On 6/4/68 received note that Raymond Sneyd had called. Sneyd called again same date at 5 p.m. saying he wanted to locate his brother a mercenary, in Angola. Wanted to talk with Major Alastair Wicks. Sneyd gave telephone number of New Earl's Court Hotel in Penywern Road. Wicks did not know Sneyd's name and did not call Sneyd.

On 6/6/68, Sneyd left message, and later called asking about Wicks. Ray then seemed satisfied just to talk about

mercenaries. Colvin gave Sneyd name of Jean Gerard-Liebor in France, and would send Sneyd the address. Sneyd gave Colvin the address of the Pax Hotel, Warwick Way, Pimlico.

On 6/7/68 at 2:30p.m. Colvin sent him postcard with Embassy of Belgium address because feared imposition on French. The postcard was returned 6/10/68 with an insufficient address. Colvin gave postcard to [REDACTED]

Colvin realized that this Sneyd might be same one as in jail. Colvin went to Pax Hotel. Told by proprietor, Anna Thomas, that Sneyd was there Thursday 6/6 through Saturday morning. She said Sneyd was nervous and stayed in his locked room most of the day. She emptied dust bins for Colvin and would save for police. She seemed to also have recognized Sneyd from photos.

In London, he said he stayed at 3 hotels. The first was near B.E.A. terminal in Gloucester Rd. The 2nd was in the Earls Court area. The 3rd was at Victoria near the BOAC air terminal.

He requested these tools while en route to Mexico some 2 months later.

From Mexico he travelled to California, but could not remember how long he stayed in either place.

Ray stated that a suitcase found with his fingerprints on it has not been in his possession for 4 months.

Ray mentioned a car he believed found by the police and connected to him and the assassination. Ray admitted the car was his. Ray also admitted he had been in Tenn. for some time but did not say when.

Mention was made of the man who fled the shooting and successfully fooled the police by using a radio tuned into police frequency causing them to go in the wrong direction.

Ray also said "I met a man from skid row and bought his social security card and took his identity," but this was not discussed further.

On 6/5/68, Wednesday, at 4 or 5 p.m., Sneyd asked to rent room for 3 nights, given room #2. Before went into his room, Sneyd said he was Canadian, and came from Toronto and was tired.

On 6/6/68, she brought him his breakfast at 7:45a.m. and found door locked from inside. She walked away a few paces, and he got tray. That afternoon at 4 p.m., she went in, and he was reading on his bed. She asked for the visitor's book, asked

his name, and was told Sneyd. He said he had a flight booked to Germany.

On 6/7, Friday morning, she took him his tray. At 10 am, she told him she had to move him to room 3. May have seen him that evening.

On Saturday morning at 9:30 a.m., saw him rush out into cab with an airflight bag.

He had 4 phone calls while there. Two from BEA who asked for Sneyd concerning fare and possible flights.

On 6/6 evening, a lady called with no message. She sounded American.

On Friday, 6/7, morning, a man called leaving no message. A white postcard came for him also.
