On 4/18/68, Mr. M. C. RHODES, Manager, Capitol Furniture Company, 165 Whitehall Street, Southwest, advised that on 3/26/68, a man by the name of JAMES EDWARD DAVAS had come into his store with his wife, who was pregnant, and ordered some furniture from the company. RHODES stated that the man put \$121.80 down and was supposed to pay \$99.90 in addition to that amount upon verification of his credit. On the purchaser's statement, DAVIS listed his age as 37, living at 1250 Donnelly Avenue, Southwest, Apartment 2B. He stated that he has resided at that address for a period of one year. He listed previous addresses as Isles of Pines Trailer Park, Gautier, Miss., and McLywam Drive, Waynesboro, Miss. DAVIS listed his employment as a mechanical contractor for the past one year with the Lorne Construction Company at 1983 Whitehall Street, Southwest. DAVIS listed his previous employment with the Ingall Shipyard, Gautier, Miss., and with the Kelly Brothers Construction Company in Waynesboro, Miss.

DAVIS indicated that he was now working out of Union Local #72. For identification, DAVIS furnished an Ala. driver's license, Number 2746123, and listed his wife's occupation as housewife. The form indicated that DAVIS owned a 1962 Buick financed by the Allied Finance Company, Campbellton Road, Southwest, and DAVIS listed Friedman Jewelers, Gordon Street, Southwest, as a credit reference.

RHODES stated that shortly after that day, he received a report from the credit bureau from Waynes-boro, Miss., which stated that DAVIS had a very bad



credit rating in the area, and that he had skipped out on his bills on previous occasions. At that time, RHODES and his partner, Mr. A. L. BURRELL, had decided not to furnish DAVIS with any credit at all and wished to terminate the contract. RHODES stated that BURRELL went out to DAVIS's house on 3/30/68, and that DAVIS's wife informed him that her husband was out of town on a fishing trip.

RHODES stated that the reason that he had brought this to the attention of the FBI was the fact that DAVIS seemed to fit the description of ERIC STARVO GALT and seemed to resemble the pictures in the paper concerning that man. He added that since the man had an Ala. driver's license and that he had been employed in the shipyard in Gautier, Miss., and that he had a bad credit reference, he believed that this might be the same person.

On 4/18/68, Mr. A. L. BURRELL, Salesman, Capitol Furniture Company, 165 Whitehall Street, advised that JAMES EDWARD DAVIS had come into his store on 3/26/68, and filled out an application in his presence for the purpose of purchasing some furniture. BURRELL described the man as being about 5'10", 175 lbs., and that there is a very slight resemblance to the picture in the paper of ERIC STARVO GALT. BURRELL stated that it is his opinion that this definitely was not ERIC GALT. He added that on 3/30/68, he had gone by the house to return some money to DAVIS. DAVIS was not present and his wife informed BURRELL that DAVIS had gone fishing. BURRELL advised DAVIS's wife to have DAVIS come into the store on Monday, 4/1/68, to pick up his money. BURRELL added that DAVIS did just that.

BURRELL felt that there was a very slight resemblance to the picture of GALT in the newspaper and that he was of approximately the same size as GALT as described in the paper.



BURRELL stated he cannot recognize the photograph as being the same man as DAVIS and he repeated that he was of the opinion that this was not the same man.

Re memo of SA O. RICHARD HAMILTON dated 4/17/68 (Serial 487-A), and memo of SA JAMES J. ROSE dated 4/17/68 (Serial 575).

On 4/19/68, Mr. BUDDY CUMMINGS, Desk Clerk, Fulton Hotel, 180 Luckie Street, advised that a Mr. GEORGE CLAYDON registered at this hotel at 7:00 am.m on 4/14/68, and was assigned Room 17. CUMMINGS stated that CLAYTON had departed from the hotel between 11:30 a.m. and 12 noon on 4/17/68, with another man. When CLAYTON registered he listed his address as 4325,46th Avenue North, Birmingham, Ala. CUMMINGS described CLAYTON as being between 5'8" and 5'9", 165 to 175 lbs., brown hair, and was constantly wearing dark sunglasses. CUMMINGS stated that CLAYTON was a quiet man and seemed to mind his own business.

CUMMINGS stated that his suspicions were aroused when they were gathered in the lobby watching television and the topic of KING's assassination came up. CUMMINGS heard CLAYTON say that the assassin "got him with one shot. He must have been good," and then laughed. Shortly thereafter, he left the discussion and went up to his room. CUMMINGS added that when CLAYTON checked out he said that he was going back to work and would not be bothering them any more.

Upon being shown a photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT, CUMMINGS said that he was of the opinion that this was not the man, for if it were, he would have had to have lost a great deal of weight in the face. He added that CLAYTON seemed to have a much smoother face and one that was much younger looking than that of the photograph.

HOOVER added that the only other information he had on WARD was that he had made one long-distance telephone call for the sum of \$1.10.

Upon being shown the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT, HOOVER stated that he has only been manager of this hotel since January of 1968, and that the face was totally unfamiliar to him.





HOLT only worked two or three months and was not fingerprinted upon entering service. TIERCE advised that subject frequents his truck stop and his sister-in-law lives in a trailer next to the truck stop. Subject has indicated that he may be wanted in Missouri and claims that in past was questioned by FBI as Bank Robbery suspect in unnamed city in California.

Several weeks ago HOLT came to TIERCE's establishment carrying several guns and indiscriminately fired through roof of building. TIERCE described HOLT as being 5'4" - 5'5", appears to be about 26 years of age, 140 pounds.

HOLT has abandoned wife and presumably gone to Missouri. SYLVIA AOLT is now working in a local tavern and TIERCE believes she would not cooperate with police and would alert HOLT if HOLT is guilty.

For additional information, the entire security force at Stone Mountain, Georgia, was discharged about six months ago after \$16,000 robbery of week's park receipts. It appeared to have indications of having inside assistance. It was reportedly learned at that time that many of the security members had criminal arrest records. On 4-19-68 Reverend EDWARD NELSON, Tyron, Ga., telephone 461-7985, appeared in this office furnished a copy of some notes he had typed and written re DEAN MATHIS and EARL STRATHER, residents of Fayette County. NESSON stated he wanted to furnish the information to the FBI on a confidential basis as he felt the FBI should be aware of these men as their are "racist".

He desribed STRATERR as a wealthy man who owns a construction company. He is a w/m, 35, flys a twin engine plane and travels a great deal. On occasion he has flown to British Hondarus on business. MATHIS is a w/m. 34, who runs a Gulf service station in Peachtree City.

He stated he knows that STRATHER has killed a Negro for which he was acquitted by a jury. He feels that it is possible that both men could have had some connection with the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, but he has no reason to suspect this other than they are both "racist".

The kyseds typed and written notes furnished by NELSON are attached.

- 1) April 15th., 1968, 11:30-45 P.M. (Tax Night) an unidentified man began a a conversation about Eric Starvo Galt as if he were intrigued with the name and person of Dr. King's assassin. He spoke knowledgeably on the subject as if he were interested in the character, more than usual. He was involved in the search of Eric Starvo Galt, emotionally. As I recall, this unlearned man startled me with his native interest in the assassanation of King. He seemed to be testing my reactions to his knowledge of King's assassin. I recall my schock after hearing his proper pronounciation of Eric Starvo Galt. He was so careful and clear and gentle in how he said the name. I was totally unprepared for this dialogue from this provincial southerner and segregationist. This man awaken my conscience that another human being was enthralled with the fictitious name of Dr. King's assassin. Mathis spoke so knowingly of the character and the originality of the name from literature. To be honest. I was overwhelmed with this man's native interest and self-style intelligence on Eric Starvo Galt. Since I realized that my conversationist was more informed on Eric Starvo Galt than I, the conversation changed into a new aspect of the events.
- 2) Mathis spoke of Martin Luther King, revengefully, as a great man, Nobel Peace Prize Winner, but grieved that so many respectful people had appreciated King beyond his own perception and ability to appreciate him. He could not comprehend the fact that King was given such a royal funeral. He was hostile toward disciples of King and baffled at his international support.

In speaking of Dr. King, he was adament in saying that King may have been non-violent in theory, but never had such violence and destruction followed any single man. He was vicious in criticism. He held King responsible for all violence, national upheaval, and social disorder. His illustration was several marches and his death. Mathis did not approve of King leading a March and then, leaving it to the mob.

He illustrated his hatred and hostility toward King. Once, Negroes in Mountrie, Georgia asked Dr. King to lead a civil rights demonstration. According to Mathis' version, King requested a fee of \$5,000.00 which negroes citizens attempted to raise, but failed. Negroes thought King's request was extravagant and lost repect for him. King did not go to Moultrie, so the Negroes were outraged and disenchanted with King. Mathis was very bitter with King here and at people who paid for civil discobedience, especially, King whom he accused as being Communist

- 3) Mathis made a statement, questioning the sinceraty of the people in the funeral march from which I took the issue-up and rebuttled him.
- 4) We argued the issue of racism, segregation, intergration, intermarriage, etc. I stood my ground and kept backing him in a defensive corner.
- 5) Mathis was intelligent for non-college, rural, service station man. He was outspoken segregationist. He wore blue service station clothing. He was average looking man, 165 lbs, 5'8", hair grown-out from crew cut and a little greesy looking and tired.
