On 4/17/68, Lt. C. J. STRICKLAND, Homicide Squad, Atlanta PD, advised that about 1959 or 1960 he and Det. PERRY (now Lt. PERRY), Larceny Squad, had handled a murder case on Bakers Ferry Road which runs off Gordon Road, S. W., Atlanta.

He stated briefly the subject of the case, whose name he has been unable to recall was having many domestic problems and moved out and another man moved in with his wife to take his place. This individual went to Pascagoula where he worked in a shipyard and frequently returned to Atlanta to visit his wife and her new associate. This went on for some time and finally he apparently decided he should do something about it, and one night shot and killed this new associate of his wife with a rifle. Lt. STRICKLAND stated he had been reading the stories in the paper about the suspect in this murder case and noted the fact that this individual had worked in a shippard in Mississippi and did commit a murder with a rifle. The individual was apprehended and received a very short sentence for crime of shooting at another and was released after several months in custody on probation.

Lt. STRICKLAND stated this case could be looked up if further inquiry needs to be made by checking the ledger books in the Homicide Squad office which records murders on a yearly basis. He stated it is possible Lt. PERRY, who works evening watch, might recall this persons name.

On 4/11/68, Miss JACKIE CHILDS, Management Aide, Capitol Homes, 89 Memorial Drive, Atlanta, Georgia, stated that a review of her files failed to indicate any record of a man named GALT residing in Capitol Homes. She stated that all records are kept for at least 7 years, but they actually go beyond that, in certain instances.

Mr. HARRY R. CHANCE, Manager, Atlanta Housing Authority, Capitol Homes, 89 Memorial Drive, Atlanta, Georgia, advised that he recalls the name of LEONARD GAULT, as a man about 40 years of age, who was not a tenant of Capitol Homes, but his mother had resided as a tenant in Building 81 Hunter Street or 83 Hunter Street. He stated that he believed the mother to have lived in one of the four following apartments:

CHANCE added that he believed GAULT had been the person that had been constantly drunk and bothering his mother and the neighbors in the same building. He stated that he had asked her to get rid of her son, and if she did not, he would have to ask her to leave. On April 17, 1968, Special Agents ROGER L. KAAS and JOHN E. OGDEN recontacted JIMMIE D. GARNER for the purpose of determining what disposition had been made of mail addressed to ERIC S. GALT and delivered to 113 14th Street, N. E., Atlanta, Georgia. GARNER advised he had secured the mail from the table in the hall at this address and had taken the mail to his room for safe keeping. At the Agents' request, GARNER turned the two letters and one package over to the Agents. Special Agent ROGER L. KAAS subsequently delivered this mail to Supervisor A. M. SLOAN, U. S. Postal Substation C, 92 14th Street, N. E., Atlanta, Georgia. SLOAN immediately recognized the name of the addressee, at which time he was instructed by Special Agent KAAS that the addressee no longer resided at the listed address, requesting the items be appropriately stamped and personally thrown in the outgoing by SLOAN to be returned to the sender. He assured the Agents that once he had placed the appropriate hand stamp on these items, no further attention would be paid to them by the other employees.

Subsequently, on April 17, 1968, Special Agents KAAS and OGDEN went through all of the available trash at 113 14th Street, N. E., Atlanta, in an effort to locate the note which, according to GARNER, had been left in Room #2 by GALT prior to GALT's departure. No trace of this note could be found in the trash. GARNER had previously advised that he believed that he threw the note in the trash can in Room #2 and felt certain that the trash had been collected since this occurrence.

JIMMIE DELTON GARNER was interviewed in the office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, 275 Peachtree Street, Northeast, Atlanta, Georgia, after voluntarily accompanying SAs ROGER L. KAAS and HARRY L. LEE from his place of business, 1052 Northside Drive, Northwest, Atlanta, Georgia. At this time, GARNER stated that he was aware of the discrepancies in the information furnished by him but insisted it was due solely to the confusion which existed in his mind in erroneously relating the name GALT with his roomer, WILLIAM LEE.

He stated he had no reason for telling the Agents that he had no items in his possession which belonged to GALT, when, in fact, he was holding a television set, other than the confusion previously referred to.

In determining the individuals in each of the roming houses operated by him (107 14th Street, Northeast, Atlanta, Georgia) who may have been in a position to observe GALT, he advised that at the time of renting to GALT, there was no other occupant in this building.

He stated he had closed 113 14th Street on February 11, 1968, after the neighborhood hippies attempted to take it over.

He admitted that he had two double rooms vacant at the time GALT applied for a room and that he had previously rented these for the price of a single room, but GALT insisted on a single room, so he decided to open the other rooming house. He admitted it cost him more to do this than he would receive initially in rent, but that he had been planning to open it, as the other house was filling up.

GALT remained the sole occupant of this building until April 1, 1968, at which time FRED C. JONES was placed in Room Number 1.

In continuing to question GARNER as to why he had denied holding property for GALT, he finally admitted that it had been his policy in the past to retain for 30 days possessions left behind by roomers, then to claim them as his own, and it was his intention to do this with the television set.

GARNER specifically denied that he had previously known GALT, that GALT had been referred to him by anyone, that he had accepted an extra amount of money from GALT for any reason, or that he had any knowledge concerning his present whereabouts.

GARNER stated that he was born and raised in Mississippi, was a member of the Baptist Church, and was "not a Communist." He denied having any knowledge of the John Birch or other right wing organizations, stating he had joined only one organization which name he could not now recall, but described by him as a civic organization.

He reiterated that it had always been his intention to cooperate with the FBI and that he had, in fact, that morning given the address and telephone number of his restaurant to a roomer, Mr. BURGESS, where he could be reached should GALT return for the television set. He stated he did this so he could immediately notify the FBI of GALT's return.

Mrs. VIRGINIA (PHIL) ANDERSON, 1986 Montreal Road, Tucker, Georgia, who was interviewed at the State Farm Insurance Company Office, 2631 Buford Highway, Atlanta, Georgia, furnished the following information to SA's TRAVIS L. LYNCH and MAKION E. CHEEK on April 17, 1968:

At about 3:15 to 3:20 p.m., April 12, 1968, Mrs. ANDERSON was in her car in the curb lane on Boulevard in front of the Eaptist Professional Building when she heard someone in a car slightly to the rear of her and in the center lane make a remark, "When they burn Atlanta down, I'm going to laugh like hell." Immediately after this remark, Mrs. ANDERSON heard some loud laughter in the car from which the remark came.

Mrs. ANDERSON paused briefly and observed that a white male, who appeared to be in his 30's and who was wearing a rusty brown color sult coat and a light shirt, was a passenger in a white car in the center lane. This individual is the person she believes made the remark she heard and she observed that his voice was boisterous and loud. She only observed this man briefly and could not furnish a better description. She knows that the car was white but was not a Mustang. She observed there were apparently two other white males in the front seat of the car. She was unable to obtain the license number or further descriptive data regarding the individual who made the remark or his companions.

Mrs. ANDERSON later observed a sketch of the Unknown Subject (UNSUB) regarding Dr. KING's murder in the newspaper and formed her own opinion that the man referred to above who made the remark possibly resembles the sketch in the newspaper.

Mrs. ANDERSON observed a composite artist's conception of the UNSUB exhibited by interviewing agents and she advised that the individual whom she observed does not resemble this composite sketch, inasmuch as the individual she observed had a thinner face and long hair combed back.
