Ray's cellmate. Ray's maximum ambition was to make "score" of \$20,000 - \$30,000 and hide-out in Mexico at favorable exchange rate. Ray mentioned previous trips to Mexico following 2 or 3 armed robberies. Ray spoke of Campeche Bay near Yucatan Peninsula; spoke of living with peasants in 3-room shack near Campeche; spoke of Torreon or Torrejon

Ray was frugal.

Ray did not like Negroes in general.

Once referred to King as "Martin Luther Coon," but had no particular feeling toward King. Ray read enthusiastically, especially weekly news magazines, and would outspokenly react to H. Rap Brown and Stokely Carmichael, as well as to some publicity King received.

Lillibridge does not know of bounty on King. Ray may have speculated that money would be available for deaths of Brown or Carmichael. Ray told about getting into a fight with a Negro on a prison work crew.

Ray was hypochondriac, taking 6 or 7 pills/day. Ray believed to have been selling amphetamines.

Ray spoke of smuggling appliances into Mexico through Campeche Bay from Brownsville, Texas, on boats. Ray often mentioned Mateo Lopez Garcia as

Mateo Garcia Lopez as running a small smuggling operation, as living near Campeche, and as speaking English.

Ray not known to speak Spanish.

Ray mentioned a brother in St. Louis. Either the brother or a person who participated with Ray in some robberies accompanied Ray on some Mexico trips.

Ray had been to Mexico City, regarded it as tourist trap, said he could not afford to stay there.

Ray's only reference to prior jobs was as bartender, possibly in Peoria, Illinois, or some other southern Illinois town. Ray never mentioned Oregon or Canada.

Ray never mentioned escape plans.

Ray mentioned "fire dance" by Negro boys in Acapulco.

Ray once had Kenny Hurt or Hurtt send a money order in order to hide some money he had received from illegal prison activities. Sent to Stationery in St. Louis.
