

On Tuesday, June 18, 1968, Cpl.
J.S.DUNIOP of the R.C.M.P. O Division, Toronto,
Ontario, contacted the Laundry and Dry Cleaning
identification examiner of this branch in regard
to attempting to identify a Laundry mark which
appeared on a shirt collar. The mark was described
as an encircled C over the digits 24, and when
records search had been completed, appeared to
be of the type employed by personnel of Community
Cleaners, 789 Dundas Street West, Toronto, Ontario.

subsequently, Sgt FULLERTON and Cpl. DUNIOP, H.C. H.F. officers attended this section on Monday, July 8, 1968, producing photographs of two separate laundry marks. One of the photographs related to the mark previously described. The second photograph portrayed the mark EG-C83 which appeared to be on the waist band of a pair of underpants. The investigating officers were of the opinion that a positive identification had been made in regards to Community Clemers in the case of the shirt and requested that an examination be made of the second mark.

It is my understanding our examiner Mr. C.O. Byrne and the investigating officers are in complete agreement that both marks examined could have been made by personnel of Community Cleaners. I also believe that the investigating officers would like a report on this matter.

- 1. Further to para. #22 of PCR dated 17 JUN 68, Miss Marie Monique Marcelle MATHIEU (B.D. 18 DEC 40) was contacted and interviewed.
- 2. The phone bill in question was obtained from her and is held as item #1 on Exhibit Report 68/47. Copies of Exhibit Report are attached. This phone bill was initialed by Cpl. Power, Cst. MOUSSEAU and MATHIEU.
- 3. MATRIEU states that all calls shown on this bill were made by KIMBLE. MATRIEU does not know whom he was calling and did not hear any of his conversations.
- 4. Photostat copies of this phone bill are attached for further investigation by the F.B.I. At present, investigations are being conducted with the BELL TELEPHONE CO. to obtain all particulars concerning these calls.
- 5. MATHIEU stated that KIMBLE obtained his ownphone after the 15 SEP 67. The phone number he had, she no longer remembers. Further investigations are being conducted to obtain this number through the BELL at which time a further check will be made to obtain all particulars of any phone calls made.
- 6. During our general conversation with her concerning KIMBLE, she confirmed the information given by SALWYN as mentioned in para. #6(c) of PCR dated 17 JUNE 68.
- 7. Further to what she had told SALWYN, she stated that on one occasion, she noticed two (2) rifles and some ammunition in the trunk of KIMBLE'S car. She could not describe the rifles, however, in her opinion, the ammunition appeared to be shot-gun shells.
- 8. MATRIEU further stated that on one occasion, while she and KIMBLE were at the Orange Julep Restaurant on Sherbrooke St. B., Montreal, two (2) persons came and talked to KIMBLE. One was a white male, age 25, believed to be German and the other was a white female, age 25, believed to be French. The conversation was very short, no introduction was made and she did not hear any of the conversation.
- 9. MATHIEU'S present roomate Marie Claude ROUILLARD, (BD 25 NOV 39) was present. ROUILLARD also resided at 3420 St. Germain St. Apt. #3, with her sister Lucille (BD APR 36). ROUILLARD knew KIMBLE through MATHIEU. She corroborated what MATHIEU had stated except that she did not observe any of the rifles in KIMBLE'S car, nor was she present at the Orange Julep Restaurant. Mr. Andrew SALWYN (born 1 FEB 36) of 1225 St-Marc Street, Apartment 1206, Montreal, P.Q. (phone 932-6344), contacted this office in person to give information concerning a Jules Rocco KIMBLE wanted for questioning by the GARRISON PROBE into the John F. KENNEDY murder case. In return for this information, SALWYN wanted to know the following points concerning the case of:

- (a) Address where RAY alias GALT stayed in Montreal.
- (b) Duration of RAY alias GALT's stay in Montreal.

With this information, he hoped to ascertain what, if any, connection there was between the fact that KIMBLE had with RAY in that SALWYN had uncovered through his investigation, that KIMBLE had resided at 3420 St-Germain Street, Montreal, and also through the news media, it was reported in the majority of newspapers that RAY had also resided on St-Germain Street. However, the address for RAY on the street was not mentioned.

- SALWYN further requested that before he gave any information concerning his investigation, he wanted also to have our cooperation in releasing to him on a first-hand basis any information that we may have or may obtain through our investigation concerning the information he had on KIMBLE in order that he may be able to release his investigation as a front-page headline, under his name.
- It will be noted that no information was given to SALWYN but it was impressed on him that cooperation would be given to him should an investigation be made on the information which he intends to give.
- SALWYN further stated that he is employed by the TORONTO STAR and is the Bureau Chief of this newspaper with office located at 1000 St-Antoine Street, Montreal, c/o THE GAZETTE (phone 866-9006).

- It will be noted that SALWYN's main interest is to establish that RAY had resided in the same area and at the same time as KIMBLE during 1967 in Montreal and the possible connection of a conspiracy involving the murder of John F. KENNEDY and Dr. Martin Luther KING. SALWYN did not however mention the latest murder of Robert F. KENNEDY.
- SALWYN stated that during a routine check of Stagermain Street to locate the address of RAY alias GALT, he located the address at 3420 Stagermain Street where KIMBLE resided. SALWYN having been aware of the GARRISON PROBE and the fact that GARRISON is presently looking for KIMBLE, SALWYN conducted an investigation on KIMBLE and came up with the following information:
 - John SUZ, janitor at 3420 St-Germain Street (phone 522-6530) which is a rooming house, was interviewed by SALWYN. SUZ has advised that a Jules Rocco KIMBLE, age approximately 25, white, 6'2" and 200 lbs, had resided at this address during the Summer of 1967. The exact dates were unknown to SUZ as the books for the rooming house are presently in the hands of his accountant who is on holidays at the present time. The description of KIMBLE as given by SUZ matches the description as known by SALWYN. SALWYN has no photo of KIMBLE as he has been unable to obtain one as of the 13 JUN 68. SUZ went on to describe KIMBLE as a girl chaser, unemployed, claimed to be a student and received long distance calls (not collect) every day from an unknown place. KIMBLE also made a few phone calls nearly every day (not collect) to New Orleans, Louisiana, U.S.A. KIMBLE did not pay for any of these calls and left without notice taking with him the janitor's watch and radio. KIMBLE during his stay at this address also received telegrams very often from the U.S.A., exact place unknown.
 - (b) SUZ mentioned that KIMBLE was very friendly with a Marcelle MATHIEU, age 27, white, who resided in an adjacent room to KIMBLE's.
 - (c) SALWYN located MATHIEU at 3280 Bélair Street, Apt. 210, Montreal (phone 721-9612). MATHIEU is a teacher of national science. She stated to SALWYN what she knew concerning KIMBLE and the following is the content of the notes made by SALWYN concerning his interview of MATHIEU.

"On our second date, he suddenly asked me how do I like negroes. I told him I had nothing against them and that I thought that some of them were in fact better than white men. I also told him that I had kissed a negro and it did not make any difference to me. He was living in the same boarding house at 3420 St-Germain Street and he asked me to go out with him, that must have been around September 5 last year. He took me out in his car, it was an ivory CAMARO with a black vinyl roof. He had a pink telephone inside and a special receiver through

which he listened to police radio messages. He asked me once what they were talking about because he could not understand This car also had a police siren and Louisiana licence When I told him how I felt about negroes, he changed plates. the subject and never brought it up again. He told me he was the son of a US Senator but I checked with the American Ambassy and found out it was not true. I told him so and he said there were a lot of Senators in Louisiana and his father was involved in state politics. He also told me that he could hypnotize people and that he helped a doctor curing people with it. told him not to try it on me. He said that he studying psychology at McGill University but I found that this was not true Some time he told me he did not have any money to take When I told him that I had none myself, he used to go away for about an hour and came back with plenty in his pockets. Once, I managed to take him with me to mass at the St. Joseph Oratory. When we returned to the boarding house, there was a note from the Canadian National Telegram Office telling him that there was a telegram for him at the station. We went there and after he read the telegram, he said: "There are things that we did and that we should not have done". I "Never mind". asked what was he talking about and he answered: I once asked him where he got his money from and replied: "That is none of your business". He told me that he had tried some narcotic; and made other people try it but that he gave it up. He also told me that he was in a airplane accident and had a big scar on his chest. This scar, I saw. In the beginning, he used to come to my room to use my phone and make long distance calls. Later, I received a bill for \$40 from the Bell Telephone people for these calls which he never paid. All the calls were made to New Orleans. had some friends in the area but I never met them. he left the boarding house suddenly on the weekend after September 2). We were no longer going out together at this time. He and I also went to EXPO and the only thing he wanted to see was the Russian and American Pavilions. After that, he was never away from the house except for a maximum of three hours at a time during the week. He often went away during weekends. He made one weekend trip to Miami by aircraft."

(d) The phone bill as mentioned by MATHIEU is still in her possession; however, she will not give it to SALWYN but only to the RCMP. SALWYN did not see this phone bill.

SUZ further advised that KIMBLE borrowed \$5.00 from a Pierre TULMOZZ, age 22, who resided in the next apartment building to KIMBLE. TULMOZZ was contacted by SALWYN and he stated that he never received the \$5.00 from KIMBLE and further stated that KIMBLE had a friend living or nearby Sherbrooke Street. He did not know the address as KIMBLE never took him along when he went to visit this male friend. TULMOZZ also stated that he went out with another girl and this girl's

name he could not remember. TULMOZZ said that this girl knows the friend who lives nearby Sherbrooke Street.

- Further investigation by SALWYN resulted in the locating of this girl by the name of Lise ROBILLARD, age 19, white, unemployed, 155 St-Alexis Street, Charlemagne District, Montreal. Before contacting ROBILLARD, SALWYN was able to speak to ROBILLARD's mother who resides with her and she stated that KIMBLE was known to them as a doctor.
- 9. ROBILLARD was interviewed and the following is the content of SALWYN's interview with her:

"She stated that she met KIMBLE while she was hitchhiking from St. Mary's School to her residence. At this time, KIMBLE was driving the ivory CAMARO. When she was picked up by KIMBLE, they went to a small restaurant on Sherbrooke Street East, which she believes to be the ORANGE JULEP. Then he drove her home. For the next two weeks, he picked her up every morning and took her back every night. During these two weeks, he mentioned that he was expecting a call from a man. This man eventually called and according to the voice on the phone, he was between 30 and 40 years and English speaking. This phone call was received at her residence. There were no names mentioned and the call was believed to be a local one and no place was mentioned. He used her phone only once to make a local call. No names were mentioned and he said afterthis call, that he was wanted at the Montreal General Hospital on an emergency call where he worked. On one occasion, she went with KIMBLE at which time he told her he had papers to be signed. These were three identical sheets and they were to be signed by a notary which lived on Sherbrooke Street East opposite a Dominion Shopping Centre. After signing these documents, KIMBLE received \$250. This he had mentioned to her. He said he was leaving for Florida at the end of the month. He must have left as she had received a call from him later, saying that he was in Florida. This call was not a collect call. He said that he would come back to Montreal. She received another call, this time from New Orleans (not collect) a few days later. He said this time he had an accident and she understood it to be a car accident and was unable to come back to Montreal. He said he was working at a hospital in New Orleans called The MONTELEPRI HOSPITAL, 3rd Department. She phoned him on her own phone and reached him under the name KIMBLE at this hospital. At this time, he offered to pay for her fare to New Orleans which she refused. She received another call later from New Orleans (not collect) from KIMBLE and this was to pass on Christmass greetings. Lise ROBILLARD also stated that she also saw the scar on KIMBLE's chest and it was also mentioned by Mrs. ROBILLARD and Mr. ROBILLARD that they too also saw this scar on his chest. ROBILLARD further stated that she only knows the photo of RAY as having observed it in the newspapers."

- SALWYN made further investigations and located the notary who is André COUTELLIER and resides at the corner of Léry Street and Sherbrooke Street East, Montreal. COUTELLIER does not recall the name KIMBLE. In the opinion of SALWYN, he states that this notary appears to him of a shady character. SALWYN established at this time that an American male, white, student from Michigan University stayed with the notary during the Summer of 1967. No further information could be obtained by SALWYN.
- 11. SALWYN advised that MATHIEU resides with a Marie-Claude ROUILLARD, age 27, white, believed to be a school teacher.
- 12. SALWYN through his investigation with TULMOZZ ascertained that KIMBLE returned to Montreal approximately a month after he had first left, at which time he was driving a yellow CHEVELLE with Louisiana licence plates.
- SALWYN was advised by his office in Toronto that they had been in touch with GARRISON himself who advised that KIMBLE when last observed in the U.S.A. was driving a yellow CHEVELLE. GARRISON further stated that KIMBLE was wanted for impersonating a police officer. GARRISON further stated that KIMBLE had flown to Montreal on several occasions on an aircraft owned and piloted by FERRY. FERRY was the person who had committed suicide after being involved in the GARRISON PROBE. GARRISON also stated that SHAW who is another person involved in the GARRISON PROBE, was in Montreal meeting with KIMBLE and FERRY in regards to taking Cuban refugees from Montreal to New Orleans and apparently, these transactions were completed; however, the dates were not mentioned and the aircraft used was owned and piloted by FERRY.

- SALWYN made an investigation at TIP TOP TAILORS on Ste-Catherine Street East where RAY under the name of GALT had purchased a suit. This information SALWYN received through a newspaper story which appeared in the MONTREAL-MATIN on the 12 JUN 68. Photostats attached. The only information he received from TIP TOP was that GALT lived on Notre-Dame Street East and he had purchased a suit on the 19 JULY 67 and that the RCMP had all documents pertaining to this purchase.
- 15. With this information, SALWYN located RAY's address on Notre-Dame Street East and spoke to a tenant who resided at this address during the stay of GALT. Through this tenant, he received the name QUINTAL and having already known that QUINTAL resided in Windsor, Ontario, this information having been mentioned in numerous newspapers, his Toronto Office phoned QUINTAL; however, QUINTAL would not talk to them and hung up. The only thing that QUINTAL wanted to know was how the TORONTO STAR got his name and address.
- 16. SALWYN further stated that through his Toronto Office, they were able to obtain from KIMBLE's lawyer, name not known at this time, however lives in U.S.A., that KIMBLE made two (2) trips

to Montreal during last Summer, means of transportation unknown. SALWYN further stated that they had made arrangements through KIMBLE's lawyer to speak to KIMBLE at 9:00 p.m. on the 13 JUN 68; however, this did not materialize. Apparently, KIMBLE's lawyer was the only one who knows the present whereabouts of KIMBLE.

- SALWYN is very interested in establishing whether RAY alias GALT, actually lived on St-Germain Street as reported in numerous newspaper articles. He further advised that through his associates in newspaper media field, he ascertained that the information concerning St-Germain Street which appeared in newspapers was obtained from our Headquarters in Ottawa.
- 18. At the present time, SALWYN is canvassing St-Germain Street in the area where KIMBLE resided in an effort to establish where on this street RAY resided.
- 19. It will be noted that through Montreal investigations concerning the KING file, the street St-Germain was never ascertained.
- This report is being submitted under this classification in order to protect the information received from SALWYN in the event that his information is factual and also this report is being submitted as SALWYN once he makes a connection that RAY resided or was an associated of KIMBLE's, he will through the TORONTO STAR have an article published asking why and for what reasons RAY and KIMBLE were in Montreal and the possible connection between the assassinations of President John F. KENNEDY and Dr. Martin Luther KING. Whether there will be any mention of the assassination of Robert F. KENNEDY was not mentioned by SALWYN.
- 21. SALWYN further stated that prior to the release of his story to the TORONTO STAR, he will give me a copy of his release.



- 2. Further enquiries were made at the two hotels and the Y.M.C.A. The pictures were shown to the owners of the hotels, the bar tenders and the Manager of the Y.M.G.A. all with negative results. The registers at the hotels and Y.M.C.A. were checked but no familiar names appeared.
- Enquiries were also made at the only two Taxi stands and the local restaurants. No one had seen anyone resembling the photographs of RAY and BRIDGEMAN.

- Ganvassing of hotels, banks, car dealers, Post Offices, dry-cleaning establishments continued on this date by C.I.S. members. Through co-operation with Ar. He showed her BRIDGMAN's name typewritten on a piece of paper. When she replied that he moved, the man left. She did not know the man, he did not show any identification nor does she know what agency, if any, he represented. She was asked why she had not related this event during her numerous contacts with investigators earlier whereupon she stated she thought she had told us. At this point she admitted she was thoroughly confused by the events of the past week especially by her encounters with various newspaper men and photographers. It will be noted in para. 25 that on 6 JUN 68, she was interviewed with the assistance of C/M B. HRIBAC, at which time Mrs. SEPAKONSKA advised that BRIDGMAN had no associates nor was he visited by anyone. This phase of the interview was explored at that time and no mention was made of anyone asking for DRIDGMAN after he left. Due to Mrs. SZPAKONSKA admitted a confused state of mind, I place some doubt that a young man asked for BRIDGMAN; however, every effort will be made to identify this person.

- Mr. Robert McNAULTON (DB: 26 MAR 17) 10 Bellehaven Cresc., Toronto, Ontario, appeared at M.T.P.D. Headquarters and identified himself as probably being the "fat man" who delivered the letter to SNEYD, 962 Dundas St. West, Toronto, Ontario. He stated that he used the phone booth just up the street from this address, found an open letter addressed to SNEYD, realized the address was just a few houses away, walked up to the door and delivered same, telling SNEYD he found it in the phone booth. Cpl. J.S. Dunlop and Det.Sgt. R. Marsh interviewed this man and subsequently had him positively identified by Mrs. LOO. There is no doubt that McNAULTON is innocently connected with SNEYD. In view of the publicity given all known persons involved with this investigation by the press, McNAULTON asked that his identity not be released to the press. This request has been respected at this point.
- Various avenues of investigation are underway at this time, checking on persons who allegedly believe that had some association with RAY during his stay in the Toronto area. A map of Toronto found at 962 Dundas St. West has an area circled in pen at queen Street and Ossington Avenue, which is close to where RAY lived as BRIDGMAN; the Vital Statistics Office circled, and four areas marked in the eastern section of the City. Investigation is continuing to determine what connection these marked areas have with RAY.
- An Eric 3. GAULT, one of the aliases used by RAY was previously checked on in Toronto on 19 APR 68. The man here is aric St. Vincent GALT, Supervisor, UMION CARBIDS CAMADA LIMITED, home address 49 Leahann Drive, Scarborough, Ontario. He is a trusted employee and known to be in Toronto on the date in question. See Telex CIB996/2 received from the Commissioner and Telex CIB736 sent from "O" Division 19 APR 68.

The BOAC manifest referred to in Para. 32 showed SHEYD as a passenger on Flight 600, however, their manifest for the proposed return flight on 21-5-68 did not list this name. This information was relayed to Ottawa by telephone and we believe was assistance to Scotland Yard in determining that RAY had exchanged the return portion as detailed in Para. 33.

4. It might be mentioned that the laundry marks referred to in your telex CIB 1507 have been checked against the records held by the 0.P.P., negatively. They suggest they might have originated in Montreal last suggest or in the U.S.A. prior to RAY entering Canada.

5. We have no concrete information that anyone knowingly assisted RAY during his stay in this city, however, all aspects are receiving continuous attention and further correspondence will be forthcoming as information of value becomes available.
