

Marie Martin, also known as Marie Denniso, who traded television sets with Pay in Los Angeles, has been reinterviewed. She is employed as a cocktail waitress at the Sultan Noom in the St. Francis Botel and also resides at the St. Francis. Ray had a room at the St. Francis from 1/21/68 to 3/17/68 when he checked out giving a forwarding address of General Delivery. Atlanta. Bay checked into the Atlanta recenting house, 3/24/68.

Martin now recalls Bay last came to her room at the St. Francis shortly after he graduated from bartending school. (He graduated 3/2/68.) At that time Hay said he was going to New Orleans and Marie gave him a box of phonograph records and clothing for her daughter in New Orleans. The last time she saw Ray he told her that when he was in New Orleans in December, 1967, he stayed with friends who lived near Chef Menteur Michway.

Marie Martin also advised she was contacted on the evening of 4/23/68 by Louis Lomax who was brought to her room by Charles Stein. Most of her conversation with Lemax dealt with her exchange of television sets with Pay and Lomax also questioned her regarding Ray's girl friends. She states she told Longz she did not know of any girls Ray dated. Martin advised that May once went dancing with a girl named Helen who claimed to be a stunt rider for the television program "Gensmoke." He also made unsuccessful attempts to date another girl named Helene, a former exotic dancer. Marie Martin claims she has not been intimate with May.

At the Vegas Club, near the St. Francis Hotel, it has been determined that one Helens, a "belly dancer" at a bar on Sunset Soulevard. occasionally comes to the Vegas Club. Efforts are being continued to locate Helena and any other girl friends of Ray.

Marian De Grasse, 18-year-old daughter of Marie Martin, New Orieans, advised she received a telephone call from her mother on 3/16/68 stating that a friend named Eric would deliver a box of clothing in a few days. She received the box from her grandmother, Lorraine Calloway, on 3/24/68 and noted it in her diary.

Lorraine Calloway, New Orleans, recalled that her daughter-in-law, Dale Rodriguez, brought her a box of clothing for Marian De Grasse sometime in February or March.

Dale Hodriguez stated that an unknown man called at her home about 10:30 p. m. in February or March, 1968, and gave her a box of clothing for Marian De Grasse. She saw this man only for a few seconds at her door and cannot describe him. She took the box to Lorraine Calloway within a few days.

While at Leavenworth, Bay worked as a baker as well as in the fire department and the paint shop. When he was conditionally released, 4/5/58, he indicated an intention to contact bakery unions for employment and to eventually get a job as a baker on a ship calling to South America.

Walter Molan, who requested his identity be protected, advised he was May's closest associate at Missouri State Penitentiary. Me described May as a loner who considered all convicts as potential stool pigeons and furnished little, if any, information about himself. Molan claims May actually escaped from prison thirty days before the escape was reported and that he walked out the front door instead of hiding in a bread truck as officially claimed.

It has previously been reported that Raymond Louis Curtis alleged while Ray was in Missouri State Penitentiary. Ray spoke of a \$1,000,000 bounty on Ring. Curtis also talked to the press and has been widely quoted in this regard. Larry Sero has now voluntarily contacted the Memphis Office, requested his identity be protected, and furnished the following information.

Sero was in Missouri State Penitentiary from February until June, 1964. He was adquainted with both Bay and Baymond Louis Curtis. Sero mentioned to Bay and Curtis he had heard speculation that if King

Joe Peters, bartender in the Sultan Room, St. Francis Botel, San Francisco, advised that Loman had been using the Sultan Room as an office for a week or ten days but had been told to leave by the owner. Feters added that Loman had inquired about a blonde named Jerri with nearly every patron of the Sultan Room and had received no information.

Charles Stein has previously said that when traveling to New Orleans with Ray, 12/15-17/67. Ray made calls from various telephones in Texas on 12/16/67 but except for one occasion he returned to the car so quickly Stein believed the calls had not been completed. Stein described an area near Houston as the place from which Ray used a telephone long enough to complete a call. A detailed search by FBI Agents has located nine telephone booths similar to Stein's description but telephone company records show no calls recorded at these locations on 12/16/67.

Cary Delaun, news director, Radio Station KNUZ, Houston, confidentially advised the Special Agent in Charge that Mugh Ainsworth of "Newsweek" was contacted by Louis Lomax and Charles Stein and told that they would arrive in Houston sometime on 4/25/66 to retrace the route taken by Stein and Hay for the purpose of locating the telephone booth from which Hay made a call. Delaun has been asked to accompany Lomax and Stein and he will confidentially advise the Houston Office of their activities and the results of their inquiry. Arrangements have been made with the telephone company at Houston for the field office to be advised of any requests for information concerning long distance calls made on 12/16/67.

over attempted a boycott in Memphis it would be worth a lot of money to local businessmen to have King killed. Sero says this was sheer speculation and no particular group of businessmen was mentioned and the statement itself had absolutely no basis in fact; if Curtis and Ray interpreted it otherwise they were reading more into it than Sero intended. He does not recall who first mentioned this idea to him.

Sero described Ray as a born loser who does not know how to make friends but who hates Negroes and has a strong desire to perform some notorious act that will make him feel important. Sero questioned Bay's ability to plan and execute even the simplest "caper."

Jerry William Ray, brother of subject, Wheeling, Illinois, has received a telegram from "Life" magazine and has advised us that he consequently furnished "Life" information concerning his family for which he was paid \$150. He believes "Life" will publish a story on Ray either this week or next week.

Russell Lee Martin informed the Little Rock Office he received a pardon about three months ago after helping authorities break up a narcotics ring in Missouri State Prison. Prior to Ray's escape. Martin alleges Bay sold narcotics to other inmates.

Additional witnesses at Fuerto Vallaria, Jalisco, Mexico, state that when May was there last fall he drank beer during the daytime and almost any kind of mixed drink at night. When offered a cigarette he invariably replied, "I don't smake anything but marijuana;" however, no one has been located who saw him use marijuana. While in Fuerto Vallaria he appeared to be on a meticulous budget alloting so much a day for drinking and an equal amount for feminine companionship.

Louis Louisx and Charles Stein reportedly left Los Angeles, 4/25/68, for Houston, Texas. A confidential source in the telephone company at Los Angeles advised that Louisx inquired for toll call information on Sam J. Recile, 510 O'Keefe, New Orleans, telephone number 821-1411. This number was determined to be listed to the "Times Picayune States Item" and the telephone company is not obtaining any tell information for Louisx.

By letter dated April 21st, Robb enclosed an anonymous communication she had received dated April 3rd postmarked at Fort Pierce, Florida, wherein the writer suggested, "someone should pop him (Martin Luther King) off."

INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

Bufiles show no prior correspondence with Robb. Memo from M. A. Jones to Mr. DeLoach 5-19-65, pointed out that an article by Robb concerning the murder of Mrs. Viola G. Liuzzo, white civil rights worker from Detroit, Michigan, stated that the FBI owes the Nation an explanation of its action in this case. Regarding Inez Robb, the Director commented that "Back in the 30s or 40s she yilified the FBI and me personally when I was in Miami Beach & even picketed my cottage there." The Director disapproved the recommendation in this same memo that Robb be contacted to set her straight regarding our responsibilities in the Liuzzo murder case.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the foregoing it is recommended that her letter not be acknowledged.

Douce to determine the Bureau's reaction to the possibility of repeating this announcement following the presentation of the television series next Sunday, 4-28-68.

dePaolo has indicated that if the Bureau approves this proposal, he is certain that the Ford Motor Company would be delighted to provide the time for it as a public service.

Assassination of Martin Luther Eing, Jr.

Reference is made to my memorandum dated April 20, 1968, setting forth pertinent details relative to information furnished by Mr. John McFerren regarding his suspicions that circumstances which occurred at the LL and L Produce Company in Memphis, Tennessee, on April 4, 1968, might be related to the killing of Martin Luther King, Jr.

As you were previously advised, the owners of the LL and L Produce Company denied having any connection with the killing and Mr. Frank Camillo Liberto, one of the owners, advised that he had relatives in New Orleans and discussed large sums of money when making produce purchases over the telephone.

Other members of the Liberto family in New Orleans have been interviewed and they have advised that they have no knowledge of the killing beyond accounts appearing in local news media.

On the basis of the information reported by kir. McFerren and the information developed through our inquiries, it is not felt further inquiries along these lines are warranted.

Returned herewith is the copy of the "Time" report previously furnished.

NOTE:

The Attorney General's office furnished a copy of a "Time" report of information from John McFerren, Negro from Somerville, Tennessee. The Attorney General was previously furnished substantial information developed indicating there is no basis for McFerren's information. The "Time" report is being returned to the Attorney General with additional information developed in connection with McFerren's story.

We previously received information concerning this "Time" report and furnished pertinent information concerning it to the Attorney General in a memorandum dated 4/20/68. Although there does not appear to be any substance to the information furnished by McFerren as set out in the "Time" report and the information furnished Bureau Agents by McFerren on interview which is substantially the same as that set forth in the "Time" report, we are completely running the information out. McFerren has participated in civil rights activities in and around Somerville, Tennessoe, for a number of years. He has previously reported incidents to our Memphis Office, many of which were found to be without any substance in fact. In essence, McFerren has reported that on the afternoon of 4/4/68, the date of the shooting of Martin Lather King, Jr., he overheard one end of a telephone convergation at the LL and L Produce Company in Memphis, Tennessee. The substance of the telephone conversation and the descriptions of the individuals involved as well as McFerren's belief that an individual who was previously employed at the produce market resembled Eric Starvo Galt, now identified as being James Earl Ray, lead McFerren to believe that these individuals might be involved in the King marder. In running out McFerren's information, Bureau Agents showed him six random photographs, one of which included the 1968 photograph of Eric Galt and he definitely eliminated Galt as the individual he saw at the LL and L Produce Company, and who he thought was identical with the sketch of the subject he saw in the newspaper. McFerren picked three photographs of individuals who are all over UNDEL twentyfive years of age and do not resemble Galt at all. One individual in the photographs is known to be in prison at this time, and the other two are not known to have been in the Mcmphis area at any time.

Investigation disclosed that the individuals referred to in connection with the telephone call received at the LL and L Produce Company are Frank Camilla Liberto and James William Latch, President and Vice-President respectively of this company. They have dealed ever discussing the possibility of shooting King or having knowledge of the person responsible. They stated they may have made deregatory remarks about King because of the loss of revenues caused by his activities. Mr. Liberto advised that he makes frequent trips to New Orleans for produce, has relatives in New Orleans and discusses large sums of money when making produce purchases over the telephone. Mr. Liberto stated he always employs Negro males as helpers in the produce department and has not had in his employment any individual fitting the description of the unknown individual previously described by McFerren.

ACTION:

- 1. Although the basic facts of McFerren's allegations have been run out and there appears to be no substance to them, we are continuing to completely resolve these allegations.
- 2. Inamuch as the Attorney General has already been furnished substantial details of this matter, it is suggested that Mr. Deloach may desire to return the attached "Time" report to the Attorney General pointing out the information previously furnished him in our memorandum of 4/20/68. A copy of the "Time" report is being retained in the Bufiles.

Information was received that John McFerren, a Negro of Somerville, Tennessee, had reported to "Time" magazine information concerning an individual possibly involved in the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. McFerren allegedly overheard one end of a telephone conversation while at a produce market in Memphis on 4/4/68. According to the report McFerren overheard the individual state "Shoot the S. O. B. on the balcony. Don't werry about the money. Your brother will get it in New Orleans."

McFerren has participated in civil rights activities in and around Somerville, Tennessee, for a number of years. He has previously reported many incidents to bur Memphis Cffice, many of which were found to be without any substance in fact. McFerren was interviewed by Dureau Agents on 4/8/68 and 4/18/68 and he furnished information essentially along the lines of the above. Although there does not appear to be any substance to McFerren's information, we are completely running this out.

ACTION:

Attached for the Attorney General, the Deputy Attorney General, and the Civil Rights Division is a memorandum setting forth details of the information received from McFerren.

HURDER OF HARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

Information was received that John McFerren, a' Negro of Somerville, Tennessee, had reported to "Time" magazine information concerning an individual possibly involved in the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. Mr. McFerren allegedly overheard one end of a telephone conversation while at a produce market in Memphis on April 4, 1968. According to the report, Mr. McFerren overheard the individual state, "Shoot the S.O.B. on the balcony. Don't worry about the money. Your brother will get it in New Orleans." Hr. McFerren allegedly was contacted on April 18, 1968, by a white man formerly of Somerville who now resides in Louisiana. It was indicated that as a result of this visit Mr. McFerren feared for his own safety.

On April 8, 1968, Mr. McFerren advised Agents of this Bureau that he had picked up supplies for his grocery store at the LL and L Produce Company, Memphis, Tennessee, on April 4, 1968. At that time he overheard a heavyset white male talking on the telephone say, "Kill the S.O.B. on the balcony and get the job done. You will get your \$5,000." Mr. McFerren stated another white male with a scar on his right cheek came by at this time and told him to go on to the back of the produce company and help himself.

After completing his business Mr. McFerren heard the telephone ring again as he was passing the office and the man with the scar answered the telephone. He then handed the telephone to the heavyset man. Mr. McFerren heard this man say, "Don't come out here. Go to New Orleans and get your money. You know my brother."

Mr. McFerren attached no significance to these remarks at the time. When he arrived home at Somerville, Tennessee, at approximately 6:15 p.m., April 4, 1968, he Note: See memo Rosen to DeLoach captioned MURKIN, 4/20/68, CLM:wjc EJM:vea.

was advised by a neighbor that Martin Luther King, Jr., had been shot. Mr. McFerren advised that the following day he observed a sketch of the assassin in a newspaper. The artist's conception together with a description as read to him by his wife immediately made him think of an individual who had been employed at the LL and L Produce Company sometime in the late fall or early winter last year. He believed this man to be identical with the sketch of the unknown individual who shot Martin Luther King, Jr. He described this individual as five feet nine inches tall, weighing 140 pounds, white male, slender build and approximately twentyfive years of age.

Mr. McFerren was reinterviewed by Memphis Agents on April 18, 1968. Mr. McFerren stated he was suspicious because an individual he knows from Somerville, Tennessee, presently residing in Louisiana, visited his residence on the norning of April 18, 1968, and asked questions regarding his travel. Mr. McFerren identified this individual as Robert/Powers who came to McFerren's residence with his wife driving a 1966-1967 late model beige Cadillac. Mr. McFerren advised he was not threatened by this individual and the only reason he suspects Powers of being strange is that McFerren states it is not common for a white man to shake a Negro's hand in that particular environment.

Mr. McFerren was shown six random photographs, one of which included the 1968 photograph of Eric Galt, and he definitely eliminated Galt as the individual he saw at the LL and L Produce Company and who he felt was identical with the sketch he saw in the newspaper. Mr. McFerren picked three photographs of individuals who are all under twenty-five years of age and do not resemble Galt at all. One individual in the photograph is known to be in prison at this time and the other two are not known to have been in the Memphis area at any time.

Investigation disclosed that individuals referred to by Mr. McFerren were Frank Camilla Liberto and James William Latch, President and Vice-President respectively of LL and L Produce Company. These individuals have been interviewed and emphatically deny ever discussing with

anyone the possibility of shooting Reverend Dr. King or having any knowledge of the subject responsible for his death. They stated that they may have made derogatory remarks about the actions of Martin Luther King, Jr., in Memphis and that the fact that he had been responsible for a loss of revenue by business establishments in the Memphis area. They advised that such disparaging statements had been part of general conversation among workers in and around the produce company and other individuals residing in the Memphis area.

Each of the individuals denied receiving any telephone call wherein mention was made of Martin Luther King or the shooting of Martin Luther King. They stated they did not have any knowledge concerning the shooting of -Martin Luther King, Jr., while at work at the produce company on April 4, 1968. Mr. Liberto advised he frequently makes trips to New Orleans, Louisiana, for produce. He stated it is common knowledge among employees and customers of his produce company that members of his family reside in New Orleans and he frequently mentions trips to New Orleans. He stated that most of the produce is purchased through telephone conversations and this involves talking about large sums of money over the telephone. Mr. Liberto stated he always employs Negro males as helpers in the produce department and had not had in his employment at the produce company any individual fitting the description of the unknown individual previously described by Mr. McFerren. In this connection, Mr. McFerren was not identified at any time to Mr. Liberto as being the source of the information.

Mr. Liberto's brother in New Orleans is being interviewed for any information he may have concerning this matter.

THE STORE IS LOCATED IN THE HILLS EAST OF MEMPHIS, JUST OUTSIDE THE TOWN OF SOMMERVILLE, LESS THAN 100 MILES FROM MEMPHIS. MCFERRIN MADE SEVERAL UNEVENTFUL STOPS IN MEMPHIS. AT ABOUT 4:30 P.M. HE DROVE INTO THE PARKING LOT AT 11 AND 1 PRODUCE COMPANY, STOPPED IN ITS OPEN-AIR PRODUCE SHED, THEN WENT INTO THE WAREHOUSE BUILDING TO MAKE HIS PURCHASES.

AS HE WALKED THROUGH THE DOORWAY HE HEARD A MAN'S VOICE FROM AN OFFICE JUST OFF THE HALL. "THE MAN WAS SCREAMING AND I COULD HEAR HIS VOICE BEFORE I GOT INSIDE," SAYS MCFERRIN. "I STOPPED JUST INSIDE THE DOORWAY AND LISTENED FOR A MOMENT. I WAS STANDING IN THE HALL, JUST OUTSIDE THE OFFICE WHERE THIS MAN WAS SCREAMING."

THE MAN (WE'LL CALL HIM RED AND TRY TO FIND OUT HIS REAL NAME) WAS SITTING BEHIND A DESK IN A TINY 6° BY 6° OFFICE.

PHONE, MUTTERED "'YEAH, HE'S HERE" -- OR SOMETHING TO THAT EFFECT -- AND PASSED THE PHONE TO RED.

RED WAS IN NO MOOD FOR FURTHER TALK. HE SAT WITH BOTH THE DESK AND GROWLED: "DON'T CALL ME NO MORE, AND DON'T COME NEAR MY PLACE. YOU KNOW MY BROTHER IN NEW ORLEANS -- HE'LL GIVE YOU THE DLRS5,000. DON'T BRING YOUR ASS NEAR MY PLACE AGAIN." RED SLAMMED THE PHONE DOWN WITHOUT WAITING FOR A REPLY.

"I MADE OUT LIKE I DIDN'T HEAR WHAT HE SAID -- THEY THINK I'M DEAF ANYWAY, "CAUSE EVERYTIME I GO IN THERE I PLAY LIKE I'M HARD OF HEARING," SAYS MCFERRIN. "I WENT UP AND PAID MY BILL AND LEFT."

JOHN MCFERRIN HAS NOT BEEN BACK TO THE PRODUCE COMPANY SINCE.

BUT FOR SEVERAL YEARS -- ABOUT SIX, SAYS MCFERRIN -HE HAD GONE THERE EVERY THURSDAY. MCFERRIN SAYS THE PRODUCE
COMPANY IS A HANGOUT FOR POLICE, COUNTY OFFICERS AND SOME
STATE LIQUOR OFFICERS. USUALLY THEY SIT AROUND IN RED'S
OFFICE, WATCH TV AND GOSSIP; THEY OGLE RED'S PICTURES OF
BATHING BEAUTIES WHICH HANG IN FRAMES ON THE WALL. THEY

**WHAT BUDDY? ** ASKED MCFERRIN.

**I TOLD HIM, "I JUST TEND TO MY OWN BUSINESS," "SAYS MCFERRIN. "I DIDN'T WANT TO GIVE HIM A CHANCE TO START NOTHING WITH ME.

HE LOOKED VERY MUCH LIKE THE MAN MCFERRIN HAD SEEN WORKING AT THE PRODUCE COMPANY LAST FALL. "THEY DIDN'T HAVE A SIDE VIEW OF HIM", SAYS MCFERRIN (HE MEANS THREE QUARTERS VIEW) "OR I COULD HAVE TOLD FOR SURE. BUT HIS FACE LOOKED ABOUT RIGHT, HE HAD SLENDER SLOPING SHOULDERS AND JUNGLE ROT HIS NECK. I PICKED HIM OUT AS MY FIRST CHOICE." MURKIN (THE KING MURDER CASE). PERSONNEL MATTER

This is the case involving the sarder of Martin Luther

Peter Paul Kasper, resident of Fords, New Jersey, at 8:45 p.m., 4/19/68, telephonically contacted the Hewark Office to complein relative to actions of SA Peter G. Loftus assigned to the New York Office. Kasper questioned whether SA Loftus was acting within FBI jurisdiction when Kesper was being checked out as suspect in the King murder case.

New York Office files show that Kesper filed application for Euresu employment on 1/11/68, but failed to appear for interview set for 1/32/68, and no further action was taken on his application. The New York file on Kesper indicates he had two previous arrests, owes approximately \$4,000 to various banks and credit associations and during last four years has been unable to keep a job for a period longer than nine months.

SAC, New York feels actions of SA Loftns in this instance appear to be proper and no administrative action is recommended.

DETAILS:

All Peter G. Loftus, who resides in Fords, New Jersey, and who was at home on night of 4/19/68, was advised by detectives of the Woodbridge, New Jersey, Police Department that a complaint had been received that a man resembling James Earl Ray was seen driving a 1968 Chevrolet Impals with New York license plates in the area. The detectives stated they were in the process of checking the registration through their office and saked Si Loftus if he desired to join them, which he did. After about twenty minutes, the officers received a message that the license was registered to a Peter Easper, Bellmore, New York, and the license had been issued for a 1967 yellow Pontiac.

A check of the mail bores disclosed the spartment assigned to Essper. SA Loftus and the officers discussed the situation and decided that a protext interview would be conducted.

One of the officers was to identify himself and advise Kasper he had received a complaint that the Impala had been seen speeding on a local street and upon checking the registration it was discovered the plates were not on the automobile to which originally issued. Since the officer was not certain of making an identification on Kasper, SA Loftus stated he would accompany him and be in a position where he could observe the persen when he came to the door.

The officer knocked on the door and it was opened by a woman at which time the officer identified himself and anked to see Kasper. When Kasper appeared at the door, it was obvious that he was not the subject James Barl Ray. The officer used the pretext upon which Kasper became indignant stating he had recently purchased the car and it was officially registered. Kasper assumed a very belligerent attitude.

Upon entering the spartment with the officer SA Loftus identified himself showing Kasper his badge at which point Kasper became obsoxious and insulting stating he was not impressed with the "little tin badge." He went on to state that he did not mind the police coming aroung but didn't see how the FBI had any jurisdiction. SA Loftus attempted to explain the Bureau's "interstate transportation of stolen motor vehicle" responsibility but he was openly hostile and refused to listen stating he had several complaints of his own, including such items as his dog is on the loose, children knocking on the windows and loud hi-fi sets. He appeared irrational and unwilling to listen to further explanations.

Thereafter Kasper called the Woodbridge Police Department and our Newark Office to complain of the situation. Kasper then calmed down considerably and produced his registration after which he shook hands with SA Loftus and the contact was terminated.

After SA Loftus had boft, Kesper again called the Newark Office inquiring of what action would be taken on the complaint and when informed the matter would be given proper attention he appeared agreeable and hung up. At 1:00 a.m., 4/20/68, Kesper again contacted Newark Office and stated he wished to withdraw any charges against SA Loftus.



Reference is made to the Director's notations, asking why the evidence in captioned case has not been returned to the Memphis Police.

This is my responsibility. I knew of the necessity to return this evidence as soon as logically possible; however, I also realized that the Director would not want the evidence returned only to have the Memphis Office obtain it once again and send it back for further comparison purposes with new evidence.

In compliance with the Director's instructions, the evidence was to be returned as soon as Laboratory examinations were completed. There has been a constant accumulation of evidence, making it imperative that the original items be retained briefly for comparison purposes. The true name of the subject was not known until Friday, 4/19/68.

There has been no request from the Memphis Police relative to the return of this evidence. To the contray, the police feel that this is strictly an FBI case and have indicated this fact accordingly.

The evidence will be returned to the Memphis Police immediately. There will be no consultation with the Department.
