A search of City Directories and telephone books did not disclose any contractor by the name of McCaffrey.

On 5/9/68 SA GEORGE KEEFER interviewed the following persons at the Bamboo Hut, 6812 San Pedro, San Antonio:

BOB GUERRA, owner

ANN ROSS, bartender

Miss ROSS advised that she did not see anyone sitting at the bar at the Bamboo Hut on the night of 5/4/68 who resembled the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY or in any way resembled the description of the individual in retel.

BOB GUERRA advised that he was on duty on the night of 5/4/68 waiting on tables situated in a different portion of the establishment from that occupied by the bar. He said that he remembered four women who sat at a table and who appeared to be bowlers attending a Women's Bowling Congress Convention currently being held in San Antonio. He said that during the evening an individual described as in retel did approach these women and try to become better acquainted with them. He said it was his observation that they did not want to have anything to do with him and tried to discourage conversation but that he was persistent. GUERRA said he had never seen this man before and that the individual has not been in the Bamboo Hut since 5/4/68. After seeing the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY on W.F. # 442A GUERRA stated that he is of the opinion that the man above referred to is not identical with RAY. He said that the patron of 5/4/68 was about 5'll" tall, weighted about 150 pounds, and had a very slender build. He said that the man was in his 40's, had long dark hair, was well dressed but looked dirty. He said he did not see any scars or marks on this man and did not note any peculiarity with reference to an ear. He said the man had a very narrow face with a long pointed chin and was drinking whiskey from a bottle he had brought with him. said he did not see the cigarette lighter described in retel and did not hear the name BOB SHILLINGS. He stated that he would call the FBI if this individual ever appeared again at the Bamboo Hut.
