- Further to paragraph 10 of PCR dated 19 APR 68, MACNAN was re-interviewed and shown the photograph of RAY which appears on F.B.I. Identification Orders 4182 and Wanted Flyer 442. He stated that on his trip to Nassau via U.S.A., he had seen the same photographs of RAY in SEGAL.
- Further to paragraph 7 of PCR dated 7 MAY 68, "C" Division C.I.S. will forward copies of F.B.I. I.O. #4182 to major police forces in the Province of Quebec who are known to maintain latent fingerprints files. These I.O.s will be forwarded along with a covering letter requesting that RAY's fingerprints be compared against those they may have on file. Only affirmative replies are being requested.
- Further to memorandum from the A/Officer i/c C.I.B. dated in Ottawa 6 MAY 68, the F.B.I. Wanted Flyers are being retained at G.I.S. PCR dated 7 MAY 68.
- Further to memorandum from the A/Officer i/c C.I.B. dated in Ottawa 7 MAY 68, and appended to F.B.I. correspondence, Ginette BORMANN née LaFURETE will be interviewed in respect to her knowledge of RAY.
- Insofar as EDMONDSON's allegations that all hoodlums are familiar with the procedure to get Canadian passports, this is not contradicted at this point as the same application documents are readily available for any honest citizen who wishes a passport. As a primary requisite, the wanted person needs a birth certificate under a new name. Past experience in this line has shown that sometimes in order to obtain a birth certificate under an assumed name, a wanted person reads the obituary column of newspapers or visits a graveyard and reads inscription on headstones. From these two sources, he finds a deceased person of approximately his age as well as some family background. Using the deceased person's name, he writes to the Registrar of Births (includes in his letter the nominal price of a birth certificate) and requests a copy of his birth certificate which, in turn, is mailed to him at a given address. Under his assumed name, the wanted person then completes a passport application form or has this done through an intermediary, includes the necessary fee and in due course receives his passport by mail again at a given address.

- from Mr. STEPHEN, the Night Manager of the Sheraton-Mt.Royal Hotel in Montreal, P.Q. These papers had originally been found on the 9 MAY 68 in the main hallway of the fourth floor of the hotel by a client, Mrs. H.R. JOSEPH, P.O. Box 96 Northridge, California, U.S.A., telephone 782-0080, who was occupying room 4008 at the hotel. On receipt of STEPHEN's call, CORNETTA had proceeded to the hotel and had spoken to Mr. and Mrs. JOSEPH who had wanted that these items be turned over to the F.B.I. Whilst at the hotel, CORNETTA requested that hotel security collect all papers from the refuse closet in the proximity of the hallway where Mrs. JOSEPH had picked up the papers as it was suspected that the papers had originally been disposed of in a hotel room waste paper basket and had been dropped on the hallway floor by a cleaning maid when transferring paper wastes from her cleaning cart to the refuse closet.
- that she had picked up the papers in the main hallway of the fourth floor around 10:00 p.m. of the 9 MAY 66 in the proximity of the refuse closet. The onion skin paper had been folded in four and the section of the match-book cover was next to it. Mrs. JOSEPH had added that she first noticed these papers in the hallway during the late afternoon of the 9th around 4:00 p.m. and had walked by them on various occasions until she decided to pick them up for no reason at all. On having noticed the context of over to Mr. THOMPSON of the Security had been called and the papers handed them over to Mr. STEPHEN.
- At the conclusion of the interview, Mrs. JOSEPH was asked to point out where she had picked up the papers and this is indicated as (c) on the attached diagram of the section of the fourthfloor concerned.

Hotel cleaning maids employed in the area concerned were interviewed and no information of value was obtained. They viewed the photographs of RAY with negative results. One more cleaning maid remains to be interviewed and this will be reported on accordingly.

Refuse collected from the closet has been examined and no 15. documentation which could be directly linked to exhibit items 1 and 2 of Exhibit Report #68/38 was found. Eleven (11) pieces of paper and envelopes containing various writings were however found and are being retained at this point and are covered in item 3 of Exhibit Report 68/38. In respect to items 3-1 to 3-5 inclusive, all these papers were found folded together and enquiries conducted at the Sheraton-Mt. Royal Hotel revealed that W.J. DUTHIE of 4745 Picadilly Street, Vancouver, B.C., was registered in Room 4019 from the 4 MAY 68 and he checked out of the hotel at 2:22 p.m. of the 9 MAY 68. Further report in respect to items 3-6 to 3-11 inclusive will be submitted. In respect to item #2 of Exhibit Report 68/38, it has been established that the portion of the matchbook cover concerns the ST.MORITZ Hotel of New York City, N.Y. The George Clark Association of 1010 Ste-Catherine West, Montreal, are the local representatives of ST.MORITZ Hotel. They were contacted and they advised that the matchbooks of the ST.MORITZ Hotel are only available at the said hote; however, the George Clark Association office does have a few on hand for advertising purposes. In the event it is deemed necessary to compare the handwriting on the exhibit item #1 of Exhibit Report #68/38, original copies of hotel registration cards will be obtained under authority of a search warrant.







On 25 APR 68, occurrence was received from Montreal G.I.S. Section, regarding the complaint of Mrs Marie Jeanne CORRIVEAU, 594 Delanaudiere, Joliette, P.Q.

On 26 APR 68, Mrs COERIVEAU was questionned and she said that on the 22 APR 68, she saw Eric Starvo GALT, who is actually wanted for the murder of Martin Luther King; she saw GALT driving a light blue car whom passed in front of her house, while she was painting it; the said car was mooving at a very low speed, and the individual who was driving it, stopped in front of 580 Delanaudiere, Joliette and weht into a bakery.

Mrs CORRIVEAU did not play any more attention, but later, when she read the newspaper, she saw the real picture of -- Gelt and she remembered having seen him during the day.

The cashier at the said bakery, Mr Jacques Messier, was questionned and upon showing him the picture of Galt, he said that he never saw the man in question; he also said that Mrs CORRIVEAU is a little mentally disturbed.

During the follo ing days, several phone calls were received from Mrs Corriveau and she said that the "Mafia" wanted to kill her because she talked. She said that they had cut the electricity in her house and she was very afraid and wanted our protection.

As Mrs Corriveau seemed to be a little mentally disturbed, this occurence is considered as closed at that point. Copy of this report is forwarded to Montreal G. . . S. for their information.

- 1. On the above date, Miss Marjorie BIRCH called to report that when she saw the picture of GALT, alledged assassin of Dr. Martin Luther KING when shown on the 11:00 p.m. TV news this evening, she noticed a striking resemblance to a person she had seen at 6:00 p.m. today in the waiting room of the Cartierville Airport. The man, in his early thirties, 5:10" or 5:11", had facial features practically similar to the one shown on TV. For more details, Miss Birch advised she could be contacted at 288-8322 the next day in the a.m.
- Miss Marjorie BIRCH was interviewed at which time she was shown a glossy photograph of Eric Starvo GALT. She identified him as being the man she saw the Laurentide Aviation, Cartierville Airport. BIRCH's roommate agreed with the above. They both saw the suspect enter by the door that leads to the runway. He was dressed in a camel hair sweater. The physical description is identical to the one held by this office. A check at the Laurentide Aviation waiting room proved that the suspect was not seen by the employees.
- Mr. LAMBERT, despatcher of the said airport, was asked if any aircrafts came in around 6:00 p.m. of the 17-4-68. He stated that the only one that came in at that time was registered to Ted WALKER from Aylmer Ontario, registration number CF-UGO. He also mentioned that he was accompanied by some passengers. A telex was forwarded to London Detachment requesting checks on the owner, date and time of departure from Aylmer, identification of passengers and destination. A reply was received stating that CF-UGO flew to Montreal on business on the 2-4-68. Log book and independent sources verified that the said plane was on the ground at Aylmer, Ontario, for the duration of the 17-4-68.
- Mr. LAMBERT was again contacted at which time he stated having made an error and that he now remembers WALKER's flight on the 2-4-68. At this point, the Daily Air Traffic Records of Cartierville Airport, were obtained from the Control Tower giving all the details of flights made on the 17-4-68. From these records, the registration number of aircrafts, owners, arrivals and departures between the hours of 4:00 pm and 8:00 pm were taken off the said records. The flights made between the said hours were aircrafts mostly all registered to Laurentide Aviation, Won Del Aviation and The Montreal Flying Club which makes up the Cartierville Airport. After checking these flying clubs, the writer was advised that these are mostly all routine training flights; however, the log books were checked and the pilots, students or passengers are registered and all known by the said clubs. Other aircrafts not attached to Cartierville Airport were identified as being regular customers and are also known at this point.

The writer was also made aware that no pilot can depart the airport for a flight without checking with the front office. He also has to identify his student or passengers. A violation of this sort would cause a pilot to loose his licence. Therefore, there does not appear to be any possibility whatsoever that GALT could have arrived or departed without being registered or noticed. It should be noted that the staffs of these flying clubs were shown a photograph of GALT at which time the writer was advised that he was not seen in these vicinities; however, if he is seen, our office will be advised.

6. Due to the above facts, this file is considered closed unless otherwise instructed.

- Miss Shirley GREENFORD contacted the Duty N.C.O. and stated that she had information concerning Eric Starvo GALT. This information was referred to Cst. Donelle for immediate attention. was interviewed at her place of employment, "SEE EUROPE TOURIST", 375 Victoria Ave., room 204, Westmount, telephone no. 489-5359, and she stated that a former employee, named Collin J. BLACKHAN, 7845 Mountain Sights, apt. 73, Montreal, telephone no. 733-4224, has a strong resemblance of suspect. He was employed from 25 MAR 68 to 29 MAR 68 and on that date he told her that he was flying to New York and she said that SAUNDERS, another employee, told her that BLACKMAN said that he was flying to Philadelphia. SAUNDERS was subsequently interviewed on the 29th. He was asked to describe BLACKMAN and the description given was the exact description held by this Office on GALT. He was then shown the photograph of GALT and he identified BLACKHAN as being GALT. It was also learned at the Agency that he quit his job without notifying his employer and for no apparent reasons; he was again seen on the 8th or the 9th of April by SAUNDERS whilst driving in a 1968 white convertible, Ontario plates, make and licence number unknown. He told SAUNDERS that he had been in the hospital and that he would contact him in theafternoon but has never been seen or heard from afterwards.
- The record of Collin J. BLACKMAN, F.P.S. no. 742327, was requested on the 30th of April and his photograph as well as GALT's and several others, were again examined by Miss GREENFORD, Mr. SAUNDERS and Mr. CLEMENS, manager of the said agency, who had returned from a trip. They all picked out BLACKMAN's photograph as being the one employed previously at the Agency. Mr. CLEMENS was shown GALT's photograph which he identified as also being BLACKMAN. Other photographs of GALT taken from the "Newsweek Magazine" which were taken in 1952, 59, 60 and 66 were also shown to the staff. Miss GREENFORD said that the photo of GALT taken in 1960 had a strong resemblance of BLACKMAN and Mr. SAUNDERS said that the photograph taken in 1966 resembled BLACKMAN.
- BLACKMAN was located and interviewed at this office; I immediately recognized BLACKMAN whom I met some five (5) years ago whilt he was working for Murray Hill Limousine Service at the Monteeal International Airport, Dorval. He worked for Murray Hill Limousine for approximately three (3) years and has held various jobs since that time including SEE EUROPE TOURIST, TRAILWAYS OF CANADA, Richmond Hill, Ont, CHARLTON TRANSPORT and is now driving a taxi for Emil ISPAS, 8040 Wiseman Hontreal. He is divorced from his second life Anita DUBE who resides at 7845 Hountain Sights, Montreal and visits his children regularly. He is presently residing at 2582 Sheppard St., Montreal, telephone no. 526-0717, living in common law with Miss Rachel TAYLOR, who I also knew when she was working for Bry's Pharmacy at the Airport. She is now employed ....

NOW EMPLOYED at the Bell Telephone. His social insurance no. His date of birth is March the 9th 1936 but on his driving permit his date of birth is shown as 9th of Harch 1933. He changed his birth date in order to obtain a driver's permit when he was under age and has not been able to change it. BLACKMAN was shown various photographs of GALT and admits that he somewhat resembles GALT but said that his brother strongly resembles GALT and would not be surprised if this office would receive similar information. It is intended to interview BLACKMAN's brother in order to eliminate useless and extensive enquiries.

It should be added that many verifications were made before contacting BLACKMAN but are not elaborated upon in this report. It has been established without any doubt that BLACKMAN is not identical to GALT.

It is to be noted that the better part of the above business concerns would be large in size and have many employees. A direct approach of personnel of these concerns is not concerned feasible at this point and our investigators would have to visit the same business on more than one occasion as all employees would not be readily on hand for interview, i.e., salesmen or employees out on the road, absent on holidays or for various other reasons. As an example: new cars sales garages in Montreal are in an approximate amount of 115. In placing an average of three (3) salesmen per garage, our investigators would have to contact three hundred and forty-five (345) persons on a direct basis.

In view of the above, it is suggested that a form of bilingual "Wanted" notice be prepared by our Crime Index Section for mail circulation to the above mentioned businesses. This matter was discussed with the N.C.O. i/c "C" Division C.I.S. who concurred with the fact that notices could readily be prepared and that this manner of procedure would expedite the investigation. The mailing list would be prepared at G.I.S. level.

These persons would be Mr. and Mrs. Morris QUINTAL, former janitor of RAY's Montreal address, who are presently residing in Windsor, Ontario (reference: Windsor Detachment report dated 18 APR 68).

Photographs of RAY were exhibited and he was asked if any were familiar to him. He replied in the negative and the same results were obtained from his wife. He could add nothing further in respect to the theft of the car itself and neither him nor his wife were familiar with the name Mitchell or Michel ST-PIERRE. EISENBERGER also stated that he would be out of town for the remainder of the week and would not return until the 13 MAY 68.
- Captain ST-PIKRRE, Montreal City Police, was interviewed and through him, a search of records was made with the Auto Theft Squad. A complete ledger which lists all auto thefts from the City of Montreal and surrounding communities was checked for the months of August and September 1967. Out of approximately 1,400 cars reported stolen, the only theft which could be remotely related to this file was one recovered in Glens Falls, New York, U.S.A. The car was rented from Avis Rent-A-Car, 1225 Met-calfe Street, Montreal, P.Q., telephone 861-6761. It was described as a Dodge coach, year 1967, green in colour and bearing 1967 Quebec registration 187-127. This vehicle was reported stolen on the 13 SEPT 67 and located on the same date. No further information could be obtained from the Montreal City Police. With respect to canvassing all homes on Charles Gill Street, it should be noted that there are approximately 300 residences on this street alone. Homes surrounding EISENBERGER's were canvassed and the investigation revealed that they had already been canvassed by police at the time of the car theft. At both times, negative results were obtained. It is felt that further canvassing would not reveal anything of use in this investigation.
- Purther to telex CIB 1128/2 dated 2 MAY 68, this matter was discussed with the N.C.O. i/c "C" Division C.I.S. who will attend to the distribution of RAY's fingerprints to police agencies who maintain latent fingerprints files. This matter will be further discussed with C.I.S when they have received sufficient copies of F.B.I. Identification Orders 4182 for distribution with their request to police forces concerned. The matter of obtaining sufficient copies of the Identification Order has already been attended to by Division C.I.S.

- 1. FORWARDED for your information together with report of 2 MAY 68.
- Report of 3 MAY 68 is also attached and deals with Collin J. BLACKHAH, FPS#742327. Photographs of GALT were shown to Hr. SAUNDERS of the See Europe Tourist and he identified this person as Mr. BLACKHAH, one of their former employees. Photograph of BLACKHAH and several others were shown to Mr. GREENFORD, Mr. SAUNDERS and Mr. CLEMENS, Manager of the said agency and they all picked out BLACKHAH as being their former employees. Mr. CLEMENS was shown GALT's photographs and he also identified this as BLACKHAH. BLACKHAN was interviewed and he was immediately recognized by the investigator who had met him some five (5) years ago when BLACKHAH was working for Murray Hill Limousine at the Montreal International Airport, Dorval, P.Q. BLACKHAH does bear a resemblance of GALT and stated that his brother strongly resembled to GALT and would not be surprised if this office was to receive similar information. BLACKHAN's brother will be interviewed in order to eliminate useless extensive enquiries.
- 3. A bilingual form is being prepared by our C.I.S. for circularizing to all car dealers, Banks, Caisses Populaires and Post Offices in the Montreal area.
- 4. As mentioned in para. 2 of this report, it would be very little time consuming for an investigation if our members were to attempt to interview each employee of these businesses. In. EISEMBERGER was interviewed and shown photographs of RAY with negative results.

1. Further to report dated 19 APR 68 from this Section, please be advised of the following.

- Personal contact was made with the Managers and Sales Staff of the Tip Top Tailors branch stores at Fairview and on Jean Talon. Cst. DONELLE exhibited photographs of RAY alias GALT; however, no identification could be made. Further canvassing of the small stores and beer outlets in the area surrounding 2589 Notre-Dame East also met with negative results.
- Upon receipt of CIB telex 1002/2 from the Commissioner, Ottawa, further enquiries were conducted at the Personnel Office of Expo \*67 and also at their investigations office. Their files were verified for additional aliases; however, this met with negative results. A copy of the "wanted" circular issued by Ottawa was received at this point. Enquiries with the Q.P.P. and M.C.P. revealed that as soon as such a circular is received, their files are immediately verified by them. Again, this netted negative results.
- 4. With respect to reported sightings of RAY in this area, please find appended hereto copies of form C-238 numbered 68/52-67-68 which are self-explanatory.
- Enquiries are continuing to cover all possible leads and a further report will be submitted. Please find attached forms C-246 to cover lease and ledger sheet previously mentioned. Should these exhibits be required for handwriting analysis, please advise. It may be noted that close liaison is being maintained with M.C.P. as most leads requiring investigation fall within their jurisdiction.

- Insp. Duchesneau, from a French speaking male person, who refused to identify himself, to the effect that a white male roughly fitting the description of the fugitive Eric Stavro GALT was residing at the Chateau Gai Motel, Route #4, Chateauguay, Quebec. The complainant stated that he and his wife were employed at the motel, him as a general handy man, she as a room maid. His wife apparently found two (2) booklets of matches which would have originated from Memphis, Tenn. It was also stated that the suspect received regular visits from a female who drove a white Ford Mustang. In addition, the suspect had a white 1960 Chevrolet bearing 1968 Quebec licence no. 7M-2595. The complainant stated that the suspect had a knife in his room as well as in his car, and generally acted in a suspicious manner.
- The complainant enquired about a reward offered for the capture of GALT, and was informed by Insp. Duchesneau that \$100,000.00 reward was being offered by the U.S. authorities. Arrangements were then made whereby a member of this Force would meet the complainant, alone, at 7.00 P.M. at the Tower Shopping Centre, Route \$4, Chateauguay, Quebec. Suitable arrangements were made for the identification and recognition of the complainant.
- 7. Verification of 1968 Quebec licence no. 7N-2595 revealed that same was not yet on file to Quebec Motor Vehicle Bureau, Quebec City.
- At 7.00 P.H. on even date, I met Lucien LEVESQUE, D.O.B. 11 MAR 30 and his wife Nicole at the pre-designate location. They confirmed that they were the complainants in question and they were both employed at the Chateau Gai Motel in the capacities previously mentioned. LEVESQUE stated that he and his wife started work on the 6 APR 68 and that the suspect, whose first name was "Clod" (phonetic was already residing at the motel. They were unable to supply his correct name or state exactly when he has checked in. The subject was quartered in unit #19.
- LEVESQUE stated that the subject kept a bayonet in his room, and a digger on the dash part of his car. He kept irregular hours and did not appear to be employed. The subject is described by LEVESQUE as being approximately 30 years of age, blonde receding hair, blue eyes, 5'7" to 5'3", 170 to 180 lbs., fair complexion and a husky built. Subject speaks English with what LEVESQUE describes as an .....

- During the week of the S to 13 of April Mrs. LEVESQUE, after emptying the waste baskets from a number of motel units, including that of the subject, found two (2) booklets of matches, both having originated from a Sea Food Restaurant in Memphis, Tenn. Mrs. LEVESQUE cannot state that these matches come from the subject's room but merely from one of a group of rooms, including that of the suspect, which she had cleaned that day. LEVESQUE was asked to produce the match booklets in question but stated that they were in other clothes they had at the motel.
- 7. When discussing of the woman driving the Mustang, LEVESQUE described her as being 19 to 20 years of age, shoulder length blonde hair, 5°3", 105 lbs. casually but neatly dressed. LEVESQUE was unable to supply the licence number of the Ford Mustang driven by this woman, however he stated that it was a recent model that it was a Past back, and that it was pale yellow and not white, as previously mentioned.
- At this point the photographs of GALT were shown to LEVESQUE and his wife and both stated that the subject "CLOD" was not GALT. The most distinguishing feature of GALT as applied to our subject indicate that GALT has a full head of dark hair and that his ears stick out from his head. LEVESQUE pointed out that the subject had blonde receding hair and that his ears did not stick out. The date of the photograph of GALT is not known however it is assumed that it would be several years old. The possibility therefore of him having a receding hair line does exist and it was decided to have LEVESQUE obtain more details of the subject "CLOD". LEVESQUE stated that he would be able to obtain the subject's name and date of registration from the motel records. He indicated that his wife had seen Income Tax documents in subject's room and she would take any details that she was able to from those documents. It was then agreed that LEVESQUE would phone this Office on the following day at 11.30 A.M. with any further information he could supply.

# 19-4-68

Stated that the subject's full name was Joseph Claude EDWARDS and that he had checked into the Chateau Gai Motel some time in December 1967 and that he had been living there continuously since that time. He stated that upon cleaning EDWARD's room his wife had come across subject's Social Insurance card He stated that as his wife had been cleaning the room with another maid, she had been unable to explore EDWARD's personal papers. LEVESQUE stated that he had again perused the photograps of GALE which had appeared in the local newspapers, and having compared them to EDWARDS, was positive that EDWARDS was not GALE. He further added that he had been unable to find the two (2) booklets of ....

..... BOOKLETS OF matches, and that he had probably thrown them away.

Verification of subject's social Insurance number through our U.I.C. source indicated that EDWARDS was born on the 30-6-43 in Newfoundland. Subject claimed U.I.C. benefits in 1960/61 and 62 in Newfoundland. He is at present claiming benefits from the U.I.C. office at 1035 Galt Avenue, Verdun, Quebec and has been doing so since the 24th of March 1968. He is listed on U.I.C. records as being married with two children Mark and Scott. His last employment was St.Lawrence Steeplejack Co., 823 Atwater Street, Montreal. His address on U.I.C. records is shown as 350 Oliver Street, Chateauguay, Quebec.

Il. The indices of the Q.P.P., M.C.P., and this office were checked and it has been determined that EDWARD has no criminal record here.

Mr. Gilles GAGNE, registration clerk at the Chateau Gai Notel was interviewed and stated that EDWARDS checked in on the 13th of December 1967 and has lived there since that time. His rental is \$15.20 per week. In so far as GAGNE was able to state, EDWARDS is unemployed and lives off of U.I.C. Benefits. GAGNE stated that EDWARDS had resided at the motel during the summer of 1967 and had left returning on the date mentioned above. GAGNE was asked to verify motel records from the first of April up until the present time in order to determine whether or not any guests had been registered as having been from Memphis, Tenn. He did so but was unable to come across any visitor from the State of Tennessee, although there were numerous registrations from U.S. citizens of every part of the U.S.A.

Acting on verbal instructions received from the C.I.B. Officer EDWARDS was interviewed by Cst. Grondin and myself. It was noted that the description of EDWARDS given by LEVESQUE was quite accurate with the exception that EDWARDS wears long sideburns. It was also noted that he bears absolutely no resemblance to the photograph of the fugitive GALF.

Subject was asked to identify himself and produced Quebec 1968 driver's permit #E-3632300643 in addition he produced his Social Insurance card He also produced 1968 Quebec registration #78-2595 showing a 1960 Chevrolet Coupe as being registered under his name at 350 Oliver Street, Chateauguay, Quebec. EDWARDS stated that he was born in Lawn, Newfoundland and that his father Patrick EDWARDS still resides there. Subject stated that he is married and legally separated from his wife Janine DUNALLY, and that he has two (2) sons Wark three years old and Scott 1; years old who reside with his wife. He stated that his wife resides with her parents in Verdun but he does not know her address. Subject stated that the address of 350 Oliver Street is the home of Paul HENOPHY who is a good friend, and ....

..... IS A GOOD FRIEND, AND that he uses this address as he was not able to register his vehicle showing residence in a motel.

- 15. He stated that the woman described in previous paragraph and driving the Mustang vehicle in question, is his girl friend Lise COUVIER who is employed as a secretary by the Diamond Reel Co. in Dorval. Quebec.
- EDWARDS speaks with a definite Newfoundland accent which could have been mistaken by LEVESQUE as a U.S. accent. As it was established through Mr. GAGNE that EDWARDS was living at the motel on the 4th of April, and as we are satisfied that EDWARDS was in no way connected with the assassination of Doctor KING, further investigations into his background were discontinued. This phase of the investigation will be concluded at this point.

## 16 AFR 68

This date, Sgt. B.A. CARREAU, Temporary i/c Sindsor Detachment received a telephone call from Cst. G.s.J. MONUSEAU, Montreal G.I.S. Branch. Cst. MOUSSEAU, acting on instructions from the Assistant C.I.B. Officer, Montreal, F.B., requested that members of our Detachment interview one Morris GUINYAL of this city who used to be the janitor of Markay Apartments, 2559 Notre Dame East, Montreal, F.A. MOUSSEAU went on to say that one Eric S. (Starvo) CALT G John WILLARD & Harvey LOWRIER, suspected by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U.S.A. of assassinating Br. Martin Luther MING in Momphis. Tennessee on 4 AFE 68, reportedly resided at the aforementioned apartment building in Montreal. He further added that GUINTAL was presently residing at or working for Mil Neighbor Floor Company, 557 Myandotte St., East, Windsor, Ontario and requested we interview him and obtain any information whatsoever concerning GALT as soon as possible with results being telephoned to their office.

- In view of the above a check of the Windsor City Directory revealed that Hi! Meighbor Floor Covering Co., Ltd., was located at 257 Syandotte St., East, Windsor, Ontario. A check of the records of this company revealed that Morris QUINTAL was presently employed with their company as warehouse foreman and was presently residing at 1392 Hickory Road, Windsor, Ontario.
- Same date, Cst. H. AVERY and myself interviewed Morris QUINTAL and his wife at their residence. I should mention here that during this interview our true purpose was not divulged to these persons and all questions pertaining to GalT were not associated by these persons to the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther KING. The QUINTALS were questioned at great length and the following information was obtained with regard to GALT. According to the QUINTALS, GALT had rented Apartment \$18, 2589 Notre Dame East, Montreal, P.4. during the month of August, 1967 for 390.00 per month. At the time of renting this apartment GALT was requested to pay two (2) months' rent in advance and to sign a six (6) months ! lease, which he did. During the latter part of September, 1967 Gall informed Mrs. WURTAL that a relative residing in the U.S.A. was very sick and he had to return to that country and departed. The QUINTALS were shown the artist's recreation of the features of the man suspected of killing Mr. KING as released in the Montreal newspaper, The Gazette, Saturday Final Edition, dated 13 APR 68; however, upon examining this drawing both stated that the drawing did not resemble GALT. Their description of GALT is as follows: 5'll" to 6' 160 to 170 lbs., approximately 32 to 35 yrs. of age, light complexion, dark hair combed back at an angle (no receding hair line), shallow face and gave the overall appearance of being thin.

When questioned pertaining to any known associates, visitors, mail, and possible vehicles used by GALT the QUINTALS stated that during the month and a half that he resided at apartment #18, two (2) visitors only were seen visiting his and those were two (2) elderly women, approximately 40 to 42 years of age. The only description given of these two (2) women was that one had reddish brown hair and the other black hair. At this point the names Mrs. Rita STEEN, 5666 Franklin and Mary DENISHO, 5533 Hollywood Avenue, both from Los Angeles, California, were volunteered to QUINTAL in the event that these known associates of GALT were in fact the two women in question; however, neither name made any impression whatsoever on the WINTALS. Upon further questioning Mr. WINTAL stated that at the time subject rented the apartment Gall questioned him as to the price charged for parking a vehicle and when informed that it was \$20.00 a month GALT stated that this figure was too high and asked QUINTAL where else he could park a car. QUINTAL informed him that he could either leave the car on the street in front of the apartment building or parking facilities were available at either a Shell or Esso Service Station down the block from this particular spartment building. It should be mentioned here that at no time did either Mr. or Mrs. QUINTAL observe a vehicle used by GALT. With regard to any mail received by GALT the GUINTALS stated that during the duration of his stay mail was received by his from two (2) sources only; letters from an unknown company in the U.S.A. and another one from Tip Top Tailors, St. Catherine Street, Montreal, P. . advising him that a suit he had purchased was ready for delivery. The only other piece of information concerning GalT that could be supplied was that GALT had informed Mrs. QUINTAL that he was employed by EXPO 67.

Ar. William was questioned with regard to the lease alleged to be signed by GALT and stated quite emphatically that GALT had signed the lease and if his memory served him correctly an information sheet was attached to this document stating GALT's employment, past employment, past addresses, and two (2) relatives. These documents, according to GELNTAL, should either be in the safe or file cabinet on top of the safe in possession of the present superintendent of the apartment building or in possession of the owner of the building, Mr. H. ROTHMAN, 11 Holthman Road, Amstead, P.C. No other information pertaining to GALT could be supplied by the CUINTALS at this time.

7. Same date, the QUINTALS were once again contacted in an effort to ascertain additional information pertaining to GALT that may have been overlooked by them the previous evening. institution. When questioned pertaining to any telephone calls received by GALT the QUINTALS stated that the only phone available to him was a pay phone located in the hallway, and to the best of their knowledge one call only, a local call, was received by GALT. No long distance telephone calls were either received by him or placed by him. At this stage of the proceedings these persons were asked if they could supply a composite sketch of GALT to which they replied in the affirmative.

## 18 APR 68

This date, a further telephone call was received from Cst. MOUSSEAU, Montreal G.I.S. and he requested that the Wanted Flyer No. 442 issued by the F.B.I. dated 17 AFR 68 be shown to the QUINTALS for a positive identification. MOUSSEAU also requested that QUINTAL supply the names of the persons occupying apartments 17 and 19; who the lease signed by GALT was turned over to; and who the rent was paid to.

Same date, the wanted Flyer on GALT was shown to the QUINTALS who stated that this definitely was the man in question and there was no physical change in his appearance. The QUINTALS went on to say that an elderly gentleman by the name of Owen TINDALE was presently occupying apartment 19 and had been there for approximately thirteen (13) years. They could not supply the names of the occupants of apartment 17 nor 17A, however, they did state that this information should be in the possession of the present superintendent and janitor, a Mr. RACICOTT. With regard to the lease signed by GALT the QUINTALS once again emphatically confirmed that a lease was signed by GALT and was turned over to the owner of the building, Mr. H. ROTHMAN. The rent for the apartment was also turned over by QUINTAL to Mr. ROTHMAN.

Officer, Montreal, P.Q., requested that members of our Detachment interview one Morris QUINTAL of this city who used to be the janitor of Markay Apartments, 2589 Notre Dame East, Montreal, P.Q. MOUSSEAU went on to say that one Eric S. (Starvo) GALT & John WILLARD & Harvey LOWMYER, suspected by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U.S.A. of assassinating Dr. Martin Luther KING in Memphis, Tennessee on 4 AFR 68, reportedly resided at the aforementioned apartment building in Montreal. He further added that QUINTAL was presently residing at or working for Hi! Neighbor Floor Company, 557 Myandotte St., East, Mindsor, Ontario and requested we interview him and obtain any information whatsoever concerning GALT as soon as possible with results being telephoned to their office.

- In view of the above a check of the Windsor City Directory revealed that Hi! Heighbor Floor Covering Co., Ltd., was located at 257 Wyandotte St., East, Windsor, Ontario. A check of the records of this company revealed that Morris QUINTAL was presently employed with their company as warehouse foreman and was presently residing at 1392 Mickory Road, Windsor, Ontario.
- Same date, Cst. H. AVARY and myself interviewed Morris QUINTAL and his wife at their residence. I should mention here that during this interview our true purpose was not divulged to these persons and all questions pertaining to GalT were not associated by these persons to the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther KING. The QUINTALS were questioned at great length and the following information was obtained with regard to GALT. According to the QUINTALS, GALT had rented Apartment #18, 2589 Notre Dame East, Montreal, P.J. during the month of August, 1967 for \$90.00 per month. At the time of renting this apartment GALT was requested to pay two (2) months' rent in advance and to sign a six (6) menths' lease, which he did. During the latter part of September, 1967 GALT informed Mrs. QUINTAL that a relative residing in the U.S.A. was very sick and he had to return to that country and departed. The QUINTALS were shown the artist's recreation of the features of the man suspected of killing Mr. KING as released in the Montreal newspaper, The Gazette, Saturday Final Edition, dated 13 AFR 68; however, upon examining this drawing both stated that the drawing did not resemble GALT. Their description of GALT is as follows: 5'11" to 6', 160 to 170 lbs., approximately 32 to 35 yrs. of age, light complexion, dark hair coabed back at an angle (no receding hair line), shallow face and gave the overall appearance of being thin.
