Went into MSP 9/65. Assigned to J Hall; met Ray who took orders for cigarettes, candy, etc. Ray moved *freely* around hall.

First conversation: Source reading B'ham Newspaper. Source from Wallace Co., Ala. in a detailed way; said stayed there and visited. Ray asked to have source's paper each day. Ray as (each day.)

Ray never talked a family or background. Source gave Ray his address and phone #. Ray said he made call when released.

Ray quiet; only interest was money. Ray said he was one day going to get himself a lot of money. Said his plan was "The Businessmen's Association had offered \$100,000 to kill King" When asked what the association was, Ray said he didn't know but would find out. They never talked about plans again. Ray said he always worked alone and had a hiding place picked. Ray ran one lottery on J hall, and Valenti ran other. With "Boston." Never saw Ray run drugs. Never saw Ray with a large amount of money.

"Cooley's organization" was a protection and enforcement group at MSP. First informed of Cooley's organization by an ex-con returning to MSP named Craig. At MSP source gave Craig \$10.00 initiation fee, and Ray came to cell that night with source's card. Never talked

with Ray about group. Card said "membership Cooley's Club" on it. Source had grievance once, went to Craig who said he would settle it for 50% of what owed source. Ray came to source that night with the cigarettes owed source.

Before Craig transferred to prison farm, asked Craig who to take grievances to Craig only said to mess hall or yard.

Source thinks Cooley's organization is dangerous; run by trustees or old ex-cons in A Hall. Never saw Ray after his, Ray's attempted escape.

Never heard of Ray being involved in death of 3 Negro prisoners.

I.D. many pictures of Ray. Ray slough footed; cleft chin; heavy drinker; normal sex life.
