will not attempt to defend Ray's past when he got into a lot of trouble as young man. The family he came from was a victim of extreme poverty and he should be granted the same forgiveness and leniency liberal social workers now demand for young negroes who get into trouble. But we will not deal here with the past. THE PERFECT PATSEY

During the past year of Mr. Ray's freedom, there is no knowdedge that he was anything butmodel citizen. He is not charged with any robberies or other mis-conduct, outside the King incident. The FBI charges that Ray was open in his views against race-mixing and that he had worked in the Wallace For President movement. He now has asked one of the South's outstanding right-wing lawyers to: defend him.

Being a fugitive on the Missouri charges and a known White Supremist, Ray was the logical 'fall guy' or 'patsey'. Being a fugitive, he could not publically reply to charges that he was Gault. Some of the glaring discrepancies in the FBI's case against Ray are:

1) Witnesses who helped in the creation of the composit drawing of Ernest S. Gault, say present pictures of Ray, are not those of Gault. These include Gault's landlord in Birmingham, landlady in womphis, and a taxi

cab-driver in Atlanta. All agreed upon the artist's conception of what Gault looked like, but said, that was not Ray. Another hole in the government's case is the fact that finger prints of Ray given to Atlanta police were not those of the man called Gault.

These are but just a few initial holes in the FBI's case against Ray. We have yet to hear from Ray himself. Judgement should never be passed until both sides of the story are heard, contrary to the anti-Ray, hate filled daily press, an American is still "PRESUMED INNO-CENT UNTIL PROVEN GUIL-



Reference is made to memorandum dated June 11, 1968, captioned as above.

On July 18, 1968, Mr. Emory Dowling, Sr., Owner, Perdue Radio, Television and Appliances, Incorporated, 2425 East Colonial Drive, Orlando, Florida, advised that the captioned individual had returned to Orlando, Florida. He had taken him back on his job as a technician.

On June 13, 1968, Mrs. Fay Ezzell, 636 22nd Street, Orlando, Florida, advised that her husband had returned to Orlando, Florida, and she had seen him at the Holiday Inn located on South Orange Blossom Trail, Orlando, Florida. She said he had a gun and he had frightened a bell boy with it when he came to the room with ice. Allegedly her husband was drinking.

Mrs. Fay Ezzell said that her husband had not mentioned being connected with any conspiracy or plot to shoot Dr. Martin Luther King and Senator Robert Kennedy, but she was fearful of him in his condition.

Mrs. Ezzell said she understood she would have to consult either the Orlando, Florida Police Department or the Orange County Sheriff's Office for any personal protection.

On June 13, 1968, Sergeant George Pegues, Orlando Police Department, Orlando, Florida, was advised of the above information furnished on that date by Mrs. Ezzell. It was also furnished to Deputy Sheriff Otis Mosley, Orange County Sheriff's Office, Orlando, Florida, on the same date who said he had Ezzell's presence verified at the motel but the management said they could not locate any bell boy who had encountered Ezzell with a gun. They did locate one who had served him ice but he denied Ezzell had confronted him with a gun.



Reference is made to prior communications in the captioned matter, the most recent one being dated June 19, 1968.

Mr. Emory A. Dowling, Jr., son of the owner of Perdue Radio, Television and Appliances, Inc., 2425 East Colonial Drive, Orlando, Florida, furnished the following information on August 12, 1968:

Pernell Ezzell recently had his Florida driver's license revoked because he had been involved in an accident some months ago in North Carolina. Ezzell hadito terminate his employment with the company as a color TV technician because he was unable to drive a car and his services were not needed on a full time basis in the shop. Because he was unable to do his job in Florida, he went to California to seek employment. At that time, he was not drinking and he was perfectly normal. He had just returned from a trip to North Carolina, where he had gotten his 1965 Buick automobile back from an automobile repair garage.

On Saturday, August 10, 1968, Mr. Dowling had received a long distance telephone call from a manager of a motel in Long Beach, California. He could not recall the manager's name or the identity of the establishment which he represented. The manager inquired as to whether he should cash a check for Pernell Ezzell in the amount of about \$200.00 and he refused to recommend cashing the check. could not recall the name of the bank on which the check was drawn and he said he did not speak with Ezzell at the time, but he believed he was standing nearby during the telephone call.

Mr. Dowling said that he had no further information concerning Ezzell at this time.

On August 12, 1968, Mrs. Fay Ezzell, wife of Pernell Ezzell, 636 22md Street, Orlando, Florida, furnished the following information:

Pernell Ezzell had his driver's license revoked for five years by the State of Florida because he had hit a bridge with his 1965 Buick in or near Fayetteville, North Carolina, or Clinton, North Carolina, during his last escapade. He had been charged with driving while intoxicated. Ezzell said that he had paid for the damages to the bridge, but his license was still revoked last week. Mrs. Ezzell said that her husband tried to obtain bench work as a TV technician in the Orlando, Florida, area, but he was unsuccessful, since he had no driver's license and he could not travel throughout the city to do his work. She advised that he left Orlando on Monday, August 5, 1968, for California, in order to seek employment.

On Thursday, August 9, 1968, he called in the middle of the night, saying that he was in Los Angeles, California, working for an aircraft plant and making good money. He did not mention the name of his employer or the location of the aircraft plant. He told his wife that he wanted her and the family to fly out in the near future when he would send money.

On Saturday, August 11, 1968, Ezzell called about 8:00 P.M., saying he was in Los Angeles, California. He remarked to the effect that he had been out of the country and he had just gotten back, therefore, he had not gotten a permanent address. He did not state where he could be reached or the name of his employer. He did not say where he had gone while he was out of the country. Mrs. Ezzell said she is bitter because her husband had run up about a \$1,000.00 debt on his American Express Credit Card during his last escapade and he still has this card. She said that she wanted him to show good faith by supporting her and their child before she would decide whether or not to go to California. Mrs. Ezzell said that she was not certain whether or not Ezzell had been drinking, but she was unable to detect that he was under the influence of alcohol from the sound of his voice on the two occasions on which he made calls. She said that if he does

not help support their child, she will change her telemone number to an unlisted telephone number in the near future to avoid getting telephone calls from her husband in the middle of the night. She explained that she has to go to work very early each day. She said that she did not believe Ezzell's story about being out of the country and that he had possibly utilized the story to cover up for a period during which he had been drunk. She said that she could not believe but very little of any statements that Ezzell made to her and she, therefore, does not question him when he calls her. She said that she has no information as to her husband's exact whereabouts, the identity of his employer, or any of the details or location of the foreign trip that he allegedly made. She said that she did not believe him because he did not previously have a passport and he had not had time to obtain a passport before allegedly going out of the country. She said that she is waiting to see if he shows good faith by sending money for her and their child's support or whether he will go on another escapade and go deeper into financial trouble.

On August 12, 1968, Mrs. Mary Smith, Orange County Drivers License Office, Orlando, Florida, furnished the following information:

Pernell (no middle name) Ezzell, 636 22nd Street, Orlando, Florida, was issued chauffeur's license number H94422 on April 8, 1968. It was ordered revoked for five years by the Department of Public Safety, State of Florida, Tallahassee, Florida, for driving while intoxicated on the third offense within a ten-year period. It became effective May 27, 1968, but the order was not received and executed in Orlando, Florida, until August 6, 1968. The revocation resulted from Ezzell being convicted of driving while under the influence of intoxicants in the State of North Carolina. One of his other suspensions of his driver's license was from August 18, 1967, until February 29, 1968, because he forfeited bond in the State of South Carolina, on a charge of driving while under the influence of intoxicants.

Mrs. Smith said that she did not have a record of the third offense pertaining to Ezzell.

On August 12, 1968, Mrs. LILA HOEQUIST, Orange County Auto Tag Office, Orlando, Florida, furnished the following information:

Pernell Ezzell or Fay Ezzell, 636 22nd Street, Orlando, Florida, obtained Florida automobile license registration number 7W-10531, on May 1, 1968, for a 1965 Buick, two-door sedan, and Florida license 7-1518 on the same date, for a 1966 Chevrolet, two-door sedan. The file contained no additional descriptive information pertaining to these automobiles.

On October 2, 1968, Lieutenant Wayne Henderson, Intelligence Unit, Police Department, Orlando, Florida, advised that he had learned from a confidential source, whom he considers reliable, that four racial agitators, Walter "Buster" Cooper, Charles Releford, Robert Small, and Lewis Walls (phonetic for all), who are allegedly from Jacksonville, Florida, came to Orlando, Florida, in connection with racial incidents involving the Orange Liquors, 403 Magruder Avenue, Orlando, Florida. Lieutenant Henderson advised that Cooper and the others apparently arrived too late to take an active role in the Orange Liquors matter and that several of the men were sent to St. Petersburg, Florida, Miami, Florida, and to Sarasota, Florida, for the purpose of stirring up racial discord. Lieutenant Henderson stated that these racial agitators are reportedly able to make molotov cocktails and to instruct. others in how to prepare such devices.

Small and Walls are known to have been sent to Sarasota in connection with recent racial problems in that citv.

Just recently, Henderson learned that Releford was reportedly dispatched to Sanford. Florida in an effort to stir up discord in connection with the assault on the Negro male, one McNeil Simmons. Simmons was assaulted by two white males, and the matter has caused considerable concern in Seminole County. The immediate whereabouts of Releford is not known, but he and the others are expectedto return to Orlando, Florida. INDEXED

Henderson stated that the foregoing information has not been confirmed.

Representatives of Military Intelligence, Orlando, Florida, Sheriff's Office, Orlando and the Sheriff's Office, Sanford, Florida, have been advised of this matter.

Lieutenant Henderson additionally advised that he had learned from his source that the four racial agitators supposedly have a connection with Moses Davis and the Florida Black Front, although this is not certain. This source also advised Henderson that the racial agitators were allegedly paid by Vaughn D. Mizell of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) in Florida.

Representatives U. S. Attorney's Office, Tampa, and Secret Service, Jacksonville, Florida, have been advised of the foregoing.

PERNELL EZZELL was interviewed at the Shreveport, Louisiana, Resident Agency. At the outset of the interview EZZELL was advised of his rights but declined to sign a waiver of same. EZZELL declined to furnish a signed statement but voluntarily furnished the following information:

EZZELL denied that he had received or was ever in possession of a great amount of money as a result of his participation in the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING and the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. He further denied stating to anyone he was on the payroll of the OSI and CIA.

EZZELL said he definately did not participate in any manner, nor did he have any knowledge of or information concerning the murders of MARTIN LUTHER KING and Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

EZZELL admitted that he was glad KING was dead as he felt KING was a troblemaker, but emphasized that he did not have anything to do with killing him.

EZZELL said he could not remember making any statements to anyone regarding any of the above. He admitted that he may have made them when he was in a drunken condition, but could not recall making any such statements. He said he often has black-out periods which occur when he is drinking and he has been known to appear sober even when he is in a drunken state.

EZZELL said FRANK WETZEL is the Shop Foreman for his former employer at Perdue Radio and Television Company, Orlando, Florida. He and Wetzel have been out drinking together on a few occasions, usually after closing shop or on a payday night. WETZEL has been trying to get him into trouble with his wife. EZZELL said WETZEL thinks he is a ladies man and has in the past tried to take his wife out. His wife has told him that WETZEL has called her several times and in addition to trying to make a date would tell her of his running around with other women. EZZELL believed WETZEL tells his (EZZELL's) wife what he tells WETZEL in confidence. He was sure WETZEL told her about

his being responsible for another girl's pregnancy at the time he married his wife.

EZZELL stated he has never confronted WETZEL with any of the above, but WETZEL has told him that he called him one night when he was drunk and cursed him out. EZZELL said he could not remember this call.

EZZELL advised that he has a serious drinking problem, but he did not consider himself an alcoholic. He said he was treated in the Veterans Administration Hospital, Fayetteville, North Carolina, for drunkeness shortly after his release from the Air Force in 1953. He further advised he had been a patient at Cherry Hospital, Goldsboro, North Carolina, for about 2 months during the past year. While at this hospital he underwent a number of psychiatric tests. He did not know the results of the tests.

EZZELL stated that he has had this serious drinking problem since his marriage in November 1967. He indicated he was forced to marry his wife as a result of her pregnancy prior to their wedding. He said, since his marriage he has been under constant pressure from his wife and in addition has serious financial problems.

EZZELL advised that because of his heavy drinking and the resulting "black-outs" he is not able to fix exactly his whereabouts on specific dates during the past year. However, he remembered the night of MARTIN LUTHER KING's death and said he was drunk at the time. He was registered at the Motel South, Orlando, Florida. With him at the time was a girl friend, whom he identified as VIOLET ALLRED, a nurse, who operates the Clear Lake Manor Nursing Home, Orlando, Florida. He said she is about 38 years of age. He recalled hearing of KING's death on the T.V. on the night it happened.

EZZELL said he did not remember where he was the night Senator KENNEDY was shot.

EZZELL could not account for his whereabouts on the night of June 5, 1968 and said he could not recall where he was at all during the month of June as he again was on a drunk.

EZZELL remembers flying from Orlando, Florida,

to Los Angeles twice in recent months. The last was about August 4, 1968 when he flew via Delta Airlines. He stayed in Los Angeles four days and left driving a rented car after an unsuccessful effort in finding a job. On his way to Shreveport he stopped briefly at Phoenix, Albuquerque, and Hope, Arkansas. He claimed he pawned his 357 magnum revolver with a police officer in Hope, Arkansas, for \$45 on August 23, 1968. The gun was purchased for his second job as a security guard with Associated Security Company, Orlando, Florida. He claims he has never used the gun in commission of a crime.

EZZELL believed the previous trip to Los Angeles was made in June 1968 when he flew via Delta Airlines from Orlando, Florida. He was looking for a job on the occasion also. He stayed only two days and remembers returning from California via an unrecalled airline and that he stopped at Las Vegas, Denver, New Orleans and Miami. He does not remember if he stayed in any of these cities for any length of time. After reaching Miami he rented a car and drove to Orlando.

EZZELL claims he had no employment other than his jobs in Orlando and that he financed his trips with the money earned from working these two jobs, along with using his credit cards.

EZZELL recalled after driving from Miami he did not go home, but to a motel with Miss ALLRED. The following day he drove back to Miami and then returned to Orlando by bus. He thinks he rented the car at Miami from either Hertz or Avis-Rent-A-Car.

EZZELL stated he has not worked any where since August 4, 1968, and that he presently had in his possession \$36.00 which was left over from the sale of his gun.

EZZELL claimed he pawned a .38 Colt "Cobra" in Los Angeles on the last trip at an unrecalled pawn shop and that he presently has no weapon.

EZZELL could not recall any other details concerning his first trip to Los Angeles, he said he was drinking heavy on these trips and could not remember anything much about them. He could not remember the names of motels where he stayed. He claimed he has no friends in Los Angeles and

that he made none while there on these trips.

EZZELL stated he is not now and never has been a member of any "hate" type organization such as the Ku Klux Klan.

EZZELL stated he would be leaving Shreveport, Louisiana, this evening by bus and could be reached through his mother Mrs. ACRIE EZZELL, Route 4, Clinton, North Carolina.
