Other Offices receiving copies of this airtel were not furnished rerep and so the following background information is being set forth to assist these Offices in conducting the requested investigation:

Investigation has determined that the subject, using the name of E. G. [REDACTED] left Los Angeles, Calif., on 12/15/67, driving his Mustang automobile, in the company of C. [REDACTED] S. [REDACTED] of Los Angeles. S. [REDACTED] had formerly been a resident of New Orleans and the alleged purpose of this trip was for S. [REDACTED] to pick up two children of his sister's who were residing in New Orleans and return them to California. According to S. [REDACTED] they arrived in New Orleans on 12/17/67 and left New Orleans on 12/19/67. S. [REDACTED] stayed with relatives and investigation has determined that subject registered at the [REDACTED] New Orleans, on 12/17/67 as E. G. [REDACTED] and was assigned [REDACTED]. The registration card indicated G. [REDACTED]'s automobile to be a Mustang bearing Alabama license [REDACTED] and his address as [REDACTED] Birmingham, Ala. The subject, as G. [REDACTED], stayed at the motel until 12/19/67 when he checked out.

Interviews of motel employees in regards to the subject have been negative in that they cannot recall him.

There is set forth under a caption for each Office the identity or identities of persons staying at the Provincial Motel from 12/17 through 19/67. The identities of these persons were obtained from the motel registration cards as well as other information which is set forth under the name. The date listed under each name is the date the individual or individuals stayed at the motel. Each Office should locate and interview these individuals for any knowledge or contact they may have had with the subject. Various photographs of J. [REDACTED] R. [REDACTED], which have been furnished to all Offices, should be displayed to these individuals to ascertain if they recall R. [REDACTED]

In order to assist Memphis, the Office of Origin in this matter, each Office should set forth the results of this investigation in report form with copies of the reports designated for the Bureau and Memphis.

In the preparation of these reports, it is suggested that an appropriate predication for this part of the investigation be utilized in the details prior to reporting the results of contacts with these individuals. As an example, the following information might be used for this predication:

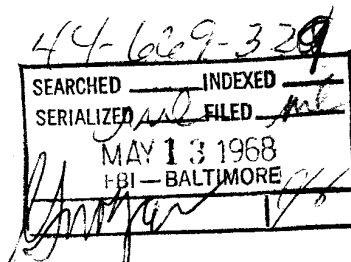

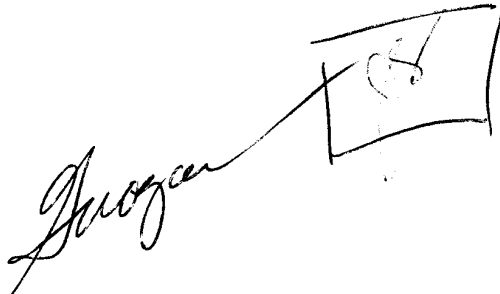

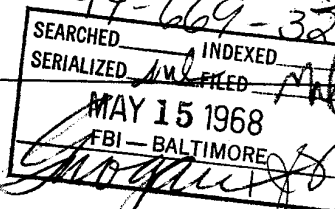

It was concluded that none of the machines used to prepare K227 through K238 was employed in preparing the laundry marks appearing on Q69 and Q70 and that the machine used to prepare K228 was not used to prepare the laundry marks appearing on Q97 and Q99.

Differences were noted between the tapes designated K227 and K229 through K235 when compared with the laundry marks appearing on Q97 and Q99, but the lack of sufficient identifying features precluded a definite opinion from being reached.

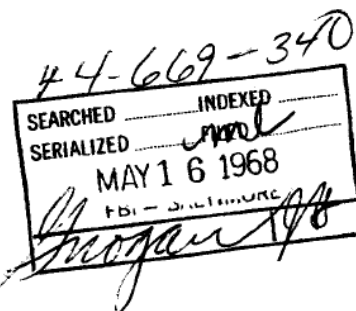

Mrs. M [REDACTED] furnished the following information:

She advised that on viewing the photograph of the artist's sketch which appeared in the newspaper she considered such to bear a resemblance to one H [REDACTED] B [REDACTED] whose family resided in Brentwood on Webster Street and who rents a room elsewhere and was in the United States Marine Corp. before he lost a hand and now wears an artificial left hand. She stated that this individual formerly wore a hook before acquiring the artificial hand.

B [REDACTED] was associated with the Lincoln Rockwell Group and brought some of these individuals to Duffy's Tavern near the 4400 block Rhode Island Avenue and there passed out some literature. Furthermore, this individual has been known to make general remarks against people of the Negro race.
