Thompson Report: Affidavit of above dated 6/11/68 Chief Foreign Leader Writer, Daily Telegraph, London, E. C. 4.

On 6/4/68 received note that Raymond Sneyd had called. Sneyd called again same date at 5 p.m. saying he wanted to locate his brother a mercenary, in Angola. Wanted to talk with Major Alastair Wicks. Sneyd gave telephone number of New Earl's Court Hotel in Penywern Road. Wicks did not know Sneyd's name and did not call Sneyd.

On 6/6/68, Sneyd left message, and later called asking about Wicks. Ray then seemed satisfied just to talk about

mercenaries. Colvin gave Sneyd name of Jean Gerard-Liebor in France, and would send Sneyd the address. Sneyd gave Colvin the address of the Pax Hotel, Warwick Way, Pimlico.

On 6/7/68 at 2:30p.m. Colvin sent him postcard with Embassy of Belgium address because feared imposition on French. The postcard was returned 6/10/68 with an insufficient address. Colvin gave postcard to Det. Thompson 6/10/68.

Colvin realized that this Sneyd might be same one as in jail. Colvin went to Pax Hotel. Told by proprietor, Anna Thomas, that Sneyd was there Thursday 6/6 through Saturday morning. She said Sneyd was nervous and stayed in his locked room most of the day. She emptied dust bins for Colvin and would save for police. She seemed to also have recognized Sneyd from photos.

Curtis was reinterviewed; he showed the FBI the 20 page story he has written. The first 5 of 6 pages is Curtis' life of crime. The rest is the same as the interview in April. They pulled a burglary together in Quincey, Illinois in 1954. Later they were in prison together. After JFK was killed, Ray stated that King was probably next. In jail was FNU Willett (see Willey) from Vicksburg who talked of klan support for King's murder. Ray suggested he would kill King, and that he would leave
