Evans and his wife are entremely upset over the interviews by the press. Pearson's man and "Newsweek" are allegedly still "nosing around in Los Angeles."

Galt was registered at Notel Rio, Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco, Mexico, 10/19/67 to 11/6/67. It has now been determined he registered at the Tropicana Hotel, Puerto Vallarta, 11/7/67 and checked out 11/13/67. Luis Garcia, bartender at Hotel Ocena, Puerto Vallarta, states he was acquainted with Galt for a few days in Puerto Vallarta. Galt told Carcia he had been in the Army for nine years serving as a driver or chauffeur but had not previously been out of the United States. Garcia said he terminated his brief association with Galt when Galt indicated an interest in obtaining marijuana.

An office of the Piedmont Laundry is just around the corner from the Atlanta rooming house used by Galt. Laundry records show Eric Galt, no address given, brought in nine laundry items and three dry cleaning items between 9 a. m. and 10 a. m. on 4/1/68. All items were picked up by the customer on 4/5/68 shortly after 9 a. m. The dry cleaning items included a black check sport coat, gray trousers and a black tie with tan and brown stripes. The laundry was marked EGC 83 with an indelible pencil. The dry cleaning was marked with a removable tag showing a figure 8 over the number 755. It is noted Galt also had a necktie dry cleaned while in Los Angeles.

Richard Gonzalez, fellow bartending student from 1/19/68 to 3/2/68, says Galt told him he had been in Mexico for about three years, exact time not stated. He said he liked Mexico and planned to return. Gonzalez stated he understood from Galt that he planned to go to Birmingham after graduating from bartending school to visit a brother for two weeks. Galt indicated to Gonzalez he had been a chef in the Merchant Marines on a seagoing vessel. He never mentioned any other type of employment or members of his family. Gonzalez said Galt was right-hended when mixing drinks.

Thomas Lau, director of the bartending school, said that Galt can speak only a few words of Spanish. He now recalls Galt mentioned he had lived in Fuerto Vallaria, Mexico, for about three years.

Sharon Rhoads, part time dancing instructor at the dancing school at Long Beach, California, which has previously been mentioned,

recalled giving instructions to Galt between December, 1967, and the middle of February, 1968. She describes him as an introvert, very shy with crowds and with women, and said he would not talk about his past or background. She believed Galt had visited a brother in Louisiana in January, 1968, and he said he had formerly owned a bar in Mexico but sold it shortly before coming to Los Angeles. She states that Galt signed his name left-handed and had "pretty" blue eyes.

When enrolling in bartending school at Los Angeles, 1/19/68, Galt showed employment as "Mr. Willard," 751 South Figueroa Street, Los Angeles. No record of either Willard or Galt can be located at this address.

All phases of this investigation are continuing to receive top priority attention.

S. Code, for conspiring to interfere with the constitutional rights of Martin Luther King. Jr. It was understood that no publicity would be given to the complaint unless some change in the situation indicated the complaint should be made public. A proposed complaint is set out below: On or about March 29, 1968, at Birmingham, Alabama, in the Northern District of Alabama, Bric Starvo Galt and an individual whom he alleged to be his brother . entered into a conspiracy, which continued until on or about April 5, 1968, to injure, oppress, threaten, or intimidate Martin Luther King, Jr., a mend citizen of the United States, residing in Atlanta, Georgia, in the free exercise or enjoyment of a right secured to him by the Constitution or laws of the United States; namely, the right to freely travel from state to state. In furtherance of this conspiracy. Eric Starvo Galt did, on or about March 30, 1968, purchase a rifle at Birmingham, Alabama, all in violation of Section 241, Title 18, U. S. Code. The above proposed complaint is considered to disclose the absolute minimum information that would be acceptable to a U. S. Commissioner or Federal Judge. To satisfy the judicial officer, it may be necessary to add some additional details such as the description of the gun and the fact it was abandoned at the crime scene. If necessary, such detail will be added but only to the extent necessary to obtain a warrant. WLLMivea COMPANIED - CHEER 重要概象

Memorandum to Mr. DeLoach RE: MURRIN Under the statute being used the complaint can be filed in any District in which the conspiracy took place or an overt act occurred. On the basis of facts presently available, we are limited to filing the complaint at Memphis or Birmingham. We understand that we cannot rely on the U. S. Attorney at Memphis. If we tried to file there, we would immediately lose control of the situation and the complaint would become public knowledge. We have checked with Birmingham and we have no assurance we could keep a complaint filed there a secret. We would have to go through the U. S. Attorney's Office and Macon Weaver, the U. S. Attorney, is presently in Mouston. The U. S. Commissioner is a woman who does not have too firm a grasp on her operations. Investigation at the Canadian address given by Galt, 7/31/67, has not been productive and a Mansas City address as of 3/1/67, that we obtained in Canada is nonexistent. Calt is last known to have been in Atlanta, 4/5/68, and his present whereabouts are unknown. We are faced with the danger that he may leave the country before he is located. In view of the above circumstances, it now appears charges should be immediately filed and Galt's fugitive status should be given the widest possible publicity. ACTION: 1. We should openly file the proposed complaint at Birmingham. 2. We should issue a wanted flyer and a fugitive press release. 3. We should issue an Identification Order even though no fingerprints are available. 4. 
It has previously been reported that Galt met Charles Stein, Stein's sister, Rita Stein, and Marie Martin in a Los Angeles bar, 12/14/67, and drove Stein to New Orleans, 12/15/67, to get Rita Stein's children and return them to Los Angeles.

Marie Martin says she first met Galt in the middle of December, 1967, in the Sultan Room at the St. Francis Hotel, Los Angeles, where she works as a cocktail waitress. She asked Galt if he would take her home and when he agreed she told him she lived in New Orleans. She explained that Rita Stein had to pick up her children in New Orleans and Galt was given the impression that either Marie or Rita was going to New Orleans with him. When he learned that Charles Stein was going to New Orleans with him instead of one of the women, Galt told her, "If it's a set up, I'll kill him. I have a gun,"

After Galt returned to Los Angeles from New Orleans, 12/21/67, Marie Martin says she saw him about 30 times in the Sultan Room. He usually drank straight vodka but sometimes drank beer. He never smoked. His hands were clean and were not calloused. His eyes were blue but sometimes appeared hazel. He was always solemn, showed no emotion and was pale as if he were indoors a great deal. Galt said he had just finished a six-week bartender course but could only make a screwdriver.

Marie Martin said Galt told her on one occasion he was driving through a Negro community and tomatoes were thrown at his car because it had Alabama license plates.

Charles Stein now recalls further details of his trip to New Orleans with Galt, 12/15-21/67. Galt had one small bag, similar to the one recovered at Memphis, and probably a shaving kit. He wore a wrist watch, believed to have been purchased in Mexico, and a dark brown suit with faint vertical lines. Galt used an excessive amount of hair dressing and drank beer throughout the trip. He was soft spoken, believed to be right handed, and continuously played country and Western music on the car radio. Stein thinks Galt had Mexican insurance on his car. This is being checked.

Galt seemed familiar with New Orleans and mentioned contacting two men associated with either an engineering or contracting firm, probably in Chalmet (phonetic). Galt mentioned these men lived near the Jackson Barracks. Galt told Stein he had seen him. probably 12/18/67, while Galt was in a bar. Stein says the bar would have to have been in the 400 or 500 block of Canal Street. New Orleans.

Galt attended the International School of Bartending, Los Angeles, 1/19/68 to 3/2/68 when he graduated. The school has a photograph of Galt which is being forwarded to the Bureau. On his application he showed a prior employment as "Mr. Willard". 751 South Figueroa, Los Angeles, and stated his Selective Service Classification is 3A. On 3/2/68 the school offered him a bartending job and he declined saying he was leaving town in two weeks to visit his brother.

Galt told a fellow bartending student he had been a cook on a Mississippi River boat or barge.

Los Angeles witnesses say the above photo of Galt is an excellent likeness.

Jimmie Garner, manager of the hippie rooming house in Atlanta, admits that he lied when first interviewed and now says Galt had no connection with William Lee and Harold G. Anderson,

Garner now maintains Galt checked in 3/24/68 paying \$10 for rent through 3/31/68. On 3/31/68 Galt paid another weeks rent. Garner saw Galt only on the two occasions he paid rent. On 4/5/68. when the linens were changed in Galt's room, a note was found saying Memorandum to Mr. DeLosch

in effect, "I have to go to Birmingham. Can't take TV now. Will try to get back in a week to pick it up." The note was destroyed. Garner states he originally lied to conceal the existence of Galt's television set since he would have appropriated it if Galt did not return.

Garner could produce no record of Galt except for his name on the back of an envelope which he says was hand printed by Galt.

All items associated with Galt in the rooming house are being examined in the Laboratory.

Wesley G. Hughes, "Redding Record Searchlight," Redding, California, advised he is preparing an article based upon the following theory relating to the name Eric Starvo Galt. Eric, a simple noun, means a payment imposed for homicide. Starvo is the middle name of Eric Starvo Blofield, a villainous character in James Bond novels. Galt, as a simple noun, is a gelded swine; gault has other means including "rabbit track" which has a significant connetation to Hughes due to the apparent fictitious cover used by Galt.



Jimmie Delton Carner, manager of this "hippie" rooming house has now been interviewed. Garner was approached on a general line of inquiry concerning recent tenants without mentioning the name Galt. Carner named Galt as a tenant who had recently loft without completing a week he had paid for in advance. A complete review of Carner's records revented no montion of Calt and Garner alleged this was an oversight as he collected the rent away from the location of his records. Carner stated Galt arrived about 0:00 p. m., 4/5/68, driving a black car, probably a Ford, 1992 or 1993 model, possibly bearing a Tennessee Moonee. Calt first contacted Fred C. Jones, a temant, who directed bina to Garner, and Calt told Garner be was a welder from the Carolinas I if had been working in another clate. Calt was placed temperatily in Hoom Bat 107 14th Street, and on 4/7/63 moved to Room 6 at 113 14th Serect. Carner caw him move a paper bag or bex of possession but cla not note any luggage. Cn 4/7/63, Harold G. Anderson, an employee of the Albert Tick Mobel, was brought to Carner by Fred C. Jones and was elven Moons 2, 113 14th Street. At about 9:00 p. m., 4/0/68, Carner says Calt and Anderson came to his room stating they were checking out. Galt said he had received a call from a friend in hischigan telling him that welders are better paid there. They were leaving for hischigan that night and Anderson boped to get a job as a welder's helper. Anderson received a partial refund from two weeks rent previously paid. Galt was paid through 4/11/68 but did not oak for a refund. He did receive a refund of a key deposit. Garner noted beer bottles in Anderson's room and presumed they had been drinking there.

Carner said he could not remember Calt's first name but volunteered he had seen mail for Calt and accompanied Agents to the table where mail is left for tenants. Three pieces of mail for Calt from toe locksmithing school were on the table postmarked 4/1/00, 4/9/03 and 4/10/63. He remarked that his cister, Robbie Lee Carner, visited him last Friday or Saturday at which time she noticed the mail for Calt and commented this was the same name as the King nurder suspect. Carner said he did not feel it was likely his tenant was identical with the suspect and thus did not feel compalled to tell anyone.

of Gali before 4/5/68. He could offer no explanation as to why Cali would receive mail postmarked 4/1/63. Carner denied Gali left anything with then for storage. He said Dooms 4 and 5 are reserved for storage but contain nothing but linen and possibly a few items of no value left behind by roomers. Garner's description of Gali resembles that of the subject.

The rooming house records on Anderson show his next of kin as G. F. Anderson, Atlanta, telephone 448-4072. Carner described Anderson as 40 years of age, 5' 9", 155 - 160 pounds, light brown hair, medium to fair complexion.

After the interview Carner telephoned the Agents to say he had re-examined his records and feels Galt is identical with william Lee, Route 1, Gastonia, Porth Carolina, who registered 4/5/68 and gayo person to be soldled in emergencies as Detty Retireman, 1982 Walts Street, Tarren, Alichjan. Investigation is being conducted at Gastonia, North Carolina, Warren, Michigan, and Atlanta is locating Carner's sister and Anderson's father.

Two Agents have rooms in Carner's rooming house in an un requer capacity. One is in From 2 and noted that From 4 has a new padlock. In casual conversation with Carner, Carner told the spent about one week ago a clean cut young man said he would be gune over a week and rented room 4 for storage of personal effects. Dy taking the hinges off the connecting door from Room 2, the Agent examined Room 4. There is no bed in this room. There is a brown Zonith portable television set. Marie Martin, Los Angeles, has stated she traded a white Coneral Electric portable television set to Call; however, she is color blind and her description of the controls matches the Zenith set in Room 4. Also in Room 4 is a brand of sugar sold in California but not in Georgia, a map of Atlanta with four circled areas, one of which is the general area of Ming's home and one of which is the general area of SCLC headquarters. There was also a John Birch Society pamphlet. Except for a dock and an easy chair, there is nothing else of monotary value but there are a fow minor items of food, a bread knife, a colice warmer and a clip-cutie.

To avoid compromising the Agent in Room 2. Change was not questioned about the items found in Room 4. The rooms alleged by Carner to have been occupied by Call have been treated for improprints, some paper and other items of unknown value were recovered from one of the rooms that has not been re-rented, and sheets allegedly used by Call in the second room have been obtained. They are being forwarded the Laboratory.

Cost adviced the Locksmith Institute, Little Falls,
(New Jercey, that he was taking a course from American Business
Consultants, Long Essen, California, Haviar Von Hoss, owner of
American Business Consultants, stated he has been in business since
May, 1989, teaching self-hypnotism and "powers of the mind," He
teaches by consultation only, keeps no records and does not recall
Calt either by name or by the artist's concept of the subject.

In correspondence with the locks mithing company, Galt listed as references hirs. Data Steen and hirs. Marie Denkard, Los Angeles. Charles J. Stein has cavised that on 12/14/07 he was in the Sultan Bar, St. Francis Butel, Los Angeles, accompanied by

his sister, Rita Stein, and his cousin, Marie Martin, also known as Marie Dennino, who had a room in the St. Francis. They became acquainted with Galt in the bar and he offered to drive Stein to New Orleans to pick up Rita Stein's two children and return them to Los Angeles. Galt stipulated that he would only do this if the two women registered to vote and gave their party affiliation as George Wallace's American Independent Party.

Stein states that on 13/15/67 Gait drove Stein and the women is his white hasting to a voting registration office and let them out at the door. Gait entered the effice later as they were completing their registrations and Stein gained the impression Gait was known to the people in the effice.

Upon leaving the registration effice the women were dropped off at Stein's residence and after stopping at Cali's Serrano Street address the two men drove to New Orleans without stopping to sleep, arriving there 12/17/67. While on route Cali made a number of calls to unknown persons from pay telephones, mostly in Texas.

In Now Orleans Calt declined an invitation to stay at the home of Stein's mother and Stein directed him to a motel.

Calt had said he wanted to contact an engineering or contracting firm in New Orleans. On 12/18/67 Stein accidently met Calt on the street and Calt said he had contacted the people he was interested in and was ready to return to Los Angeles but Calt telephoned later that day to say a ctorm was blocking their route. Calt, Stein, and the two children last New Orleans 12/10/67 and returned to Los Angeles without stopping except for food and gaseline, arriving in Los Angeles 12/21/67. Stein has not seen him since.

Galt paid for all purchases in each and Stein says Galt mentioned he was from Alabama and planned to return there.
Stein gained the impression Galt was involved in the California Campaign of George Wallace. On one eccasion Galt told Stein that if Hogrees want to be free men they should go North or West; if they want to be slaves they should stay in the South.

Galt further told Stein he recently returned from Mexico where he formerly owned a bar in partnership with a Mexican to whom he recently sold his interest. This is being checked out.

Stein made available undeveloped film taken during the trip to New Cricans. He said Calt might be in one of the pictures. The film has been developed by the Europu and no photograph of Calt was found. Stein subsequently stated he had found another roll of color film and a roll of black and white film that might have a picture of Calt. The black and white film has been developed by the Los Angeles Cifice. There was no picture of Calt. The color film is presently being processed at the flureau.

The records of the Providence Motel, New Orleans, show that Eric S. Galt, using Galt's old Dirmingham address, registered 12/17/67 and checked out 12/19/6/2. He made no long distance calls and records of local telephone calls have been destroyed. Two sheets of paper that may have indented writing were found in the telephone book in the room occupied by Galt. This paper and the registration card are being examined in the Laboratory.

The telephone company check Fric Calt used for payment of vent at the St. Francis Hotel, Los Angeles, has been traced. It represents a refund from a deposit Galt posted for telephone service at 1836 Forth Serrano, Los Angeles, which was discontinued 1/22/08. Only one long distance call had been charged to Calt. This was made 12/10/67 to telephone number 200-703-2303, which is listed for Bear Valley Lodge, 40 miles capt of Lake Alpha, California. Sacramento is checking this out. Los Angeles is checking for records of local calls made by Galt, One local call from Galt's telephone has been traced to the Los Angeles campaign headquarters of George Wallace,

It has been established by botel records that Galt stayed at Hotel Pio, Puerto Vallaria, Julisco, Acadeo, from 10/19/67 to 11/6/67. Additional details are being obtained.

It has previously been reported Galt took dancing lessons in Directly ham in September, 1967, and in New Orleans in 1884-65.

Durlin and Jane Meyers, who gave dance lessons to Galt in Birmingham and New Orleans, say he is "exary" about dancing but a poor dancer and difficult to teach because he cannot remember instructions. He gave no information about himself and answered questions with yer or no answers. He was a loner who did not mingle and made no effort to make friends.

Catherine Norton, National Dance Studio, Long Deach, California, states she frequently gave lessons to an Eric Galt from December, 1967, to February, 1968. Galt told her he was a merchant seaman not presently working and was attending bertending school. He did not appear friendly with dance students or instructors. Calt did attend one party of approximately 20 dance students but agrived and left along, stayed to himself during the party and was uncommunicative. He drank an alcoholic gench at the party. Norton said in general Galt was withdrawn and often evenive. Ele described him as about 27 years old, having brown, crew out hair, slightly protruding ears, straight, narrow nose, blue eyes, slight Southern accont, rural language and diction suggesting he does not have a high degree of education, 5° 11"; 165-170 pounds, tooth straight and clean, fingernalis clean and trimmed, wore gold ring with dark sions, always neatly dressed with cost, tie and shiny black alligator shoes, and wore a tie tue and cuff links. He had a nervous habit of occasionally pulling at an ear lobe. She described him as a good dancer.

Reducy Arvidson, owner of above studio, stated Eric Galt, 1825 North Serrano, Los Argeles, took a \$430.00 dance course from December, 1937, until February, 1983, when he said he quit abruptly to go to a bartending school. He believed Galt had recently been in Monico and thinks he is a Southerner from his references to Alabama. Galt said he was a morehant scaman. Arvidson, who speaks Spanish, says Galt does not speak Spanish and speaks Paglish poorly, is socially inopt, an introvert, and a poor dancer because he wouldn't loosen up. He rarely suilled and when he did it was a "nervous, excelted smile." Arvidson also said Galt was a loner, unangloyed, and paid cush for his lessons by taking a wad of bills from his picket.

Personnel of the Exhibits Section were dispatched to the Memphis and Birmingham Divisions in order to produce an artist's sketch of the unknown subject based upon witnesses' observations and descriptions. Witnesses in Birmingham furnished oral descriptions which are at variance with the descriptions of Memphis witnesses. Consequently the artists' conceptions show differences which cannot be reconciled.

It was not felt that we should provide the press an artist's conception which was not a good likeness and which would possibly further confuse witnesses and other citizens who may have been the unknown subject. 


With regard to the resemblance between Galt and the artist's conception of the subject. Verson stated that the eyes, nose and chin of the Memphis artist's conception based on the interview of Memphis witnesses should be placed on the artist's conception based on the interview of Birmingham witnesses and that if this were done it would be a better likeness of Galt.

Marlin Myers, owner of Continental Dance Studies, Birmingham, has advised that Eric 5. Galt took dance lessons beginning 9/12/67 when he paid \$10.00 and reported for consecutive weekly lessons from 9/12/67 to 10/3/67. He did not appear for a lesson on 10/10/67 and between 10/10/67 and 10/14/67 Myers received a letter from Galt saying he had to leave town and could not continue the lessons. Myers destroyed the letter and does not recall where it was mailed.

Myers also said that he recalled that Galt had taken dance lessons in 1964 and 1965 when Myers operated the Continental Bence Studies in New Orleans. Records of the New Orleans operation are in possession of Louelia Lutz, a former pariner now in Los Angeles. Joan Myers, wife of Marlin Myers, recalls Galt and believes he took dancing lessons in New Orleans on a full-year budget plan contract possibly starting in April, 1964. She described Galt as a loner who likes to dance.

Louella Lutz has been located in Los Angeles. She has burned most of the records of the New Orleans studio and no record of Galt could be located in the records that remained. She did not recall Galts

Supervisor John Hall, Newark Office, telephonically furnished following information which was obtained during the evening of 4-12-68, from investigation conducted at the Locksmithing Institute, 1500 Cardinal Drive, Little Falls, New Jersey.

Eric S. Calt, student number 30-15189, submitted an enrollment 7-31-67 form dated 7-31-67, at which time his address was furnished as 2589 Rue Notre Dame, EST, Montreal, Quebec, Canada.

Also submitted by Galt was a confidential information form for Locksmithing Institute which contained eight questions that Galt responded to, all answers being typewritten. This form showed Eric S. Galt, student number 30-15189, telephone left blank, age 36, single, no dependents, under employer it was indicated that he was taking a course with American Business Consultants, 16000 Crenshaw, Long Beach, California. Galt indicated he had specialized training in the military in ordnance type work and he felt that a combination of the ordnance work and the locksmithing would combine in one business. He indicated he had a high school education and on the question on how he planned to capitalize on training, he checked "other plans." This form indicated he did not have any physical defects and he furnished the following two character references: Mrs. Rita Steen. 566 Franklin, Los Angeles and Mrs. Marie Deninno, 5533 Hollywood, Los Angeles, whose occupations were shown as housewife and waitress respectively.

He responded to the question if there was any other information which would help in connection with his enrollment, that he had never been convicted of a crime or grand or petty larceny. This form was signed Eric S. Galt, 1535 -N- Serrono, Los Angeles, California, 90027, in handwriting.

The records of the institute revealed a third form which contained the "School Record" of Eric S. Galt, Student Number 30-1-15189, 1535 N. Serrano, Los Angeles, California, and furnished a change of address (no date) to 2608 Highland Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama, 35205. A photograph copy of the enrollment ledger, and accounting document showed a change of address as of 3-30-68, to 113 14th Street, N.E., Atlanta, Georgia. Memorandum to Mr. Rosen

Of significance is a handwritten note made by an employee of the school on Galt's record 10-5-67, "Going on vacation, will advise."

SA Hall advised that the Locksmithing Institute records are in a state of flux with respect to the ledgers and that efforts are continuing to locate any additional information. The only additional thing that the manager thinks may be in the ledger records is a subscription card.
