Delta Airlines passenger "LEMEYER - L" made a reservation at the Birmingham, Alabama, Airfield Ticket Office at 6:14 p.m. on March 27, 1968, with Delta Ticket Agent Code Number CCl, for Delta Flight 932 from Memphis, Tennessee, to Chicago, Illinois, on March 27, 1968. In connection with this reservation, passenger L. LEMEYER furnished no place of contact such as a telephone number in Birmingham. At the same time the above travel arrangements were made, LEMEYER made reservations, through Delta, at Birmingham, on Northwestern Airlines Flight 239 on March 27, 1968, from Chicago, Illinois, to Minneapolis - St. Paul, Minnesota, and had these reservations confirmed through Delta.

The above Delta Airlines records further reveal that this passenger was listed as "LEHMEYER - L" on standby for Delta Flight 595 on March 27, 1968, from Birmingham to Memphis, with no place of contact being given by the passenger in Birmingham. This standby reservation was made at 12:54 p.m. on March 27, 1968, with Delta Clerk Code Number FW3 in Birmingham; however, no information was available at the Delta Data Processing Center in Atlanta as to whether this passenger actually made the flight.

Reverend JAMES C. MELSON, 942 Fairburn Road, N. W., was interviewed at the Buffalo Cab Company where he is employed. MELSON voluntarily furnished the following information:

On Wednesday evening, April 3, 1968, MELSON delivered a customer to the Atlanta airport at approximately 8:00 p.m. A white male standing near the last door in the departing ramp near the Delta Airlines counter got into MELSON's cab and asked for a ride. MELSON explained he would have to get a cab from the pool waiting near the end of the ramp and that the customer refused. MELSON then agreed to take him and asked where he would like to go. The person asked what was the next largest town to which MELSON replied, "It must be Rome, Georgia." The customer asked for the rate and after checking with his dispatcher MELSON quoted him a rate of \$26.00 paid in advance. They then proceeded to Rome, Georgia, in MELSON's cab.

The only stop made after departing the Atlanta airport was at a Shell Service Station located on Interstate 85 in Northeast Atlanta. Upon arriving in Rome, the customer said the town looked too small and it could not have been the one he was referring to. He ordered MELSON to drive to the bus station and After about ten minutes in the station the customer wait for him. returned and asked how far it was to Chattanooga, Tennessee. MELSON explained it was about twice as far as they had already gone and quoted a fare of about \$70.00 to which the customer agreed. They then proceeded to Chattanooga, Tennessee. The customer was quite nervous during the entire trip and smoked two packages of his own cigarettes as well as one package of MELSON's. They passed three separate ambulances on the road with red lights flashing and on each occasion the customer ducked his head below the dashboard. Upon leaving the bus station in Rome, Georgia, MELSON motioned to a policeman standing nearby to get directions out of town and again the customer ducked his head as if to avoid exposing his face. He only explained that he was afraid of police in general.

Upon arriving in Chattanooga, the customer instructed

MELSON to proceed to the bus station. He indicated his "people" would be glad to see him inasmuch as it had been four years since he had seen any of them. MELSON thought of this as being unusual at the time inasmuch as the customer indicated he had been in the service for the past eight months. On arriving at the bus station, the customer instructed MELSON to drive around to the back side where it was dark. He stated he would make a phone call and have his "people" pick him up. MELSON suggested he would deliver the customer wherever he wanted to go but he refused.

MELSON described the customer as a white male, aged 33, 6' 0", 175 pounds, narrow shoulders and heavy hips, blond to light brown hair - medium long and combed up in front. He was wearing a dirty, wrinkled khaki Army uniform and an olive-drab hat and regulation Army shoes. He had a few ribbons and medals on the pocket, some of which indicated "Sharpshooter." During the trip the customer discussed his several brothers and indicated he had grown up on a farm in the country. He was carrying a roll of money in his left pants pocket containing mostly \$10.00 and \$20.00 bills. The customer paid for the initial trip to Rome, Georgia, from money in his wallet and concealed his wallet when removing the money from it. MELSON explained it was about 8:00 o'clock when he picked up the customer at the Atlanta airport and they arrived in Rome, Georgia, about 9:40 p.m. He recalled the time in Chattanooga, Tennessee, at which he let out the customer as being 12:35 a.m. on April 4, 1968. MELSON could not recall any other details in the conversation with the customer concerning his past activities or his proposed destination. The customer had no luggage and when asked by MELSON, stated he had sent his luggage ahead. MELSON viewed two composite sketches and could only say there was some similarity. He recalled that the customer had a long, pointed nose which was thin and boney. He could recall no scars, tattoos, or other identifying data concerning the customer. After learning of the death of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, he began to wonder if there might have been some connection with the customer of the previous night. He was unable to recall any other information concerning that trip.

DOUGLAS SMITH, Apartment 504, Building 165, Capitol Homes, advised that on April 11, 1968, he was standing outside his residence observing FBI Agents inspect a white Mustang in the parking lot down the mall from his home. He stated that a man, whose name he did not know, approached him and began to talk with him. This man informed him that he was in Memphis on the day MARTIN LUTHER KING was killed, and was within half a block of the hotel when the shooting took place. The man stated he saw four men come running out after the shooting. SMITH stated that at this time that he, SMITH, went into his house, and the man continued to talk to his wife, MARY SMITH. SMITH stated that he had asked the man why he did not go to the Agents and explain what he knew about the situation, and the man told him he didn't want to get involved. It is SMITH's belief that the man was frightened while he talked.

SMITH further learned that the man after speaking with his wife went up the walkway with a Mr. BISHOP who is a maintenance man at Capitol Homes. SMITH added that he believes BISHOP knows the name of the man, and that the man had lived or still lives in Capitol Homes. SMITH stated that he has seen the man on numerous occasions walking on the sidewalk in front of SMITH's home while proceeding to the store. He added that on several occasions the man had a young boy under five years of age with him.

Mr. AMOS A. BISHOP, Maintenance man, Capitol Homes, advised that he has been with the company for the past twenty-two years. He stated that on April 11, 1968, at approximately 5:00 p.m. while he was putting on the lights at apartments 658 and 501, a man whom he knew to be named HOLCOMB, approached him, called him Mr. BISHOP, and shook his hand. He stated that HOLCOMB began talking about the car that the FBI Agents were inspecting at the end of the mall in the parking lot. HOLCOMB advised him that that was not the car that they were looking for and that the actual car had a red streak across the back of the car from fender to fender. HOLCOMB told him that he was within twenty feet of the car in Memphis when he saw it drive away after the shooting. HOLCOMB further advised that he saw a man raise a rifle from a window, but he thought he was just shooting at a Negro and not KING. HOLCOMB added that he had been approached by a man who offered him one hundred thousand dollars to help him get away and to remain quiet about the incident. BISHOP stated that he does not recall HOLCOMB saying if he had met the man before or after the shooting. HOLCOMB continued by saying that the man that shot KING had the same name as HOLCOMB, but was going under a different name at the time. HOLCOMB said he took the one hundred thousand dollars, but BISHOP stated he didn't believe it. However, BISHOP added that HOLCOMB indicated that he had helped the assassin get away for he said "he got away. didn't he".

At this time BISHOP got into his car on the mall by Memorial Drive and drove off.

At this time his mother had remarried and moved into Apartment 48 and had lived there until approximately one month ago. He stated that HOLCOMB has been away from the Capitol Homes area for some time; however, he returns on occasion.

BISHOP added that he believes HOLCOMB to be living in the Grant Park area of Atlanta and that after hearing his story he connected HOLCOMB's description with the artist's conception of the assassin as printed in the newspaper.
