

Ray's Capture Muffles FBI C

A NOTHER phase of the sick-ness of our society, of which petty, petulant cynicism and a wish to believe the worst are symptoms, was revealed by the capture of James Earl Ray, suspected of killing Dr. Martin Luther King.

A Bible text may be helpful beginning with Matthew 11:12:

"From the days of John the Baptist until now, the kingdom of heaven suffereth violence and the violent carry it away . . .

"The man who has ears to hear, he must use them.

"But how can I show what the people of this generation are like? They are like children sitting in the market place calling out t their friends, 'We played at weddings for you but you would not dance, and we played at funerals and you would not cry.' For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they said, 'He is a hypocrite and crazy!' Then the Son of Man came, enjoying life, and people say, 'Look, a drunkard and a glutton - the close friend of the tax collector and the sinners

ALWAYS the doubters — the cynics, the nay-sayers, the makers of false rumors refuse to accept reality.

Dr. King was murdered April 4. Ray was arrested in London

on June 8. Yet, in those few weeks the most amazing rumors, doubts and evil reports were circulated abou the Department of Justice and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Some of these false ac-. cusations and spurious claims of "inside reports" were set in motion by persons of malice, by enemies of the American system or those who tried to make the Negro doubt the integrity of the administration.

'Among the more commonly circulated false rumors and lies was one that the FBI didn't want to catch the man because the FBI didn't like Dr. King.

IT IS SURPRISING how many do not understand the legalisms it again. Not even the truth that i trict the FBI to in- stops them.

vestigative work connected with violations of federal law. The bureau is not a police force. The FBI for example, was largely impotent in the civil rights area until Congress enacted federal

It is a tribute to J. Edgar Hoover and his bureau that they have done so tremendous a job in federal law enforcement and detection. Maybe the FBI has a peer, but no superior.

While "they" were whispering that they "knew" the FBI was not trying to find James Earl Ray, a massive force was at work in 50 states, in Mexico and Canada. Now Ray is caught.

On 6/14/68, Superintendent CARL DOEY, RCMP, Toronto, Ont., Canada, telephonically advised that he had received a telephone call from their Ottawa Office. The Ottawa Office had informed him that they had received information from their liaison office at the Bureau that he had received information concerning an individual in Montreal during the summer of 1967, who might be the individual referred to by ROBERT JOHNSTONE, Reporter for the "Toronto Star."

Superintendent DOEY identified this individual as JULIUS ROCCO KIMBLE. KIMBLE allegedly was an Agent recruited by some State law enforcement agency from the South to infiltrate the Ku Klux Klan (KKK). KIMBLE did infiltrate the KKK, but once he did so, he doubled in favor of the KKK and furnished them with information, as to what law enforcement was doing.

Superintendent DOEY said this was all the information he had relative to KIMBLE.



On 7/3/68, Mr. WALTER PACKARD. IR. 26 Raymond Road, Penfield, New York, Telephone 586-2276, contacted SA ROBERT W. DAWSON by long distance telephone and advised that he had some observations concerning captioned matter. PACKARD admitted that he had been a former patient at Strong Memorial Hospital, Rochester, New York, inasmuch as he had been mentally disturbed. He had undergone numerous electric shock treatments and these treatments had "really blasted my memory".

PACKARD stated that he is studying for advancing academic degree; and based upon his education and upon his experience in the past, it is his belief that an intelligent properly trained individual could have programed the slaying of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. into the mind of JAMES EARL RAY through chemotherapy or subliminal processes. He further believed that RAY could have been programed to have left evidence such as dropping the gun and could have been programed to break down and involve some innocent party rather than the

Ar advised by my lawyer, I am enclosing a check endorsed by Peggy Wray and giving an address in Santa Maria, California.

When we lived in Santa Maria, she worked for me, and from conversations I recall, I feel she may have been married to James 44.37 Earl Ray. The validity should easily be checked by contacting the Santa Maria High School...because this woman had a son registered in high school at that time. If my memory is correct she called him James Earl.

I have no further information that I think would be of help to you, but if for any reason you do feel it necessary to contact me, please do so by telephone first. My children remember her only as "Peggy" and I do not feel it wise for them to be aware of this connection, if it should prove to be true.

My delay in contacting you is because of my personal concern for her and her efforts to make a new life for herself and her children. If information concerning her is not pertinent to the case I would urge you not to intrude on her.

Mr. GERALD CASTIGLIA, Innkeeper, Holiday Inn, Camp Road, Hamburg, advised on 6/21/68 that a review of his records for the period 4/6,7,8 and 9/68 and 4/10/68 failed to reflect anyone registered at that motel by the name of JAMES EARL RAY or his aliases.

He stated further that the photographs of RAY are not familiar to him as a person having stayed at that motel. He further stated that his motel has a large lunch and dinner serving and it is possible for many individuals to eat there who do not stay overnight. He added that if anyone looking like RAY had stayed there, during that period, they would have been listed in his records.

Mr. CASTIGLIA further stated that the display of photographs to the personnel employed here failed to locate anyone who could identify RAY as having stayed at this motel.

Ray Disputes Quote By Detective About Reaction to Capture

From News Wire Services
LONDON, June 28 — Shortly after a Scotland Yard detective testified that James Earl Ray had said "Oh, God, I feel so trapped" upon his capture, the accused slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. took the stand Thursday and denied making the statement.

Chief Detective Supt. Thomas Butler told the Bow Street Magistrate's Court in an extradition hearing that Ray had made the remark after being told his identity was known and he was wanted for murder.

Ray himself advised the court he wanted to contest Mr. Butler's testimony and then went on to deny slaying Dr. King April 4, or even knowing him.

The hearing was adjourned until next Tuesday after Ray's

testimony.

Meanwhile, an organization called the Patriot Legal Fund amnounced in Savannah, Ga., that it has offered to defend Ray free of charge.



COURT RULES SLAYING OF DR. KING WASN'T POLITICAL CRIME

Defense Plans Appeal; Could Delay "He expressed fear that the "liberal press" in the U. S. would **Extradition for Several Weeks:** Missouri Charge a Key

LONDON, July 2 - A court today ordered James Earl Ray extradited to the United States to stand trial for the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Ray, 40, identified as an escaped convict from a body of persons who disagreed Missouri prison, was accused of shooting the civil rights with the objects and aims of leader in Memphis, Tenn., on April 4. 

He is expected to fly home under heavy guard in the next few days for trial in Memphis, Tenn. in the shooting of the Nobel laureate there last April 4. Ray, an escaped convict from the Missouri State Penitentiary, was arrested in London June 8. He has steadily claimed his innocence of the kill-

A legal informant said Ray signed a statement declaring he would not pursue an appeal in the British High Court against a Magistrate's Court order July 2 extraditing him to the United States.

Little Chance of Success

The statement, signed Tuesday morning at a conference with his court-appointed lawyer, cut short a complicated legal case which had little chance of success.

People who talked to Ray re-cently in Wandsworth Prison said he had been growing restless and tired of waiting. Another factor was the news that the British had refused to continue legal aid for his appeal. He had been granted free legal service for the lower court case.

Ray's statement was signed in an irregular hand, 'Ramon George Sneyd," the alias under which he had been held here since his arrest.

On 8/24/68 at about 2:30 PM, Bureau Supervisor RICHARD LONG, General Investigative Division, telephoned concerning captioned case with regard to information that has become available from a source which Mr. LONG described as highly confidential. He said that the Bureau is very anxious to establish whether subject spent some time in Toronto, Canada, as early as June or July, 1967. Information from this described source suggests that RAY was arrested in early 1967 (probably June) by the Metropolitan Toronto Police Department on a charge of Jaywalking, but the name under which the arrest occurred is not known.

Supervisor LONG in speculating how subject came to use the SNEYD, GALT and BRIDGEMAN aliases, wondered whether old newspapers would have had the necessary information concerning the parents of these individuals. I told him that investigation conducted in June, 1968, at Toronto while SA JAMES MC MAHON and I were there, developed the possibility that this could have been the source since such newspapers are available in the various branch libraries.

He also said the question has arisen as to whether any pretext interviews were made of SNEYD, GALT or BRIDGEMAN to establish the necessary information for this new identity by RAY. He was told that there had been some telephone calls which were unexplained at the time but in retrospect could well have been RAY setting up his identity. He was told that all available information in this regard has been previously set forth in communications from Buffalo.

Supervisor LONG requested that any additional investigation possible be conducted with a view toward placing RAY in Toronto in 1967 with emphasis on the alleged jaywalking arrest.

Re telephone call from Bureau Supervisor RICHARD LONG, General Investigative Division, to Buffalo, 8/24/68, during which Supervisor LONG advised that highly confidential information had been received indicating that the subject, JAMES EARL RAY, might have been arrested by the Metropolitan Toronto Police Department in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, during June or July, 1967, on a charge of jaywalking.

On 8/27/68, Inspector RICHARD GIBSON (NA), Head of the Central Identification Division of the Metropolitan Toronto Police Department (MTPD), was requested to make the necessary record checks to determine whether RAY was, in fact, arrested in Toronto for jaywalking, and in connection with this request, was furnished with all known aliases used by RAY in the past.

On 8/28/68, Inspector GIBSON advised that subject, under his true name and all aliases, had been checked through the Central Identification Bureau, the Records and Inquiry Bureau, and the Letter File of the MTFD; and no information was developed indicating an arrest in Toronto at any time under any of RAY's aliases.

In addition, Inspector GIBSON pointed out that it was not the practice of the MTPD to arrest individuals for jaywalking but that on infrequent occasions, a police officer would issue summonses for this offense. Inspector GIBSON had all available records of the MTPD checked regarding summonses issued for jaywalking and determined that no unanswered summonses were on file for the offense of jaywalking in the City of Toronto during the months of June and July of 1967.

Inspector GIBSON pointed out that ordinarily if a person failed to appear in answer to a jaywalking summons, a bench warrant would be issued for his arrest and that the records of the MTPD contained no cutstanding warrants based upon this type of violation during the pertinent period.

connection with Supervisor LONG's inquiry concerning innocuous calls previously received by the individuals in Toronto whose identities subject assumed while in Toronto during the period from April 8 to May 6, 1968, attention is called to Buffalo airtel to the Bureau dated 6/11/68 with which were forwarded two copies of a memorandum setting forth a chronology of subject's activities while in Toronto insofar as was known at that time and which included specific references to the innocuous calls received by the individuals whose identities RAY assumed. More detailed data concerning those calls was undoubtedly submitted by Legat, Ottawa, since the RCMP in Toronto are known to have prepared a lengthy report for Legat, Ottawa, including that type of information.

The same situation exists insofar as the third point raised by Supervisor LONG in referenced telephone call, that is, the availability of vital statistics information utilized by RAY in connection with the assumed identities while in Toronto.
