On 5/1/68, the following individuals were contacted in the neighborhood at 14th Street and Peachtree in an effort to insure that all persons who might logically have had any contact with the subject in this case who resided in this immediate area had been given adequate opportunity to observe photographs taken at various times of the subject, and to insure that all information available in this area had been obtained. No identifications of the subject were effected through inquiry of any of these persons, with the exception of the fact that Miss JOYCE PALMER and Mr. FRANK CORNELIUS at the Pennant Restaurant, both advised that the photograph of RAY was somewhat familiar to them, and they thought they might possibly have observed him as a customer at the restaurant at some time. Both Miss PALMER and Mr. CORNELIUS said this data had been previously made available to agents who contacted them some time ago, but that they had been unable to furnish any positive information in this regard, and said they were still of the opinion he may simply have come into the restaurant as a customer on one or two occasions and had left. They were unable to furnish any specific information of any kind in this regard, saying they had no idea who he may have been with, or whether he was with anyone at all.

On 5/1/68, SAMUEL HARRISON JEWELL, Atlanta Police Department #1A4780, FBI Number 320813B, was interviewed by SAS HARRY L. LEE and KENNETH R. HEINEMAN at the Fulton County Jail, Atlanta, Georgia.

This inquiry was conducted in response to previous information received from Atlanta informant AT 1860-C to the effect that JEWELL had been frequenting the Capitol Homes Area of Atlanta for a long period of time since his release from the penitentiary, that he was a known narcotic addict, was involved in the sale and use of "pills" over a wide area of Atlanta, and might have some information with regard to the subject in this case.

JEWELL, who is presently confined on three charges of armed robbery, on burglary charges and on check charges,

and is presently awaiting trial, advised that he has been in jail for approximately three weeks, but that prior to that time, he was well known around the Capitol City Buffet, a beer tavern located about one block from the Capitol Homes Area. JEWELL advised that he could furnish no specific information with regard to the subject of this case, but that if the subject were involved in the sale or use or purchase of "pills," there were three principal areas in the southern part of the city of Atlanta where these might be obtained. JEWELL identified these areas as follows:

"The Corner Bar," located on Lee Street

A delicatessen located in the Little Five Points Section.

Bill Bailey's Tavern located on Moreland Avenue

JEWELL said that individuals at all of these areas were involved in the sale of "pills," but JEWELL doubted that they would be willing to furnish any information of any sort in view of the fact that they are involved in criminal activities.

JEWELL said he was unable to be of any help, obviously since he did not feel that he could obtain a bond of any sort, but he did advise that from what limited contact he would be able to make, he would do so with the hope that some assistance might be furnished him in regard to his pending prosecution.

JEWELL was furnished no specific assurance in this matter, but he was requested to make whatever contact possible.

Records of the Denver Police Department, Eureau of Identification and Records, Denver, Colorado, reveal that Holt Chew, Denver Police Department Number 50534, was placed on probation April 24, 1957 after conviction for shooting James Thomas Jackson, a Negro on January 20, 1966.

On April 29, 1965 and April 30, 1968, Chew was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI. He was asked if he recalled he made a telephone call to the office of Martin Luther King in Atlanta, Georgia on December 13, 1965. He reflected for a few moments and then said he was not about to lie about the situation, especially to the FBI. He said that he has no love for Martin Luther King and is glad he is dead. He stated King was not the non-violent civil rights leader he claimed to be. Wherever he went, violence followed and he was responsible for 37 deaths in the United States. He added that, as a personal matter, King was directly responsible for the destruction of the business career of one of his sons, Bill Chew of Saint Augustine, Florida. He estimated his son's financial loss at \$400,000.00.

Chew stated that his son was head of a hotel and motel association in Saint Augustine, Florida a few years ago when King and his followers came down to Florida and started efforts to integrate the industry. His son was also operating a motel in Saint Augustine at the time. Bill Chew was taken into Federal Court by these people for refusing to integrate his establishment and as the result of an unfavorable court decision, he ended up resigning his position with the association and selling his motel at a

severe loss. Chew said that there was considerable newspaper publicity over the matter at the time.

Chow placed King in the bame category as Stokely Carmichael and H. Rap Brown and stated frankly that he hoped the same fate befalls the latter two. He made the statement that he is not against the Hegro race; that he was born in Georgia, brought up with Hegroes and hunted and fished with them. He made it clear that he is against some individual Negroes like Carmichael and Brown, who advocate violence and have no regard for property rights, but is not against all Negroes.

Having made these points, he returned to the original question and stated that he had no recollection of the telephone call and admitted that the reason could be that he could have been drinking at the time the call was made. He volunteered that at that time in his life he was a "bad drinker". He emphasized that he had no doubt that he made the call, if interviewing Agents said he did, but that he could not recall it. He stated that he was certain, whether or not he had been drinking, that he would not have made a threat over the telephone since he knows such a threat could lead to trouble for him. He said if he had had any intention of doing anything concerning King, he would not have used the telephone, he would have taken direct action.

Chew advised that he is certain that no one "put him up" to making the telephone call, and it was not an action involving anyone other than himself. He was shown photographs of James Earl Ray, the man being sought in connection with the assasination of Martin Luther King, but disclaimed any knowledge whatsoever of Ray.

He constantly referred to King, Carmichael and Brown using expletives in an effort to show his intensedislike for these men.

He stated that he was in Denver on April 4, 1966 and April 5, 1968 and left the city by Eastern Arilines for Augusta, Georga on April 6, 1968 where he is promoting business interests in the food industry, whereby he hopes to set up his son Bill in business. He was unwilling to further identify his business interests. He stated his son Bill is

presently running the Paradise Motel in Sylvania, Georgia and drove up from there to meet him in Augusta the first then for the week of April 7, 1003. Both he and his son then drove to Sylvania and on to St. Augustine, Florida where they were met on April 12, 1006 by Mrs. Chow and a founder son, who had just returned from military service Denver. The said his wife and younger son flow from Paradia until he, his wife and younger son returned to Denver on April 20, 1008 in a new car he purchased in

He specifically stated that he had nothing to do with King's death and said that he knew of no conspiracy relating to it. He stated that he saw King's funeral on television and the way it was conducted it looked to him like it had been planned for 20 years.

He volunteered to the Interviewing Agents that he has every intention of protecting his apartment house property in Denver, Colorado with as much force as is necessary if anyone attempts to cause damage or loot it. He stated that he was angry at the leaders of this country for putting up with rioting, looting and the like. He more expletives to emphasize his point. He stated that he is "all for" law and order, but would like to see law enforcement empowered to act. He also stated that he of Colored People were able to close businesses throughout the country after King's death when very few businesses convinced that threats were used to accomplish the closing of businesses in Denver, as he was so informed before he

It should be noted that a source who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on January 21, 1906 that Chew is a highly irascible and unpredictable individual, an alcoholic and possibly a user of narcotics.

Mrs. Holt Chew on April 30, 1008 advised that how husband left Denver on April 6, 1968 for Augusta,

Georgia via Mastern Airlines and that she and a younger son traveled to Florida to meet him on April 12, 1860 via United, Mastern and Delta airlines.

Records of the Retail Credit Men's Association, Denver, Colorado revealed on Appil 30, 1930 that Molt Chew was born at Bert City, Georgia. He attended school there and came to Denver in 1832. He served in the United States Army during World Mar II and has been owner and operator of Holt Chew Motor Company for many years. His wife's name is Elaine and he has four children. He has been on record with the credit bureau since February, 1937 and has maintained a satisfactory credit rating.

RE: BOBBY JOE FAULKNER

On April 29, 1968, BOBBY JOE FAULKNER, employed by Alleghany Electric Company, a subcontractor of Rust Engineering Company, MacMillian-Bloedel Paper Mill Site, Yellow Bluff, Alabama, residing at Kimbrough Trailer Park, with father, JAMES FAULKNER, advised Special Agents ROBERT L. FRYE and DAVID A. CHANEY as follows:

He lived at Garner's Rooming House, Atlanta, Georgia, located on 107 14th Street, during the latter part of January and first part of February, 1968, while employed on a Government housing project in the Atlanta area. He left Garner's in February and moved to Chestatee Inn, Ponce De Leon Avenue, Atlanta, Georgia. On about April 1, 1968, FAULKNER returned to Garner's and obtained a room at the "Second House", operated by GARNER, which is next door to 107 14th Street.

FAULKNER claimed that GARNER had closed this house for a period of time as GARNER said, "the hippies were moving in on me." When FAULKNER returned to Garner's about April 1, 1968, he obtained a similar room in this house that GARNER had closed for a period of time.

FAULKNER claimed he knew of no one else who lived in the second house with him during the period of about April 2-8, 1968, except an individual he described as a white male, 50 years of age or older, 6', 150-160 pounds, gray hair, wrinkled rough skin on face. FAULKNER claimed this individual did not resemble any of the photographs of JAMES EARL RAY, also known as ERIC STARVO GALT. He does not know where this individual was employed, but he wore gray work clothes.

FAULKNER recalls that this person was in the company of two other individuals on the evening of April 1, 1968, when he was waiting for GARNER on the front porch of the house to see about a room. These two other persons were on the porch; one was a white male, 40-45 years of age,

5'8" or 5'10", 200-250 pounds, dark brown hair, balding on the top. This individual apparently had a throat operation as he had a hole in his throat covered by a piece of gauze and spoke in a gruff whisper. The other man was a white male in his late forties, 5'6" to 5'8", gray hair, and was "very short!" Both of these men had on gray work clothes and he assumed that they were possibly electricians. The man who stayed in the house with him was with these two men on that evening.

FAULKNER stated that the only other person who in any way resembled the photograph of RAY was a "young fellow", name unknown, who lived in the second floor, in the front bedroom of the house at 107 14th Street. This individual resembled the photo of RAY which is shown on Identification Order with close cropped hair. FAULKNER pointed out, however, that this "young fellow" whom he described as a white male, 25-30 years of age, about 5'10", 140 pounds, light brown close cropped hair, driving a 1963 or 1964 gold colored Plymouth, had roomed at Garner's for "a long period of time". This person appeared to be well-educated, and FAULKNER thought the person was a "college student."

FAULKNER stated that although the Missouri State Penitentiary photograph of JAMES EARL RAY resembles the individual he does not believe the "young fellow" could have been RAY.

FAULKNER states he believes the time he was at Garner's Rooming House on the second occasion was the period of April 2-8, 1968, as he recalled hearing the news of KING's death in Memphis while he was at Garner's the second time. He had checked in at the rooming house two or three days prior to the time he heard the news on the radio. He recalled that Friday of that week he left work early, went to his home in Columbus, Georgia for the weekend, and on the following Monday, which was April 8, 1968, he turned his key in to GARNER at Garner's Restaurant, located on Northside Drive, Atlanta, Georgia. He did not return to the rooming house after the early morning of April 5, 1968, which was the preceeding Friday. FAULKNER stated

he left Atlanta after he picked up his money at the job on April 8, 1968, and traveled to Pine Hill, Alabama, where he has been employed since that time and has not returned to Atlanta. FAULKNER left Atlanta alone and came to Pine Hill, Alabama, where he his working with his father, JAMES FAULKNER at the paper mill site at Yellow Bluff, Alabama.

FAULKNER advised that during his last stay at 107 14th Street, Atlanta, in January and February, 1968, he shared room with ERNEST WILLIAM HARPER of Columbus, Georgia. He stated that at no time during his residence at this address did he see a white Mustang automobile parked in that area.

On 4/16/68, Mr. DERREL LEE, who stated he was a student at the University of Georgia, residing in Room 734, Russell Hall, Athens, Georgia, was interviewed as a result of his having previously contacted the Atlanta-FBI Office requesting to speak to an Agent. He was contacted on 4/15/68, telephonically and an appointment was made with him to be intervioused of the contacted on 4/15/68. was made with him to be interviewed at the RA Office in Athens, Ga., on 4/16/68.

On 4/16/68, at approximately 4:30, the writer answered a knock on the door at the Athens RA and when he opened the door, a young lady was standing at the door. At about the time the writer was going to inquire as to how he could assist the young lady, a young man got off the elevator and walked immediately to the door of the RA. The writer inquired of the young lady if she and the young man were together and she stated that they were not. The writer requested that the young man take a seat in the front office at the AA while he talked with the young lady in the back office. This young lady identified herself as SHARON BAZLEY of the Athens Daily News and stated that the newspaper had received an anonymous telephone call which stated that an individual had a 4:30 appointment with the FBI to furnish some information regarding the KING assassination.

She stated that she had come to the FBI Office for the purpose of attempting to get a news release for her paper. She was advised that the writer would not be able to give any news release in connection with this matter and besides, that any such release would have to be obtained from the Atlanta Office of the FBI.

Miss BAILEY departed the RA Office at this time and the writer proceeded to interview Mr. LEE, who stated that he was in New York City in March of 1968 while on spring vacation from the University of Georgia and on 3/17/68, he met an individual who identified himself as GARY BURNSED and who stated that he was from somewhere near Denver, Colo. He stated that after the initial meeting, he saw this individual about two other times. He stated that this individual made remarks about the fact that he was taking some sort of training and had to make periodic trips outside New York. He stated that on one occasion this individual became rather intoxicated and during this time made a number of predictions about various matters. This person predicted that President JOHNSON would not seek reelection and that BOBBY KENNEDY would be the next President. He also predicted that JIM GARRISON would be assassinated in New Orleans in June of 1968. He did not elaborate on this prediction.

He also predicted that MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. would be assassinated in a southern city, but would not elaborate on when or how this would take place. He also made various other predictions about miscellaneous things during this time. After BURNSED sobered up he seemed to be somewhat upset over the fact that he had made these various predictions to LEE. Since that time LEE stated that he has had the occasion to see some of these predictions come true and as a result he has become somewhat alarmed over this matter. He stated that this was the reason he decided to speak with the FBI.

LEE stated that since leaving New York, he has not seen or heard from BURNSED. He described BURNSED as follows:

When the writer left the RA Office a short time after LEE left, he noticed a young lady standing on the sidewalk in front of the Post Office Building with a camera pointed toward the building as if she were taking photographs of the Post Office Building. She was immediately joined by a young man, identity not known. Shortly thereafter, Mr. LEE, who had only recently departed the RA Office, walked from across the street and approached these two individuals and spoke with them for a moment, remarks not overheard. He then walked across the street, entered an automobile, and left the area.

Immediately after LEE drove away the young couple were approached by Miss SHARON BAILEY, who had previously visited the RA Office.

Although Miss BAILEY stated she did not know LEE when he arrived, it appeared that since she was in conversation with two individuals that LEE had just spoken to prior to her arrival, that a possibility existed that she was, in fact, acquainted with LEE, and the possibility also existed that some sort of a conspiracy might be in effect to get a news release for the Athens Daily News.
