

The following investigation was conducted by SA HOWARD R. LINSCOTT on April-16, 1968, at Midland City, Alabama:

WILLIAM G. FAULKNER, Box 35, formerly Box 15, Midland City, Alabama, advised that he last saw his son, BILLY JOE FAULKNER, on the evening of April 2, 1968, when he stopped by the house to pick up some clothes. At that time BILLY JOE FAULKNER told his father that he had moved from Atlanta, Georgia, and had quit his job at Square D Electronics, Inc. Box 15, Midland City, Ala., age 37, 5'10", 165 pounds, had formerly been a member of the UKA Klayern at Dothan, Ala, but had been discharged from the Klayern and was no longer a member and not eligible for reinstatement.

Re Albany airtels 4/10/68 and 4/11/68, setting forth concerns who purchased Thermo-Seal marking machines, and Bureau teletype to Memphis, 4/12/68.

The FBI Laboratory advised that pillowcase and bed sheet were found in trunk of 1966 white Mustang registered to ERIC STARVO GALT, which was located at Atlanta 4/11/68. These items contain Thermo-Seal laundry tapes of approximately same size as tapes on items previously recovered, but are yellow in color and contain code, "20R-3." In opinion of Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York, the tapes were produced by a different machine than previous tapes since the first three characters are 15 point type and the last two characters are 18 point type.

The Textile Marking Machine Company suggests the twenty in above code would be the lot number, the R may mean that this was a return of a batch of laundry, and the three is the bundle number.

Investigation at Memphis disclosed that an individual had purchased a set of binoculars at the York Arms Company in Memphis on 4/4/68. These binoculars were among the material abandoned with the rifle and recovered in Memphis. Also recovered was a brown and green herringbone bedspread. The items abandoned in Memphis were all wrapped in this bedspread. The blue bag which was inside the bedspread contained numerous items, among which were the binoculars and a set of underwear consisting of a T-shirt and shorts. The T-shirt and shorts are those on which appears the laundry mark which has been a matter of interest in this case.

A search of motel records in the Memphis area disclosed that an individual using the name ERIC S. GALT had spent the night of 4/3/68 at the Rebel Motel, Memphis, Tennessee, and was driving a 1966 white Mustang bearing Alabama License 1-38993. Investigation at Birmagham disclosed that this automobile had been purchased by ERIC S. GALT on August 30, 1968, from a private person in response to a newspaper ad. He paid a total of \$1995 cash. While in Birmingham he furnished the address of 2608 South Highland Avenue, Birmingham. This is also the address which appeared on a driver's license issued to him by the State of Alabama. The driver's license identifying data listed his birth date as and hair brown.

The automobile in question, the white Mustang bearing the Alabama tags mentioned above, was recovered in Atlanta on 4/11/68 and determined to have been abandoned there prior to 9 a,m. on 4/5/68.

In connection with the evidence submitted by Atlanta, Birmingham, and Memphis, identifiable latent prints were recovered. It was on the basis of these latents that identification was made of JAMES EARL RAY. In handling future leads, all offices should be particularly interested in securing an identifying number, military, police, or FBI, in connection with suspects so that the necessary check can be made through the Identification Division.

On 4/17/68, AUSA R. MACEY TAYLOR, Birmingham, authorized the filing of a complaint charging ERIC STARVO GALT with a conspiracy to violate Section 241, Title 18, U. S. Code, and

GIBSON, ASN assigned 41st Co, 4th Student Bn, Ft Benning Ga had been in an AWOL status from 4-2-68 until 4-18-68 and that there were indications that he was in the Memphis Tenn and Chicago areas during the time he was AWOL. Col. Blackledge stated that the source indicated that possibly GIBSON could have sometime to do with captioned matter. Col Blackledge stated that he was passing this info to the FBI for whatever action they deem necessary and that Elmer Miller, Criminal Investigator, CID, Ft Benning Ga would have additional info if needed.

On same date Miller advised that he had ascertained that GIBSON been in previous trouble of a disiplinary nature while serving in the Army and had been reduced from the rank of Sgt to that of corporal. He stated that he had not obtained any info to indicated that GIBSON may have been implicabled in captioned matter. He stated that GIBSON has stated that he does not remember where he had been while in an AWOL status and that the First Sgt of GIBSON unit stated that GIBSON has teld persons that he is being followed by persons with no head. Miller stated that GIBSON is scheduled for pyscho exam on the afternoon of 4-19-68.

On same date 1st Sgt Jesse L. Harrison, 41st Co, 4th Stu Bn advised that he obtained info that GIBSON had not while in an AWOL status, been in Memhis Tenn and in fact had traveled to North Carolina with a girl and that later he abandoned his car in Phenix City Ala and there were indications that he burned this car. Harrison stated that he does not in any way resemble the photo of GALT and that he believes that GIBSON is acting strangely as he is attemting to thwart any action by the Army in regard to his recent AWOL. He furnished the following description of GIBSON, DOB ht 5'7", wt 160, brown hair and eyes.

On 4-19-68 Miller, CID, Ft Benning Ga advised that in the event any pertinent info was received regarding this matter he would immediately contact the FBI.

RUFF, Agent, Georgia Bureau of Investigation, Cartersville, Georgia, on 4-18-68, advised he was well acquainted with LEWIS BROWN aka Louis who had stayed at the Braben Hotel, Cartersville, Georgia, having been acquainted with him over the past ten years. He advised BROWN was presently living in Acworth, Georgia, and that he had been in centact with BROWN During the last two days.

He stated BROWN was addicted to Demoral and was living with his fifth wife all of them having been Registered Nurses. He further described BROWN as a drifter who has never owned or driven a car and during his drifting he begs his food from churches and ministers.

Mr. RUFF advised that BROWN was definitely not ERIC STARVO GALT, had no resemblance to GALT's phote, and did not in any way have anything to do with the shooting of M. L. KING.

He described BROWN as W/M, 35, 61, 150, Black hair, brown exes, pecular speech (soft low tone)

MRS. FRANK MCKINKEY, 47 Northwood Ave., N.E., TR4-2173, called at 10:00 am today and advised as follows:

On 4-19-68 she and her husband were working on a house they own at 723 Peeples St.S.W., when they observed a man fitting description of subject RAY./This man was cleaning the gutters on the home of Mrs. BROOKS and MRS. HARDY at 733 Peeples. He had walked into the neighborhood and asked for any king of work and they paid him \$5.00 to clean their gutters. He told Mrs. BROOKS and HARDY that he was from California and Arizonia and he couldn't remember name of company he worked for out there.

The MCKINLEYS asked him about cleaning and painting their gutters and he said he would be back on 4-20-68 to do that. He has not been seen since. When asked where he lived he stated that he lived in the Hapeville-College Park area. He left the MCKINLEYS and walked in the direction of the Howell Park Apartments.

The MCKINLEYS are of the opinion that the man they saw looks very much like the picture of RAY on television last night. She stated the description matches including the hazel-blue eyes, except he appeared to be lighter and his hair was longer.
