

The following investigation was conducted in response to the investigative lead requiring a check of trains leaving Atlanta on 4/5/68 and 4/6/68 for positive information concerning the suspect JAMES EARL RAY, as set forth in Serial 926 in this file.

On 4/23/68, Mr. H. R. DAYY, Station Master, Atlanta Union Station, advised that only three trains leave Atlanta carrying regular passengers each day. Mr. DAVY advised that tickets can be purchased for these trains without requiring any advance reservation and without requiring any identification or prior notice of any sort. Mr. DAVY explained that an individual can simply walk to the ticket window, purchase a ticket and board the train and that the possibility of his being observed during such activity by anyone other than the ticket agent is somewhat remote. Mr. DAVY said that the conductor on board each train would have some contact with this individual, and he went on to explain further that very few passengers boarding trains utilize porter service, except for elderly persons or persons who are sick. Mr. DAVY suggested that the best possible way this matter could be called to the attention of train personnel was to leave photographs and complete descriptive information readily available in the Station Master's Office, and that he, Mr. DAVY, would insure that conductors on board trains leaving had an adequate opportunity to observe this photograph and to be advised of the Bureau's interest in this matter.

This information was left with Mr. DAVY, who immediately posted it on a board in the Station Master's Office where conductors and other train personnel report for service each day.

On 4/26/68, Mr. DAVY advised that he had called this matter to the attention of conductors on Georgia Railroad Train Number 2, on L&N Railroad Trail Number 604, and on Seaboard-Coast Line Train Number 95, the only three trains leaving the Union Station on a daily basis.

On 4/24/68, Mr. J. B. STEWART, the principal Ticket Clerk at the Union Station, was contacted and the same data was furnished to Mr. STEWART with the request that the photograph and descriptive information be made available to all employees working in that area throughout the day to insure that anyone having any information in this regard would be contacted. Mr. STEWART immediately posted the photograph on the "wanted flyer" of subject RAY at the ticket counter, and he advised that this office would be contacted immediately if any information with regard to RAY could be obtained.

On 4/24/68, Mr. H. D. MUZLING, Ticket Agent, Atlanta Terminal Station, and Mr. R. E. EMBREY, Ticket Clerk, Atlanta Terminal Station, were both contacted in an effort to determine whether or not they might have any information concerning the subject, and the possibility that he may have purchased a ticket on a train leaving the Atlanta Terminal Station on April 5 or 6, 1968.

The photograph of the subject was exhibited to both Mr. MULLINS and Mr. EMBREY, who advised they had no data in this regard, and they were then requested to post the photograph of RAY where all employees of the Atlanta Terminal Station would have an adequate opportunity to observe this photograph and to be aware of the Bureau's interest in this matter.

Mr. MULLINS advised that there was no requirement as for as reservations were concerned on any train leaving the Atlanta Terminal Station, and that individuals traveling in this manner simply purchased a ticket and boarded the train without identification of any sort being required. Mr. MULLINS said that after a period of a day or two, he thought it highly improbable that anyone in the station would recall

any single individual purchasing a ticket at the ticket counter, but he did explain that station masters occasionally obtained complaints or information regarding passengers who furnish some particular problem to the railroad during the course of their trip, and he suggested that the Station Master be contacted in this regard.

Mr. JACK BRAMBLETT, Station Master, Atlanta Terminal Station, advised on 4/24/68 that there are 13 trains departing from the Atlanta Terminal Station on a daily basis, beginning in the morning at 7 a.m., and concluding in the evening at 9:30 p.m. Mr. BRAMBLETT advised that conductors and train personnel working these particular trains, on most occasions, checked in at the Station Master's Office prior to departure each day, and he suggested that photographs and descriptive data might be left with him.

Identification Orders with complete descriptive data, along with a "Wanted Flyer," were left with Mr. BRAMBLETT, who posted this data on a bulletin board in the Station Master's Office near the sign-in area, and Mr. BRAMBLETT advised that as conductors and train personnel arrived, he would point these identification orders and Wanted Flyers out to them with the request that any information they might have be furnished to the Atlanta FBI Office.

On 4/26/68, Mr. BRAMBLETT advised that conductors on the following trains had been contacted in this manner and he was confident that any information that they might have would be reported promptly to the Atlanta Office:

Mr. BRAMBLETT stated he was absolutely confident that any data which could be obtained in this matter would be promptly furnished to the Atlanta Office, and he pointed out that the extremely large reward which has been offered in this case has been common knowledge to personnel around the train station and that this matter has, in fact, been discussed by them. Mr. BRAMBLETT said he would be prompt to report any data obtained.

Reference memorandum from Supervisor CHARLES S. HARDING dated 4/22/68, further identified as Serial #940 in this case.

This memorandum includes a copy of Memphis teletype to the Bureau dated 4/22/68, indicating that because JAMES EARL RAY, the subject in this case, is known to have a history of criminal activity of various sorts and the source of his funds being of interest to this Bureau, it was suggested that each office should review unsolved bank robbery matters and bank burglary matters where latent fingerprints were recovered, should identify the case in question, and should request the Bureau to search these latents against the latents recovered in the MURKIN case.

This teletype also suggested that because RAY may have been involved in burglaries and robberies not within the Bureau's jurisdiction, the matter should be of interest to local police departments, and receiving offices should contact major law enforcement agencies within their division and determine whether or not any armed robberies or burglaries were perpetrated in which latent fingerprints were recovered on which the unknown subject might fit the general description of RAY.

Immediate contact was made with Lt. GEORGE CHRISTIAN. Robbery Squad, Atlanta Police Department, who advised that his department is, of course, completely familiar with the interest regarding RAY, and the police department has discussed the same possibility that RAY's source of income is open to question, and that he might possibly have been involved in criminal activities in the Atlanta area in order to finance his living expenses. Lt. CHRISTIAN advised he had not been

able to identify any matter in which RAY might logically be considered a suspect insofar as armed robberies were concerned. He suggested that further inquiry might be made with Lt. WAYNE SPIVA of the Identification Division, and that latent fingerprints obtained through the course of robbery investigations by the Atlanta Police Department could then be compared with the known fingerprints of the subject RAY.

Lt. WAYNE SPIVA, Atlanta Police Department, Identification Division, advised that upon first receiving information regarding RAY, latent fingerprints, to date unidentified in major cases during the preceding two years, were compared with the known fingerprints of subject RAY, but no identifications were effected.

Lt. SPIVA said further that this matter not only included armed robberies but also burglaries, and major thefts where latent fingerprints were of value. SPIVA said he had previously been contacted by SA JOSEPH P. AYERS of the Atlanta Office in this regard and the matter had been thoroughly discussed. Lt. SPIVA advised that latent fingerprints obtained in major cases in the future would also be compared with RAY's prints.

On 4/24/68, Lt. M. B. FLANNAGAN, Burglary Squad, Atlanta Police Department, was contacted with regard to the possibility that RAY might have been obtaining funds through the course of burglary activities in the Atlanta area during the preceding years since the time of his escape. Lt. FLANNAGAN said that the only way he knew this matter might be checked was through the examination of latent fingerprints, obtained in burglaries investigated by the Atlanta Police Department, and he suggested that this matter be followed through contact with Lt. SPIVA of the Identification Division. FLANNAGAN said that in view of the widespread interest in this matter, he did not think it open to any question that major burglaries committed in this area would not include the consideration of RAY as a possible subject.

It is noted that another lead has been set forth in this matter requiring this same contact with other major police

departments in the Atlanta Division. For this reason, this investigation is not being included in this memorandum.

It is further noted that inquiry in this matter has been conducted in response to information from the Memphis Division to the effect that RAY may have been identical with an unknown subject using the name STEVE or STEVIE, identified by a Memphis Police Department informant as being an associate of a group of burglarers operating out of the Memphis area. This matter has also been reported in another memorandum.


