

Indices of the Buffalo Office do not contain any information identifiable with JOHN A. FOREST or JOHN FOREES based on data furnished by POMPI.







The Bureau has advised that JAMES EARL RAY is known to consort with prostitutes and "street bums." The photograph of RAY wearing dark glasses, which has been furnished to all Agents, was obtained from a prostitute in Mexico.

The Bureau has instructed that in daily contacts with informants, officers of the Vice Squads, and prostitutes, this information should be borne in mind.

Attached hereto for assistance in handling this lead are 20 copies of IOs of RAY for each Agent. Also attached is a Xerox copy of a photograph of RAY, showing the distinct cleft in his chin.

At approximately 3:10 p.m., 6/5/68, ASAC WASON G. CAMPBELL telephonically contacted the Buffalo Office from Toronto. He advised that they had just finished interviewing Miss LILLIAN SPENCER, travel agent for Kennedy Travel Bureau. She told them that the man using the name of RAYMON GEORGE SNEYD first contacted her on 4/16/68. She made out most of his passport application for him although he signed it. He showed no identification or birth certificate. She felt he must have given her the return date of 5/21/68 because this plane was for a 21-day excursion and he was showing his return before the 21 days would have been up.

In his passport amlication SNEYD shows <u>PAUL BRIDGMAN</u> as the person who would always know his whereabouts. This is the name that SNEYD used when he stayed at the Ossington address.

On the application it has to be shown that the traveler has a smallpox vaccination. She does not recall how she verified SNEYD had one.

Miss SPENCER said that SNEYD wrote her a letter saying he was going to a community in northern Ontario on a business trip but would be back. He came back on 5/2/68 at which time he paid for his ticket with \$345 in Canadian currency. She did not recall the denominations but it was for a round trip ticket. Miss SPENCER said that normally if he cashed in the unused return trip ticket it would be returned to the travel agency where he purchased it but this is not an iron-clad situation.

Miss SPENCER could not identify our photographs of RAY although she identified the photo on the passport as that of SNEYD. She said there was nothing outstanding about him in her mind and described him as a "milk toast" type who looks more assertive in the passport photo than he impressed her in

person. He sat with his hands folded in his lap, as she recalled. There was nothing about his accent or demeanor that made her think he was not Canadian. He wore no hat, and an ordinary suit. She could recall nothing unusual about his clothing. He wore his glasses naturally and did not act like a person wearing glasses for the first time.

Miss SPENCER said he did not have to have a birth certificate because he said he was a native of Toronto.

ASAC CAMPBELL said he and SA MC MAHON had been at a one-hour conference in the morning with MTPD Chief JAMES MACKEY, A Deputy MTPD Chief, the Superintendent of the RCMP, an RCMP Sergeant and Corporal and an MTPD Detective.

ASAC CAMPBELL said that the following material had been recovered which had been in SNEYD's possession which has been previously reported in memorandum:

5 packages of film
Gray metal strongbox
Miscellaneous bandaids
3 paper bags, one size 16
Empty cardboard box which had contained
plastic material used for laminating
identification
Jar of Stein's cold cream, theatrical type
3 maps, one of Montreal, one of all Canada and
one of Toronto

All had been processed with silver nitrate and one latent was developed on the box.

ASAC CAMPBELL did not know at this time what was going to happen to the evidence recovered.

With regard to the real RATMON GEORGE SNEYD, the subject had his correct date of birth. SNEYD cannot explain how the subject got it. The RCMP and MTPD went to the Bureau of Vital Statistics where they found a letter from the subject dated 4/16/68 enclosing a money order for \$2. In this letter he
