He further noted that the face of the tape has a whitish cast because it is conted with a starch-type material. He stated the true color appearing on the garments recovered in instant case would more closely resemble the color of the underside of the tape.

It is noted that Lot #517 was found to be the lot number of tape in the possession of Home Service Laundry and Dry Cleaning, 5280 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, California, as furnished to Albany Office by Los Angeles Office by telephone call on 4/11/68.

The Laboratory is requested to compare the enclosed specimen of tape with the tape on the garments recovered immediately after the slaying at Memphis for identification of the tape.

At 3:30 PM, 4/11/68, Investigator THOMAS FOGGERTY, NYSP, Sidney, NY, telephonically advised that an un-named truck driver had contacted his office earlier this date, stating he had observed an individual who resembled the artist's conception of the unknown subject in captioned matter. The driver had said the individual he observed was driving a red car bearing Indiana license plates and was heading in a westerly direction on Route 17, east of Binghamton, NY.

Investigator FOGGERTY continued by stating that subsequently a state trooper of that command stopped a 1962 F-85 Oldsmobile, maroon, bearing Indiana license plate 51A3729. Inquiry by the trooper determined the driver of the car to be PAUL G. MISCHLER, 122 Church Street, Loogootee, Indiana, who was born on Investigator FOGGERTY advised that the trooper noted a young male passenger occupied the car with MISCHLER but this individual's name was not obtained. The trooper was told by MISCHLER that both occupants were enroute to Binghamton, implying they attended a school in that city and both appeared to the trooper to be college-age males. However, the trooper did not determine the identity of any school that they may have attended.

MC GAUGHEY described unsub as being between 5'11" and 61" tall, weighing between 190 and 195 lbs., and 25-27 years old. He had sandy hair and was wearing light trousers and a small checkered shirt. MC GAUGHEY could not tell what color the shirt was. He stated that the shirt sleeves were rolled above his wrists and that unsub was carrying a small brown envelope.

MC GAUGHEY further advised that unsub was alone and that he got into a white, late model Mustang. He stated that it had Indiana License with the first two numbers being 64. He stated that two of the other numbers were 22 and that another number was 5 but that he was not certain whether the 5 was the third number or the number after the digits 22. MC GAUGHEY stated that the Mustang was parked on the north side of the bank at the west end.

Memphis Lifts Curfew; Killer Hunt Expanded

By BILL JOHNSON

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — The curfew which was dropped over Memphis for six nights after Dr. Martin Luther King's assassination was lifted Wednesday, as federal authorities expanded the search for his killer.

The developmenst came as authorities looked into the possibility of unauthorized broadcasts on police radio frequencies which may have thrown authorities off the killer's trail immediately after the slaying.

Meanwhile, curfews were relaxed in Nashville and Chattanooga, which also had had racial outbursts following King's death—and the state tried to return to normal.

Frank C. Holloman, the city's police director, confirmed he is investigating what seemed to be false radio reports on the police frequency. These told of an alleged police chase of a White Mustang and a Blue Pontiac through North Memphis. A White Mustang reportedly had been seen leaving the area of the snaving.

But Lt. R. W. Bradshaw, who specifies the police car from which the radio reports supposedly came, said he did not broadcast them. He and Holloman declined further comment.

Local officers say the search for the assassin is in the hands of federal authorities. The search for a possible suspect spread for a time to Mexico, but officials later said their information had been checked out and the man they were looking for apparently had nothing to do with the slaying.

Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark had said shortly after King was struck down at a local motel they had a definite suspect—"a man on the rum." But as the days dragged on, it became apparent the search had settled down to the routine sifting of clues and leads.

As the search continued, negotiators met with President Johnson's own mediator again Wednesday in an effort to resolve the garbage workers strike, the reason King had come to Memphis. They were reported near settlement when they recessed about mid-day.

"They (negotiators) have asked for some information," said Mayor Henry Loeb, who led the city's negotiating team. "As soon as it is available, we'll go back into session."

The second Mustang, parked north of the rooming house entrance, also left the scene near the time of the shooting.

Police said they would investigate reports that a supposed police chase in northeast Memphis—eight miles from the scene—30 minutes after the shooting may have been a decoy to allow the killer to escape.

A recording of the police radio dispatcher's transmissions showed seven calls in 12 minutes from a lieutenant's car in the northeast section of the city detailing the chase.

FBI Revokes Pickup On King Suspect

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — The FBI distributed a teletype pickup order to Florida police Thursday for Eric Starvo Galt, then withdrew the message four hours later because it had been released by mistake.

The message gave a description for Galt matching the description they circulated for the killer of Martin Luther King and said he was driving a white Mustang similar to that believed driven by King's assassin.

ATLANTA (UPI)—FBI agents investigating the sniper-slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. have been on the trail of Eric Starvo Galt, listed as an unemployed merchant mariner, for nearly a week, United Press International learned Friday.

Galt's name first surged into the headlines Thursday night when a white Mustang auto, registered to him and resembling one that reportedly sped from the King assassination scene, was found parked in an Atlanta apartment complex.

No warrant has been issued for Galt's arrest, but it was learned that the FBI in Miami had issued—and then for unexplained reasons withdrew—a "locate and notify" bulletin on Galt Thursday.

The Mustang registered to Galt carried Alabama license number 1-38993. A check with Alabama authorities established Galt's address as a roominghouse at 2608 Highland Ave. in Birmingham, but residents, while recalling Galt, said they had not seen him since November.

In obtaining his driver's license in 1967, Galt listed his occupation as an unemployed merchant mariner.

The FBI replied with a blanket "no comment" to all questions concerning the King investigation, butpersons at the Birmingham roominghouse said agents were asking "plenty" of questions about Galt last week.

This was four or five full days before the Mustang was located in Atlanta.

The only official announcements in the King case have come from Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark, who was sent to Memphis by President Johnson to help with the investigation after King was killed by a sniper while standing on a hotel balcony last Thursday.
